High School Esports Frequently Asked Questions

What is esports? *An umbrella definition, “competitive video games,” but if you talk to scholar gamers it is so much more. **Valuable Resources: www.WIHSEA.org, <https://www.taoesports.com/podcast/>, [CESA10 Esports Support Site](#)(<https://sites.google.com/cesa10.org/esports>)***

What is a scholar gamer? *As esports becomes more mainstream and more nongamer audiences start to take a look inside esports it is hard to determine what to call the competitors. Are they athletes? Maybe not to the traditional definition, but they sure are competitors. As the Wisconsin High School Esports Association (WIHSEA) takes shape we are adopting the term scholar gamer. Our scholar gamers focus on academics first (follow your schools athletic code). Grades matter, but so does being a health citizen, so we focus on healthy diet, sleep habits, and exercise. Really trying to break down the negative stigma that is gaming.*

What does it look like? *Students will compete against other high schools of similar size. Using the computers and systems within your school building the scholar gamers will connect virtually with their schedule opponent for the week.*

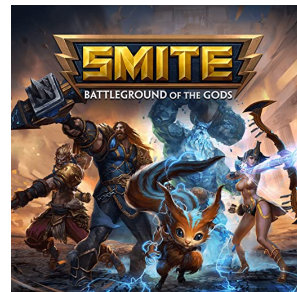
There are two seasons. Fall Season (Overwatch and Smash Bros Ultimate) and a Spring Season (SMITE & Rocket League). Each season runs 8 weeks, with a 9th for make-up games, followed by a tournament and rounding out with a state championship which is held in person. This year's fall championship will be held at Madison College (Jan. 22nd) and spring championship will be held at NTC (May 14th).

Your school can have one varsity team per title and as many JV teams per title. Your varsity team needs to be comprised of 9-12 grade students, however, your JV team can promote 6th, 7th, & 8th grade students.

Why is this important? *Change is inevitable. Right now the competitive culture is shifting from intense impact sports to virtual sports. Colleges are offering varying amounts in scholarships for their competitive esports teams. But, ultimately, it's for the students. Right now there is a group of students that go home after school, put on a headset and disappear. Unfilter, unmonitored, and unnoticed, these students are a part of something. Offering a varsity esports program brings students into your school culture and accepts them for who they are and what their true passions are. Some of these students want to showcase their talents, represent themselves and their community, show pride in their school just like a "traditional sport competitor" wants to do. Even if it is one student, isn't it worth lifting them up to their true potential?*

Is there a coach? *Each program is a little different. There are general manager roles and coaching roles. Sometimes your general manager may be your coach as well. Ideally the adult (coach/GM) is responsible for establishing a regimented practice, communicating with the other schools in preparation for competition, monitoring the competition to uphold the so very important sportsmanship expectations, and reporting match results. As your school accepts this as a legitimate sport, this should be a paid coaching position just like your traditional sports.*

What games will be used? *Like mentioned before we will be using Overwatch (ESRB Rating T for Teens) and Smash Bros Ultimate (ESRB Rating E for Everyone) for our fall season. SMITE (ESRB Rating T for teens) and Rocket League (ESRB Rating E for everyone). These games have been chosen because they have the greatest collegiate potential and they are tried and true professional games. They are not "fad" games in which they are popular and will die out, they have been around for quite some time. They also promote the multilevel transferable skill sets we hope all students will acquire and graduate high school with.*



What is the Wisconsin High School Esports Association? *6 years ago, several school teachers wanted to create a platform in which their students could be recognized for their talents. We started with just 7 schools, and over the 6 years we have grown to represent 70+ different high schools going into the fall and spring seasons (2021-2022). WIHSEA is a nonprofit association, which governs, supports and promotes the growth of high school esports through community development, advocacy, equitable participation, and interscholastic competition to enrich the educational experience.*

How much will it cost? Initial cost is minimal. Your school probably already has devices that run the games. Most of your scholar gamers will already have accounts. Since we are all about equitable play, we suggest you purchase a few gaming licenses for Overwatch. Overwatch runs about \$20-\$30 per game (you would need 6) and Rocket League and SMITE are free. Smash Bros is on Nintendo Switch, the costs here can be mitigated by using student devices if need be.

When do we compete? Competitions for all games start at 4pm on the designated nights of play. Most matches will conclude in about an hour and a half or less. Timing is really dependent upon the level of competition between the two teams. Varsity matches run Tuesday/Wednesday and JV matches will run Monday/Thursday. Friday can be used for makeup time.

Title Ratings? Our titles are chosen for a variety of reasons, but one is appropriateness of content for the age. Our games are rated E for Everyone or T for Teen. For a deeper look into the title rating system, please visit ESRB rating website (esrb.org).



Everyone

Content is generally suitable for all ages. May contain minimal cartoon, fantasy or mild violence and/or infrequent use of mild language.



Teen

Content is generally suitable for ages 13 and up. May contain violence, suggestive themes, crude humor, minimal blood, simulated gambling and/or infrequent use of strong language.

Band Appreciation:

In this course students will explore and learn about music theory, composition, and musical styles! we will dive into movie music and try to answer the "Why?" in music!

This course will give students the opportunity to learn more about music without having to be in band or play an instrument. It will also help the students who are already in band to become even better musicians.

Budget:

Possible technology/music writing software needs

Arts & Crafts:

In this class we will explore your untraditional arts and crafts. Things you would not normally do in any current K-12 art class offered. Some examples I am thinking of (home décor, fashion design, DIY projects, needle felting, quilling)

This course is for the student that does not think they would be good at art but wants to try something new.

Budget:

I would need to add supplies for projects into my yearly budget. Just like any other class I offer.

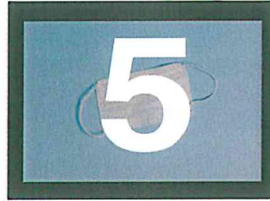

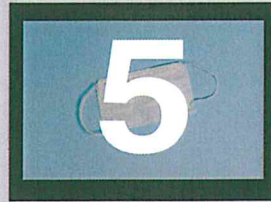

Do Not Need to Quarantine If:

- Vaccinated with Pfizer:
 - Completion of the 2 dose primary series within the last 5 months.
 - Completion of the 2 dose primary series, and it has been 2 full weeks since receiving a booster.
 - Completion of the 2 dose primary series for those aged 5-11.
- Vaccinated with Moderna:
 - Completion of the 2 dose primary series within the last 6 months.
 - Completion of the 2 dose primary series, and it has been 2 full weeks since receiving a booster.
- Vaccinated with Johnson & Johnson (Janssen):
 - Completion of the 1 dose primary series within the last 2 months.
 - Completion of the 1 dose primary series, and it has been 2 full weeks since receiving a booster.

Please review these forms and discuss them with your personnel responsible for maintenance, or the contractor who provides student transportation for your school. The State Patrol is statutorily required to inspect all school buses annually.

When reviewing the forms, please especially note any violations in the “OOS” column. These violations place the bus out of service until repaired. This also results in the vehicle being “disapproved” for service as marked on the lower portion of the form. The State Patrol and Wisconsin School Bus Association have agreed upon certain violations that place a school bus out of service. If you are noticing a high frequency of out of service buses please follow up with your maintenance personnel or contractor to see what steps are being taken to reduce the number of vehicles being placed out of service.

All defects noted on the inspection reports have been corrected at this time. School buses continue to be the safest way for students to be transported, with countless statistics to support this fact. With continued diligence to inspections and repair this trend can continue. The Department of Public Instruction (department), Division for Learning Support (DLS), is responsible for ensuring local educational agency (LEA) compliance with state and federal special education requirements. The department's oversight responsibility is explicitly defined in 20 USC 1212(a)(11)(A)(i) and s. 115.762 (3)(g), Wis. Stats. Through its general supervision system, the department identifies LEA noncompliance with special education requirements and ensures correction.

Thank you for submitting the report of your LEA's *Reading Drives Achievement: Procedural Compliance Self-Assessment (RDA:PCSA)*. Department staff reviewed the report and determined it is complete. We appreciate the effort you and your staff have taken in completing this portion of the *RDA:PCSA* process. The next part of the process is ensuring the identified noncompliance is corrected and activities are undertaken to ensure future compliance. The U.S. Department of Education, Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP), requires any identified noncompliance be corrected as soon as possible and no later than one year after the LEA receives notification of the noncompliance. Consequently, the department must ensure all noncompliance identified during the *RDA:PCSA* is corrected no later than one year from the date of this letter. In order to meet this requirement, the department requires all student-specific noncompliance to be corrected by **January 15, 2022**, and verification of current compliance is completed by **November 1, 2022**. This will allow the department sufficient time to provide technical assistance, if needed, and verify correction by December 15, 2022.

As part of the *RDA:PCSA*, your LEA identified noncompliance with state and federal special education requirements. The enclosed *Self-Assessment* report identifies the noncompliance identified for your LEA. Please refer to the *RDA:PCSA* report for information on the required corrective actions. Student-level errors should be corrected as soon as possible, but no later than **January 15, 2022**. For all noncompliance, the public agency must also take steps to ensure current compliance. To ensure current compliance with requirements, the district must review and revise, if necessary, its systems of internal control. An internal control system is a set of practices designed to detect and correct noncompliance. It may include a review of records by the special education director or designee, the establishment of a tracking system to identify noncompliance,

or other activities to ensure compliance. Please maintain documentation of activities taken to ensure current compliance (e.g., type of action, who were the recipients of the action, when was the action taken, and what was the result of taking the action).

An assurance that all student specific noncompliance has been corrected and your LEA is taking steps to ensure current compliance is due **January 15, 2022**. The assurance is submitted through the RDA:PCSA application in the Special Education Web Portal. More information will be provided to your LEA regarding activities to verify the correction of noncompliance by department staff in early February 2022.

Thank you for your continued efforts in completing the *Self-Assessment* process. It is our hope this process proves to be valuable and supportive of your efforts to properly implement state and federal special education requirements. 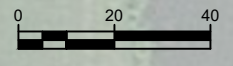
