4. Opening Statement

F. Bogle-Assegai, Board Secretary, welcomed all attendees. The purpose and process of the Board of Education meeting were stated.

5. Consent Agenda

A. Approval of Minutes – Regular Meeting – October 10, 2023

A motion was made by H. Frydman and seconded by F. Bogle-Assegai for the Bloomfield Board of Education approve the meeting minutes from the regular meeting on October 10, 2023, as presented.

The motion passed unanimously 7-0-0.

6. Presentations

A. Student Representative Report – Global Experience Magnet School

A student representative from Global Experience Magnet School (GEMS) shared a Power Point providing updates from the school. She shared information about the Active Learning program and the SEL Day and Talent Show. GEMS is now participating in athletic programs and SuitUp Business Competition in New York City. Upcoming events were also shared.

7. Public/PTO Comment

Gail Jorden, 102 Wolcott Hill Rd., Wethersfield, CT

Ms. Jorden spoke on behalf of the teachers from the Bloomfield Educators Association and welcomed the new Board of Education.

8. Superintendent's Report

A. Superintendent's Update

Dr. James Thompson, Jr. provided an update to the Board of Education members for the month of November. He welcomed Mr. Christopher Prescott, the district's School to Career Specialist. Dr. Thompson noted the district Climate Committee is sponsoring a district-wide food drive. He also recognized Niagara Bottling LLC for the generous donation to the district schools.

B. Financial Report – October 2023

Mr. William Guzman, Chief Operations Office reported on the financials as of November 10, 2023. He noted that 12.14% of the adopted budget has yet to be expended or encumbered.

Mr. Guzman noted on the one-page summary report, major account 01 Certified Salaries, is over-budget by \$184,491 as receivables have yet to be booked.

On page 1 of the six-page detail report, sub accounts 1110 – Salaries, Teachers, 1210 - Salaries, Professional Staff and 1240 – Salaries, Clerical are over budget as the district has yet to book receivables for special education out-of-district tuition.



T. Moore inquired about the district addressing the receivables to offset the over budget accounts. Bills for services are sent to districts and posted once payment is received.

F. Bogle-Assegai noted she was interested in receiving information on the use account (12) Textbooks/Library Books. She also asked about staffing for the ELL programs. Mr. Guzman noted there are paraprofessionals at each school and these are non-certified positions.

T. Grant-Mohammed asked for clarification on page 2 of 6 employee benefits. Mr. Guzman explained that Medical Insurance is a sub-account of the Benefits major account.

L. Easmon requested clarification on school librarians and how town librarians are utilized in the schools. Additionally, she requested information for the number of Special Education students over the last five years and the cost associated with special education services.

9. Old Business

A. Portrait of a Graduate Update

Anne Marie Cullinan, Curriculum Specialist, provided a high level overview of Bloomfield's Portrait of a Graduate initiative and strategic plan. She shared information relative to the adoption of the Portrait of a Graduate (POG), a timeline and implementation of the strategic plan.

Mrs. Cullinan noted that the POG plan is aligned to the district Plan of Excellence with four priority areas. Within each area, objectives were identified. Sub-committees were created to carry out the work of these objectives. Some recent actions as a result of the Portrait of a Graduate Strategic Plan is the creation of a Preschool Readiness Program at Laurel, the Talented and Gifted program known as SOAR, enhancing family-school partnerships, and using the climate survey to improve school culture.

K. Dunbar inquired about the SOAR program, and how student are selected. Mrs. Cullinan noted there are currently 98 participants and they are evaluated in grade 3 for grade 4 entrance. They use a variety of assessment tools including teacher recommendations. The Renzulli program is a whole school model. The SOAR teachers model lessons in classrooms and also provide professional development.

B. Policies for a Second Reading and Possible Adoption

i. Policy Regarding Possession Of Deadly Weapons Or Firearms – 1700

Mr. William Guzman, Chief Operations Officer, presented a second reading policy 1700 and is replacing the old policy. This policy was presented for a first reading to the Policy Committee on May 23, 2023 and October 24, 2023 and to the full Board of Education on June 6, 2023.



Mr. Guzman noted a revision from the first reading on page B, paragraph two, language was added to include a list of prohibited weapons, as suggested by Lynette Easmon at the Policy Committee meeting on May 23, 2023.

Mr. Guzman noted this new policy eliminates permission to have a firearm or weapons on school property for the purpose of accessing public or private lands for hunting (Section IV, C on the old policy). Mr. Guzman also noted this language was drafted by Board attorneys Shipman and Goodwin.

Mr. Guzman also noted the question by K. Dunbar at the committee meeting that “weapon facsimile” does include ghost guns and 3-D printed guns.

A motion was made by H. Frydman and seconded by F. Bogle-Assegai for the Board of Education to return Policy 1700 – Policy Regarding Possession of Deadly Weapons or Firearms to Policy Committee for review.

The motion passed unanimously 7-0-0.

ii. Minimum Duty-Free Lunch Periods For Teachers – 4113.12

Mr. William Guzman noted this policy is in compliance with Public Act 22-80 Section 14 that stipulates a duty free 30 minute lunch for certified staff. Mr. Guzman noted that our Bloomfield Education Association (BEA) contract already includes this provision.

A motion was made by H. Frydman and seconded by F. Bogle-Assegai for the Bloomfield Board of Education to adopt Policy 4113.12 – Minimum Duty-Free Lunch Periods for Teachers.

The motion passed unanimously 7-0-0.

10. New Business

A. Review and Possible Action on the Proposed 2024 Board of Education Meeting Schedule

Chair Lynette Easmon noted the proposed 2024 Board meeting schedule was shared with Board members prior to the meeting.

A motion was made by H. Frydman and seconded by F. Bogle-Assegai for the Bloomfield Board of Education to approve the 2024 Board of Education meeting schedule, as presented.

The motion passed unanimously 7-0-0.



11. CABA Updates

Ms. Lynette Easmon reminded the Board of Education members about the upcoming CABA/CAPSS Convention at the Mystic Marriott on November 17 and 18, 2023. She will be attending the Delegate Assembly on November 16, 2023.

12. Board Comments

L. Simone shared her appreciation for being elected to a four-year term and is very excited. She has had over 24 years of experience in education and currently serves as the Director of Alternative Education for ACES.

T. Moore congratulated the new Board members. He noted the Board has a big job ahead of them and they are in agreement that the students come first. Mr. Moore also noted they will be starting the Superintendent search and looks forward to receiving feedback from the community.

T. Grant-Mohammed stated she is excited and humbled to be elected to serve. She has 2 young children in the district. She is a mother and homeowner in the town of Bloomfield and she takes this responsibility seriously.

K. Dunbar extended her congratulations to Lynette Easmon for her election as Board Chair. She noted that Ms. Easmon has served as PTO Co-Chair, and in many leadership positions locally and statewide. She recently was honored by the state democratic party for her leadership. She also welcomed the newly elected Board of Education members and looks forward to working together.

F. Bogle-Assegai thanked the people of Bloomfield for her recently elected position. She had 5 children go through the Bloomfield school district. She has strong interest and commitment to education. She noted she is excited to see more parents and stakeholders in attendance at the meeting and noted the relationship between a good school system and the value of homes.

H. Frydman congratulated the new members of the Board of Education. He looks forward to a partnership with the town going forward with a collective vision to prepare Bloomfield students for the future. He wished all a happy Thanksgiving.

L. Easmon thanked everyone for the great honor as being elected to serve as Chair. She welcomed the new Board members. She also thanked Mr. Easmon for his support. She thanked the audience members for attending and wished all a wonderful Thanksgiving.
