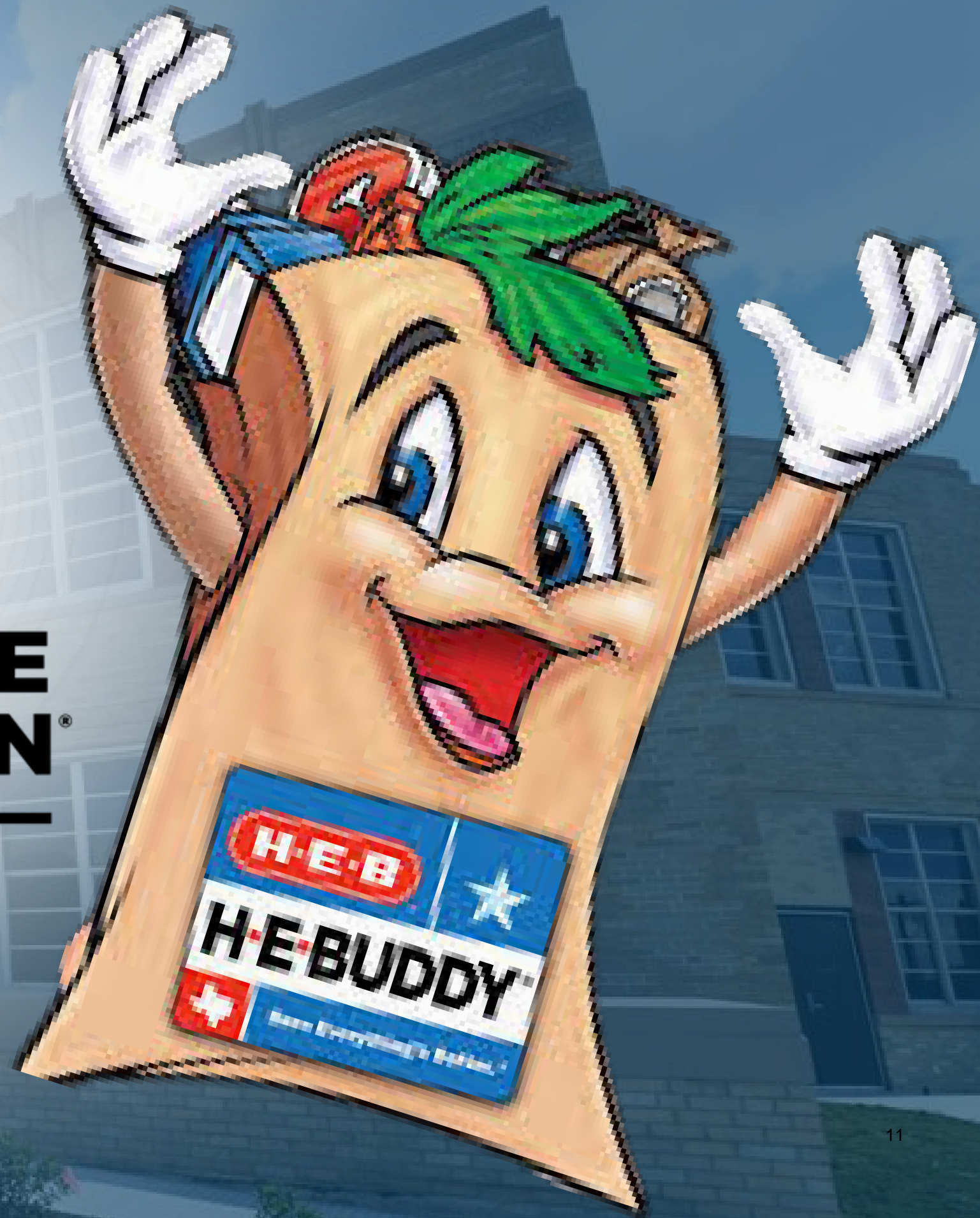

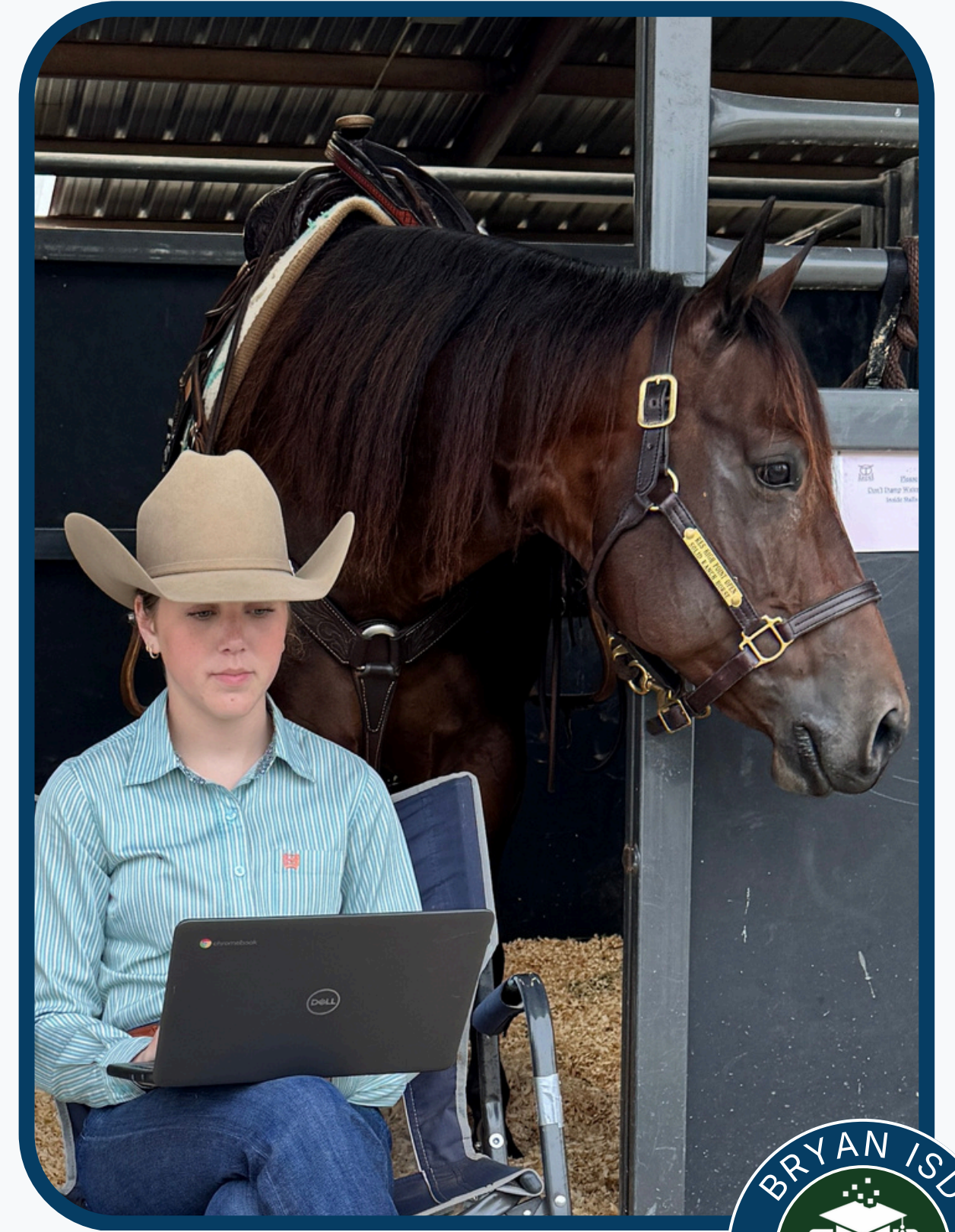

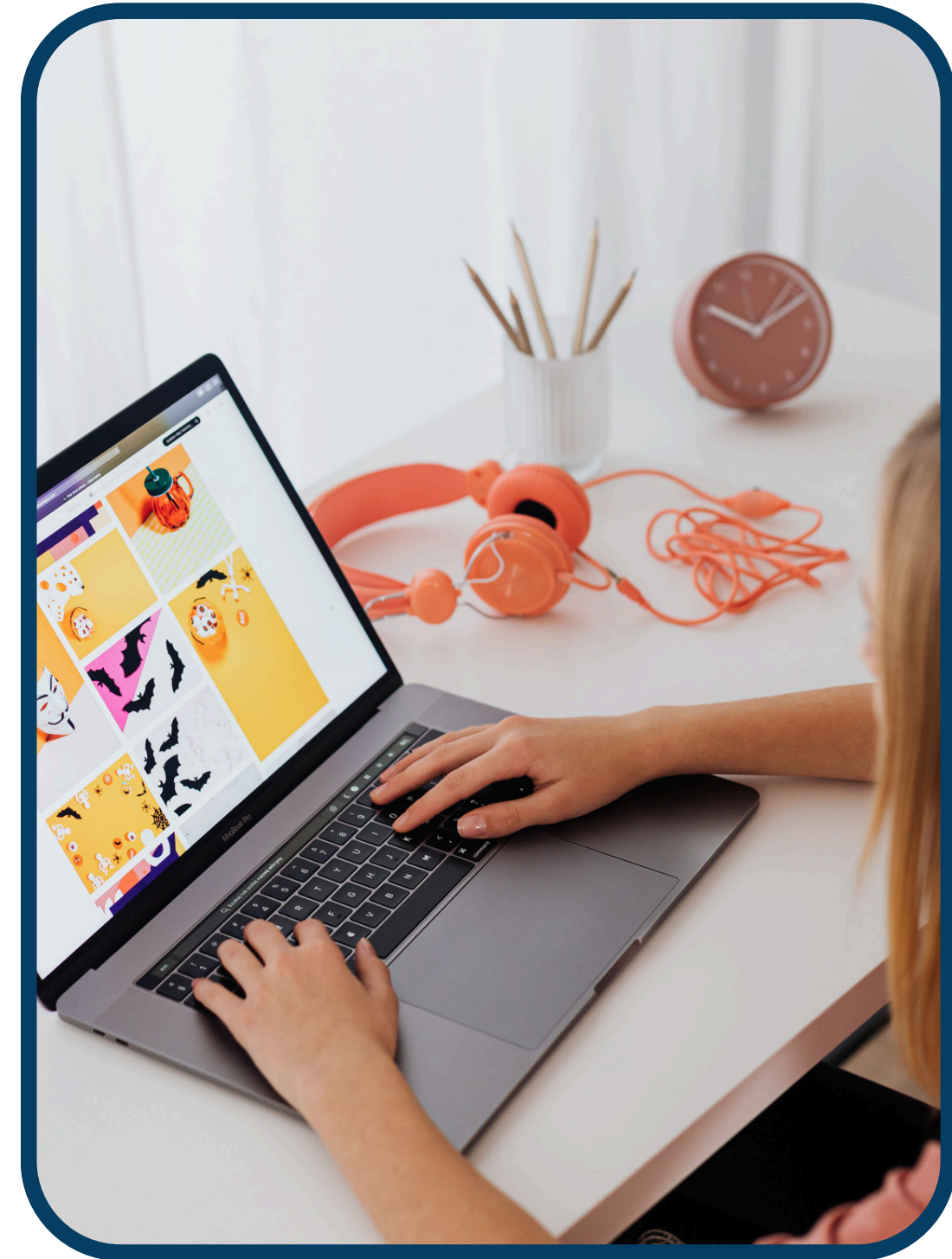

SUPPORTING STUDENTS

Connections Learning Progress Monitoring

Students identified as needing additional academic support based on grades, participation, or progress may receive a phone call or email every 1–2 weeks with helpful tips, resources, and invitations to meet with staff. Parent access to grades and teacher communication.

Students who continue to need support for several weeks will receive a personalized success plan that may include:

- Teacher support time

EXTRACURRICULAR PARTICIPATION

- UIL Athletics, Academics & Fine Arts
 - Bryan ISD (zoned) students remain UIL eligible through their home campus; UIL allows virtual/hybrid students to participate at their school of residence, as long as eligibility requirements are met.
 - Out-of-District: students must follow UIL guidelines for participation.

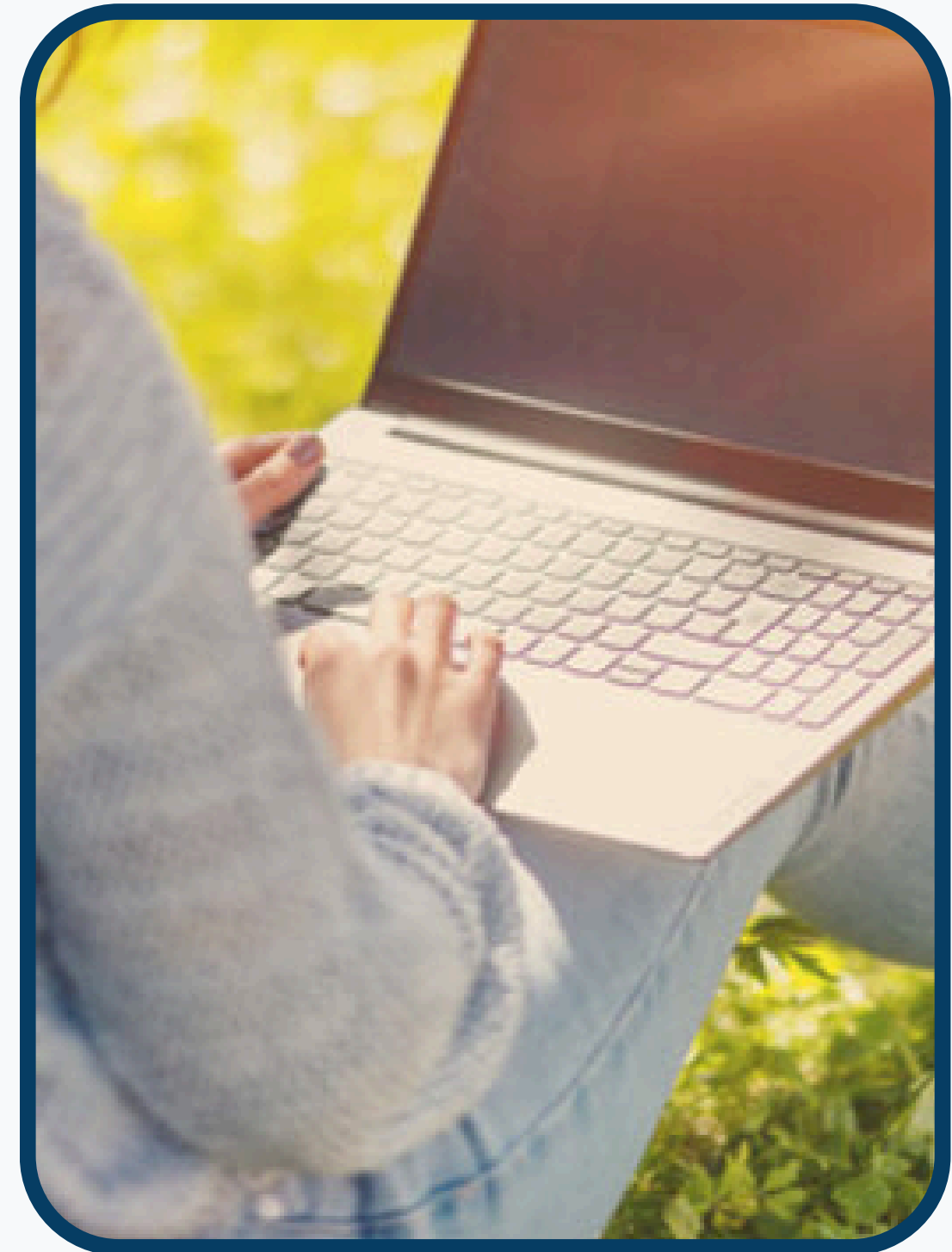


FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

Access to all Bryan ISD Family Engagement Activities & Events

Online Partnership with Parents

- Parent Observer role allows parents/guardians to monitor student progress, grades, attendance, and activity. Observers can view course content, upcoming to-do lists, and teacher communication without directly interacting in the course.
- Gradebook Access: Track grades, badges, and objective mastery
- Progress Monitoring: Review student activity and attendance
- Daily Focus: View announcements, to-do lists, and course content
- Access WebMail and message boards to connect with teachers
- Family Orientation
 - Beginning-of-year orientation provided in partnership with the district that walks parents and students through the platform, how to use it, and how to get assistance. Also connecting them to campus and district resources.

Understanding General Fund, Fund Balance



How We Plan Today for a Stronger Tomorrow

The General Fund is the district's primary operating fund. At the end of each fiscal year, revenues may exceed expenditures, creating a fund balance. This fund balance is not "extra money" - it is a financial tool that helps us manage resources responsibly and prepare for future needs.

What is Fund Balance?

REVENUES	EXPENDITURES	FUND BALANCE
Total Money Received	Total Money Spent	Remaining Resources (surplus or deficit)

Fund balance is the district's remaining resources after all **(revenues minus expenditures)** over the course of a fiscal year

How TEA Rates Fund Balance: Financial Stability

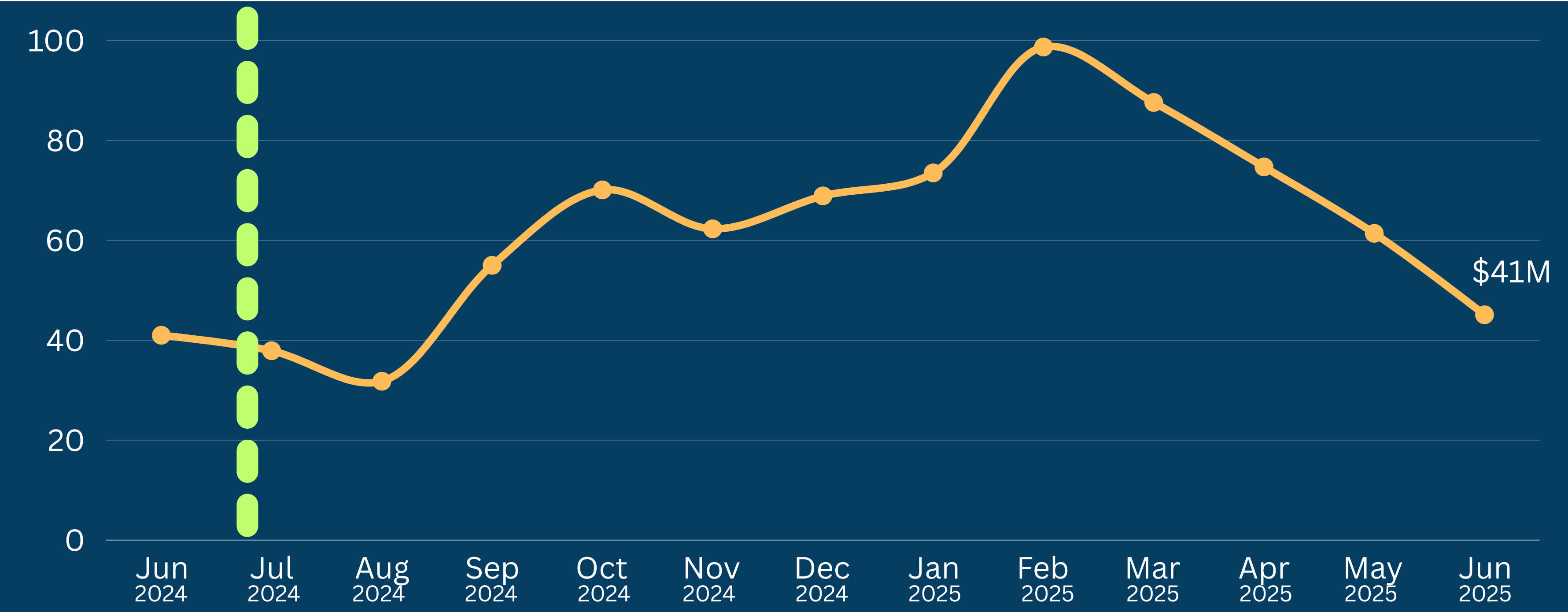

Fund balance fluctuates throughout the year as revenues are received and expenditures are incurred. The June 30 balance reflects the district's final fiscal year position after all revenues and expenditures are recorded.



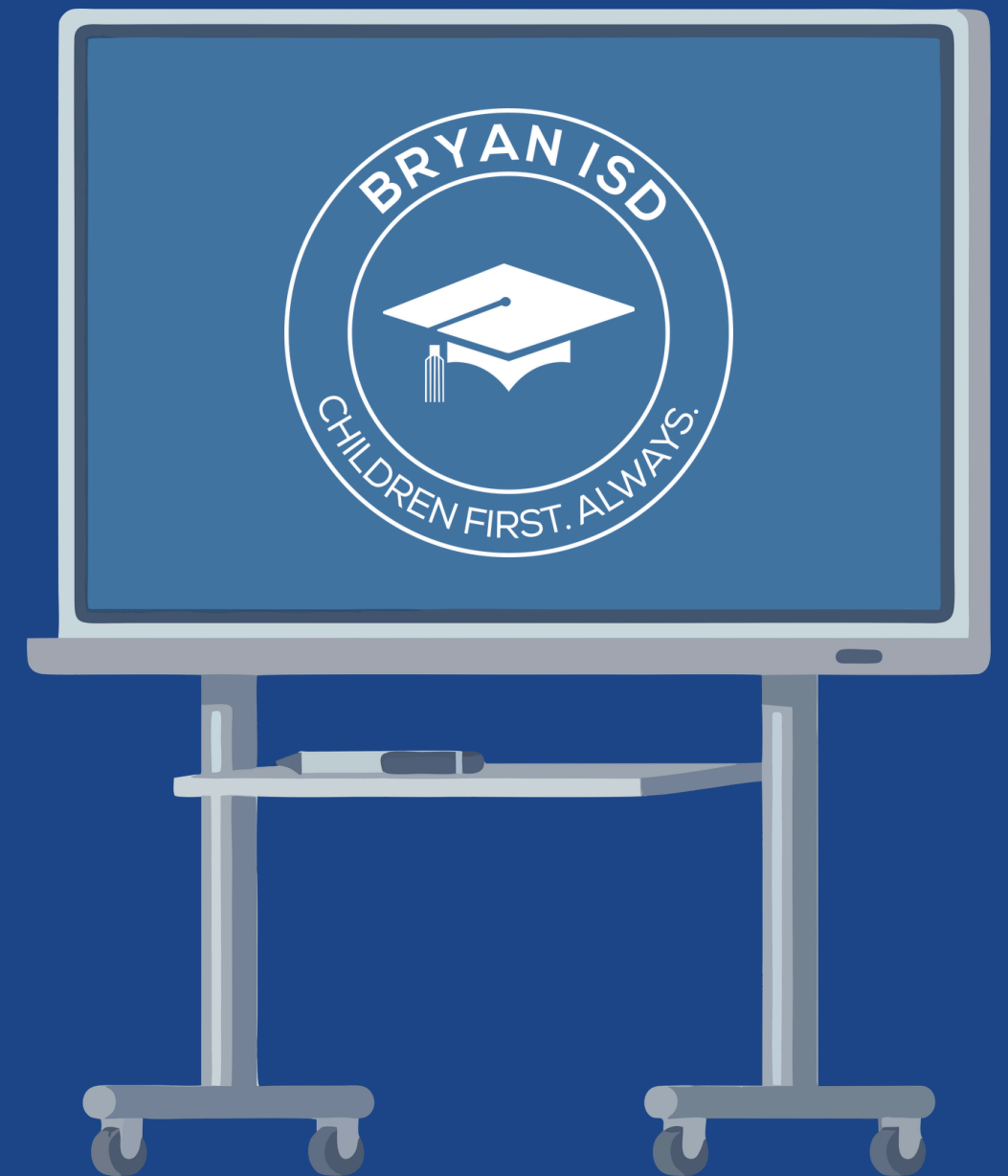

RESOLUTION TO CONDUCT A VOLUNTARY EFFICIENCY AUDIT

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of [NAME] Independent School District (the “District”) is committed to the responsible stewardship of public resources and continuous improvement in the delivery of educational services; and,

WHEREAS, the Board desires to evaluate the District’s operations, programs, and resource allocation to identify opportunities for increased efficiency and effectiveness; and,

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that obtaining an independent efficiency audit will assist in informing future planning, budgeting, and policy decisions; and,

WHEREAS, Texas Education Code Section 11.184 establishes certain requirements for efficiency audits in connection with a voter-approval tax rate election (“VATRE”); and,

WHEREAS, the Board desires that the efficiency audit be conducted in a manner generally consistent with applicable guidelines so that the audit may be available for lawful use if needed in the future;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE [NAME] INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. The Board hereby authorizes the conduct of a voluntary efficiency audit of the District’s operations for governance, planning, and financial management purposes.

SECTION 2. The Board selects MoakCasey, LLC to conduct the efficiency audit. The audit shall be conducted in compliance with the guidelines established by the Legislative Budget Board and in a manner intended to satisfy the requirements of Texas Education Code Section 11.184, to the extent applicable.

SECTION 3. The Board intends that the selection of the auditor and the conduct of the efficiency audit be carried out in a manner that preserves the District’s ability to comply with the requirements of Texas Education Code Section 11.184 in the event a voter-approval tax rate election is subsequently ordered, including any applicable timing requirements.

SECTION 4. The Superintendent or designee is directed to coordinate with the selected auditor to ensure that the scope, methodology, and reporting of the efficiency audit are consistent with the standards and guidelines established by the Legislative Budget Board.

SECTION 5. The efficiency audit shall include a review of the District’s major operational and instructional areas, resource allocation, staffing, and financial management practices, together with any additional components required under applicable law or guidance, so that the audit may be used for statutory purposes if needed.

SECTION 6. The District shall provide documents, records, and personnel reasonably necessary to facilitate completion of the audit in an efficient manner.

SECTION 7. The Superintendent or designee is authorized to take such actions as may be necessary to ensure that all documentation, workpapers, and final reports associated with the efficiency audit are maintained in a manner that supports public posting and legal compliance in the event such requirements become applicable.

SECTION 8. Upon completion of the efficiency audit, the results shall be presented to the Board of Trustees. The District shall retain the audit and make it available in accordance with applicable law, including any public posting requirements that may arise if a voter-approval tax rate election is subsequently ordered.

SECTION 9. Adoption of this Resolution does not constitute a decision by the Board to call a voter-approval tax rate election, and no such election shall be ordered except by subsequent Board action.

SECTION 10. The District shall comply with all applicable legal requirements in the event a voter-approval tax rate election is subsequently ordered.

SECTION 11. The Board hereby finds that conducting the efficiency audit at this time serves a valid public purpose in supporting transparency, accountability, and long-term financial planning, independent of any future decision regarding a voter-approval tax rate election.
