AES Campus Improvement Initiatives (TSL and Wink Education)

- AES students took the released Reading and Math STAAR before the Christmas break. Our John Wink spreadsheets were updated with the new data and Mr. Andrews met with Mr. Wink to review the data. We are not where we want to be just yet but we are making progress.

Attendance

- The month of December impacted AES attendance significantly, as many of our students were affected by flu and strep. One week in particular, we had at least 60 students absent each day. Our attendance clerk, Courtney Allen, has been very diligent in maintaining communication with parents and ensuring that necessary school staff are kept informed regarding student absences. As we return from the holidays, our attendance has picked back up and we seem to be back into our normal pattern.

PLC Meetings

Each Thursday, we hold PLC (Professional Learning Community) meetings with our teachers. This past Thursday, I met with teachers to review data from the released STAAR test administered in December. While our overall results were impacted by a high number of student absences, we focused on using individual student scores to chart personal growth and identify skills that need to be spiraled within instructional groups. Students utilize a growth tracker sheet that they complete after each assessment. This allows them to see their specific goals, track their current progress, and visually observe their growth over time. This process helps students better understand where they are academically and reinforces the importance of continuous improvement.

Middle of Year Assessments

Students are also completing the NWEA assessments in Science, Math, and Reading this month. These assessments serve as the middle-of-the-year benchmark. The data will be used to track student progress from the beginning of the year to the middle of the year and ultimately to the end of the year. In addition, this data will be utilized to evaluate student growth rates and support teacher growth conversations based on their students' academic progress.

Anahuac Book Mobile

The Anahuac Book Mobile is making its first appearance at AES this month as part of a pilot with our 3rd grade students. Dr. Abshier is coordinating the setup and providing students the opportunity to select books to take home and read. Students are very excited about this experience, and we truly appreciate the time, effort, and dedication Dr. Abshier has invested in getting the Anahuac Book Mobile up and running for our students.

UIL

Students will be competing in our District UIL events on January 22nd at East Chambers Elementary School. We have 86 students from AES competing in UIL on January 22nd. Students have been practicing after school and working very hard to prepare for competition. We look forward to supporting our students and celebrating their successes.

- January 13, Mrs. Vernon went over IXL information for our teachers to begin to use in their classes.
- January 16th our AMS band members who made the TMEA Region Band will attend their clinic to prepare them for their concert on January 17th.

Texas Strategic Leadership

AMS is continuing to give benchmark tests for core tested subjects. Teachers are learning how to use the IXL program in core subjects which helps fill where each student specifically has gaps or needs accelerated instruction based on diagnostic assessments, teacher description or NWEA Map results. It is a prescriptive program that the teachers are excited about. We will have a virtual training session with IXL in the next couple of weeks.



AHS Board Report January 2026



AHS recognition: School Board Recognition

Math Dept:

- Algebra 2 will begin this semester by taking a screener to show growth from the beginning of the year. Students will begin discussing factoring and how it applies to quadratic functions.
- Math Models will take a screener to show improvement in math this year. Students will begin the unit over data and statistics once the screener is completed.
- Algebra 1 is starting the new year by reviewing exponent rules before we go into multiplying binomials. Students will have a MOY exam to continue to measure growth among the Algebra 1 students.
- Algebraic Reasoning is starting the new year by reviewing polynomials, starting with cubic functions and tying in with how polynomials are used with technology. Students will have a MOY exam to continue to measure growth.
- CPM and Precalculus are taking the Middle of Year NWEA Testing. Students will continue working on Systems after testing.
- Precalculus will Complete Sequences and Series and end the week with Binomial Expansions.
- January 12th is the first day of Math 1314 dual credit class.

Science Dept:

- **Biology-** In December, Biology students completed their fall final exam presentations, where they chose a future career and connected it to a biology concept learned this year. From veterinarians and wood carvers to pediatric dentistry, students explored a wide range of career paths and made meaningful real-world connections to how biology will impact their lives. As students return from winter break, they are now reviewing all fall semester content and preparing for the Middle of Year (MOY) assessment, helping them set goals and track progress as they move closer to the STAAR exam.
- **Chemistry-** Chemistry students are starting the spring semester strong by diving into stoichiometry. Several hands-on labs are coming up, including an activity where students apply their balancing equation skills to create the perfect cup of hot cocoa. Next week, they will use stoichiometry concepts in a creative project designed to show how chemistry connects to everyday life in fun and practical ways.
- **Forensics-** Forensics students are beginning an exciting new unit on blood spatter analysis. In this unit, students analyze stain size, shape, and angle of impact to determine what happened at a crime scene, including force, movement, and positioning. Through hands-on labs, students measure droplets, test different surfaces and angles, apply math and biology, identify patterns in blood spatter types, and use chemical tests such as luminol. This unit brings together science, problem solving, and real-world investigation in a highly engaging way.
- **Physics-** Physics students are starting Unit 6 on waves. They will be learning how to classify different types of waves, study properties such as wavelength, frequency, amplitude, and speed, complete mathematical calculations, and explore wave behavior. Students will also connect these concepts to real-world applications including sound and light.
- **Rockets-** Second semester means it is officially rocket season. Students are beginning the build phase for the annual rocket launch at Smith Point, which will take place in just a few months. This year's event is projected to include approximately 60 rockets launched over three days with participation from more than 10 school districts. It is always one of the most exciting highlights of the year for our students.

CTE / FFA

- **ENTRE 2** - Students had DECA district competition in Conroe Jan 8. The first year of DECA, our chapter earned recognition in the community service campaign and received a pennant. Only 181/4,364 chapters earned recognition for that honor (or 4.1%). Our chapter also earned recognition (another pennant) in the membership campaign and only 869/4,364 (19.9%) of chapters received that honor. In the classroom, students will be focused on studying for and passing their IBC exam related to Entrepreneurship.
- **CHILD DEVELOPMENT & HUMAN GROWTH and DEVELOPMENT**- Students are learning about milestones among the elementary school ages (6-11). Differentiating the milestones between physical, emotional, social, and cognitive. They will prepare presentations and lessons related to the different milestones.
- **PRINCIPLES OF EDUCATION** - The Panther Buddies mentorship program will be planning out the best way to begin a small garden, as instructed by The Giving Field last month. In the classroom, students are traveling back in time to learn about education history from the 1800's and then will teach a lesson as if they were back in a 1 room schoolhouse.
- **FFA**- is gearing up for our Career Development Contests (CDE's) that mainly happen this semester. They will be training and competing in various contests such as Livestock Judging, Floriculture, Horse Judging, Entomology, Veterinary Science, Wool Judging, and possibly Dairy Foods Judging. They are also excitedly anticipating the start of the Major Show Season for some of our heifer, steer and lamb exhibitors. There are 3 Heifer exhibitors, 2 Lamb exhibitors and 2 Steer exhibitors all planning on attending the Fort Worth Livestock Show towards the end of January.

Highlights from the Counseling Office

- To kick off the holiday break, students participated in the "Beach Shazam Holiday Edition" activity during their lunch periods. The event was hosted by AHS Counselors Mallory Daigle and Melinda Crawford. It served as a wonderful way for the student body to engage with one another and celebrate the start of the holiday season.

Remediation / Acceleration Efforts / Strategies

- Students started logging minutes in the Beanstack program as a reading incentive. Since starting the program at the beginning of December 4,816 minutes have been logged.

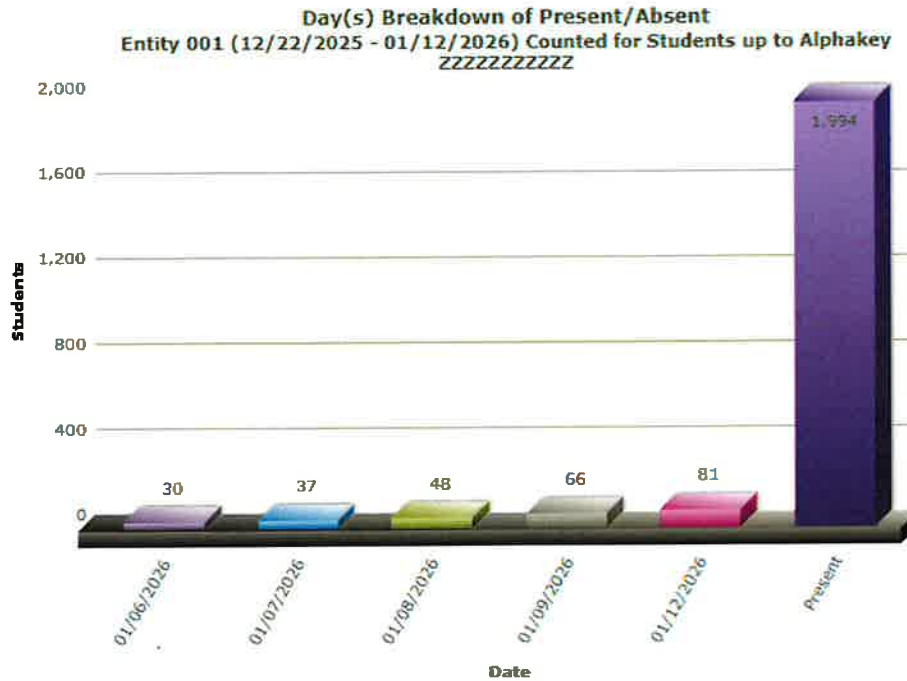

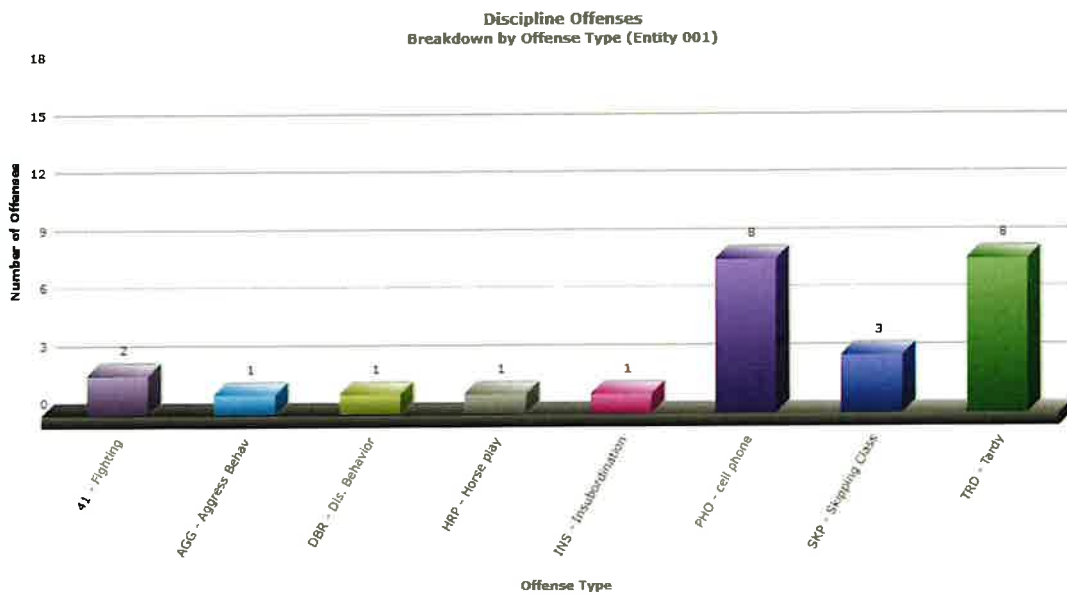
