Hayden Days – Community Engagement: Review and Select Photos for Boards: Chair Eichelberger discussed the Hayden Days display boards with the Commission. She confirmed the board size with Director Phillips and explained that the boards will be used to engage the community and gather feedback on architectural styles for the City of Hayden. The display will feature photos of residential and commercial buildings, allowing community members to identify which styles they believe best reflect Hayden's unique sense of place.

Discussion continued about the photos, and how they will incorporate sticker dots for members of the community to vote. Commissioner Eichelberger said there are more photos on another thumb drive as well that Commissioner Storm can use while putting the boards together.

Director Phillips mentioned that a board like this/a survey like this has already been done. She asked whether the purpose of the board is to understand what the community wants to preserve or to gather input on what residents would like the city to look like in the future. She also noted that many of the photos in the slideshow are not from Hayden and suggested that using images that are not locally recognizable which could help reduce bias in the survey results.

Discussion between the commission continued about using photos of buildings that could be more "preservable" or come from a more historical perspective.

The commission discussed rescheduling the next meeting from July 9<sup>th</sup> to July 13<sup>th</sup>, 2026, at 11 am. They continued by saying the verbiage on the boards will read something along the lines of “What is the story of Hayden” or “What advances the story of Hayden.”

Vice-Chair Brizee mentioned that if people ask why the commission is doing this survey, they can respond by saying to find out what buildings are significant to the community and the information provides helpful information to the Historic Commission and allows for grants for historical buildings.

Chair Eichelberger went on to talk about when the Kootenai County Historic Preservation Commission did a fact gathering survey prior to the Garden District Neighborhood Designation. She stated that SHPO has a survey of historical structures registration which she believes comes before doing a community survey.

Vice-Chair Brizee mentioned that in order to get a grant for a historical register survey, that there needs to be community input or survey prior to that.

Discussion continued about this, and Chair Eichelberger said that when SHPO came to visit the City of Hayden, they said we didn’t qualify for a historical district but encouraged the city to do the registry, and the surveys next.

Director Phillips stated that when SHPO visited, they recommended that City staff and the HPC evaluate buildings throughout the city to determine whether they have historical significance. Based on those findings, SHPO recommended conducting a survey of areas containing historically significant properties.

Chair Eichelberger stated that the next steps are to send the photos over to Commissioner Storm, so that he can gather them, and narrow them down for the July 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. Commissioner Storm requested to have all of the photos by July 6<sup>th</sup>. It was determined that only six or eight photos will fit on each board for Hayden Days.

Public Comments from Members of the Commission:

The Commission discussed the process for submitting public comments, the role of the HPC in public hearings, and how the Commission can make recommendations on matters such as demolition permits for historically significant structures. Director Phillips stated that because of the Commission's involvement in upcoming public hearings, it has achieved positive outcomes in the past, including the installation of two historical markers on properties the Commission determined to have historical significance.

Director Phillips stated that the liaisons for all commissions communicate and collaborate when they wish to work together on specific projects. Commission members serve as representatives of the City and should remain mindful of how their words and actions are perceived. When making public comments, members should remember that they are speaking in their capacity as representatives of the Commission and the City.

Protocol for publications of announcements, articles, etc. to the website and/or various media platforms:

Ms. Phillips stated that general service announcements need to provide general information about how, who, what, when, where, and why for whatever is being announced to the public.

Ms. Phillips went on to discuss the HHPC Awards process, and how the commission can improve the timeline for next year. The commission recognizes that they needed

more time to research. Specifically mentioned the winner of this year's award which was the Armory Depot. Commissioner Budvarson is going to research this building and create a timeline/backstory so that a more detailed social media post can be created. For next year the commission mentioned having the applications open earlier, possibly around December this year.

**NEW BUSINESS ACTION ITEM**

Tom Richards – Dike Road History:

Ms. Phillips stated that she met with Tom Richards, and he has a presentation about Dike Rd that he would like to present to the commission, and it will be recorded as well if the commission would like to have him do so.

Commissioner Budvarson made a motion to have Tom Richards attend one of the next HPC meetings with his presentation about Dike Rd, and to have this meeting recorded by City staff as well.
