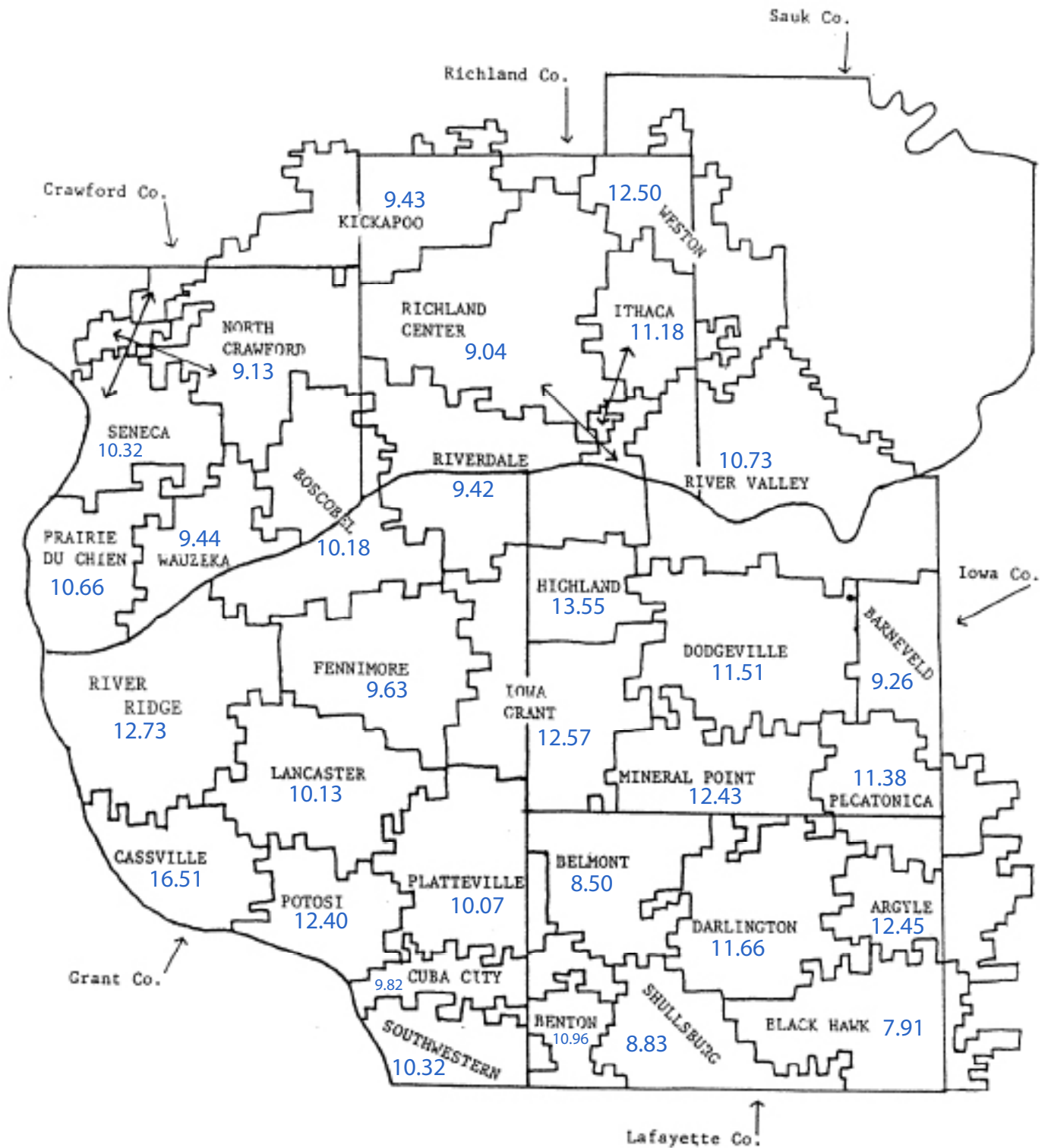

Scott Walker to release 'dramatic' plan for rural schools

A school bus drives along a rural road in La Crosse County. Gov. Scott Walker plans to unveil a "dramatic" plan to help rural schools on Thursday.

Gov. Scott Walker is preparing a plan to help rural school districts, he said Wednesday.

No details about the plan have been revealed by the governor, but Wisconsin Rural Schools Alliance executive director Kim Kaukl said funding for rural schools and transportation, expanding broadband access and initiatives to improve the "teacher pipeline" and administrative efficiency are being discussed.

Walker's 2017-19 state budget proposal also will include funding to allow districts to apply for grants for mobile wireless internet hot spots for school buses and to allow students to take home, Kaukl said.

Assembly Republicans have previously floated the idea of proposing in the upcoming budget to supply a tablet or laptop computer to nearly all high school freshmen.

Walker said during a Wednesday meeting of the Wisconsin Credit Union League that he planned to tour the state on Thursday to release "dramatic" proposals intended to help rural schools. But his spokesman said late Wednesday that the stops would be rescheduled because Walker is ill.

Walker had planned to stop at schools in Stanley, Hilbert, Wauzeka and Crandon. It's unclear when Walker will reschedule and unveil details of his proposal.

Kaukl said he met with the governor and suggested increasing the state-imposed revenue limits to more than \$200 per pupil and increase funding for rural school districts that have had to recently quit offering summer school in part because of transportation costs.

Kaukl also said he requested more money for mental health services, special education, a financial incentive for school districts to share services and a repeal of the state school year start date of September 1.

Jim Jones, who is superintendent of the Stanley-Boyd School District, where Walker planned to stop, said small, rural school districts with few students face financial troubles that larger districts don't because their costs per student are much higher.

The quality of the districts' teachers, principals and administrators must be on par with larger school districts, but because of their low enrollment, the districts' budgets don't always accommodate salaries that would attract good candidates for school positions.

"The rural schools, they have some real, tough budgetary parameters," said Jones. "They have issues that everybody else doesn't have simply because of their size. So I hope he will quote-unquote throw some money at them."

Walker has said he would increase state-imposed revenue limits and backfill the increase with state funding to allow districts to spend more but keep residents' tax burden the same.

He also has said for months that increasing "investment" in schools will be a priority in his upcoming 2017-19 state budget proposal, especially for rural schools, which state Superintendent Tony Evers has called for in past budget cycles.

Evers' current budget request asks for \$5.5 million to provide rural school districts with grant money to pay teachers to retain and recruit them; increase transportation funding for rural school districts and millions more in funding for bilingual-bicultural programs and programs aimed at students who are learning English as a second language.

It was a rough start to the new year at the bus garage. The weather has not been cooperating or allowing for safe passage on the roadways. Last Friday, January 20th, we had two buses stuck on ice. The County had to come and sand to help get one school bus back on route, and the other I had to go out and place chains on to assist the bus over the icy hill. I am in process of training a new sub-driver for this year, he hopes to be a full-time driver next year. I have verbal confirmation from a previous NCSD bus driver that is returning to the district and interested in driving for the school again. The new Propane Buses are handling the winter temperatures with ease. We plug them in overnight, but not during the day. The thought is that it will prolong engine life, and hopefully save on cost down the road. In the recent weeks, we have been having a persistent problem with the DEF Exhaust After-treatment system on the only Diesel bus that has that equipment. Luckily the bus is a 2013 and is still under warranty. That is about all at the Bus Garage, just wishing for a mild end to winter.

SUBJECT: January Technology Update

Testing is on our horizon. Dick Davies will be setting up the server software for Tarasa to give the **Access ELL test** to a student the end of January. In February the Juniors will prepare for the **ACT test** and will take the actual test Feb 28th on their Chromebooks. I hope to be back at least part time after Feb. 7th, to help with that setup. March brings **ACT Aspire test** for 9th and 10th grade, on their Chromebooks, and the **Forward Exam test** in early April.

The district purchased 170 Chromebooks (with 2 year warranty) for 8th, 11th and 12th grade and they are holding up well. I've received less than a dozen Chromebook complaints this year, typically broken screens.

In other tech areas

- Dick Davies will be working on SMARTboard and printing issues in 3 classrooms.
- Demetri sent me the remaining Tech budget and when I return we will need to discuss whether we need to replace the server and SAN environment this year or if we can extend the warranty for 1 more year.
- Several new projectors were purchased and will be used to replace non-working projectors.

January Board Report (School Counselor)

In the month of January, seniors have started working on scholarships. Currently, we have over sixty scholarships listed on the North Crawford webpage. Our local scholarships are due Tuesday, March 21 (the week after spring break). We are planning to hold the Scholarship Award Ceremony on Wednesday, May 24 (the Wednesday prior to graduation).

I am working with students and teachers on APEX. I will be meeting with ten students on a weekly basis to discuss course progress. Students will also be allowed a testing window every Friday morning to complete chapter testing in Lab 315. Toby and I will take turns proctoring the tests for students. In addition, I created an APEX contract for credit recovery to help serve as a guide for students in course expectations. Over the next few weeks I plan to spend significant time on creating APEX courses for summer school. I have been discussing options with other districts in regards to setting up the classes for summer school. I contacted Dorienn Medrano, an APEX Account Executive to discuss the potential for additional summer seat classes. As for summer licenses, they are available for summer only (10 weeks in length), and must be started between May 15 and July 10. The seats are only \$50.00 each since they have limited availability and length. As first semester comes to an end I should get a better idea of the number of seats needed for summer school. As of today, I have potentially eleven students to take summer school courses based off previous years of failed credits.

Lastly, I built the master schedule for the 2017-2018 school year. Toby and I are planning to start meeting with staff to review the master schedule. In addition, I have been working with surrounding schools with distance learning classes and some on-site learning opportunities.

SUBJECT: 8-person football discussion

Mr. Tripalin, Coach Oldenburg, and myself met recently to discuss the feasibility of North Crawford moving to 8-person football starting in the 2019 football season. This discussion came about from the Ridge and Valley District Administrators, many of who have expressed interest in their schools moving to 8-person football. We have also received some interest and inquiries from teams outside of the Ridge and Valley Conference. The belief is that if we are able to get 6-8 schools in our conference/region to commit to moving to 8-person football, this would begin in the 2019-20 school year. This would allow adequate time for teams not interested in making that transition to petition and find an alternative conference to join for 11-person football.

After meeting with Mr. Tripalin and Coach Oldenburg, I would like to recommend that we sit and wait on this issue. While we see the need may arise in the future to move to 8-person football, we are not comfortable making that commitment at this time. We will continue to evaluate our enrollment, participation numbers, and movement of 8-person football over the next couple of years before making a decision on what we feel is best for our kids and district.

SUBJECT: Resolution to Repeal September 1st Start Date

There is a push around the state that is gaining momentum and traction, to repeal the September 1st start date for school districts. Many of the area school districts in CESA #3 are approving board resolutions to repeal the September 1st start date. These districts are going to present these resolutions to their appropriate state representatives.

I recommend that we approve the attached resolution to present to our local representatives to consider repealing the September 1st start date and give that decision back to the local districts.

RESOLUTION TO REPEAL EXISTING STATE STATUTES RESTRICTING THE SCHOOL START DATE

We, the North Crawford School District School Board, support local school boards having the sole authority to establish the school calendar.

We believe that repealing existing state statutes restricting the school start date must be accomplished during this legislative session.

The rationale supporting local control of school starting dates includes:

- Allowing School Boards the opportunity to develop local calendars that include starting prior to September 1, could allow students to complete the first semester before the December holiday break, rather than taking tests and turning in big projects after a long Holiday break. Students and teachers would not have to spend time reviewing material in January when they should be starting a new semester.
- An earlier start date would provide more instructional time for students prior to taking statewide assessment tests, including the Forward Exam and ACT. You as legislators have created a report card that utilizes student performance on these high stakes assessments to evaluate school effectiveness, so you should be vested in giving students every possible advantage to improve their performance.
- Representatives from more advantaged school districts supported legislation that would have allowed districts who had a certain percentage of the students who take Advanced Placement tests to start school when the local board felt it was academically necessary. The language in this bill left out many rural schools and would have concentrated local control for start dates in the more affluent communities. Rural students deserve this same academic advantage, and our locally elected school board officials should be able to determine when it is necessary to start school to have the largest educational impact.
- A school's culture and climate is difficult to establish and maintain in the fall after many of our co-curricular activities have started. Especially at the high school level, school climate is greatly impacted due to numerous activities and events which are scheduled before the first day of school. To maximize school culture and decrease student discipline issues, it is imperative to work with the student body to promote academic achievement, a positive school climate, and the connection of students and families to the school. As an example, the 2017 football season will have had 25 practices, a scrimmage, and three football games before the start of the football season. Other activities that will have already begun prior to the start of school include volleyball, cross country, marching/pep band, and the Fall musical production.
- History has shown us that students involved in these fall co-curricular activities are not vacationing once those activities start. This was one of the primary reasons for establishing a school start date on or after September 1st.

- Students and families are left to arrange transportation to and from these co-curricular activities that start prior to the September 1st start date. This expense and inconvenience would be diminished if our local school board regained control of our start date. Some students must act as caregivers to younger siblings, thereby making it difficult for those students to participate in co-curricular activities that begin prior to the September 1st start date.
- Starting before September 1 would allow schools to end the regular school year in May, providing additional flexibility and availability for districts to offer extended learning opportunities to students, and for staff to participate in additional professional development opportunities.
- A start date prior to September 1 would allow locally elected school boards and school staff to develop calendars that include natural breaks for students throughout the school year to promote increased student engagement and achievement. Additionally, this calendar would allow for additional staff development time to continue to grow and develop our staff members in the school district.
- Private schools, of which approximately 131,000 students attend in the state of Wisconsin, are not governed by this law and are allowed the flexibility to create their own school calendars. If the primary reasoning to start school after September 1 is revenue generation through tourism, you must realize that private school tourism tax dollars must be equally as important as public school tourism dollars.
- Rural school districts tend to experience more inclement weather days than urban and suburban school districts. Allowing school districts flexibility to set their own start dates would allow districts to create a calendar that effectively addresses issues associated with inclement weather days and other unexpected school closure dates.

Middle/High School Principal/Athletic Director Tripalin shared with the Board that he's hosting technology committee meetings to see how technology is being used in the District, he's also utilizing our own staff's knowledge to train others within the building in technology, and he has implemented a "Lunch Bunch" program to help high school students who have received a failing grade.

Business Manager Andrews updated the Board on the implementation of True Time, the electronic time sheet program, and how the pilot group is adapting to the new program and the future timeline for the other staff to begin using the program, he also shared with the Board the property walk-through results by the insurance company.

Superintendent Munson shared with the Board the District's report card and discussed plans to begin closing the gaps and areas that need improvement, discussed the state's 2017-18 budget proposal announcement and asked the Board to move the regular January Board meeting to January 26, 2017 due to a conflict with the State Education Convention.

Committee/Leadership Reports

Personnel Committee: The Fair Labors Standards Act implementing the proposed overtime and salary provisions were not implemented due to a federal stay on the issue.

The Buildings and Grounds Committee: FEMA projects are in stage 2 from the fall flooding. Before any large projects could begin we were required to submit samples for asbestos testing and all samples came back negative. Poellinger, Inc. was chosen for the lighting project. The exterior door project is expected to begin in the spring. A new 250kW diesel generator, which will run everything in the building at the same time except the air conditioning unit, will be installed by McCormick Electric.

The Board received electronic reports from the director of resource development and transportation supervisor.
