- 3. CELEBRATION OF EXCELLENCE:** Jon Baehr and Whitney Armstrong presented to the board a vision of a NBC Hall of Fame to celebrate the accomplishments of our students and staff. They shared their proposal and how the purpose of a physical Hall of Fame display would make a positive impact on our school and how it would tie to the booster club.

 - A. SUPERINTENDENT REPORT:** Mr. Ningen shared with the board the NASB Area Membership meeting is in Fremont on Wednesday, September 24th, from 4:30 - 8 pm., The 2024 State Education Conference is slated for Nov 19-21, at the CHI Conference Center in Omaha. Mr. Ningen also shared with the board that the annual Option Enrollment Numeric Capacity Resolution will need approval at the October Board Meeting. Randy Herrick from Voss Lighting sent back data to show that the installation of the LED lights is projected to have saved the district around \$22,605 for the year. He also recommended that we look into upgrading our HVAC and doors and windows at the high

school for further savings. Mr. Ningen will reach out to the Negotiations committee and NBCEA to set up the initial meeting. He also touched on where they are at in the bid process for the roof. Representative Flood and Senator Wordekemper visited the High School last week. They spoke about federal funding, school shootings and our new cell phone policy. 12 companies that attended the pre-bid conference last week.

B. HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL REPORT: *Reported by Mrs. Petersen*

Mrs. Petersen shared that the school year is off to a great start. All clubs/activities have met and are planning their activities for the year. NSCAS/MAPS - Math, English, and Science teachers have administered the appropriate assessments to their classes. This data will determine where our students are at academically and next steps. In middle school they will use the data for interventions with Mrs. Camenzind.

September Inservice- We will work on IXL training, School Improvement, new teacher training, math alignment and department meetings.

Homecoming celebrations will begin at the end of September. The cheer and dance squads have already put efforts into preparing for the festivities. This year's theme is Wizard of Oz! Each day has a theme, such as red/white/blue day, class color, dress as your favorite character, comfy day, and NBC spirit day. The week will end with the homecoming football game which will kick off at 6:30PM followed by the homecoming coronation and homecoming dance.

C.ELEMENTARY PRINCIPAL REPORT: *Reported by Mr. LaChapelle*

Off to a Great Start! We always start the year off with setting routines and expectations for behavior and learning and the year is going well! Kindergarten Tiger Walk- Several years ago we started the tradition of introducing the newest class in the NBC family at a home football game. Our kindergarten students, the class of 2038, walked the track and waved to their families before the start of the football game on Friday. Fall Assessments and Data Digs- In September we give our Fall benchmark assessments for reading and math. We are meeting in grade level teams to dig down into the data to make instructional decisions to help each child reach their fullest potential. Interventions-Small group interventions have begun and the students are doing very well. Curriculum Work- We have been meeting in the afternoons to map out our curriculum for the year. Office help- LeAnn is taking on a lot of work, especially in Infinite Campus. This will benefit both buildings, but she is taking a lot of work home on the weekends.

College Readiness

October is also a big month in regards to college readiness. Mrs. Wess has established two nights to prepare seniors who intend to further their education with information to begin the

process. At the end of September, she had an opportunity for parents/students to hear from Education Quest via a live webinar which covered college options and basic financial aid. The next parent meeting will be specific to the FASFA completion process which is required for graduation. Seniors have also been active in attending college visits and participating in Apply2College Month; where they did activities and received assistance in applying to colleges.

Professional Development

We have a full in-service planned this month that will include a presentation by Dept. White on drug and alcohol awareness. We also will have Dennison present the survey results to the staff, along with our School Improvement and mentioning meetings.

Leadership learning walks - This year, I am again participating in the ESU#2 leadership learning walks. This year I will be working with a team from Yutan, Oakland-Craig, and the ESU#2. Principals visit other schools to observe and share best practices in a collaborative, non-evaluative format. These walks are focused on specific instructional goals, such as set forth by the host district, and are designed to support continuous improvement rather than formal evaluation. Staff will have some classroom time to work on the upcoming curriculum as well as prepare for Parent Teachers Conferences, which will be held October 22nd and 29th from 5:30PM to 8:30PM.

Fire Prevention Week- The North Bend Fire Department will come for a school wide assembly on October 13th and talk with students about developing evacuation plans for their homes and testing smoke detectors.
