RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING COMBINED POLLING PLACES

WHEREAS, if an election other than a School District election is held within the School District on the same day as a School District election, voters shall vote at the polling places and precincts designated by the municipality or county;

WHEREAS, if a School District election is held on a day on which no other elections are being held within the School District, the School District is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, section 205A.11, subdivision 2, to designate combined polling places for one or more election precincts within the School District; and

WHEREAS, each combined polling place designated herein is at a location that is also designated for use as a polling place by a municipality or county (for unorganized territories).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of Independent School District No. 239, Rushford-Peterson Public Schools, State of Minnesota, as follows:

1. The School Board reaffirms that, if an election other than a School District election is being held within the School District on the same day as a School District election, voters shall vote at the polling places and precincts designated by the municipality or county.

2. Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 205A.11, subdivision 2, the School Board hereby designates the following location as the polling places for the stated precincts for any School District election held when no other elections are being held within the School District:

**CITY OF RUSHFORD VILLAGE HALL
43038 STATE HWY 30
RUSHFORD, MN 55971**

This combined polling place serves all territory in Independent School District No.239 located in FILLMORE COUNTY: Amherst Township, Arendahl Township, Holt Township, Norway Township, City of Peterson, Pilot Mound Township, Preble Township, City of Rushford and City of Rushford Village; HOUSTON COUNTY: Black Hammer Township, Money Creek Township and Yucatan Township; WINONA COUNTY: Hart Township, Saratoga Township and Wiscoy Township.

3. If any precinct identified herein as voting at a combined polling place is in a jurisdiction holding an election on the same day as a School District election not on the date of a statewide election, said precinct shall vote at the location and in the manner operated by the jurisdiction holding the election. All other precincts identified herein as voting at a combined polling place shall vote at the combined polling place identified herein.

4. The clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice of the establishment of these polling places to be provided to the County Auditor of each county in which the School District is located, in whole or in part, within 30 days after the passage of this Resolution. This notice must include a list of the precincts that will be voting at each polling place.

5. Except for any election held on the second Tuesday in August, the Tuesday following the first Monday in November, or for a special election conducted entirely by mail, the clerk is hereby authorized and directed to notify voters of the date of the election, the hours of voting, and the location of the voter's polling place. Such notice shall be sent by nonforwardable mail at least 14 days before the election to every affected household in the school district with at least one registered voter. Any notices returned as undeliverable must be forwarded immediately to the appropriate County Auditor.

6. If this Resolution causes a change in the polling place of any election precinct in the School District, the clerk is hereby authorized and directed to send a notice stating the location of the new polling place to every affected household with at least one registered voter in the precinct(s) to be served by this polling place. This notice shall be sent by nonforwardable mail at least 25 days before the next election. Any notices returned as undeliverable must be forwarded immediately to the appropriate County Auditor.

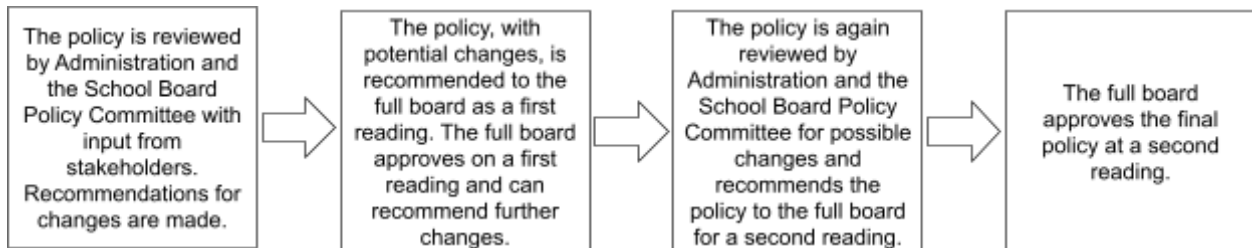

We are finishing our third story of the year, and students have been working hard on reading, answering questions with evidence, and finding the literary elements of stories. We will be starting our first of three novels soon and are excited to share the stories with the students. Every reading unit we try to incorporate a STEAM activity, so far we have built tin foil boats, created a watercolor piece, and built a tool to fish a hat out of a well. In science we are learning about water and weather and in social studies students have begun to learn about the regions (culture, locations, geography) of the United States. Looking forward to more exciting times!

5th- Chris Drinkall, Emily Charlebois

In fifth grade ELA, we just finished Unit 1 (Facing Challenges) in our Reading Street curriculum, and the students are working on a personal narrative about a challenge they have overcome. In social studies, we have covered the very first Americans and are moving into learning about the early European explorers. We are finishing up our chapter on volume and area in fifth-grade math. Mr. Lind has been coming in to help with a fun sauerkraut-making activity in science. The fifth graders are learning the history of sauerkraut, the science behind it, the health benefits, and some interesting facts.

K-2 Intervention is up and running. Was quite successful with our Kindergarten groups last year so have small first groups. Extended Day will begin on Oct. 18 and run until April 20th on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons. Have room for approximately 25-30 students. This program provides some homework help but, majority of time is spent on reading and math skill building.

3-5 Intervention- Dave Lind

Intervention is working on math facts and reinforcing what the classroom teachers are presenting

PE- 2-5 – Teresa Brown

We are enjoying the nice fall and outside as often as we can be. Second grade has been working on soccer skills playing various games. The benchmarks for soccer are: 1) Dribble with the feet while traveling through general space. 2) Receive a partner pass with the feet while maintaining control of the soccer ball and the body. We also had a football unit working on our overhand throwing and catching. The benchmark we were working on was: Throwing overhand with side facing target and opposite foot forward. Another unit we are working on is hula hoop. We play a variety of games and perform various tasks with the hula hoop. The benchmark looked at when using hula hoops is to follow classroom rules and protocols related to self, space and equipment. The 3rd through 5th grade have worked on Soccer skills during various drills and small sided games. The benchmarks for 3rd grade soccer are: 1) Dribble with the feet while traveling through general space with control of ball and body 2) Pass and receive a ball with the feet “giving” on reception before returning the ball to another player. 4th grade benchmarks for soccer are 1) Dribble with feet while traveling through general space, increasing and decreasing speed in practice task 2) Pass and receive a ball with the feet in a practice task. 5th grade benchmarks are 1) Dribble with the feet in small sided games 2) Pass and receive a ball with the feet in small sided games. My student teacher, Mr. Roden also did a week of tennis with the 3rd through 5th graders. The students performed various skills such as racket control activities, practice tasks and small sided games. We did not check off any benchmarks for this unit as we only had a week for tennis.

PE- K-1 – Nikki Schultz

K and 1st grade finish their bean bag unit and after 2 weeks are finishing their hula hoop unit. We drove cars and went fishing with our hula hoops. Our next unit is tag games.
