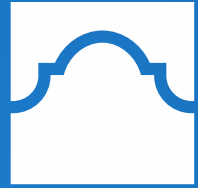

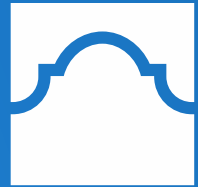

**WHEREAS**, after earning an Associate in Applied Science at San Antonio College, he went on to earn Bachelor and Masters in Mathematics degrees with a concentration in Statistics at the University of Texas San Antonio.

**WHEREAS**, he earned a Doctorate in Higher Education Leadership at Texas A&M at Corpus Christi in 2008.

**WHEREAS**, he continued his professional development through memberships in professional organizations.

**WHEREAS**, he served on or chaired numerous college and district committees.

**WHEREAS**, he gave numerous presentations to professional organizations.

**WHEREAS**, he received numerous awards for his service to Alamo Colleges – San Antonio College including induction into the Texas Phi Theta Kappa Hall of Fame, Excellence in Teaching Award (NISOD), and the International Conference on Technology in Collegiate Mathematics Recognition.

**WHEREAS**, he served the community of San Antonio through his participation in local charity events and the San Antonio Educational Partnership.

**WHEREAS**, he served as a mentor and role model to the administrators, faculty, and staff of Alamo Colleges – San Antonio College through his dedication, composure, calm demeanor, even handedness, and commitment to maintaining academic standards.

**WHEREAS**, he proudly, diligently, and unceasingly represented Alamo Colleges – San Antonio College, its faculty, staff, and most of all its students, and the mission they all serve to Chancellors, Board of Trustee Members of the Alamo Colleges, the city of San Antonio and its citizens, the state of Texas, and beyond.

**WHEREAS**, he retired effective August 31, 2025.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Trustees of the Alamo College District, with recognition and appreciation for 31 years of dedicated service at Alamo Colleges - San Antonio College and with the recommendation of the Faculty and Administration of Alamo Colleges - San Antonio College and the Chancellor of the District, name Conrad D. 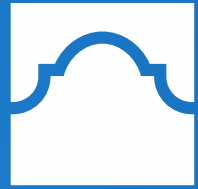

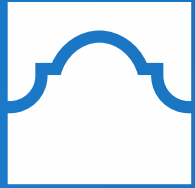
# ALAMO COLLEGES DISTRICT FACULTY SENATE

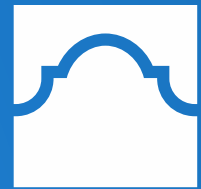

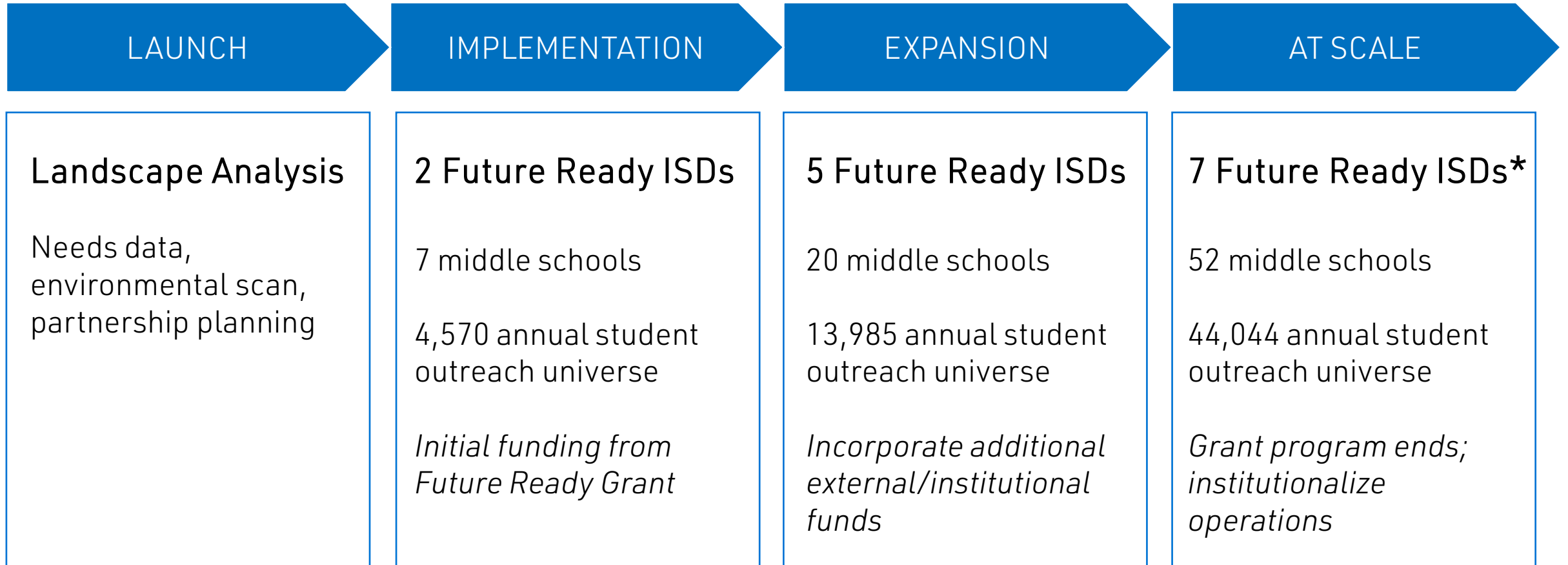

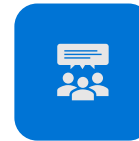
# PHASED GROWTH TO EXPAND OUTREACH

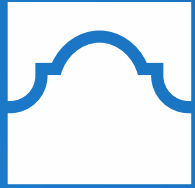

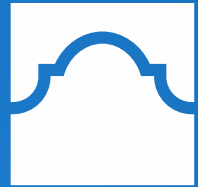

# STATE UPDATES

- Governor Abbott Empowering Texas Taxpayers 5-step plan:
  - Local Spending Limits
    - Limit spending to population + inflation OR 3.4% (the lesser of the two)
  - 2/3 Voter Approval for Tax Increase
    - 2/3 voter approval for ANY tax increase
  - Voter Roll Back Option on Taxes
    - Would allow 15% of registered voters to sign a petition to force a rollback election to lower the entity's tax rate
  - Cap on Appraisal Growth
    - Decrease homestead appraisal cap from 10% to 3%, expand the cap to all properties (inclusive of commercial properties) and allow appraisals on properties once every 5 years
  - Elimination of School Property Taxes
    - Constitutional amendment to eliminate school property taxes for homeowners<sup>33</sup>

# ACCT/AACC NLS 2026

- Advocated on key federal policy issues including Pell Grants, MSI funding, increased wrap around support services, and workforce program funding.
- Met with several members and staff of our congressional delegation including Congressmen Henry Cuellar, Joaquin Castro, and Tony Gonzales, along with Senator John Cornyn.

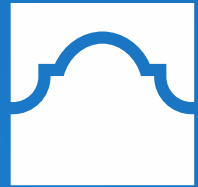

# FEDERAL UPDATES

- SNAP after One Big Beautiful Bill Act
  - Expanded Work Requirements
    - Able-bodied adults without dependents 18-64 years of age must participate in work or job training at least 80 hours per month
  - Reduced Exemptions from Work Requirements
    - Exemptions removed for veterans, individuals who are unhoused/homeless, and youth aging out of foster care
  - Parents Impacted
    - The new work requirements now apply to parents of dependent children over the age of 14
  - Increased costs to the States
    - Shifting of obligations to the state depending on error rates in awarding benefits

SUBJECT: **MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORT**

Please find attached the Alamo Colleges District Police Department's Monthly CLERY Act activity report through January 2026 and the yearly totals summary page. Please note that the report reflects new CLERY reporting activity categories enacted in 2008 and required beginning in 2009 when a bias motivation is present, including the Theft / Larceny category, which was not part of the previous CLERY reporting requirement; however, it was previously included for informational purposes. None were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2011, effective for reporting year 2011, to include reports received for Simple Assault that are motivated by bias or hate. Simple Assaults are included in this report for information purposes; however, none were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2014 as per VAWA and Campus SaVE Acts, effective 2015, to include reports of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking.

Burglary of a motor vehicle is considered a theft from a vehicle under Uniform Crime Reporting definitions and therefore is included in the Theft category for CLERY purposes. For CLERY reporting purposes the Theft / Larceny category includes all thefts and burglary of motor vehicle reports made to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department and is reported as one total when reported to the Department of Education and published by the Department in its annual report. They have, however, been separated for this report.

Theft totals listed on this report include all thefts of district property and personal property belonging to students, faculty and staff reported to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department.



*"The vision of the Alamo Colleges Police Department is To Be the Best in The Nation" while fulfilling its mission of providing a safe environment through a high level of proficiency in which all members of the District community may work, teach, study and learn. This department, in the daily performance of its function, stresses: Service, the protection of life, property and investment, the security of the campuses, and the pursuit of excellence in campus law enforcement and safety.*

\*The reports below include arrests by being booked into 201 N. Comal (The Justice Intake Assessment Annex), by being issued a citation (other than traffic), or by being detained and released with possible pending charges being filed with the Bexar County District Attorney's Office.

- 1) **ACCESS (078873 – Possession of Drug Paraphernalia)** On 01/07/2026, an officer was dispatched to the parking lot at ACCESS for two suspicious male individuals (non-students). The officer observed a glass water pipe in the bushes that both individuals were focused on. One of the individuals stated that the glass pipe belonged to him. Both were detained, and a citation was issued for Possession of Paraphernalia. A warning was issued for the small amount of marijuana.
- 2) **SAC (078886 – Burglary of a Vehicle)** On 01/09/2026, an officer was dispatched to Parking Lot 26. Upon arrival, the officer met with a male (non-student) who had parked in Lot 26. The male stated someone had burglarized his vehicle in Lot 26 between 0845 and 1410. The male stated there were multiple items missing, including a non-lethal pistol. The parking lot cameras did not capture any footage of the incident because they were offline.
- 3) **SAC (078887 – Burglary of a Vehicle)** On 01/09/2026, an officer was flagged down by an individual stating that one of their employees had their vehicle burglarized. The burglarized vehicle was on level 4 of the Tobin Garage. The male registered owner (non-student) met the officer at the garage. The male stated he departed his vehicle at approximately 1230 and returned at approximately 1430. Video footage showed a male driving a Gray 4-door Kia with obstructed plates arrive at the vehicle and commit the burglary. This case will be followed up by the Criminal Investigations Division.
- 4) **PAC (078889 – Theft)** On 01/10/2026, an officer was dispatched to the courtyard by Sabine Hall and Brazos Hall. The officer met with a male (non-student) contractor. The contractor stated that an underground wire locator was taken. He stated he left the tool on the ground and went to work in a different area. When he returned, the underground locator was nowhere to be found. There were no cameras in the area where the underground wire locator was left.
- 5) **SWC (078919 – Burglary of a Building)** On 01/16/2026, an officer was dispatched to Building 8 at Southwest Campus. The officer met with a male (non-student) contractor who made a report of stolen copper pipes. He stated the pipes were left in place at 1430 the previous day. When they returned the next day at 0800, the copper pipe was gone. This case will be followed up on by the Criminal Investigations Division.
- 6) **SPC (078933 – Felony Theft)** On 01/20/2026, an officer was dispatched to Lot 16 at St. Phillips College. The officer met with a male (non-student) contractor who reported that grounds equipment had been taken from a chain-link enclosed lot. There was evidence of the cut chain link at the scene. Several pieces of industrial equipment were taken from the scene. This case will be followed up on by the Criminal Investigations Division.
- 7) **SAC (078970 – Public Intoxication)** On 01/23/2026, an officer was patrolling at Evergreen and N. Main and observed a male (non-student) lying on the ground and struggling to get back on his feet. The male was found to be intoxicated and unable to sufficiently care for his safety while in public. The male was transported to detox at 601 N Frio. The officer was called back to detox because the male had become violent, and they were unable to assist him. The officer returned and transported the male to 401 S Frio, where he was booked for Public Intoxication.
- 8) **SAC (078997 – Assault)** On 01/28/2026, an officer was dispatched to Evergreen and Howard to meet with a female (student) who wanted to report an assault. The female stated that a male (student) had become aggressive by grabbing her arm and speaking loudly at her. Another male (student) was present during the interactions. Detectives arrived at the scene, interviewed her, and took photos of her arm and hands, but found no visible scratches. Multiple attempts to make contact with the male have been unsuccessful. The female stated she made a report regarding the same male last year, around

October. She states they had not been in a relationship together. Student conduct at San Antonio College has been notified, and they are also attempting to contact the male. This case is pending.

- 9) **NVC (079006 – Criminal Mischief)** On 01/29/2026, an officer was dispatched to Live Oak Hall for a report of graffiti on the men's restroom stall. The person making the report was a female (employee) custodian. The graffiti was in indelible marker, and there was also marking etched into the stall. The damage was estimated at approximately \$475. There are no suspects for this incident.

## Discussion and Possible Action on Monthly Contracts Report

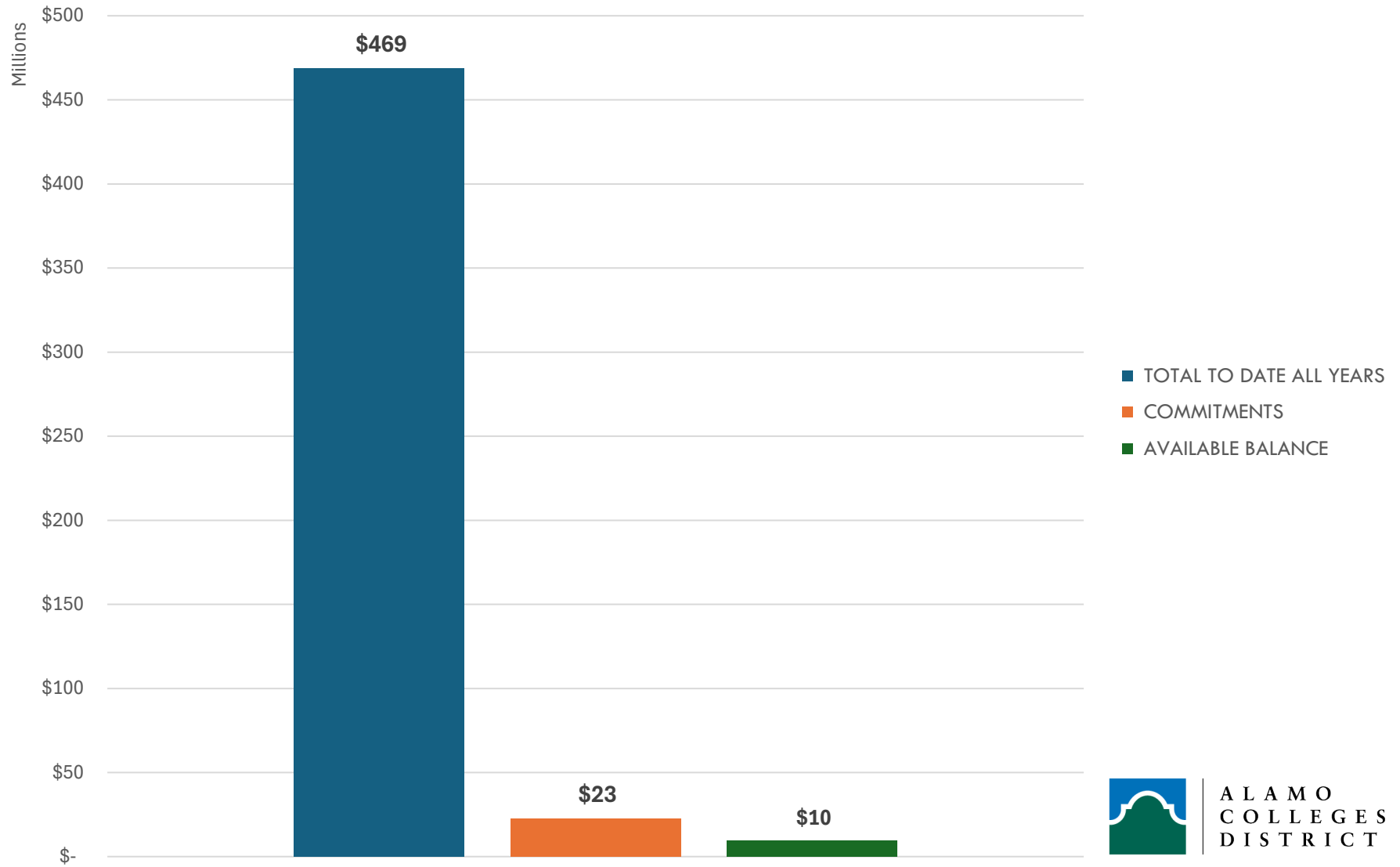

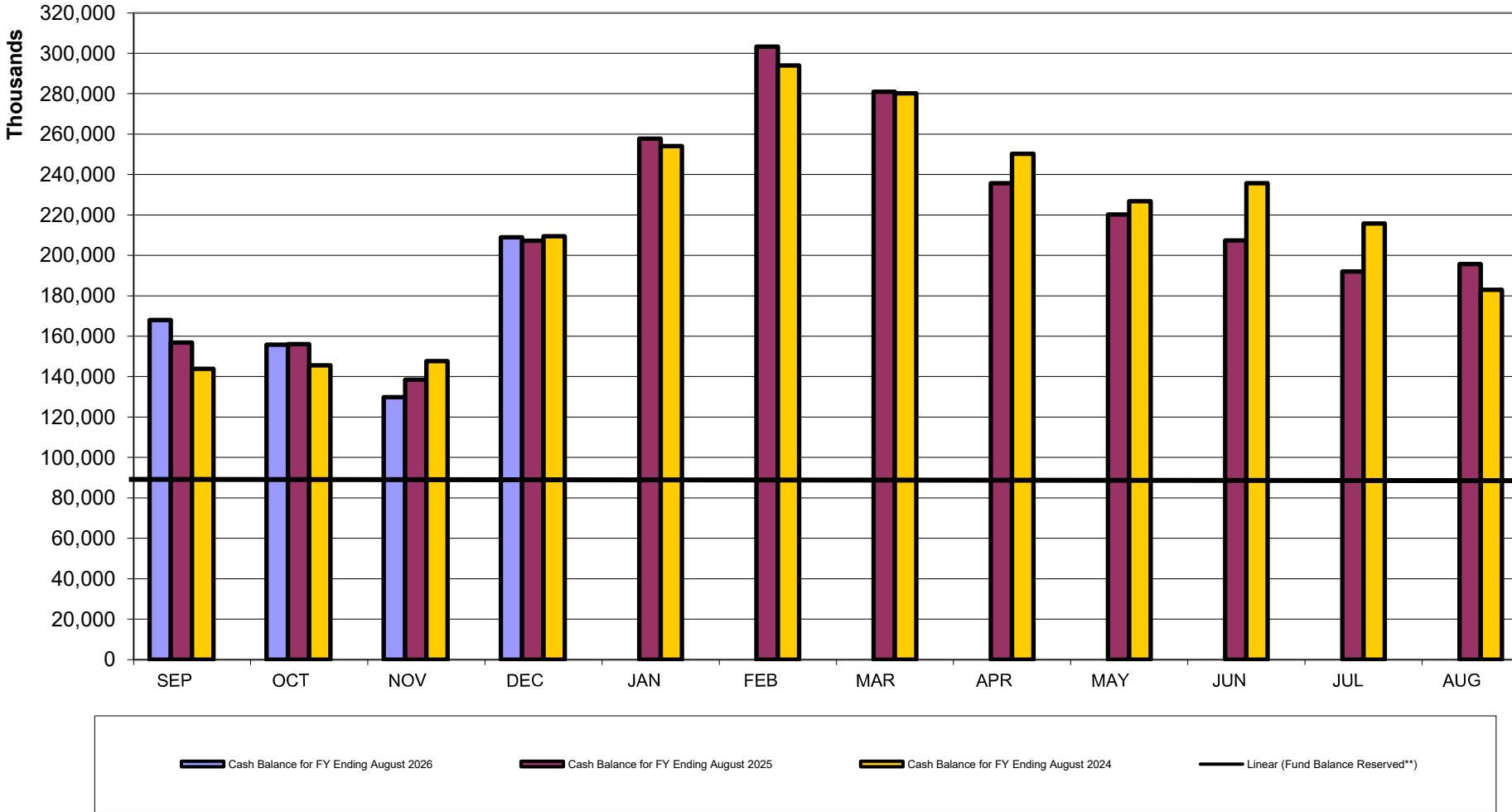

Through December 2025



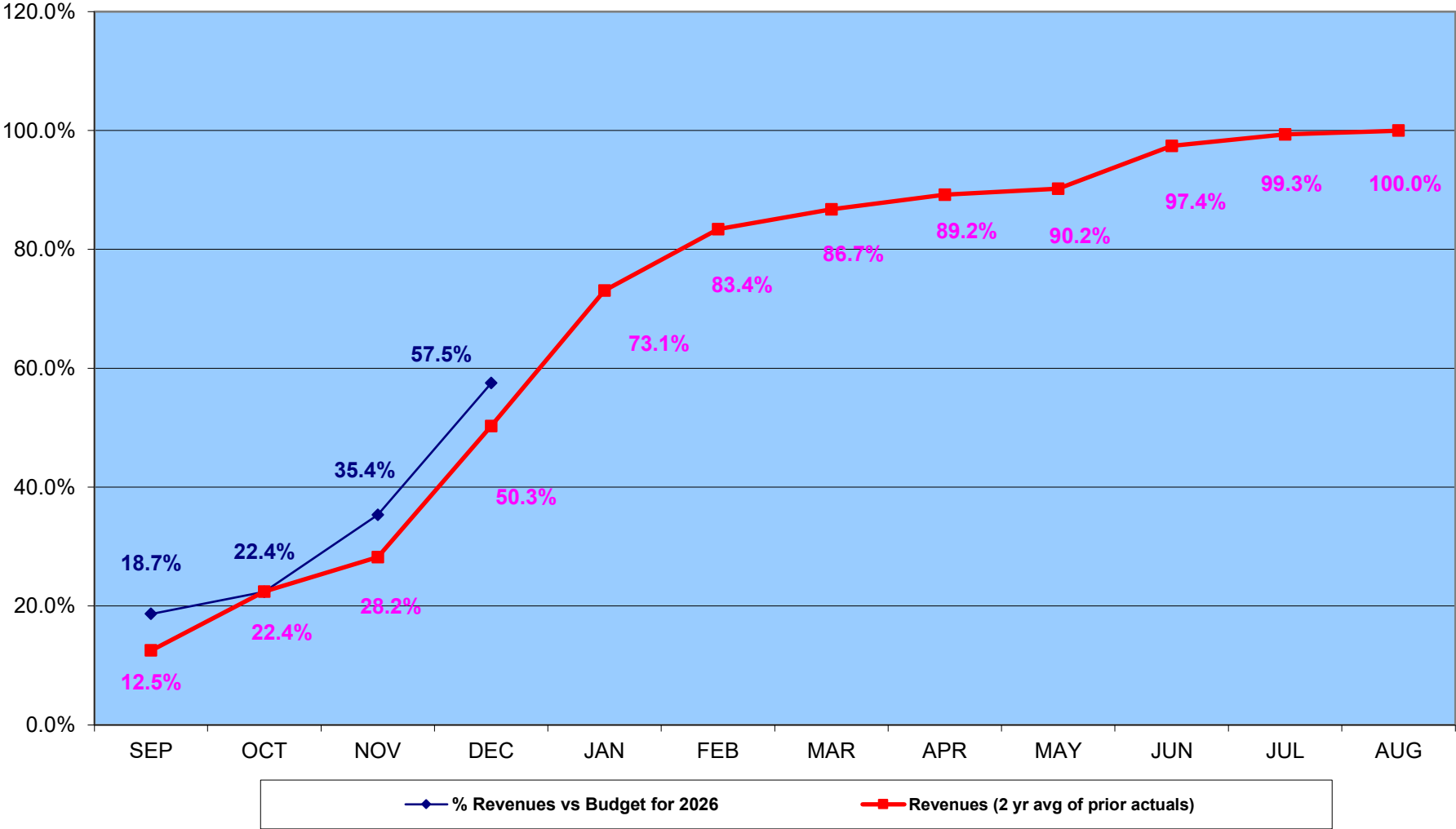

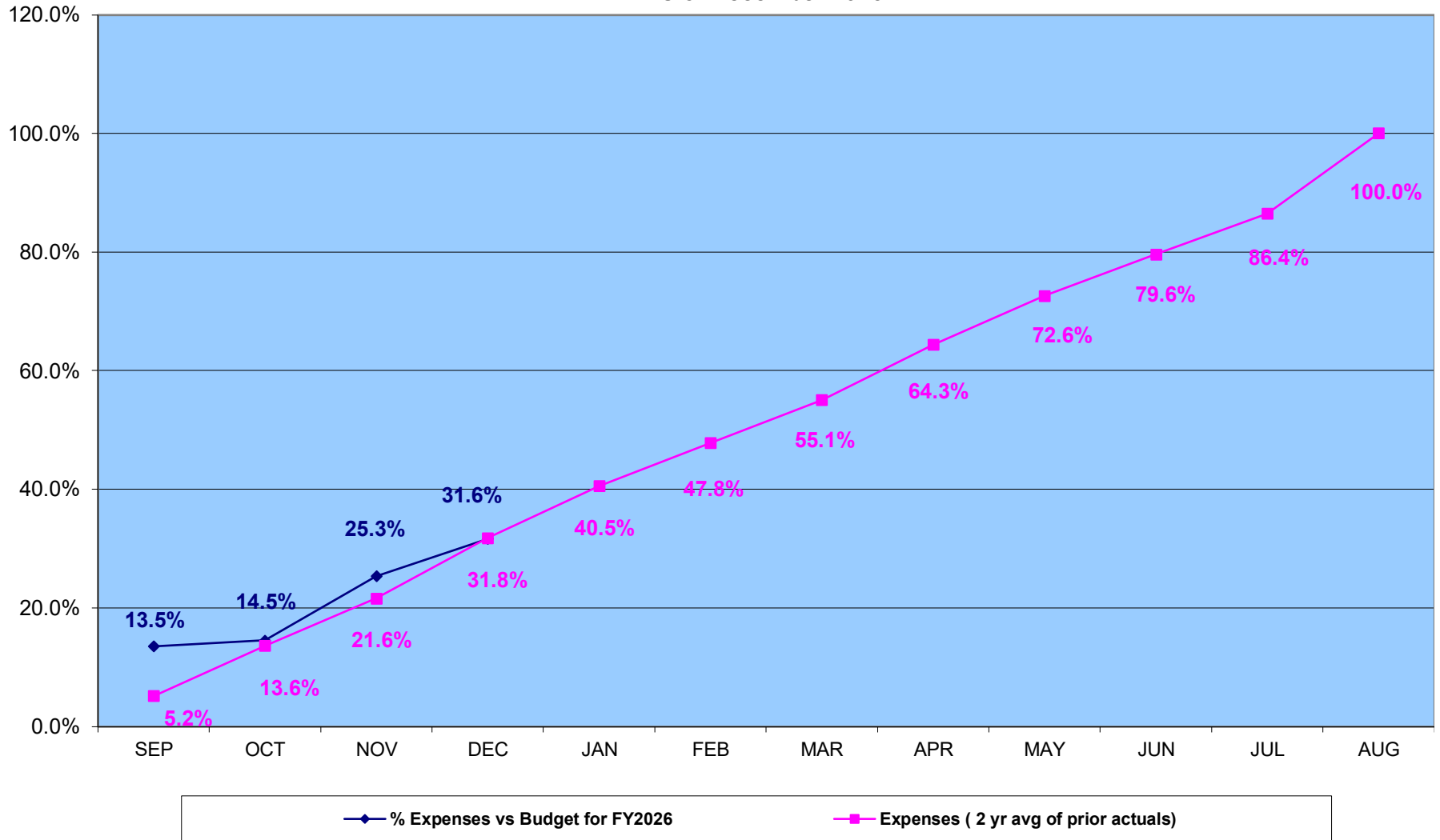

### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this Minute Order is to provide a monthly report of purchases exceeding \$200,000 and any fees charged by the various local, state, and national providers of Cooperative Purchasing (COOP) programs during December 2025, and January 2026. Not all COOP programs charge fees, and some COOP's offer cash rebates paid directly to Alamo Colleges. The Purchasing and Contract Administration Department utilizes the COOP programs to gain greater access to goods and services, cost savings through leveraged buying, and reduced administration costs by issuing fewer competitive bids and proposals. The combined buying power of public institutions throughout the State of Texas nationally translates into savings and provides an efficient, cost effective and legal means for providing goods and services to departments throughout the Alamo Colleges in an expedited fashion.

### **BACKGROUND**

Vendor contracts awarded through approved federal, state, or cooperative purchasing agreements are a statutorily approved alternative to competitively procured vendor contracts. Only the following contract purchases require prior Board approval:

- a. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that will result in additional gross square footage (permanent or otherwise) that will require cleaning and maintaining and have at least two utilities present.
- b. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that in the judgment of the Chancellor or Purchasing & Contract Administration would commit the College District or one of the colleges to an entirely new technology that would be pervasive for subsequent years.

For any cooperative purchasing contract valued at \$25,000 or more, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall document any contract-related fee, including any management fee. At least annually, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall present a written report regarding any contract-related fees, including any management fees, to the Board of Trustees at a properly posted open meeting.

## **Discussion and Possible Action for the Purchase of Bond Counsel Services**

Presented to the Board Acting as Committee of the Whole on February 17, 2026 and now presented to the Board for approval on February 24, 2026.

### **MINUTE ORDER**

**"The Board of Trustees hereby awards a contract providing for the purchase of bond counsel legal services to Norton Rose Fulbright US, LLP., or to the next highest ranked awardee that negotiates a fair and reasonable price and terms acceptable to District counsel, as requested by the Office of the Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration."**

### **PURPOSE**

This contract action provides for the purchase of bond counsel services as needed based on requirements. The awardee will represent the District's interests in regard to all bond matters, including the drafting of all legal documents relating to the issuance of bonds, reviewing and approving the disclosure documents relating to the sale of the bonds (in consultation with the representatives of the District and the District's financial advisor), and obtaining the approval of the Texas Attorney General for the issuance of the bonds. The awardee will also issue its formal legal opinion concerning the validity and enforceability of the bonds, and the exemption of interest paid to bondholders from their federally taxable income.

### **BACKGROUND**

Debt Management Policy C.3.1 requires the College District to periodically re-solicit the qualifications of potential bond counsel to provide outside legal services to the District in connection with the issuance and management of bond indebtedness.

Texas Government Code Section 1201.027 requires that a public issuer seeking bond counsel services must first select the most highly qualified provider on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications and then attempt to negotiate a contract at a fair and reasonable price. If a satisfactory contract cannot be negotiated with the most highly qualified provider, the issuer must formally end negotiations with that provider, select the next most highly qualified provider and attempt to negotiate a contract at a fair and reasonable price.

A notice soliciting a Request for Qualification Statements (RFQ) was advertised in the San Antonio Express News twice over a twenty-one-day period. Additionally, Purchasing and Contract Administration sent notices to approximately one-hundred potential offerors. The seven qualification statements received by the RFQ deadline were evaluated by representatives from the Office of Legal Services, Office of the Associate Vice Chancellor for Finance and Fiscal Services, and the Treasurer considering the RFQ specifications and requirements.

Matters considered in evaluating demonstrated competence and qualifications include, without limitation, experience as bond counsel to comparable public entities, particularly Texas community colleges, and the experience and expertise of the vendor's proposed engagement-attorney team, as well as that of the entire firm, regarding Texas bond elections, federal tax law (especially private use restriction compliance) and cited examples of vendor creativity in achieving client objectives.



As a result of this effort, incumbent bond counsel Norton Rose Fulbright US, LLP is recommended for award on the basis of competency and qualifications. The contract will begin on an effective date selected by the District once an agreement for a fair and reasonable price is negotiated and executed, and terminate three years thereafter, and have two, one year renewals on the same terms and conditions with mutual consent.



## PURPOSE

The combined buying power of public institutions throughout the State of Texas and nationally translates into savings and provides an efficient, cost effective and legal means for providing goods and services to departments throughout the Alamo Colleges District in an expedited fashion. Vendor contracts awarded through approved federal, state or cooperative purchasing agreements are a statutorily approved alternative to competitively procured vendor contracts.

The Job Order Contracts Method can be used to procure maintenance, repair, alteration, renovation, remediation, or minor construction of a facility if the governing body of a governmental entity shall approve each job, task, or purchase order that exceeds \$500,000. As such, this purchase is recommended in accordance with the Texas Government Code 2269 Contracting and Delivery Procedures for Construction Projects, Subchapter I Job Order Contracts Method.
