## **Driver's Education**

Karma Amison will again be our Driver's Education Instructor for the 2026 summer course. The classroom portion of the course will run from roughly May 26th to May 29th from 8 am to noon each day. After the classroom instruction, students will sign up for the behind-the-wheel instruction which must be equal to 5-hours. To complete the driving portion of the course, students must be 14 years of age and hold a school/learner's permit. All driving must be completed by August 15th. I would recommend we leave all fees the same for the upcoming school summer.

## **Interventionist**

Mrs. Camenzind sees roughly 11 students on a regular basis a week in the MS/HS building. She sees them individually or in groups of 2 and 3. Each session is roughly 30 minutes and the goal is to meet with each student/group three times a week. Mrs. Camanzind uses OG+ and Morphology as her intervention tool and Fastbridge for progress monitoring in English Language Arts. In math, the MS teachers reach out to her when they have someone struggling and she tries to find a time slot that works and provides support. She states it is not perfect, but it is working for now. Along with assisting with interventions, Mrs. Camazind has also assisted in working with our English Language Learners. As they require more intensive sessions, she works to see them 3 to 4 times per week but session length is only about 20 minutes a time. She said balancing both schools has been challenging as there is always more she could do at both buildings, but has found the position to be very rewarding and professional gratifying.

## **State Testing**

ACT

March 23th - All 10th graders will report to the old gym for the Pre-ACT test.

March 24th - All 11th graders will report to the old gym for the Practice ACT test.

April 9th - All 9th graders will report to the old gym for the Pre-ACT test.

April 7th - All 11th graders are required to report for testing. Communication has been set home to families and all 11th graders are aware of the expectation to report.

### **Science of Reading Training**

We had Kelly Georgius from the ESU2 come in and explain to our teachers what the requirements are specific to from the state about The Science of Reading trainings and when they were required to be completed. It was a great question and answer session and the elementary classroom teachers felt a lot more comfortable with the information they received. Many will be taking that training this summer at the ESU2 building with other districts.

### **Kindergarten Roundup**
