- 1. Maintenance will be done at fifty dollars per hour.***
- 2. Parts will be sold to us wholesale with no mark up.***
- 3. Keith Duncan Director of Transportation for Morgan County School will be responsible for providing Peggy Morgan Transportation Coordinator with certification for mechanics. He will be providing a monthly calendar for service schedule on all vehicles. Safety inspections will be done on all vehicles monthly. He will also Make sure Peggy is receiving invoice on each vehicle serviced as service is completed, with cost, labor, and parts listed separately. He will send Morgan County Head Start a statement monthly for services rendered and we will pay once monthly.***
- 4. Maintenance work sheets will be signed by a certified mechanic. With a statement of work done parts and cost on each vehicle.***
- 5. We will purchase tires and have them delivered to school bus garage and pay for them to install.***
- 6. Keith will keep in contact with Peggy about her aware of any services needed, if service is more than Five hundred dollars he will get approval before work is done.***
- 7. Morgan County Head Start has twelve buses and five agency vehicles.***

1 The Board will transact all business at official meetings that may be either regular or special.  
2 Every meeting of the Board, except with the attorney to discuss pending or threatened litigation, will be  
3 open to the public.<sup>1</sup> Open meetings will be physically accessible to all students, employees, and  
4 interested citizens.<sup>3</sup>

5 No one shall bring a camera, camcorder or other photographic equipment to Board meetings without the  
6 consent of the Board.<sup>4</sup>

## 7 **REGULAR MEETINGS**

8 Regular meetings of the Board shall be held on the first ~~Monday~~ **Tuesday** of the month at 6:30 **6:00 p.m.**

9 In instances when any regular meeting date falls on a legal holiday, the meeting shall be rescheduled by  
10 the chair.

## 11 **SPECIAL MEETINGS**

12 The Board shall hold such special meetings as necessary to transact the business of the Board. Such  
13 meetings shall be called by the chair whenever, in the chair's judgment, the interests of the schools  
14 require it or when requested to do so by a majority of the Board.<sup>2</sup>

15 Only business related to the call of the meeting, and details related to agenda items shall be discussed or  
16 transacted by the Board at a special meeting.

## 17 **ELECTRONIC ATTENDANCE<sup>5</sup>**

18 Absent board members may attend a regular or special meeting by electronic means if the member is  
19 absent because of work, a family emergency, or the member's military service. If a board member is  
20 absent due to military service, he/she may participate electronically as often as he/she is able to do so.  
21 However, a board member may not participate electronically more than two (2) times per year for  
22 absences due to work and/or family emergencies.

### 23 *General Requirements*

24 The following requirements apply to all electronic attendance, regardless of the reason for the member's  
25 absence:

- 26 1. A quorum of the Board must be physically present at the meeting in order for any member to  
27 attend electronically.

1        2. Any member wishing to participate electronically must do so using technology that allows the  
2        chair to visually identify the member.

3        3. The responsibility for the connection lies with the member wishing to participate electronically.  
4        No more than three (3) attempts to connect shall be made unless the Board chooses to make  
5        additional attempts.

6        *Work-Related Absence*

7        The following requirements apply to electronic attendance due to a work-related absence:

8        1. The Board member must be absent from the county due to work.

9        2. The member wishing to participate must give the chair and Director of Schools at least five (5)  
10        days notice prior to the meeting of the member's desire to participate electronically.

11        *Family Emergency*

12        The following requirement applies to electronic attendance due to a family emergency:

13        1. The member must be absent due to the hospitalization of the member or the death or  
14        hospitalization of the member's spouse, father, mother, son, daughter, brother, sister, son-in-law,  
15        daughter-in-law, stepson, stepdaughter, father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, or sister-  
16        in-law.

## 2 **Purpose**

3 This policy sets out guidelines for providing a limited open forum for public prayer or non-theistic  
4 expressions at municipal-related meetings, events, and gatherings.<sup>1</sup> It balances two important  
5 interests.

6 First, many in our civic community, including citizens, elected officials, municipal employees, and  
7 other participants at municipal events, believe it is beneficial to publicly solemnize gatherings of  
8 municipal entities and the larger community, as well as to remind those involved of the need for civility  
9 and goodwill. Likewise, developing and nurturing a sense of mutual respect can contribute positively  
10 to the exercise of civic responsibilities in our community. We agree that these are suitable purposes,  
11 consistent with the traditions of our community. Such public solemnization, reminder, and community  
12 building may be done by a welcoming statement, followed by moment of silence, a citizen- or  
13 municipal official-led invocation, an inspirational exhortation, or some other means.

14 Second, it is important that our municipality does not sponsor or endorse any particular religion or  
15 show favoritism to any religious belief or non-belief. We are conversant with the Supreme Court's  
16 decisions in this regard, including *Town of Greece*, 572 U.S. 565 (2014), as well as other applicable  
17 court decisions, and have prepared this policy with the intent to act consistently with those court  
18 decisions. We do not read those decisions as requiring our community to forbid religious expression  
19 or to prohibit all prayer at municipal-related events or gatherings, but as requiring that they be  
20 conducted with appropriate safeguards, which this policy puts in place. We do not accept the notion  
21 that permitting an opportunity for voluntary public prayer or other speech at municipal events always  
22 amounts to an unconstitutional endorsement of whatever the speaker says or that members of our  
23 community cannot distinguish between voluntary speech and municipally endorsed messages.

## 24 **Limited Public Forum for Prayer and Non-theistic Expression**

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<sup>1</sup> Such events and gatherings include, but are not limited to: city council meetings or committee meetings of the council; honor or award ceremonies; retirement recognitions; and patriotic commemorations related to veterans or national holidays and other dates of historical significance.

1 Municipal organizations are permitted to provide an opportunity at the beginning of a meeting or other  
2 municipal-related gathering for an invocation or other expression appropriate to the event or gathering  
3 to be given using the public-address loud speaker system otherwise provided at the event, provided  
4 the following guidelines are satisfied.

- 5 1. A municipal organization may, but is not required to, restrict those allowed to lead in a prayer or  
6 other expression to local citizens. However, it must give all members of whatever group is  
7 selected equal opportunity to participate. Selecting the individuals by vote is not permissible, as  
8 this may restrict the selection to the majority of the group. The approved method of selection is a  
9 blind drawing of all individuals who have volunteered for a particular meeting or event. Any other  
10 method of selection must be approved in advance by the municipality's legal office.
- 11 2. A municipal organization may publicize the opportunity for an individual to provide a prayer or non-  
12 theistic expression at a meeting or event, but must select such individual on content-neutral  
13 grounds and must not require participation by anyone.
- 14 3. A municipal organization may limit the timing and place of the prayer or non-theistic expression  
15 and should monitor the public proceeding to assure that its guidelines are not being violated. For  
16 example, the meeting or event organizers may turn off the public-address system if a speaker  
17 exceeds the time limit.
- 18 4. Speakers of prayers or non-theistic expressions are to be informed of the purposes as stated in  
19 the "Purpose" section of this policy, provided a time limit not to exceed **one minute**. The  
20 municipal organization will not provide a text to be used by any speaker.
- 21 5. At the beginning of a prayer or other expression, the following statement will be read by a  
22 municipal representative: "**Morgan County Board of Education** is pleased to have **name** and  
23 **position** lead us in a short invocation [or other expression] today. S/he is doing so as a volunteer  
24 and is not sponsored by the municipality. We request your civility, but do not require your  
25 participation."

26 **Reporting Violations,**

- 27 6. Potential violations of this policy may be reported to the municipality's legal office.
- 28 7. The municipality's legal office will review every report of a potential violation to determine (a)  
29 whether there has been a violation, (b) whether remedial action is appropriate, and (c) whether  
30 additional training or instruction is appropriate to minimize the potential for future violations of this  
31 policy.

32 **In-person Training**

1 8. Within 30 days of the adoption of this policy, the municipality’s legal office will be responsible for  
2 providing in-person training on this policy to all municipal elected officials and managerial level  
3 employees.

4 **Proactive Amendment of this Policy**

5 9. The municipality’s legal office will keep apprised of any legal developments in this area and  
6 propose appropriate revisions to this policy to be consistent with controlling law.

7 10. Any amendment of this policy will be transmitted promptly to all municipal elected officials and  
8 managerial-level employees. Consideration will be given to whether in-person training would be  
9 desirable to discuss any such amendment.
