Elementary (K-5)

- Student Issues will be used each week in the classroom. The Student Issue looks like a health magazine and is used as a periodical or informational text. At the end of the month, students take the Student Issue home and use them for family activities, discussions, and homework.
- Each K-5 grade level teacher will cover one lesson per week.
- Parents/Guardians will be given the option to opt-out their child from participating in lessons pertaining to human sexuality. Students opted-out of human sexuality will visit the grade level above or below their grade while their class covers the health topics related to human sexuality.

Middle School (6-8)

- Student Issues will be used each week in the classroom. The Student Issue looks like a health magazine and is used as a periodical or informational text. At the end of the month, students take the Student Issue home and use them for family activities, discussions, and homework.

- The PE teacher will cover one lesson per week.
- Parents/Guardians will be given the option to opt-out their child from participating in lessons pertaining to human sexuality. Students opted-out of human sexuality will be given a supervised space to work on their other classroom studies while their class covers the health topics related to human sexuality.

High School (9-12)

- Freshmen and Seniors (9th & 12th Grades) will each be required to take 0.5 credit of health. Students will meet with a classroom teacher daily for 18 weeks during their freshman and senior years.
 - Freshmen will cover Chapters 1-7 of the text, Live Well Comprehensive High School Health, and seniors will cover Chapters 8-15.
 - Parents/Guardians will be given the option to opt-out their child from participating in lessons pertaining to human sexuality. Students opted-out of human sexuality will be given a supervised space to work on their other classroom studies while their class covers the health topics related to human sexuality.
