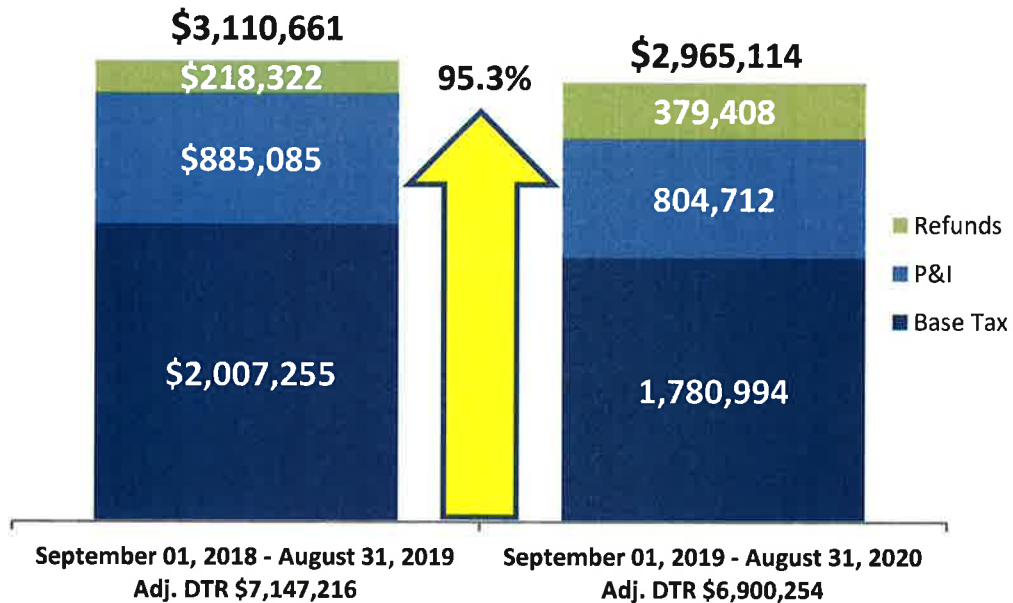
Tax Sale Activity

Scheduling of Property Sales

As properties are taken to judgment, they will be reviewed and checked for payment and/or payment agreements. Those judgments with no taxpayer response will be further reviewed and scheduled for possible tax sale.

Property Visits

Property inspections will be conducted on accounts owing 1 or 2 years of delinquency.

Execution of the work plan established for the Pharr-San Juan-Alamo Independent School District will include the constant monitoring of collection figures in order to adjust resources and enforce the collection of delinquent taxes. Our collection efforts will also include prosecuting pending suits to conclusion, mailing monthly letters, and filing new suits in order to maximize the collection of taxes. We will continue to work closely with you and your administrative staff to provide assistance and advice on all property tax matters, including changes in the law brought about by amendments to the Texas Property Tax Code.



Executive Summary

Demographics Summary: PSJA ISD houses students from three different cities, who come from similar backgrounds and way of life. The student body at PSJA ISD is 99.03% Hispanic, 89.60% Economically Disadvantaged and 70.00% at-risk. With the district's proximity to Mexico, 41.36% of the students are considered English learners (Els) with Spanish being the language spoken at home.

Comprehensive Needs Assessment Summary: The district's overall grade is based on performance in three different areas, or domains. PSJA ISD scored 87 out of 100 in overall performance. The Student Achievement domain shows how much students know and can do at the end of the school year, in which PSJA ISD scored 87. The School Progress domain shows how students perform over time and how that growth compares to similar schools. PSJA ISD scored 89 in School Progress. PSJA ISD scored 83 in the Closing Gaps domain which shows how well different populations of students in a district are performing.

Executive Summary - Continue

Curriculum and Instruction and Assessment: PSJA ISD Curriculum & Instruction office oversees implementation of a TEKS aligned curriculum, that is relevant, rigorous and engaging for all PSJA ISD students. 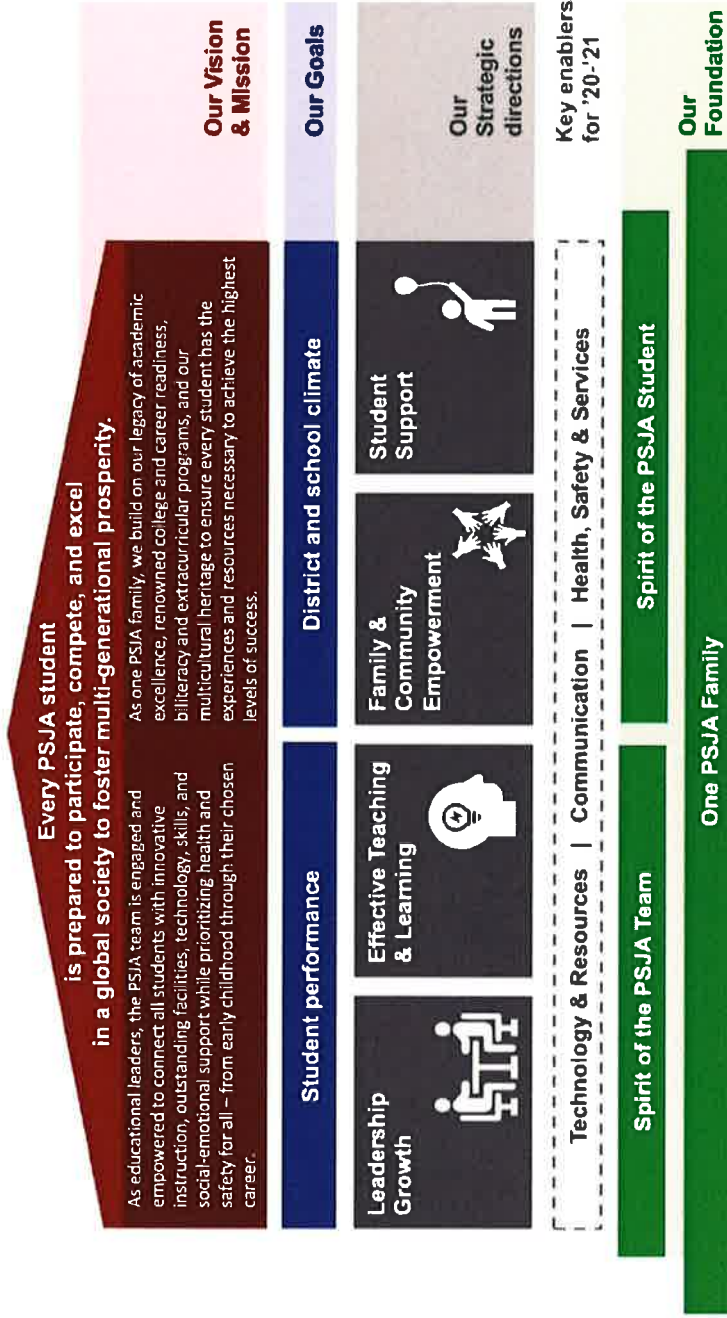
