1. CALL TO ORDER

D. Harris called the meeting to order at 6:12 p.m. The roll was called and a quorum was present.

2. CONSENT AGENDA

2. A. Approval of Minutes – Policy Committee Meeting – September 30, 2021

A motion was made by H. Frydman and seconded by D. Harris for the Policy Committee to approve the minutes from the September 30, 2021 meeting, as presented.

The motion passed unanimously.

3. OLD BUSINESS

3. A. Policy for Second Reading

3.A.1. District Goals - 0200

Mr. William Guzman, Chief Operations Officer presented Policy 0200 – District Goals to the Committee for a second reading.

This policy was presented to the Policy Committee for an initial reading on September 30, 2021 and the full Board of Education on October 12, 2021.

The additional language a result of Public Act 19-58 which was an act promoting careers and manufacturing to public school students and establishment of a task force to study the demand of career and technical education. This is a mandated



policy to ensure school districts are offering students options to look at careers for those who do not want to pursue post-secondary education.

F. Bogle-Assegai recommended a percentage for number 6. of the stated goals: “To increase the percentage of students scoring at competitive levels on statewide assessments, in order to close the District's achievement gap.” Dr. Thompson stated we can include a numerical value in the goal.

She also inquired what the term “achievement gap” referred to. Dr. Thompson stated it is how the district students are doing relative to their counterparts in other district. It is also looking at referenced sub-groups.

This policy will go back to the policy committee for review.

4. A. Policy for an Initial Reading

4.A.1. Age of Attendance – 5112

4.A.2. Students Who are Homeless – 5118.1

Mr. William Guzman, Chief Operations Officer, presented policy 5112 – Age of Attendance

The additional language a result of Public Act 19-179 an act concerning homelessness and access to education. The added language authorizes a parent/guardian to request a written explanation for denial of access and rights to appeal a decision for denial of access to school.

A motion was made by H. Frydman and seconded by D. Harris to recommend to the Board of Education an initial reading of the policy 5112 – Age of Attendance.

The motion passed unanimously.
