The following subjects may be topics for executive session as permitted by law: (1) matters the immediate knowledge of which would clearly have an adverse effect upon the finances of the District; (2) subjects that tend to prejudice the reputation and character

of any person, provided that the person may request a public discussion; (3) matters which by law, municipal charter, or ordinance are required to be confidential which includes, but is not limited to, confidential attorney/client communication. Action may not be taken in executive session except to give direction to an attorney on a specific legal matter or to a labor negotiator on pending labor negotiations. Motions to go into executive session should specify the subject of the proposed executive session without defeating the purpose of addressing the subject in private.

Subject: Request for Approval to Declare Surplus Property and Authorize Sale

Recommendation: Administration recommends that the Board declare the following district vehicles as surplus property and authorize the Superintendent or designee to sell or otherwise dispose of them in accordance with Board Policy BP 3270.

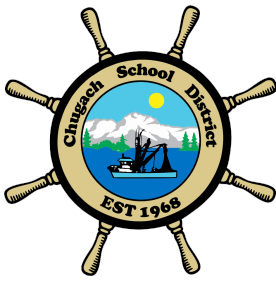
Background: District staff has evaluated the vehicles listed below and determined they are no longer needed [since the purchase of new vehicles](#). These vehicles have reached the end of their useful service for the District.

The following vehicles are recommended for declaration as surplus:

- 2015 Ford Transit Van – 150 Wagon (2)
- 2012 GMC Savana 1500
- 2010 Nissan Frontier
- 2015 Ford Fusion
- 2000 GMC Pickup

Board Policy BP 3270 – "The Superintendent or designee shall identify to the Board all inventoried personal property over \$5,000 not needed by the district, together with the estimated value and recommended disposition. With Board approval, the Superintendent or designee shall arrange for the sale or disposal of district personal property in accordance with state law."

Recommendation for Board Action: Move to declare the vehicles listed above as surplus property and authorize the Superintendent or designee to sell the vehicles in accordance with Board Policy BP 3270 and applicable Alaska law. Any proceeds from the sale will be deposited into the appropriate District account in accordance with District financial procedures.

2026/27 SCHOOL YEAR TEACHER'S CONTRACT

This contract is between the CHUGACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as the "DISTRICT", and, ALEXIS ROSENBERY hereinafter referred to as "TEACHER". The DISTRICT reserves the right to transfer the TEACHER to another assignment either before or after beginning duties of the proposed assignment.

WITNESSETH:

It is mutually agreed between the DISTRICT and the TEACHER in consideration of the promises and covenants herein contained;

THAT THE TEACHER WILL:

1. Perform the duties of TEACHER in the schools operated by the DISTRICT during the 2026-2027 school year, during the period between **July 1, 2026** and **June 30, 2027**, for a total of not less than 190 days at full time status, which shall include legal school holidays. Salary is based on BA+36, Step 10.

AND THAT THE DISTRICT WILL:

2. Pay a salary in accordance with the DISTRICT salary schedule. Salary for the 2026-2027 school year shall be \$380.87 per day or \$72,366 to be paid in 12 equal payments. Salary shall be subject to adjustment if the computation or placement is found to be in error.

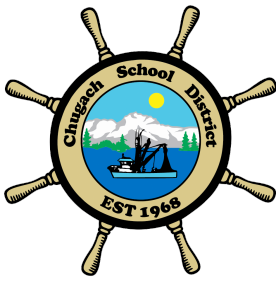
3. It is understood that the daily salary rate shall be paid for each day the school is approved for temporary or emergency closure by the Commissioner of Education provided that such payment under this paragraph shall be made only if the TEACHER was under contract at the time of closure.

AND THAT THE TEACHER AND THE DISTRICT AGREE TO BE BOUND BY THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

4. The term "TEACHER", as employed herein, is defined in AS 14.20.207 (1) and AS 14.20.350.

5. The TEACHER shall abide by terms and conditions set forth within any Teachers' Negotiated Agreement between the Chugach School District and PWSA that is effective during the term of this contract.

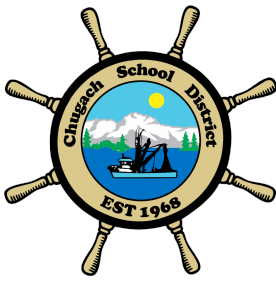

6. The TEACHER shall abide by the code of ethics and the professional teaching standards adopted by the Professional Teaching Practices Commission.
7. The TEACHER shall abide by the policy manual, policies established by the DISTRICT and the Procedures established by the DISTRICT's Superintendent.
8. The TEACHER shall abide by the Department of Education Regulations and Statutes of the State of Alaska.
9. The TEACHER prior to commencement of work must file with the DISTRICT a current medical certificate as and when required by Alaska Law and DISTRICT policy.
10. The TEACHER must hold a valid Alaska Teaching Certificate at the time of entrance on duty and maintain said certificate while employed with the DISTRICT. Expiration, suspension or revocation of said teaching certificate is grounds for immediate termination of employment without penalty to the DISTRICT.
11. This contract may be terminated without liability to the DISTRICT should the TEACHER fail to discharge the duties imposed either through incapacity or disability or for cause as defined in AS 14.20.170.
12. This contract may be terminated without liability to the DISTRICT should it become necessary to eliminate the position because of a decrease in enrollment or funds; provided that at least thirty (30) days prior written notice is given. In cases of hardship, the DISTRICT may, at its discretion, afford such compensation as it deems necessary, not to exceed payment for twenty (20) days of service at regular contract per diem rate.
13. The DISTRICT reserves the right to transfer the TEACHER to another assignment either before or after the TEACHER begins duties under this contract if enrollment decreases, funding is not available in the DISTRICT's budget or other conditions warrant change.
14. If this contract is terminated by the TEACHER without the written consent of the DISTRICT, the TEACHER shall forfeit as liquidated damages seven (7) days pay at the daily salary rate as set forth above. The parties recognize that it will be difficult to accurately assess or measure the costs to the DISTRICT of employing a replacement or rearranging existing personnel to fulfill TEACHER's duties. The parties agree that per diem for seven (7) days is a reasonable forecast of the costs the DISTRICT will incur in such event.

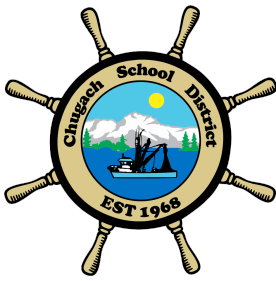

15. This contract may be terminated by mutual consent of both parties upon thirty (30) days written notice by either party and the written consent of the other party.
16. This contract creates no obligation on the DISTRICT to offer continuing employment to employees except as required under Alaska law.
17. The TEACHER authorizes The DISTRICT to make payroll deductions for Teachers' Retirement System, if TEACHER is eligible, and/or social security where applicable.
18. The TEACHER swears to the oath of allegiance as prescribed by AS 39.05.045.
19. The violation or breach by the TEACHER of any term, condition, or requirement of this contract shall be grounds for discipline, including, but not limited to termination of employment.
20. TEACHER specifically agrees that the point of hire of this contract is **FAIRBANKS, Alaska**. The DISTRICT shall not be obligated to provide return transportation for the TEACHER beyond Anchorage, Alaska pursuant to the provisions of AS 23.10.380. TEACHER waives any rights set forth in said Statute.
21. The DISTRICT may withhold the TEACHER's final paycheck pending submission of summaries, statistics documents, grades, school property or pending resolution of salary or compensation disputes. The TEACHER waives the right to be paid final payment within seventy-two (72) hours of termination as set forth in AS 23. 05.140.
22. This contract must be signed by the TEACHER and returned to the Superintendent to be received within thirty (30) days of receipt by the TEACHER or the offer of employment shall be null and void as provided under AS 14.20.145. This contract shall have no affect and shall not be binding on the DISTRICT unless, and until signed by two school board members as provided for below.
