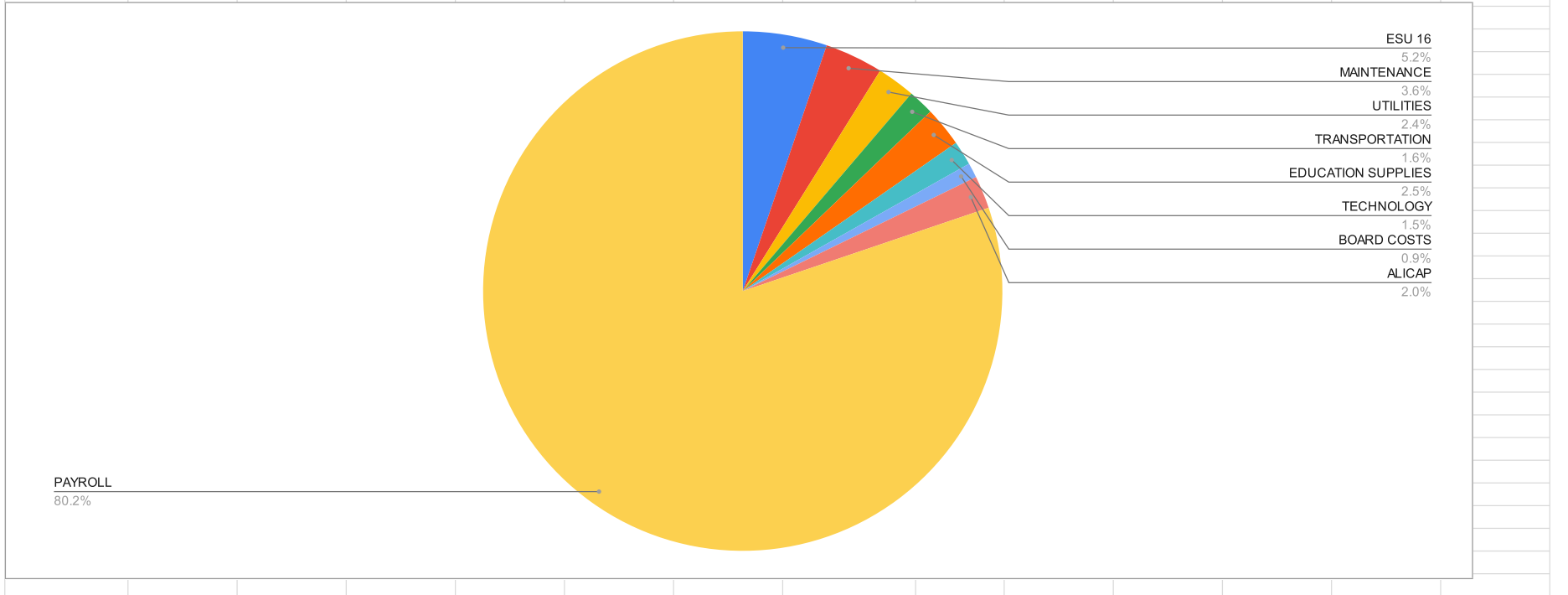

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

INSTRUCTIONS FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO WISH TO SPEAK:
This is the portion of the meeting when members of the public may speak to the board about matters of public concern.

- **Getting Started:** After signing in at the meeting, you will be recognized. When you have been recognized, please identify yourself, including an address and the name of any organization you represent. The board may waive the address requirement to protect the security of the individual.
- **Time Limit:** The board will generally allow a total of 30 minutes for the presentation of all public comments. Individuals may speak only one time, and must limit comments to around 5 minutes. If there are more than 6 individuals who wish to address the board, the 30 minutes will be divided equally between the number of speakers. These time limits may be changed by a majority vote of the board members in attendance to extend the time for a specific item or speaker.
- **Personnel or Student Topic:** If you are planning to speak about personnel or a student matter involving an individual, please understand that the district has a complaint policy and/or procedure to resolve such complaints and concerns. The Board requests that you follow the policy and procedures before addressing these matters with the Board. Board members will generally not respond to any questions you ask or comments about individual staff members or students.
- **General Rules:** This is a public meeting for the conduct of business. Comments from the audience while others are speaking will not be tolerated. Lewd, obscene, profane, slanderous, threatening and hostile conduct or statements and fighting words (words whose mere utterance entails a call to violence) will not be tolerated.
- **No Action by the Board:** The board will not act on any matter unless it is on the published agenda.

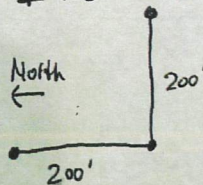

➤ **INDIVIDUAL RUNNING EVENTS:** The winner of first place and second place in each event will qualify for the state meet, plus the next SIX fastest times of the non-qualifiers, regardless of place in a finals event. There shall be a maximum of 24 qualifiers. If there is a tie for the last qualifying spot of the non-qualifiers, the tie will be broken by comparing the times to the thousandths.

➤ **RELAY EVENTS:** The winner of first place in each event will qualify for the state meet, plus the next SEVEN fastest times of the non-qualifiers, regardless of place in a finals event, with a maximum of 16 relay teams qualifying. If there is a tie for the last qualifying spot of the non-qualifiers, the tie will be broken by comparing the times to the thousandths.

➤ **FIELD EVENTS (LONG JUMP, TRIPLE JUMP, SHOT PUT, DISCUS):** The winner of first place and second place in each event will qualify for the state meet, plus the next SIX best performances of the non-qualifiers across all districts. In case of a tie for the last qualifying spot, all of those tied shall qualify.

➤ **FIELD EVENTS (POLE VAULT, HIGH JUMP):** The winner of first place and second place in each event will qualify for the state meet, plus all who equal or exceed the additional qualifier mark at the 2025 NSAA Class D District Track Meet.

Mullen would like to add NSAA High School Girls Wrestling for 2025-26. We have a high school freshman that is planning on wrestling next year in high school. We will register for that with the NSAA and add that to our sports schedule as well as find tournaments to attend, find a coach (we have interest in that position already), singlet/uniform, travel expensive and fees for meet to add to our budget. We do have girls' interest in the JH also for next year.

-NSCAS TESTING 3,4,5: Our Elementary NSCAS scores turned out great. I am proud to tell you all 3 of these grades are above the state average and the individuals made some massive improvements as well. Due to our school's smaller class sizes I can't tell the exact score but I can say our 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade all scored well above the state average and our students showed excellent growth this year across the board. I used a May 7th incentive to take the top growth earners as well as top MyPath Scorers to the Dismal Golf course as they provided us a day of fun, pizza, and pop!

-MAPS Testing K, 1, 2: We took the MAPS test this Spring in Elementary for Grades K-5 and they did really well. The NSCAS test converts to a MAP score so grades 3-5 do not need to take MAPS. Since NSCAS does not cover grades K, 1, and 2 we took MAPS and all of our classes scored above the national average in both categories. Please Note: The state is switching up testing on us again next year so we will still work together as a team to figure out what the best way to test in the future is. Right now leaning on MAP K-5 in the Fall and NSCAS in the Spring as long as it converts over still with their algorithm. (This is frustrating as our teacher and curriculum has been rock solid with the current state test...it appears our state has a philosophy that if it's not broken let's fix it anyway, which is frustrating to all educators.)

-Fastbridge Testing K, 1, 2, 3: Was completed to satisfy our LB 1081 requirement (Note: We have to pay for a screener test and do it as a part of Title 1 and rule 10. Fastbridge has been the choice ever since I have been here. The state once again is putting their hand in the local pot making more rules and regulations so next year they are taking it from 8 qualifying screeners down to 4. Fastbridge is in the top 8 so if it doesn't make Dr. Mahers top 4 we will have to switch and buy a different program.

-MyPath: We use MyPath for our WIN TIME (What I Need Time) Students work on this for 30 minutes everyday as it helps them grow in the area of Reading and Math. At the beginning of the year we ordered a big chart for every teacher so they could set levels and goals based off of the points a student has earned. Level 1 goal was getting to hang out in my office and have treats that I ordered from Sam's Club. Level 2 was to grab a drink of their choice from the drinks that I ordered from Sam's Club. Level 3 was a small Ice Cream Cone from the Chuckwagon (This one really added up haha). I also

added a 4th goal called the Rocketship goal. This was made to be so challenging that if a student wanted this they had to really excel above and beyond to receive it. Our school got an email from Imagine Learning who does the MyPath program all across the United States. Mullen Elementary School ended up getting the School of Excellence award which is their highest distinction that they give. In order to get this award we had to be one of their highest achieving schools in terms of use, growth, and levels met. They sent us another 3x8 foot banner to hang in our hallway. Our kids are doing awesome things. This is our third year in a row getting this award and they give it to the top 242 schools out of 42,000. Our official ranking was 17th in the Nation in student growth.

Activities- All Field Trips are complete, Elementary Track and Field Day is complete, and we are putting on a STEM day for the last day of school. We have 8 Stations set up for students to do science experiments and activities. Each teacher and myself will have a station. This will take up our entire morning but we thought it would be a fun way for kids to learn something new on the last day of school.

-Report Cards: Will be sent out via mail May 16th

-NETA: I went to the Nebraska Education Technology Association in Kearney over the 1st and 2nd. I found a lot of cool technology tools to help build relationships and finish up the last 5 minutes of class. I also learned a lot about how AI is changing and what schools need to do to keep up as it isn't going away. Use its power to help make teachers' lives easier and to teach kids how to research. "Education in school will never die out but the way education is taught in schools will"

Sale of Excess Inventory- We plan to sell some excess inventory this summer. Some of the materials are some books that are not being used, a kitchen mixer that is not being used, possibly some scrap iron, and the Whitman route Suburban that have over 200,000 miles.. ***I recommend approval of the sale of suburbans through online auction.***

Energy Savings Contract through Facility Advocates and upgraded to the 6-12 lighting project.

Greg Barnes from Facility Advocates will be at the meeting to answer questions. After the April meeting, I had him come up with two different options.

Option 1- Replace or Retrofit all existing lighting fixtures in the 6-12 building to LED energy saving lighting. The cost of the project is \$197,750

Option 2- Add motion sensors to the Weight Room/Multi Purpose Room Hallway, Weight Room, Multi Purpose Room, and Locker Rooms. The cost of the sensors is \$12,500.

Facility Advocates provided the energy cost savings estimate for Option 1. It is an 11 year payback period with the energy savings. I have not seen the estimate for Option 2.

My recommendation would be to go with Option 1. The cost of everything is only inflating and this is something that would be a major upgrade to the 6-12 building. I would not recommend spending the \$12,500 on sensors. That price is a bit steep in my opinion.

Fencing project at the Elementary retaining wall. I apologize for the rush on this, but due to the summer months quickly approaching, we need to make a decision on a fence. We really need to get someone scheduled to put the fence up after Doug Cooley is done with the wall. We have received a quote from Travis Cooley of LazyT Custom Fencing that we reviewed in November, and a quote from Tyler Long of Precision Fencing out of Stapleton on April 29, 2025. Travis' quote is for \$10,138.61 while Tyler's is for \$6,540.04. Both companies do not like the idea of drilling holes into the concrete block as it would compromise their work. They fear that the brackets will not hold and it would be a constant pain to fix. Their opinions are to put the fence into the ground and it will last longer. Tyler Long told us that he has done similar fencing projects and the school/business puts warning signs to stay off of the block which is very doable.

My recommendation would be to approve the bid from Precision Fencing.

- 2. Greenhouse-** This will be a project that hopefully will be completed by August. There is a lot to be completed, and the team is working hard to get it accomplished. We will keep you posted.
- 4. Carpet and paint Ms. McDowell's room**
- 5. Upgrade the retaining wall at the elementary school.** Cooley will start the retaining wall and we will need to approve a bid for the fencing. We have a bid from Travis Cooley and secured one from Tyler Long of Stapleton.

Legislative Update- It has been very slow going for the Nebraska legislature which is not a bad thing. The only legislative bill of concern is LB 653 which is the bill that would make it mandatory for all schools to accept all option students unless closed which means all SPED students no matter what the verification or needs are. This could really affect a small school budget if you accept a SPED option student with very high needs. I have sent communication to Senator Mike Jacobsen on our opposition to the bill. We are hopeful that this bill not be brought to the floor as all educational entities are in opposition.
