1 *General*¹

2 Board members and school district employees may not accept, directly or indirectly, any gift, money,
3 gratuity, consideration, or favor that a reasonable person would understand was intended to influence
4 the vote, official action, or judgment of the board member or employee in executing decisions
5 affecting the school district. It is also prohibited for a board member's or an employee's spouse or
6 child living in the same household to accept such items.

7 It shall not be considered a violation of this policy for a board member or employee to receive
8 entertainment, food, refreshments, meals, health screenings, amenities, food, or beverages that are
9 provided in connection with a conference sponsored by an established or recognized statewide
10 association of school board officials or by an umbrella or affiliate organization of such statewide
11 association of school board officials.

12 **ETHICS COMPLAINTS**

13 The Board may create a School District Ethics Committee (Ethics Committee), consisting of three (3)
14 members who will be appointed to one-year terms by the Board Chair with confirmation by the Board.
15 At least two (2) members of the committee shall be members of the Board. The Ethics Committee shall
16 convene as soon as practicable after its appointment and elect a Chair and a Secretary. The records of
17 the Ethics Committee shall be maintained by the Secretary and shall be filed in the Director of
18 Schools' office, where they shall be open to public inspection.

19 Questions and complaints regarding violations of this Code of Ethics shall be directed to the Chair of
20 the Ethics Committee. Complaints shall be in writing, signed by the person making the complaint, and
21 include details as to the facts surrounding the complaint.

22 The Ethics Committee may investigate an ethical complaint received against a board member or
23 employee and make recommendations to cease any activity that, in the Ethics Committee's judgment,
24 constitutes a violation of this Code of Ethics. If a member of the Ethics Committee is the subject of a
25 complaint, the member shall recuse himself/herself from all proceedings involving the complaint.

26 The Ethics Committee may:

- 27 1. Refer the matter to the board attorney;
- 28
- 29 2. In the case of a board member, refer the matter to the Board of Education for possible public
30 censure, if warranted;
- 31

- 1 3. In the case of an employee, refer the matter to the Director of Schools/designee for possible
- 2 disciplinary action, if warranted; or
- 3
- 4 4. In a case involving possible violation of state statutes, refer the matter to the district attorney
- 5 for possible ouster or criminal prosecution.

1 *General*

2 State law provides specific instances when direct or indirect conflicts of interest may affect a board
3 member's ability to vote on certain matters.

4 Direct conflicts of interest may arise if the school district contracts with a board member or with a
5 business in which the board member is a sole proprietor, partner, or person having a controlling
6 interest.¹

7 Indirect conflicts of interest may arise if a board member votes on a matter involving a situation that a
8 reasonable person would infer affects his/her personal finances indirectly. If a board member has a
9 direct interest but is the sole supplier of goods or services in the city or county, he/she would be
10 considered indirectly interested in such a matter.²

11 **DIRECT CONFLICT OF INTEREST¹**

12 A board member shall not be directly interested in any contract in which the Board may be interested.

13 If there is a pre-existing contract that predates the board member's election to the Board, the board
14 member shall refrain from voting or discussing any matter related to that contract since he/she has a
15 direct interest. Upon expiration, the contract shall not be renewed by the Board.³

16 This shall not prohibit any board member from voting on the school budget or any budget amendments
17 unless the vote is on a specific budget amendment in which the board member is directly interested.⁴

18 **INDIRECT CONFLICT OF INTEREST²**

19 A board member shall not be indirectly interested in any contract where the Board may be interested
20 unless the board member publicly acknowledges such interest. The disclosure of this interest shall be
21 made at the board meeting in which the Board is taking action on the contract. A board member with
22 an indirect interest is not required to refrain from voting on the contract.

23 **PENALTY FOR UNLAWFUL INTEREST⁵**

24 If a board member is found to have an indirect interest and fails to disclose such interest, or becomes
25 directly interested in any contract, he/she shall forfeit all compensation. He/she shall also be dismissed
26 from the Board and be ineligible to serve in the same or similar position for ten (10) years.

1 **SUSPENSION PENDING AN INVESTIGATION¹**

2 The director of schools/designee may suspend a teacher at any time that may seem necessary,
3 pending investigation or final deposition of a case before the board or an appeal. If the matter
4 under investigation is not the subject of an ongoing criminal investigation or a department of
5 children’s services investigation, and if no charges for dismissal have been made, a suspension
6 pending investigation shall not exceed ninety (90) days in duration. Under no circumstances
7 shall the director of schools suspend a teacher with pay. If vindicated or reinstated, the teacher
8 shall be paid full salary for the period of suspension.

9 **SUSPENSION OF THREE DAYS OR LESS^{2,3,4}**

10 A director of schools/designee may suspend a teacher for incompetence, inefficiency, neglect of
11 duty, unprofessional conduct and insubordination. Before an employee is suspended he/she shall
12 be: (1) provided with written notice, including the reasons for the suspension along with an
13 explanation of the evidence; (2) given an opportunity to respond to the director at a conference,
14 if requested within five (5) days; and (3) given a written decision of the suspension within ten
15 (10) days. Both parties may be represented by counsel at the conference, which shall be
16 recorded.

17 Under no circumstances shall a director of schools suspend a tenured teacher with pay. If
18 reinstated, the tenured teacher shall be paid full salary for the period of suspension, unless
19 suspension without pay is deemed to be an appropriate penalty.

20 **DISMISSAL OR SUSPENSIONS GREATER THAN THREE DAYS⁵**

21 The Board shall maintain a list of qualified individuals who have indicated a willingness to act as
22 impartial hearing officers, as defined under Tennessee law.

23 When charges are made against a tenured teacher, charging the teacher with offenses which may
24 justify dismissal or a suspension greater than three days, the charges shall be made in writing,
25 specifically stating the offenses which are charged and shall be signed by the party or parties
26 making the charges.

27 If, in the opinion of the Board, the charges are of such a nature as to warrant the release of a
28 suspension greater than three days of the teacher, the director of schools shall give the teacher a
29 written notice of this decision, a copy of the charges against the teacher, and a copy of a form
30 provided by the Commissioner of Education advising the teacher of his/her legal duties, rights
31 and recourse.

1 A tenured teacher who has been given notice of charges against him/her may within thirty (30)
2 days after receipt of notice give written notice to the director of schools of his/her request for a
3 hearing.

4 The director of schools shall, within five (5) days after receipt of request, assign a hearing officer
5 from the list maintained by the Board.

6 The hearing officer shall notify the parties, or the attorney, of the officer's assignment and direct
7 the parties or the attorneys for the parties, or both, to appear before the hearing officer for
8 simplification of issues and the scheduling of the hearing. In the discretion of the hearing
9 officer, all or part of any prehearing conference may be conducted by telephone if each
10 participant has an opportunity to participate, be heard, and to address proof and evidentiary
11 concerns. The hearing officer is empowered to issue appropriate orders and to regulate the
12 conduct of the proceedings.

13 Either party may appeal to the Board of Education an adverse ruling by giving written notice of
14 appeal within ten (10) working days of the hearing officer's delivery of the hearing officer's
15 written findings and conclusions. The director of schools shall prepare a copy of the
16 proceedings, including all transcripts and evidence, documentary or otherwise, and transmit the
17 same to the Board within twenty (20) days of the receipt of the notice of appeal.

18 The Board shall hear the appeal on the record, and no new evidence may be submitted by either
19 party. The appealing party may appear before the Board to argue why the adverse ruling should
20 be overturned. In no event should such argument last more than fifteen (15) minutes, unless the
21 Board should vote to extend additional time. At the conclusion of the hearing, any member of the
22 Board may vote to sustain the decision of the Hearing officer, send the record back for additional
23 evidence, revise the penalty or reverse the decision. The Board shall render its decision within
24 ten (10) working days after the conclusion of the hearing. In the event that the decision of the
25 Board is appealed to the Chancery court, the Board shall transmit the entire record prepared by
26 the director and reviewed by the Board to the Chancery court for its review.

27 **RESIGNATION**

28 A teacher shall give the director of schools notice of resignation at least thirty (30) days before
29 the effective date of the resignation. A teacher, who fails to give such notice, in the absence of
30 justifiable extenuating circumstances, shall forfeit all tenure status. The Board may waive the
31 thirty (30) days notice requirement and permit a teacher to resign in good standing.

32 The condition under which it is permissible to break a contract with the Board are as follows:

- 33 1. The incapacity on the part of the teacher to perform the contract as evidenced
34 by the certified statement of a physician approved by the Board; and
- 35 2. The release by the Board of the teacher from the contract which the teacher has
36 entered into with the Board.⁶

37 Any teacher on leave shall notify the director of schools in writing at least thirty (30) days prior
38 to the date of return if the teacher does not intend to return to the position from which he/she has
39 taken leave. Failure to render such notice may be considered a breach of contract.⁷

1 Upon a breach of contract, the Board, upon a motion recorded in its minutes, may file a
2 complaint with the Commissioner and request the suspension of a teacher's certificate. After the
3 Commissioner has provided the teacher an opportunity for defense during a hearing, the
4 Commissioner may suspend the certificate for no less than thirty (30) and no more than three
5 hundred sixty-five (365) days.⁸

6 RETIREMENT

7 Retirement shall mean termination of services under conditions which will allow the employee to
8 draw benefits from retirement plans and/or social security benefits.

9 Employees eligible for retirement benefits may elect to retire at any age according to the
10 provisions of the retirement system.

11 Central office personnel shall assist employees in securing retirement benefits; however, it shall
12 be the responsibility of the retiring employee to provide verification of eligibility in writing from
13 TCRS to the central office. It shall be the responsibility of the retiring employee to file from
14 benefits.

15 Employees who retire under TCRS may be employed up to one hundred twenty (120) days per
16 year without loss of retirement benefits. Retired teachers may substitute teach for an additional
17 ninety (90) days if the director of schools certifies in writing to the Board that no other qualified
18 personnel are available to substitute teach.⁹

19 The director of schools may employ teachers retired for a least one year for full-time
20 employment as a kindergarten through twelfth grade teacher on a year-to-year basis. Retirement
21 benefits will not be lost or suspended under certain conditions, which include but are not limited
22 to the following:¹⁰

- 23 1. The director of schools of the employing system must certify in writing that no
24 other qualified individuals are available to fill the position;
- 25 2. The Commissioner of Education must certify that the employing school system
26 serves an area that lacks qualified teachers to serve in the position to be filled;
- 27 3. The retired teacher must hold a valid license and shall not be entitled to tenure
28 status;
- 29 4. The retired teacher shall not be eligible to accrue additional retirement benefits,
30 accrue leave or receive medical insurance coverage; and
- 31 5. The salary paid to the retired member shall not be less than the rate of
32 compensation set by the Board for teachers with no experience filling similar
33 positions, nor more than eight-five percent (85%) of the rate of compensation set
34 by Board for teachers with comparable training and years of experience filling
35 similar positions.

36 Upon retirement, in compliance with the guidelines set forth under TCRS, a teacher shall be paid
37 for unused accumulated sick leave. This applies to teachers who have at least twenty (20) years
38 of teaching experience with the Morgan County School System. The number of sick days paid
39 shall not exceed two hundred (200) including any personal days applied to their sick leave
40 balance. The rate per day shall be one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) for days 1-100 and

- 1 thirty-five dollars (35.00) for days 101-200. In addition to this benefit, professionally licensed
- 2 personnel may count their accumulated sick leave on their retirement.
- 3 This payment shall be made after the employee's retirement eligibility has been approved by the
- 4 Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System. A letter of intent to retire must be submitted to the
- 5 Human Resources Department and the director of schools by April 1st of the retirement year. In
- 6 extreme circumstances, the Director has the ability to waive this deadline.
