1. CALL TO ORDER

M. Walters called the meeting to order at 6:49 p.m. The roll was called and a quorum was present.

2. CONSENT AGENDA

2. A. Approval of Minutes – Curriculum Committee – October 23, 2018

3. OLD BUSINESS

3. A. Academic Reviews - Update

Ms. Stacey McCann, Chief Academic Officer, presented updated information to the Curriculum Committee on the Academic Review process.

This is the second year of implementation for the Academic Review Model. Ms. McCann shared sample Academic Reviews schedules for each school. The review session is about 25 minutes per teacher and is an opportunity to dive into individual student portfolios. The student portfolios contain multiple work samples including performance tasks, assessments, homework and classwork.

Dr. Thompson noted that the Academic Review Model was shared at the Literacy Leadership Institute in June 2018. The team provided a presentation, modeled an Academic Review and then had each district go through their own mock review process. The feedback from other districts was positive.
