Coronavirus (COVID-19) Information Update

- Information regarding Unity School District's response to COVID-19 will be updated and shared on the District website at www.unity.k12.wi.us. All communication with parents has been posted to the website.
- Unity Board of Education meetings are being conducted virtually, via Zoom, during the school closure. The login information for the meeting is located at the top of the published agenda on the school district website.

Virtual Learning Update

- Middle and High School students (grades 5-12) use their school issued iPad for learning activities online.
- Middle and High School students use the Google Classroom platform, with integrated Gmail, Drive, and Google Meet.
- Elementary School students receive their educational materials on Mondays, delivered by the meal bus. They also have access to their teacher's website to download the materials.
- Students can communicate with teachers via email, phone, or through video conferencing. Middle and High School students use Google Meet video conferencing. Elementary students and parents can use Zoom to video conference.
- Counselors are connecting with students remotely to assist with any needs or questions.
- Students will be able to keep their school issued iPads over the summer.

Food Service Meal Program Update

- Meal service will continue through June 30th.
- Over 700 children receive meals daily from the school's food service meal program.
- The meals consist of a breakfast and a lunch.
- The meals are free and are for children, 18 years of age and younger.
- Children do not need to be enrolled in the District, but do need to be residents.
- Meals may be accompanied by educational materials for younger children.
- Meals are delivered by school bus with educational assistants distributing.

- Elementary School:
 - Weekly lesson and activity packs filled with projects and experiences for home and outdoors.
 - Connection time with a grade level teacher twice a week.
 - Online office hours to share completed projects with your teacher.
 - Fun activities to maintain progress in Reading and Mathematics.
 - Surprise activities and materials delivered by school bus.
 - Food service delivery by school bus continues.
- Middle and High School:
 - Vocal and Instrumental Music lessons online.
 - Strength and conditioning activities and workouts.

LEAP Child Care Center Update

- Final State Approval of the utilities plan has been received.
- Week of May 11 - Site plumbing, backfilling, and final grading
- Week of May 18 - Playground pad is installed.
- Week of May 25 - Sidewalks and parking area curbs installed.
- Week of June 1 - Outdoor Playground equipment installed.
- Week of June 1 - Inspections

After inspections occur, the center staff will need about a week to stage the classrooms, finalize their training, and register students. It is anticipated that the Leap Center will open in mid-June.

Questions, Answered and Unanswered, During School Closure

- **How do I contact someone at school?**
 - Email them, or call their phone extension. Voicemail messages are still sent to them by the email system.
- **Are the offices open?**
 - Someone is present in the District Office daily, until 4:00pm. The School Offices have someone present one day a week, and are working remotely otherwise. All patrons should call from their vehicle or wait in the lobby for service.
- **Can I still be added to the meal list?**
 - Yes. You can call the District Office at 715-825-3515, Option 1.
- **My elementary child received a book with their meal, do I have to return it?**
 - No. Books and craft materials that have been provided should not be returned. They are yours to enjoy!
- **How can I get help with my child's school iPad?**
 - Contact your child's principal and the IT department at 715-825-3515 x4340.
- **What about my child's grades during this trimester?**
 - Third trimester grades for middle and high school students will be Satisfactory or Unsatisfactory. They will not impact the student's GPA unless it is a college class.
- **Can I use the playground or Unity Nature Trail?**
 - No. The school building, as well as the campus, are closed during the school closure.
- **What about spring sports?**
 - The WIAA has cancelled the spring sports season.
- **Will the LEAP Child Care Center open soon?**
 - The opening of the center will occur this June. The construction of the center is being completed. Parents who are considering enrolling their child(ren) are encouraged to contact the school district by email at htiedemann@unity.k12.wi.us or by phone at (715) 825-3515 x4000.
- **When will the Unity Pool and Fitness Center reopen?**
 - These two programs will be reopened when they are allowed to do so by the County Health Department. All memberships will be extended for the time of the closure.

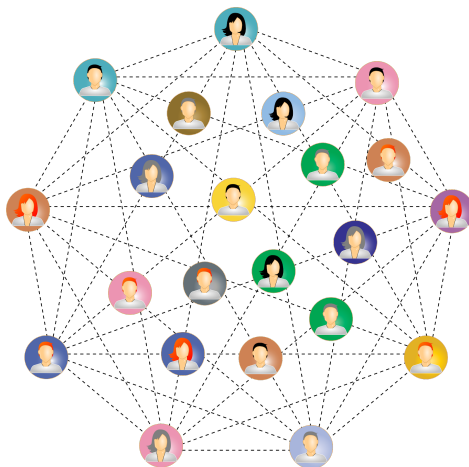

Graduation Honor Recognition
5/14/2020

The High School graduation ceremony is a time to honor Unity students who have successfully completed the requirements for graduation. It is also a time for members of the Senior Class so honored to come together one last time in a respectful and dignified manner to receive their diplomas with family and friends in attendance.

All members of the Senior Class eligible and choosing to participate in the graduation ceremony must wear the traditional cap and gown selected by the District. In addition to such attire, the following honors may also adorn the approved apparel.

Gold Cord

- **National Honor Society (NHS) Cord:** Graduating seniors who have been inducted into the Unity's Chapter of the National Honor Society shall be awarded an NHS Honor Cord.
 - Graduating seniors shall have met all of the membership requirements of National Honor Society and be in good standing.

Silver Cord

- **Academic Honor Cord:** Graduating seniors who have accumulated a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.5 after the second trimester of their senior year shall be awarded an Academic Honor Cord.

White Cord

- **Distinguished Service Cord:** Graduating seniors who have accumulated a minimum of 120 total hours of service shall be awarded an Eagle Distinguished Service Cord.
 - The service hours must be documented and be approved by a high school staff member.
 - Only actual hours of service may be recorded. Travel time, required meetings and miscellaneous time may not be recorded.
 - The award shall be determined after the second trimester of their senior year.

Red, Black, Yellow Braided Cord

- **Eagle Culture Honor Cord:** Graduating seniors who have who have earned Eagle culture honors shall be awarded an Eagle Culture Honor Cord.
 - Have displayed leadership in the Migizzi Club, the Unity Pow Wow, or the Ojibwe Language Program.
 - Have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5. This minimum GPA requirement applies to the Eagle Culture Honor Cord and not the Eagle feather.
 - The award shall be determined after the second trimester of their senior year.

- The graduating senior may be permitted to wear an Eagle feather that has been bestowed upon the student by a federally or state recognized tribe. Such requirements and adornment shall follow the cultural traditions of the tribe, having been approved by the administration prior to commencement exercises.

Navy Blue Cord

- **Fine Arts Honor Cord:** Graduating seniors who have earned fine arts honors shall be awarded a Fine Arts Honor Cord.
 - Have at least a 3.5 GPA in a combination of band, choir, and art classes.
 - Have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0.
 - Have completed a minimum of 3.5 credits in band, choir or art.
 - Have displayed leadership in Band, Jazz Band, Choir, Pep Band, Solo and Ensemble, Theater, or Forensics.
 - The award shall be determined after the second trimester of their senior year.

Red Cord

- **Career and Technical Honor Cord:** Graduating seniors who have earned Career and Technical Honor shall be awarded a Career and Technical Honor Cord.
 - Have at least a 3.5 GPA in a combination of agriculture, business education, and technology education.
 - Have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0.
 - Have completed minimum of 2.5 credits in the career and technical areas.
 - Have displayed leadership in FBLA, FFA, ~~or~~ SkillsUSA clubs, **or Youth Apprenticeship.**
 - The award shall be determined after the second trimester of their senior year.

Other Adornment:

- The Unity Scholar Athlete may affix a Scholar Athlete pin to their graduation stole. The specific pin shall be awarded by the principal prior to the commencement exercises.
- A graduating senior who is a National Honor Society (NHS) member may affix an NHS pin to their graduation stole. The specific pin shall be approved by the principal prior to the commencement exercises.

Exclusions:

No other sashes, stoles, cords, or other adornment may be worn by a graduating senior during the commencement exercises. In addition, any apparel that could be a distraction or disruption to the ceremony is not allowed. Students wearing such apparel may be excluded from commencement exercises by the high school principal.
