Staff Introductions

Lexie Crawford, Lamar Lee, Courtney Brunetz, and Mark Reeves all gave an introduction of themselves.

Student Introductions

All present committee members gave an introduction of themselves consisting of Name, School, Grade for 2025-2026 school year, and TSSAA Athletic Participation.

STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE



The TSSAA announced the formation of its first ever Student Advisory Committee. The committee is composed of 20 student-athletes from member schools across the state and will meet for the first time in early May of this year.

There are six members from each grand division (East, Middle, West) and one unified pair. The committee members represent 12 TSSAA sanctioned sports, including three unified sports.

The committee will represent student-athletes and the TSSAA, ensuring their perspectives are heard in governance and addressing key issues such as rules, regulations, and special initiatives. Their mission is to advocate for students, enhance sportsmanship, and foster a safe, ethical, and competitive environment both on and off the field.

"We are excited to have a group that will have a recognized voice for the nearly 150,000 student-athletes that participate in TSSAA sanctioned sports," stated Mark Reeves, TSSAA Executive Director. "Ultimately, the organization's purpose is to

serve student-athletes by providing opportunities that will enable them to become the best version of themselves."

Discussion to form the committee began upon the retirement of Stephen Bargatze in 2022. Stephen was the coordinator of the Student Services Program, "The Right Team." This TSSAA program dealt with student leadership development, alcohol, tobacco and drug prevention education, and sportsmanship and citizenship education. Bargatze's retirement left a vacancy that needed to be filled.

After the addition of two new employees, Lamar Lee and Lexie Crawford, the ability to pursue the establishment of a Student Advisory Committee became more of a reality. Lexie and Lamar were eager to take part in forming the committee and will continue to play a significant role moving forward.

Guidelines for the committee were presented to the Board of Control for approval and schools were informed about the launching of the committee at

the beginning of the 2025 year.

The committee members will participate in multiple meetings throughout the upcoming school year. The committee members will give input regarding TSSAA rules and regulations and actively participate in TSSAA campaigns (Officials Appreciation, Mental Health, Bullying, Sports Medicine Appreciation, and Drinking & Driving.) They will be charged with promoting a positive image of student participation in interscholastic competition. They will also be given the opportunity to volunteer at state championship events throughout the school year.



**Region 2-AAA Basketball Tournament
District #3 & District #4**

Region Tournament Format for Region #2, District #3 & District #4

- Satellite the first round (**quarterfinals**) out to the higher seed for all first round games. #1 will host #4; #2 will host #3. Game time will be **7:00**.
- Satellite the **Semifinal** round out to the higher seed. Game times will be **6:00 & 7:30**.
- The region **finals** will be played at the site of the highest remaining seed. (#1 or #2) from District 3. If both #1 and #2 are eliminated, then the same format will be followed at the #1 and #2 from District 4. Game time will be **7:00**.
- In the event of a seeding tie between the remaining teams, the site will be determined by even/odd years that correspond with the district number. During the even years, District 4 will be considered the higher seed in the event of a tie. During odd years, District 3 will be considered the higher seed in the event of a tie.
 - The higher seeded team listed on the bracket is the home team and will wear the light-colored uniform. The lower seeded team listed is the visiting team and will wear the dark-colored uniform.

Division I Sectional Basketball Contests

Dates / Times / Sites - The Executive Director of TSSAA shall set the sectional site in the area of the regional winner. In order to be considered as a sectional site, the facility must meet the following seating criteria: Class 1A - 1,000; Class 2A - 1,000; Class 3A - 1,250; Class 4A - 1,500. These are to be permanent seats and based on 18" width. The girls' sectional game shall be Saturday, March 8, 2025 ~~at 7:00 p.m. local time.~~ The boys' sectional game shall be Monday, March 10, 2025, at ~~7:00 p.m. local time.~~ Sectional pairings and results will be posted on TSSAASports.com. All games shall be played at 7:00 p.m. local time unless mutually agreed upon by the administration of both schools to play at an earlier time.

Division II First Round / Quarterfinal Basketball Contests

Dates / Times / Sites - The Girls' First Round shall take place on February 25, 2025. The Boys' First Round shall take place on February 26, 2025. The Girls' Quarterfinals shall take place on February 28, 2025. The Boys' Quarterfinals shall take place on March 1, 2025. **Schools may mutually agree to play the first round and/or quarterfinal games from 3 P.M. - 7 P.M. local time.**

Division I Sectional Girls Volleyball Contests

Region winners and runners-up will meet in the Sectional on Thursday, October 17, 2024, at ~~7:00 p.m. local time.~~ All games shall be played at 7:00 p.m. local time unless mutually agreed upon by the administration of both schools to play at an earlier time. The contest shall take place at the regional winner's gymnasium. Sectional matches are listed below (Sectional pairings and results will be posted on the TSSAA Championship Website.):

- Site 1: Winner Region 1 vs. Second Region 2
- Site 2: Winner Region 2 vs. Second Region 1
- Site 3: Winner Region 3 vs. Second Region 4
- Site 4: Winner Region 4 vs. Second Region 3
- Site 5: Winner Region 5 vs. Second Region 6
- Site 6: Winner Region 6 vs. Second Region 5
- Site 7: Winner Region 7 vs. Second Region 8
- Site 8: Winner Region 8 vs. Second Region 7

For the purpose of the coin toss and scoreboard designation, the region winner is considered the home team. In addition, the region winner will select their team bench first and teams will not switch sides after each set. However, if there is an overhead obstruction within the playable area, or an issue with lighting or sunlight, teams will switch sides after each set.

Supplement #13

Division I State Girls' Volleyball Tournament Format

The state office has a recommendation for a change in the format and seeding of the Division I State Girls' Volleyball Tournament.

The staff is recommending that the bracket change from a modified double elimination bracket to a single elimination with a consolation bracket. The draw for the state tournament will be released following the completion of all sectional matches. Teams which qualify for the state tournament who placed in the top two in the previous year's state tournament, shall be drawn to the opposite sides of the bracket. The remaining teams shall be separated so that no team from the same region will be in the same side of the bracket.



Tennis Recommendations

Background:

The tennis committee met on August 24, 2024 and recommends the following changes:

1) Adjust the regulations from a full 3rd set to 3rd set Tiebreaker

Rationale:

Speeds up play especially when courts are limited, in line with other tournaments

Tennis Coaches were polled and there were 167 responses. **74.1% are in favor** of a 3rd set tiebreaker in lieu of a full third set with 25.9% against it.

2) Adjust the Division I Class AA format to 3 doubles, 6 singles

Rationale:

The schools play this format during the regular season and must adjust during postseason and eliminate players from the lineup.

The current format of 5 singles first followed by 2 doubles, devalues doubles tennis. The majority of these athletes will not play in college and as adults will play recreational tennis. According to google, 80% of adults play doubles tennis in recreational tennis.

Division I Class AA Tennis Coaches were polled and there were 73 responses. **74.1% are in favor** of changing the format to 3 doubles, 6 singles. **53.5% already play** the 3 doubles, 6 singles format during the school year.

The coaches that opposed the change are worried about court availability and time. According to our regulations, coaches have the freedom to adjust the format during the regular season to account for time and court availability.

1. Introduction

The Tennessee Secondary School Athletic Association (TSSAA) invites proposals from qualified communities and partners to host the Spring Fling State Championships for the years 2026 and 2027. This multi-sport event includes High School championships in Baseball, Softball, Soccer, Tennis, Track & Field, Lacrosse, and Girls Flag Football and Middle School championships in Baseball, Softball, Soccer, and Track & Field.

2. Spring Fling Reimagined

Since 1994, TSSAA has hosted a multi-sport, Olympic-style spring sport state championship in one host city. The city of Murfreesboro has served as the host city of the Spring Fling Championships since 2006, conducting championships in five different sports and utilizing 17 venues. The most recent agreement concluded with the 2025 championships and included a \$125,000 cash bid from the host city, in addition to 348 hotel room nights and 525 meals provided for the 5 sports. TSSAA in turn paid host sites a daily usage fee.

In recent years, TSSAA has expanded opportunities to its member schools with the addition of lacrosse, girls flag football, and the advent of state championships at the middle school level (baseball, softball, soccer, and track and field). As a result, we recognize that the ability to host all spring state championships in one city during the same week is no longer realistic and are seeking new alternatives that can provide the best state championship atmosphere for Tennessee student-athletes, while bringing all TSSAA spring championships under the “Spring Fling” name. This likely means splitting the championships into two weeks across more than one city. With this understanding, TSSAA is now accepting proposals for a two-year term for the 2026 and 2027 events. We ask that qualified candidates submit their best proposals for only the events and dates that their community is able to host.

3. Term of Agreement

The selected host(s) shall enter into an agreement for two years:

- 2026 Championships: Championship events shall take place between the 2-week period of May 11-23, 2026
 - 2027 Championships: Championship events shall take place between the 2-week period of May 17-29, 2027

4. Scope of Work

For all proposals, responsibilities will be shared between the host and TSSAA as indicated below. A willingness to collaborate with TSSAA on scheduling and logistics is implied.

The below is a statement from my perspective and investigation findings.

Game Date: 5/2/2025

Teams: Pigeon Forge vs Gibbs Varsity Lacrosse

Altercation Summary:

Approximately 6 minutes into the first quarter Gibbs was on a clear play when #34 Gibbs player passed ball and was hit by #69 Pigeon Forge. #34 retaliated with a swing to helmet of #69 and in response #69 swung lacrosse stick at #34's head twice before they exchanged punches. From this point the altercation was about to end until #33 (Gibbs) and #7 (PF) rushed in with #33 hitting #69 followed by #7 engaging with #33 on the ground. At this point numerous players were involved in the altercation (see video clips and below notes). Officials, players, and coaches separated players after altercation coaches and officials met and agreed to end game. Officials mentioned in the meeting that both benches cleared and after further investigation that was not accurate for Gibbs.

I would like to add that I feel the players that attempted to deescalate the situation should not serve suspensions.

My investigation findings show three main instigator's and/or participants in the altercation highlighted below in red.

This is in reference to the altercation that occurred during the boys' lacrosse game between Gibbs High School and Pigeon Forge High School on May 2, 2025. The Unusual Occurrence Report submitted by the officials states the following:

During the end of the 1st quarter (3:30 left) an off ball incident occurred on the single side sideline between two players. The incident was initiated by a push (off ball) by a Pigeon Forge (PF) player against a Gibbs player well after the ball had been advanced into the Gibbs offensive side. The incident escalated rapidly with multiple players from both sides involved in a scrum with multiple punches thrown (both sides) and multiple helmets ripped off. It rapidly devolved into a scrum of 5 to 10 players scuffling on the ground with coaches trying to remove and/or intervene. I was working trail on the far sideline and by the time I had removed my pad from my pocket to record numbers of players involved both sidelines had cleared. Matthew, a first year referee working as Umpire, was working the single side. He attempted to intervene and pull players off of one another (as did coaches) and as such was unable to report to me the numbers of players who were directly involved with punches being thrown or helmets being ripped off. Jim who was working lead, likewise could not give me numbers of players directly involved in the fight but concurred that when he had turned around to note any players leaving the bench area both benches were already emptied. The state office received reports from Gibbs High School and Pigeon Forge High School along with video footage of the incident. The Gibbs High School administration indicated they took the following steps to respond to this incident:

1. Mandatory parent/player meeting with school Athletic Director on May 5, 2025.
2. Team will implement and enforce a zero-tolerance policy for fighting.
3. This incident and consequences will be used as a visual training aid that will be reviewed with parents/players and coaching staff as part of preseason mandatory player/parent meeting.



We appreciate the administration's response to this incident. After considering all the facts, the case will be closed in the following manner:

1. The Gibbs High School boys' lacrosse program will be placed on restrictive probation for the 2025-26 school year. Article V, Section 4(3) of the TSSAA Constitution states:

Restrictive probation to an individual sport in an athletic program shall result in removal from the tournament series and a fine of \$1,000 annually.

2. In addition to the restrictive probation outlined for the 2025-26 school year, the Gibbs High School boys' lacrosse program will remain on probation for the 2026-27 school year. Article V, Section 4(1) of the TSSAA Constitution states:

Probation to an individual sport in an athletic program shall result in a fine of \$500.00 annually. (Schools who are on probation remain eligible for the postseason tournament series.)

3. Since all players from Gibbs High School were ejected from the contest and must serve a two-game suspension, the Gibbs High School boys' lacrosse program will only be allowed to schedule 15 regular season contests for the 2025-26 school year. The team already forfeited one contest on May 3, 2025, due to the ejections.

The fines outlined above are in addition to what has already been communicated by our office for players coming off the bench. If you would like to appeal this decision to the TSSAA Board of Control at its June meeting, please contact Lauren Jones at ljones@tssaa.org and she can make the necessary arrangements. If you would like to discuss this decision, I would gladly schedule a call with you at a time that is convenient for both of us.

The administration of Johnson County High School submitted a plan of corrective action in response to the incident to the state office on January 31, 2024. In addition to the mandatory minimum suspension of the students involved in the altercation and fines for players and fans entering the playing floor, the following corrective action has been implemented by the administration of Johnson County High School:

- Fans who entered the court have been suspended for one home basketball contest
- Re-education of team rules regarding sportsmanship to the basketball program
- Re-education of all TSSAA Sportsmanship Guidelines to our basketball program
- Implemented a Conflict Resolution Program with Coordinated School Health
- Conduct pre-game and halftime announcements regarding the expectations and appropriate behavior of spectators



TSSAA Executive Director and Board of Control,

The leadership team at the J. Frank White Academy requests to establish a cooperative agreement with Campbell County High School for the fall 2025 girls' soccer season. In particular, we are making this request on behalf of Nora Snodderly, a rising freshman at JFWA.

Nora's family resides in Campbell County. JFWA has a long-standing feeder pattern from Campbell County to the extent that we have provided a 24 seat shuttle-style bus to and from LaFollette for over 20 years. At any given time, 15-20 students ride this bus to JFWA, in addition several other families and students from Campbell County who drive themselves to JFWA's location on the campus of LMU in Harrogate, TN.

In the spring of last year, we made a strategic decision to add girls' volleyball and to drop girls soccer. The apparent interest in volleyball seemed to be growing while at the same time we had struggled to keep adequate roster numbers for girls' soccer. As a small school – we rank among the 10 smallest schools in TSSAA most years – we did not think we could offer both sports for our female athletes in the fall because we could not adequately fill both rosters at the same time.

Based on our limited experiences with volleyball last fall, we feel like we made the right decision. We saw 19 girls join the volleyball team, a number we never reached with girls' soccer. Most years, we felt good to have 12-13 girls on the soccer roster. One year, we played the entire season with 10 girls which as you know is one less than the full 11-person on-the-field squad allowed in soccer. We plan to continue to build the volleyball program and have no current plans to bring girls soccer back. Furthermore, as we were affiliate members of TSSAA last year – our final year of girls' soccer (fall 2023) – we have not participated in girls soccer as a full member of TSSAA since our prior stint as members, well over a decade ago.


Nora plays on some community youth soccer teams, and she has grown to love the sport. As she enters high school, the community youth soccer opportunities will not be available, and she would like to pursue her chosen sport at Campbell County while maintaining her enrollment at JFWA. Naturally, we would also support the inclusion/addition of other JFWA students to the cooperative agreement should any others want to pursue this opportunity.

JFWA has established and requested cooperative agreements with the two schools in our home county – Cumberland Gap High School and Claiborne High School. Based on recent conversations with the leadership at CGHS, however, they are only inclined to pursue the existing co-op in baseball. Furthermore, establishing a cooperative agreement with Claiborne High would present a hardship for Nora's family. CHS is located on the opposite side of the county, adding approximately an hour roundtrip for their commute to and from soccer practice. Since Nora is currently the only student interested in playing soccer via a co-op and since she lives in Campbell County, requesting this agreement with CCHS makes the most sense.

We have been in contact with the athletic director of CCHS, and they are also interested in establishing this cooperative agreement. It's my understanding that representatives of Campbell County may have already made inquiries about the possibility of this cooperative agreement.





 17 An FCIC/NCIC check of the vehicle VIN revealed it was not currently registered and there was no tag assigned. Derek stated he borrowed the NC
 18 tag from a friend so he could drive the vehicle until registering it. Based upon this information, Derek was arrested for driving on a suspended license
 19 with knowledge, driving an unregistered motor vehicle, and unlawfully attaching a tag not assigned. Deputies summoned C&S towing to remove the
 20 vehicle from the scene. Before releasing it to the wrecker driver, deputies completed an administrative inventory of the vehicle in accordance with
 21 agency policy. During the course of the inventory, deputies discovered a bag under the driver's seat with a white powder residue inside. Deputies
 22 tested the powder residue using a #22 Sirchie field test kit, which resulted in a presumptive positive for Oxycodone. Based upon the results of the

 25 The driver of the black Pontiac, Judith Bussiere (D2), exited her vehicle and deputies asked her to provide her license, registration and proof of
 26 insurance. Judith stated that the vehicle did not belong to her and that it was registered to her estranged husband. When Judith provided her driver's
 27 license, deputies observed that the picture on the license and the physical appearance of Judith was not the same. Deputies attempted to positively
 28 identify Judith by using Rapid ID, but received an error multiple times. A check of prior arrest photos and further questioning revealed the driver was
 29 truly Judith. While deputies were issuing Judith a citation for speeding, Deputy Matusick and her K9 partner arrived on scene. Deputy Matusick's K9
 30 conducted a sniff of the exterior of the Black Pontiac. Deputy Matusick advised the K9 indicated a positive alert for the odor of narcotics coming from
 31 inside the vehicle. See Deputy Matusick's supplement for further details.

 33 Based upon the K9 alert, deputies conducted a search of the vehicle and found Judith's purse on the driver's seat. Inside Judith's purse, deputies

 35 appearance with that of methamphetamine. One glass pipe was tested with a Sirchie #15 field test kit which resulted in a presumptive positive for

Ray Evans, who is some type of coach/faculty staff member @ Morristown West, was sitting directly across from the home bench on the front row and was coaching the Morristown West players and harassing my partner and I. He has a past history of these type actions so I warned him that we were not going to tolerate these illegal and improper actions. He continued so I had him removed from the gym by the home representative. He is considered a fan and not a coach in this situation which he does not understand and/or does not want to adhere to. Also, the crew chief for the varsity contest which followed allowed him to return. One of the varsity crew members told me that he harassed them also

Next, after the game I went to concessions for a drink and snack for the ride home. A fan immediately approached me and asked me about the game. I gave him an explanation and then he screamed at me "that's fucking wrong and what a fucking terrible call". I stepped back because I felt totally threatened. Next, I was conversing with a concession employee and he started screaming at me "you got a problem with me?" "you got a problem with me?" Both instances he was belligerent and outraged trying to instigate a fight by making threatening questions. The tone of his voice and the profanity he used showed he was completely out of control. My intuition and instincts told me that this fan was going to harm me. So, I initiated the confrontation not waiting to get hit first. My PTSD level went sky high and I went into attack mode because of the threat and harm level atmosphere. I have no doubt that he planned to meet and confront me after I left the gym. I felt stalked and very threatened by the tone of his voice, profanity, and body actions. I could see it in his eyes that he was raging and I was not going to let him harm me if I could help it. There was no security around and I truly believe he knew that so he could possibly take a cheap shot at me. Also, he was harassing me and my partner the whole game. I have seen this fan before in previous games this year and he sits opposite the scorer's table at the division line. All officials should be warned about both of these two individuals in future games. The fan is very dangerous and has an explosive temper. All officials should be escorted out which did not happen in my case! Greg Rawlings

() I waive my right to be tried only after being indicted by the Grand jury and waive my right to a trial by jury.

Attorney for Defendant Defendant

Tenn. R. Crim. P. 44 requires defendants to execute a written waiver of the right to counsel. However, the Court must also orally explain many rights, and the effect of a waiver of those rights, prior to accepting the defendant's waiver. See Tenn. R. Crim. P. 44(a); Smith v. State, 987 S.W.2d 871 (Tenn. Crim. App. 1998).

I plea GUILTY to violation of T.C.A._____. I have been advised by the Court of the following: (1) the nature of the charge(s) to which the plea is offered; (2) the mandatory minimum penalty provided by law, if any, and the maximum possible penalty provided by law; (3) if applicable, a different or additional punishment may result by reason of my prior conviction(s) or other factors which may be established in the present action after the entry of my plea; (4) if applicable, any prior convictions may be presented to the Court for its consideration in determining punishment; and (5) that I have the following rights: (a) to be prosecuted only upon an indictment or presentment; (b) to be represented by an attorney at every stage of the proceeding and, if necessary, to the appointment of an attorney; (c) to plea not guilty or to persist in that plea if it has already been made; (d) to be tried by a jury and to the assistance of an attorney at such a trial; (e) to confront and cross-examine witnesses against me; (f) not to be compelled to incriminate myself; (g) to have an appellate court review the basis of my conviction; and (h) to have a jury set any fine greater than \$50.00.

I understand that if I plea guilty I waive all of these rights, including my right to a trial. I understand that there will not be a trial of any kind. Pursuant to the terms of my plea agreement, there will not be a sentencing hearing. I understand that if I plea guilty I may be asked questions about the offense(s) to which I have pleaded, and if I answer these questions under oath, on the record, and in the presence of counsel, my answers may later be used against me in a prosecution for perjury or aggravated perjury. After carefully considering all of these matters, I voluntarily waive my rights and request that the Court accept my plea of GUILTY.

Attorney for Defendant Defendant

I addressed the defendant personally in open court, advised him/her of the rights itemized above, inquired into his/her understanding of the consequences of entering a guilty plea, and inquired into the accuracy of the plea. I hereby conclude that the defendant understands his/her rights, that the plea is voluntary and not the result of force or threats or of promises apart from a plea agreement, that there is a factual basis for the plea, and that the defendant's willingness to plead guilty results from prior discussions between the District Attorney General and the defendant or the defendant's attorney. I find that the plea of GUILTY heretofore entered by the defendant is acceptable and, therefore, accept the plea. The judgment and sentence shall reflect the disposition provided for in the plea agreement. If I am an immigrant, this conviction may affect my ability to stay in the United States or any chances of obtaining legal status in the future.

Our primary concern is that the deadline for district realignment has already passed, and we have finalized our basketball schedules for the 2025-26 season. This includes:

- Complete District 15 scheduling commitments
- Non-District game schedules
- Out-of-town tournament participation with signed contractual obligations

Adding Southwind High School to District 15 at this late stage would create significant disruptions to our carefully constructed schedules. Our coaching staff has invested considerable time in planning the upcoming season, and we have entered into binding contractual agreements with tournament organizers. Revising our schedules now would not only cause logistical complications but could potentially put us in breach of these existing contracts.
