Great start to the school year - We had a great time kicking off the school year with our Teeing it up for a great school year theme! Students were excited to be back in the building, and we were excited to have them. We are about 3 full weeks into the year, and students have got their schedules down and activities have started to pick up. Almost all clubs/activity sponsors have met with their groups to plan out this year's activities, but are finding it difficult to find time where there isn't already something scheduled. If a student wants to keep busy, we have plenty of options for them:)

NSCAS/MAPS - Math, English, and Science teachers have administered the appropriate assessments to their classes. We will use this assessment data to determine where our students are academically and next steps. In the MS, we will use the data for interventions with Mrs. Camenaind. She has used the initial assessment along with FASTbridge to determine what interventions are needed for each MS student that she will work with during the first quarter.

September In-Service - We have a busy in-service planned for this month. We will begin with 90 minutes of IXL training. In working with the company, we believe starting with the 90-minute non-beginners training will fit our district best. We will then be able to tailor other training as needed moving forward. Other items include School Improvement, New Teacher Training, Math alignment, and Department team meetings. It will be a full day of professional development for our teachers.

Homecoming - Homecoming celebrations start at the end of this month and lead us into October. The cheer and dance squads have already put in efforts to prepare for the festivities. This year's theme is There is no place like Homecoming – Wizard of Oz! Each day has a theme, such as red/white/blue day, class color, dress as your favorite character, Tot-ly comfy day, and of course, NBC spirit. Students and staff are encouraged to participate. The week will end with the homecoming football game, which will kick off at 6:30 PM, followed by the coronation and the homecoming dance.

September Board Report

Off to a Great Start! We always start the year off with setting routines and expectations for behavior and learning and the year is going well!

Kindergarten Tiger Walk- Several years ago we started the tradition of introducing the newest class in the NBC family at a home football game. Our kindergarten students, the class of 2038, walked the track and waved to their families before the start of the football game last Friday.

Fall Assessments and Data Digs- In September we give our Fall benchmark assessments for reading and math. That is MAP testing and other assessments. We are meeting in grade level teams to dig down into the data to make instructional decisions to help each child reach their fullest potential.

Interventions- Small group interventions have begun and the students are doing very well. They actually enjoy going to another room to receive some individualized instruction. We utilize other curriculum outside of the main curriculum for interventions.

Curriculum Work- We have been meeting in the afternoons to map out our curriculum for the year. This gives the teachers some time to familiarize themselves with the new Math curriculum.

Office Help- LeAnn is taking on a lot of work, especially in Infinite Campus. This will benefit both buildings, but she is taking a lot of work home and on the weekends.
