



Dr. Kevin Roark - NVC




- Played a key role in developing an Occupational Skills Award in Computer Programming to support ISD partnerships.








FINDINGS & NEXT STEPS



PURPOSE

To award cooperative job order contracts for: 1) Palo Alto College to extend life of facilities and prevent damage to foundations by making improvements and repairs to the storm water drainage system, 2) San Antonio College to replace the roof of the Fletcher Administration Building. Project extends the useful life of the building preserves the building envelope preventing water intrusion, facility damage, and indoor air quality concerns.

BACKGROUND

The contracts will be awarded via the Cooperative Purchase Agreements. Contract Administration utilizes the Cooperative Purchase Programs (COOP) to gain greater access to goods and services, cost savings through leveraged buying, and reduced administration costs by issuing fewer competitive bids and proposals. The combined buying power of public institutions throughout the State of Texas and nationally translates into savings and provides an efficient, cost effective and legal means for providing goods and services to departments throughout the Alamo Colleges District in an expedited fashion. Vendor contracts awarded through approved federal, state or cooperative purchasing agreements are a statutorily approved alternative to competitively procured vendor contracts.

The Job Order Contracts Method can be used to procure maintenance, repair, alteration, renovation, remediation, or minor construction of a facility if the governing body of a governmental entity approves each job, task, or purchase order that exceeds \$500,000. As such, this purchase is recommended in accordance with the Texas Government Code

2269 Contracting and Delivery Procedures for Construction Projects, Subchapter I Job Order Contracts Method.

MINUTE ORDER

“For the 2025-2026 academic year, the Board of Trustees hereby approves the attached recommendations of the College Presidents for reappointment of faculty members, who have met the full-time faculty status criteria. The Board hereby authorizes the Chancellor, or his designee, to issue faculty contracts, for a period of nine (9) months, or twelve (12) months to full-time faculty and faculty chairs, within the fiscal means of the College District and to satisfy the instructional needs of the students. The Chancellor is also authorized to issue summer employment agreements required to meet the instructional needs of the students and within the fiscal means of the College District.

All salaries are subject to the availability of funds. Approval of faculty on the attached lists does not preclude cross-college assignment of faculty, if the need for such assignment provides benefit for the instructional needs of the students of the College District.”



- A new 3-year contract will be automatically issued for each future year.



Please find the attached Alamo Colleges District Police Department's Monthly CLERY Act activity report through March 2025 and yearly totals summary page. Please note that the report reflects new CLERY reporting activity categories enacted in 2008 and required beginning in 2009 when a bias motivation is present, including the Theft / Larceny category which was not part of the previous CLERY reporting requirement however was previously included for informational purposes. None were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2011, effective for reporting year 2011, to include reports received for Simple Assault that are motivated by bias or hate. Simple Assaults are included in this report for information purposes however none were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2014 as per VAWA and Campus SaVE Acts, effective 2015 to include reports of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence and Stalking.

Burglary of motor vehicle is considered a theft from a vehicle under Uniform Crime Reporting definitions and therefore is included in the Theft category for CLERY purposes. For CLERY reporting purposes the Theft / Larceny category includes all thefts and burglary of motor vehicle reports made to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department and is reported as one total when reported to the Department of Education and published by the Department in its annual report. They have, however, been separated for this report.

Theft totals listed on this report include all thefts of district property and personal property belonging to students, faculty and staff reported to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department.

Significant Activity in March:

*The below reports include arrests by being booked into 201 N. Comal (The Justice Intake Assessment Annex), by being issued a citation (other than traffic), or by being detained and released with possible pending charges being filed with the Bexar County District Attorney's Office.

- 1) SPC (076253–Welfare Check)** On 03/02/2025 an officer was dispatched for a welfare check for a student who sent an email to an employee mentioning she was having suicidal ideations and having a difficult time coping in the school semester. Officers went to her residence and were able to speak to the female student and her parents and determine she did not want to hurt herself and was embarrassed ACPD was there. The student was provided with services and resources available at the campus should she need further assistance.
- 2) ACCESS (076250 – Possession / Deliver Drug Paraphernalia)** On 03/02/2025 an officer was conducting a check of ACCESS and noticed a male (non-student) on the 2nd floor breezeway who was naked. Upon further investigation, it was determined the male was in possession of a black pipe with black residue on it. He was issued a verbal criminal trespass warning and a misdemeanor citation for drug paraphernalia and was released at the scene.
- 3) SAC (076275- Misdemeanor Warrant)** On 03/4/2025 while an officer was conducting a walkthrough of the Oppenheimer Academic Center, the officer observed a male individual (non-student), charging his phone in the first-floor men's restroom. The officer also noticed the counter where he was standing was covered with water, and he had a roll of paper towels next to him, as if he had used the sinks to rinse himself off. Upon further investigation, the officer was informed by dispatch, the male had an active warrant for criminal trespass out of Grayson County. The male was arrested and transported to the Bexar County Adult Detention Center where he was booked for the active warrant.
- 4) NVC (076350 – Possession / Deliver Drug Paraphernalia)** On 03/10/2025 while an Officer was conducting a check of the prickly pear parking garage, he noticed a black car parked appeared to be trying to hide on the northside of the garage. The officer approached the vehicle to check if there were any occupants inside, and when he approached the vehicle, the officer could smell an odor of burning marihuana. He asked the driver (male student) if he was smoking marihuana and the male stated, "Yes." Upon further investigation, the male was found to be in possession of a self-made pipe, an ash tray with marihuana residue, a clear bowl with marihuana residue, a green cup with marihuana residue, and raw rolling paper. The male student was issued misdemeanor citation for drug paraphernalia and expired registration and was released at the scene.
- 5) PAC (076367 – Public Intoxication - Alternative to Arrest)** On 03/17/2025 an officer was dispatched to the south end of Performing Arts Building for an emergency phone activation. Dispatch stated that there was a woman moaning like she was in pain. Upon arrival the officer located a black truck located in parking lot 10 where he spoke with a male and female (both non-student). The male informed the officer he and his wife were out having drinks at a local bar, and on the way home they began to argue, and they stopped on campus. The male stated when they stopped on campus, his wife exited the vehicle and activated the emergency phone and ran off. Upon further investigation the officer determined there was no physical assault and both individuals were allowed to contact a relative to pick them up due to being intoxicated. All parties departed campus separately.
- 6) NVC (076396 – Welfare Check)** On 03/18/2025 an officer was dispatched to the live Oak building for a student who crying and emotional. Upon arrival, the officer met with an employee who said a female student was in the restroom and very emotional and crying and had mentioned killing herself. After speaking with the student, she indicated to the officer she did not want to hurt herself and did not have any plans for hurting herself. The student was then released to an on campus counselor.

7) SAC (076414 – Possession of Controlled Substance & Graffiti) On 03/19/2025 while an officer was conducting a check of Parking Garage #2 he located two individuals (one male and one female / non-students) in the Northeast stairwell on the fifth level blocking the door, preventing him from entering. Upon entering the stairwell, the officer immediately smelled a strong odor of burning marijuana. The male individual had a black Beretta BB gun, a Whole Melt Strawnana Gas" THC vape, a brown cigar wrap containing green buds, which appeared to be marijuana, and a cigarette box with a small green bud inside, that also appeared to be marijuana. The female had a foil container with a crystalline substance, which appeared to be methamphetamine. Both individuals were arrested and booked for possession of controlled substance and booked into the Bexar County Adult Detention Center. All other charges will be filed at large.

8) SPC (076461 – Disturbance & Felony Warrant) On 03/22/2025 an officer was dispatched to the Learning Resources for a student arguing with the GED instructor. Upon arrival the officer met with the professor who informed him one of his students had gotten upset during an open discussion in class and began arguing with him. The professor informed the officer the student had left class. The officer was able to locate the student who said he felt the professor got very disrespectful with him, so he decided to leave. When the officer had dispatch check the student for any wants or warrants, it was determined the student had an active felony warrant out of Bexar County. He was arrested and transported to the Bexar County Detention Center where he was booked for the warrant.


9) PAC (074673 – Possession of Controlled Substance) On 03/24/2025 an officer was dispatched to the Student Center to meet with the Student Conduct Officer who reported he had entered the men's restroom and detected a sweet aroma emanating from one of the stalls. Shortly after, two males (both students) exited the stall. He identified himself as the Student Conduct Officer and requested that they accompany him to his office. Once in the office, another Conduct Officer asked the individuals to produce the item they had been using. In response, one of the male students retrieved a vape pen from his backpack and presented it to the officers. Both students are high school students and were issued a notice of intent for possession of a controlled substance and were released to their parents.

10) Off Campus (076527 – Disorderly Conduct) On 03/30/2025 while conducting an off-site check of ACCESS and returning to San Antonio College, an officer observed a male individual (non-student), urinating in public. Upon further investigation the male was issued a misdemeanor citation of disorderly conduct and released at the scene.









Through February 2025





(1) Revenue Variance:

For the six-month period ended February 28, 2025, operating revenue increased by 5.2%, or \$22.4 million, to \$451.3 million, compared to \$428.9 million for the same period in the prior year. This increase is primarily attributed to an increase in tax revenues of \$17.9 million, a \$7.1 million rise in tuition and fee revenues, offset by an decrease in other income of \$0.9 million, and by a reduction in state appropriations of \$1.7 million.

- a) Tax revenues for FY25 and FY24 are \$241.2 and \$223.3 million, respectively. This represents a 8.0%, or \$17.9 million, increase over last year. The budget for tax revenues for FY25 and FY24 stand at \$271.4 million and \$255.4 million. The District continues to benefit from increasing taxable values in Bexar County. The projected ad valorem taxes increase as the taxable assessed value of properties across Bexar County providing a 6.3% increase in budgeted tax revenues, with no change to the property tax rate. This increase will continue to fund critical facilities maintenance and operations, expansion of workforce programs like nursing and high demand programs.
- b) Tuition and fees for FY25 increased by 6.5%, or \$7.1 million, compared to FY24. FY25 revenues are \$116.6 million, or 92.5% of the budget, versus FY24 revenues of \$109.5 million, or 93.8% of the budget. The positive variance in regular tuition is attributed to a strong increase in headcount and semester credit hours, offset by the Board's decision to reduce Out-of-District and Non-Texas/Non-Resident tuition rates to make the cost of attendance more affordable. Headcount enrollment for Fall 2024 increased by 10.9%, or 7,849 students, to 79,680. Fall 2024 semester credit hours also showed a similar increase of 11.1%, or 55,481 hours, reaching a total of 557,511 semester credit hours (as of 10/23/2024). Headcount enrollment for Spring 2025 increased by 12.0%, or 8,179 students, to 76,260. Spring 2025 semester credit hours also showed a strong increase of 4.6%, or 22,356 hours, reaching a total of 509,709 semester credit hours (as of 02/24/2025).
- c) State appropriations for the current and prior years are \$82.1 million and \$83.8 million, respectively, representing 71.1% and 71.7% of their respective fiscal year budgets. State appropriations include state-paid benefits (group health and retirement). Budgeted appropriations for FY25 are \$114.0 million, compared to \$116.8 million in the prior year.

(2) Expense Variance:

- a) The total All Funds expense budget approved by the Board of Trustees for FY 2024-2025 is \$976.9 million, comprised of \$528.6 million in operating expense and \$448.3 million in restricted funds. The goal of the operating expense budget is to continue to the momentum that we have created in positioning the Alamo Colleges District for "smart growth," which makes the most effective use of every dollar of revenue to support the economic and social mobility of the members of our community and the success of our students. initiatives. The President of each of the five colleges maintains local control of their operating funds and distributes their respective allocated budget to: (a) funded employee positions, and (b) departmental operational expense accounts, based on the strategic initiatives and priorities at that location. The driving force behind the FY25 operating budget is funding the strategic priorities of the Alamo Colleges District (ACD) for our students. ACD, the largest higher education institution in South Texas and the only community college system to win the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award (twice), is working to fulfill Chancellor Dr. Mike Flores' moon shot vision of ending poverty in San Antonio through education. To make this bold vision a reality, the District and its five colleges - St. Philip's College, San Antonio College, Palo Alto College, Northwest Vista College and Northeast Lakeview College - are working to make access to a college education and successful completion of a degree or certificate accessible to all residents in its eight-county service area. ACD has implemented various investment strategies based on several identified community needs to provide accessible college education and opportunities for achieving student success.
- b) Operating expenses for FY25 and FY24 for the same period stand at 44.9% and 44.6% of the budget, respectively. Actual expenses for FY25 and FY24 are \$259.4 million and \$233.0 million, respectively, representing an increase of \$26.4 million

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Minute Order is to provide a monthly report of purchases exceeding \$200,000 and any fees charged by the various local, state, and national providers of Cooperative Purchasing (COOP) programs during February 2025. Not all COOP programs charge fees, and some COOP's offer cash rebates paid directly to Alamo Colleges. The Purchasing and Contract Administration Department utilizes the COOP programs to gain greater access to goods and services, cost savings through leveraged buying, and reduced administration costs by issuing fewer competitive bids and proposals. The combined buying power of public institutions throughout the State of Texas and nationally translates into savings and provides an efficient, cost effective and legal means for providing goods and services to departments throughout the Alamo Colleges in an expedited fashion.

BACKGROUND

Vendor contracts awarded through approved federal, state or cooperative purchasing agreements are a statutorily approved alternative to competitively procured vendor contracts. Only the following such contract purchases require prior Board approval:

- a. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that will result in additional gross square footage (permanent or otherwise) that will require cleaning and maintaining and have at least two utilities present.
- b. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that in the judgment of the Chancellor or Purchasing & Contract Administration would commit the College District or one of the colleges to an entirely new technology that would be pervasive for subsequent years.

For any cooperative purchasing contract valued at \$25,000 or more, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall document any contract-related fee, including any management fee. At least annually, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall present a written report regarding any contract-related fees, including any management fees, to the Board of Trustees at a properly posted open meeting.



Quarterly Market Summary:

After implementing three interest rate cuts in the final four months of 2024, the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) decided to keep rates unchanged following its January 2025 meeting. This decision was influenced by the slow progress in reducing inflation to the Fed's 2% target, as well as ongoing uncertainty surrounding the President's economic policies. Meanwhile, the U.S. labor market has shown continued resilience. Jobless claims were lower than expected, keeping the unemployment rate steady at 4%. Looking ahead, the Fed has seven meetings scheduled for the remainder of 2025. Market participants are currently anticipating two additional rate cuts, with roughly a 50% chance that the next cut will occur in June.






Asset Allocation by Issuer




Allocation by Fund Type

Discussion and Possible Action on Engagement of Independent Audit Firm for FY2025 Audit and Review Services

Presented to the ALAMO COLLEGES DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES for approval on April 15, 2025.

MINUTE ORDER

“The Board of Trustees authorizes execution of a one-year engagement letter, which is the third year engagement under a five-year contract with Clifton Larson Allen, LLP., providing for the purchase of independent financial audit services for the Alamo Colleges District and Northeast Lakeview College for Fiscal Year 2025 in an amount not to exceed \$352,296 (\$152,460 or 43% covers required Federal and State Single Audits); and the Board authorizes execution of a one-year engagement letter with Clifton Larson Allen, LLP. to provide independent financial review services for San Antonio College, St. Philip’s College, Palo Alto College, and Northwest Vista College for Fiscal Year 2025 in an amount not to exceed \$46,360 as requested by the office of the Associate Vice Chancellor for Finance and Fiscal Services.”

PURPOSE

State statute requires an annual audit by independent certified public accountants. The purpose of the independent audit is to provide assurance, based on independent review and testing, that the basic financial statements and accompanying notes are fairly stated in all material aspects in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles applicable to financial audits contained in the Government Auditing Standards. The audit is also designed to meet the requirements of the Federal Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 and OMB Uniform Guidance “Super Circular” and the State Single Audit related to the Texas Grant Management Standards. For FY2025, the audit services will include an independent auditor’s report for Northeast Lakeview College. This action also provides for additional services required by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) to provide financial information required under accreditation standards.

BACKGROUND

In May 2023, a contract was awarded providing for the purchase of Financial Audit and Other Attestation Services. By execution of the Services Agreement dated September 2023, Clifton Larson Allen, LLP. was engaged as independent auditors through the August 31, 2027 audits. This contract action authorizes an annual engagement letter to delineate all project deliverables for the FY2025 audit and represents the third-year engagement under a five-year contract for independent audit services for Alamo Colleges District. The fees cover up to three (3) major programs under the federal and state single audit requirements. A 3%-5% increase for each year of the five-year contract is permitted.

The amounts shown represent the Alamo Colleges District’s best estimates for a one-year period. The amount paid will be based on the services required and substantially based on the scope of work and the contract prices. The authorizations included in this action begin upon award and terminate March 31, 2026. The Board of Trustees will consider and approve each year separately to renew upon mutual consent of Clifton Larson Allen, LLP. and the Alamo Colleges District.





IMPLICATIONS

Financial: Not to exceed \$352,296 for the FY2025 Audit Engagement Letter, and not to exceed \$46,360 for the FY2025 Review Engagement Letter. Funding will be provided from operational funds.
