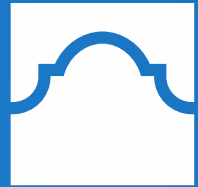

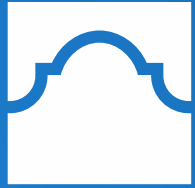

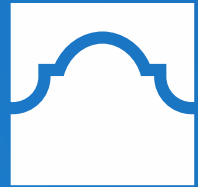
WHEREAS, he retired effective August 31, 2025.

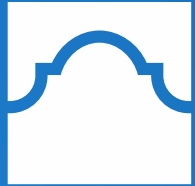

PURPOSE:

To approve the execution of a Contract for Election Services with Bexar County.

BACKGROUND:

The Board has called a general election to elect Trustees for Single-Member Districts Four (4), Eight (8) and Nine (9) whose terms expire in May 2026 on the Uniform Election Date of Saturday, May 2, 2026, to be conducted by Bexar County Elections Administration, jointly with other political subdivisions. Incumbents seeking reelection in Districts Four (4) and Eight (8) are unopposed. The election as to District 9 will proceed on May 2, 2026. The Texas Election Code requires a contract between a political subdivision and a county which will conduct an election for a political subdivision. The amount payable by the College District County is the pro rata cost of conducting the College District’s election jointly with other entities.

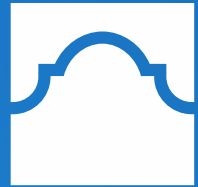

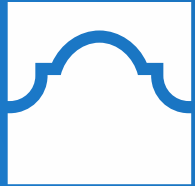

BACKGROUND:

On January 20, 2026, the Board of Trustees called a general election for May 2, 2026 to fill Trustee positions for Districts 4, 8, and 9. The deadline for filing an Application for a Place on the Ballot expired at 5 p.m. on February 17, 2026. The only Application received for Trustee position for District 4 was the Application of Lorena “Lorraine” Pulido. The only Application received for Trustee position for District 8 was the Application of Clint Kingsbery. As required by the Texas Election Code and Texas Secretary of State, Dr Pulido and Dr. Kingsbery have been certified by the authority responsible for having the official ballot prepared as the unopposed candidates for Trustee positions for Districts 4 and 8, respectively. Accordingly, the general election for Trustee positions for Districts 4 and 8 need not be held and should be cancelled.

ORDER CANCELLING ELECTION FOR TRUSTEE DISTRICTS 4 AND 8

AN ORDER OF THE ALAMO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT, SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, DECLARING UNOPPOSED CANDIDATES FOR THE OFFICE OF TRUSTEE FOR DISTRICTS 4 AND 8; PROVIDING THAT THE MAY 2, 2026, GENERAL ELECTION FOR TRUSTEE IN DISTRICTS 4 AND 8 SHALL BE CANCELLED AND NOT BE HELD; REPEALING ALL ORDERS OR PARTS OF ORDERS IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION WITH THE CANCELLATION

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the “Board”) of the Alamo Community College District (the “District”), San Antonio, Texas, on January 20, 2026, adopted an order calling a general election to be held on May 2, 2026, for trustees to serve six-year terms for single-member Districts Four (4), Eight (8), and Nine (9); and

WHEREAS, the District by same Order approved that the Trustee election be conducted by Bexar County through a Contract for Election Services; and

WHEREAS, the District by the same Order approved that the Trustee election be conducted by Bexar County with other participating entities through a “Joint Election Agreement”); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 144.005 and 144.006, Texas Election Code, the deadline for filing applications for a place on the ballot and declaration of write-in candidacy for the District’s general election has expired; and

WHEREAS, Roxella T. Cavazos, Custodian and Agent to the Board Secretary for Election Records, in accordance with Section 2.052, Texas Election Code, has certified in writing to the Board that Lorena “Lorraine” Pulido is unopposed for election to the office of Trustee, single-member District 4, and Clint Kingsbery is unopposed for election to the office of Trustee, single-member District 8; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds and determines that the candidates whose names are to appear on the ballot in said election for Trustee of Districts 4 and 8, are unopposed, there are no declared write-in candidates, and no propositions are to appear on the ballot for said election; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Election Code, Chapter 2, Subchapter C, authorizes the Board, upon receipt of certification that a candidate for an election is unopposed, to declare the unopposed candidates to be elected and, as a result, to cancel the elections for the single-member districts in which the candidates are unopposed.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ACCORDINGLY FOUND, DECLARED, AND ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE ALAMO COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT THAT:

SECTION 1. The facts and matters set forth in the preamble of this Order are hereby found to be true and correct.

SECTION 2. In accordance with Section 2.053(a), Texas Election Code, the following unopposed candidates are hereby declared duly elected to the respective offices shown and shall be issued a certificate of election following the date on which the general elections for Trustees was to have been held:

- Trustee, District 4 – Lorena “Lorraine” Pulido
- Trustee, District 8 – Clint Kingsbery

SECTION 3. Pursuant to Section 2.053(b), Texas Election Code, the general election for Trustees for Districts 4 and 8, ordered by the Board for May 2, 2026, shall not be held and is hereby canceled. The Agent is hereby directed to cause a copy of this Order to be posted at the District website. The Agent is hereby authorized to take any further actions authorized by or necessary under the Texas Election Code or other law to cancel the May 2, 2026 election for Trustees for Districts 4 and 8.

SECTION 4. The Board authorizes and directs the Agent to notify the parties to the Joint Election Agreement and the Contract for Election Services of the cancellation of the Trustee election for Districts 4 and 8. The District’s Agent is hereby authorized to take any additional steps necessary to fulfill the District’s obligations under the Joint Election Agreement and Contract for Election Services.

SECTION 5. All orders or parts of orders in conflict with the provisions of this Order are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 6. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Order be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any purpose by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Order shall not be affected thereby, and to this end the provisions of this Order are declared to be severable.

SECTION 7. It is hereby found and determined that the meeting at which this Order was passed was open to the public required by Section 551.001 *et seq.*, Texas Government Code, and that advance public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given.

SECTION 8. This Order shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

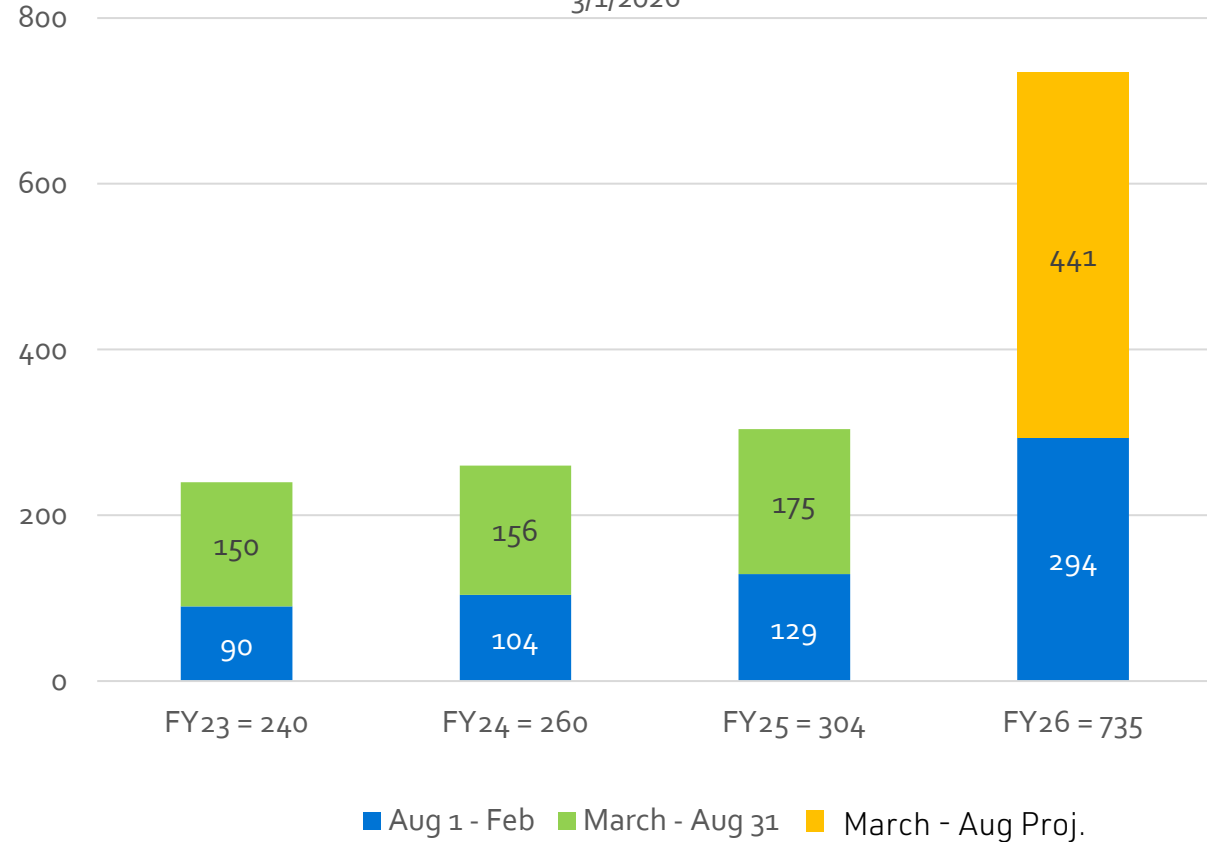

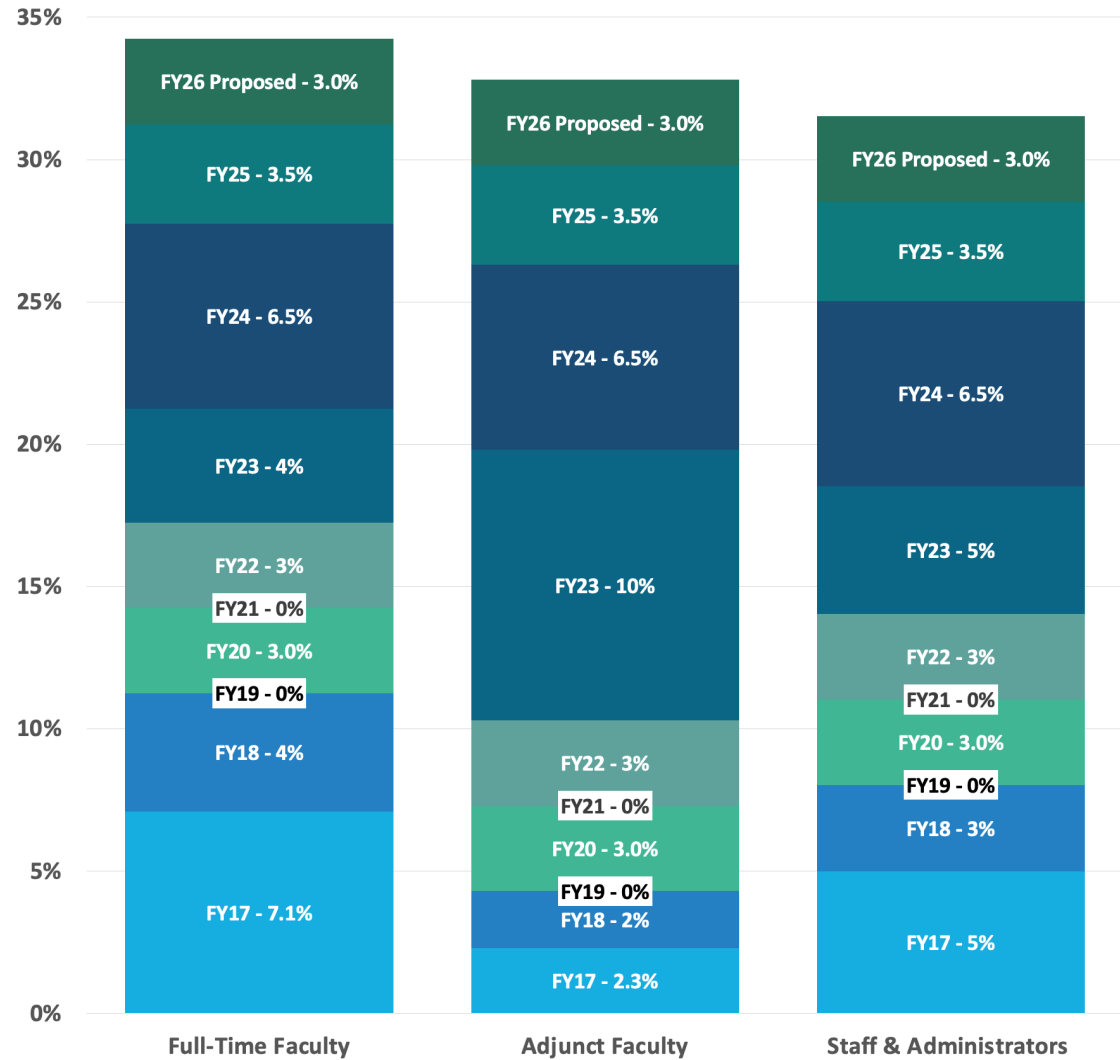

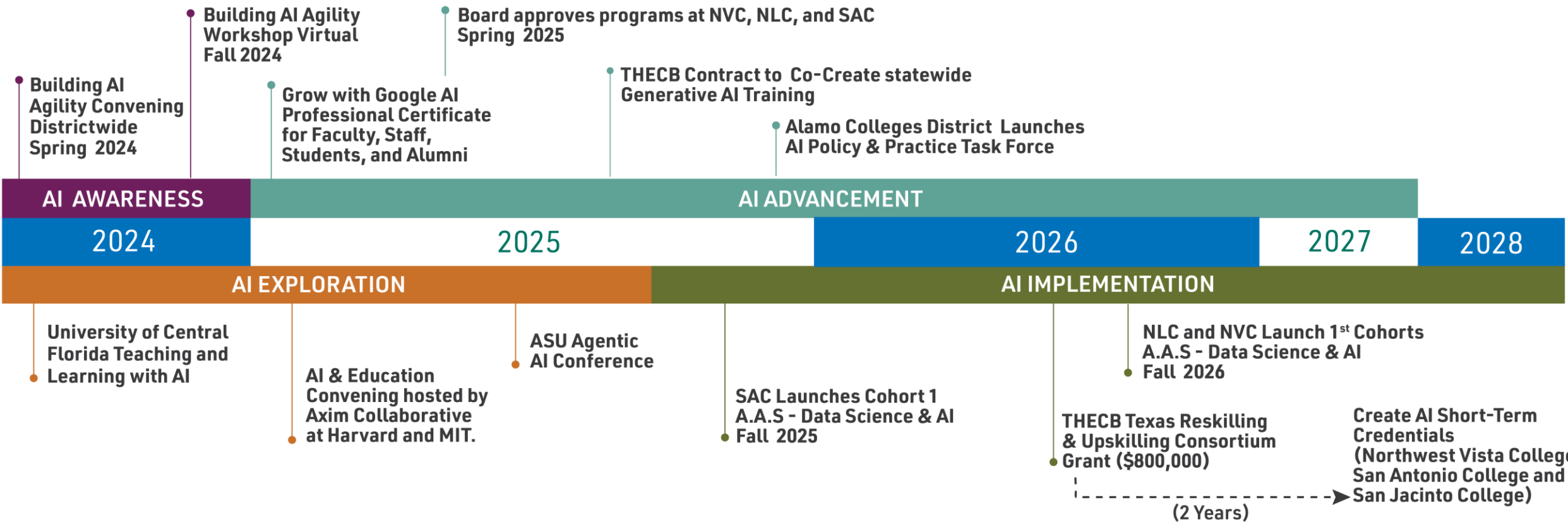

Evidence and Alignment:

Lisa Phillips exemplifies outstanding public service through her lifelong commitment to civic leadership, military service, and advocacy for the nation’s four-legged heroes. A former Northeast Lakeview College student and U.S. Army Veteran, she began her service to the nation in 2001 as a veterinary technician. During her military career, she earned a Certificate of Achievement, the Army Achievement Medal, and the Good Conduct Medal—recognition of her dedication, professionalism, and selfless service.

Her civic leadership emerged powerfully while she was enrolled in an English class at Northeast Lakeview College. An essay she wrote on the treatment of Military Working Dogs (MWDs) was so compelling that she was encouraged to pursue legislative action. Her involvement in the Politics in Action Club and her commitment to civic engagement led to her recognition as the **Alamo Colleges Student of the Month in December 2012.**

Lisa's advocacy ultimately contributed to the successful passage of the **Rambo K-9 Bill**, legislation ensuring that injured law enforcement K-9s in Texas are eligible to receive emergency and ongoing veterinary care.

The passage of the Rambo K-9 Bill:

- Protects law enforcement K-9s who serve as critical public safety partners
- Removes prior legal and financial barriers that limited life-saving medical treatment for injured service animals
- Establishes a humane and ethical standard for the treatment of working animals in public service
- Benefits communities across Texas by preserving highly trained K-9 units that directly support public safety operations

Beyond her legislative work, Lisa founded **Gizmo's Gifts**, a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization established in 2014 after her efforts to reclassify MWDs from "equipment" to canine members of the Armed Forces. Gizmo's Gifts provides:

- Free medical care for active duty and retired MWDs
- Transportation to their adoptive families
- Community education and awareness about the value of canine heroes

Her nonprofit "empowers canine heroes" through volunteers, sponsors, and community support, and has made a measurable impact on the lives of working dogs nationwide.

Lisa also travels locally and nationally to educate the public about the history, service, and needs of MWDs. Her TEDx Talk further amplifies this mission, highlighting the evolution of MWD recognition and the ongoing work of Gizmo's Gifts.

In addition, she established the **Staff Sgt. Carl Potter Working Dog Cemetery and Museum**, honoring her grandfather—a WWII POW—and all working animals, past and present.

These achievements reflect a sustained commitment to public service, ethical leadership, and the well-being of communities statewide and nationally. Her work constitutes outstanding public service to the state of Texas and to humanity at large, fully satisfying **Criterion 2** of ACCD Procedure E.1.3.1.

"The Board of Trustees hereby approves the award of contracts for the purchase of construction project management / program management services to AECOM Technical Services, Inc., Broaddus & Associates, Prolego Consulting Solutions, LLC. Freese & Nichols, Inc., Turner & Townsend Heery, or to the next highest ranked awardees that negotiate fair and reasonable prices and terms acceptable to District counsel, as requested by the Office of the Chancellor for Finance and Auxiliary Services

PURPOSE

To approve the purchase of construction project management / program management services from the selected awardees, including, without limitation, for the planning, design, and construction of Alamo Colleges District's 2025 General Obligation Bond Capital Improvement Program (2025 CIP).

Services will be performed, as needed, and based on requirements and funding, on an Indefinite Delivery, Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) basis District Wide. There is NO guarantee of any work associated with this approval.

Contractors may work on any of the Alamo Colleges District design and construction projects, which include new construction, remodeling, renovations, and/or system upgrades.

For 2025 CIP services the contractors will report to the Lacy Hampton Associate Vice Chancellor G.O. Bond Construction Improvement Program (CIP).

It is Alamo Colleges District's intent to contract for services until completion of the 2025 CIP. If at the end of the contract term, services are satisfactory and fees and rates remain unchanged, this minute order authorizes an option to extend the contract for an additional three-year renewal upon mutual consent of the Contractor and Alamo Colleges District.

BACKGROUND

FEDERAL UPDATES

- **FY '27 Budget Process Update**

- Process has begun for FY '27
- Pending - President's Proposed Budget Request to Congress
- House and Senate Appropriations Committees have sent guidance to members on how to submit their specific requests (programmatic support, language adjustments, and Community Project Funding requests (earmarks))
- Members of Congress can also submit Dear Colleague Letters supporting programs
 - Focus on Pell Grants
- Appropriators then work to review submissions and build appropriations bills
 - 12 bills are typically used in budget process
- Bill hearings and markups occur between now and September 30
- If bills are NOT passed by both chambers on or before September 30 then a Continuing Resolution must be approved to avoid a government shutdown

FEDERAL UPDATES

- **Pell Grants Update**

- Since the passage of the FAFSA Simplification Act of 2020 more students are applying and qualifying for Pell Grants
 - ACD increased Pell Grant access in 2 years from serving 21,741 student to 28,643 students
 - Our average student awards also increased from \$3,953 per student to \$4,964
- **One Big Beautiful Bill Act** – added \$10.5 B into the Pell Grant program to cover the projected shortfall for 2025
- The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) announced in February that new projections put the current shortfall at \$5.45 billion in FY26, \$11.5 billion in FY27, and \$132 billion by 2036.
- If Congress does nothing, the Department of Education (ED) could run out of Pell Grant funding for students in early 2027.
- Our top priority is protecting the Pell Grant program, without cutting Pell Grant eligibility or benefits.
- Letters will be sent to our congressional delegation as part of this effort along with advocacy during our upcoming SA to DC trip with the area chambers of commerce.

FEDERAL UPDATES

- **Regulatory Updates**

- U.S. Department of Education (DOE) has published Proposed Rules for Workforce Pell
 - Deadline for comment is April 8
 - Rules largely align with the consensus document provided by the AHEAD Committee
 - ACD will submit comments before the deadline
- Latest Actions Regarding DEI
 - Administration agreed to drop court appeal on DOE's Dear Colleague Letter sent out in February 2025, which said institutions participating in DEI programming and practices would be at risk of losing federal funding.
 - However, the U.S. Fourth Court of Appeals upheld 2 separate Executive Orders

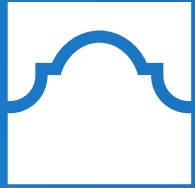

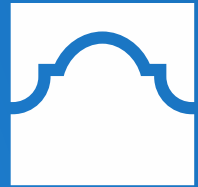

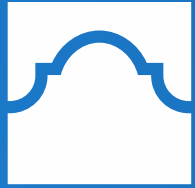

Discussion and Possible Action on Annual Employees Campaign Gifts to Alamo Colleges Foundation and United Way

Presented to the Board Acting as Committee of the Whole on April 9, 2024, and now presented to the Board for approval on March 24, 2026.

MINUTE ORDER

“The Alamo Colleges Board of Trustees hereby affirmatively opts not to participate in the state employee charitable contribution program for the state fiscal year beginning September 1, 2026, and further authorizes employee payroll deductions for charitable purposes as may be initiated by each employee in conjunction with the Alamo Colleges’ relationship with United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County, the Alamo Colleges Foundation, and such other charitable entities with which a formal relationships exists.”

PURPOSE

The Alamo Colleges have for at least the past ten years worked closely with both the United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County, and the Alamo Colleges Foundation, for the purpose of providing employees of the Alamo Colleges the opportunity to make charitable contributions through payroll deductions that support a broad range of community-based agencies and programs throughout the San Antonio and Bexar County area. Participation in the state employee charitable contribution program in lieu of the existing arrangement with the United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County, and the Alamo Colleges Foundation, would potentially dilute charitable gifts for community-based agencies and programs.

BACKGROUND

Alamo Colleges Policy D.5.1.1 pertaining to Payroll Procedures & Salary Deductions and Government Code 659.131 – as the Alamo Colleges are considered to be institutions of higher education and employees of the College District are considered to be state employees during a state fiscal year unless an affirmative decision not to participate in the state employee charitable contribution program is made by the Board. An employee of a public junior college district that elects not to participate in the state employee charitable contribution program may authorize a deduction from the employee’s salary or wage payment for a charitable contribution as provided by the policy of the Board.

SUBJECT: ***MONTHLY ACTIVITY REPORT***

Please find attached the Alamo Colleges District Police Department's Monthly CLERY Act activity report through February 2026 and the yearly totals summary page. Please note that the report reflects new CLERY reporting activity categories enacted in 2008 and required beginning in 2009 when a bias motivation is present, including the Theft / Larceny category, which was not part of the previous CLERY reporting requirement; however, it was previously included for informational purposes. None were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2011, effective for reporting year 2011, to include reports received for Simple Assault that are motivated by bias or hate. Simple Assaults are included in this report for information purposes; however, none were motivated by bias or hate. The CLERY Act was amended in 2014 as per VAWA and Campus SaVE Acts, effective 2015, to include reports of Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking.

Burglary of a motor vehicle is considered a theft from a vehicle under Uniform Crime Reporting definitions and therefore is included in the Theft category for CLERY purposes. For CLERY reporting purposes the Theft / Larceny category includes all thefts and burglary of motor vehicle reports made to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department and is reported as one total when reported to the Department of Education and published by the Department in its annual report. They have, however, been separated for this report.

Theft totals listed on this report include all thefts of district property and personal property belonging to students, faculty and staff reported to the Alamo Colleges District Police Department.



"The vision of the Alamo Colleges Police Department is To Be The Best in The Nation" while fulfilling its mission of providing a safe environment through a high level of proficiency in which all members of the District community may work, teach, study and learn. This department, in the daily performance of its function, stresses: Service, the protection of life, property and investment, the security of the campuses, and the pursuit of excellence in campus law enforcement and safety.

*The reports below include arrests by being booked into 201 N. Comal (The Justice Intake Assessment Annex), by being issued a citation (other than traffic), or by being detained and released with possible pending charges being filed with the Bexar County District Attorney's Office.

- 1) **PAC (079081 – Theft)** On 02/06/2026, an officer was dispatched to take a report of theft of a license plate from Lot 5. The officer met with a male (student) who stated his front plate was removed without his permission. He wasn't sure if it was taken on campus or off. He was given a case number and informed to get new plates from the DMV. The plate was entered into the state database as stolen.
- 2) **NVC (079084 – Criminal Mischief)** On 02/06/2026, an officer was dispatched to Mount Laurel Hall for a report of graffiti on the men's restroom stall. The graffiti was a swastika written in indelible marker. The facilities division was notified and removed the writing. The damage was estimated at approximately \$50. There are no suspects for this incident.
- 3) **SPC (079095 – Possession of Drug Paraphernalia)** On 02/09/2026, an officer was patrolling Lot 21 on St. Phillips College campus. The officer smelled the odor of marijuana while riding a bicycle in the parking lot. The officer identified the smell coming from a vehicle occupied by two male students. One of the males was cited and released for possession of paraphernalia.
- 4) **SAC (079103 – Possession of Drug Paraphernalia)** On 02/09/2026, an officer was dispatched to the Oppenheimer Academic Center on the San Antonio College campus. The officer responded and found a female (student) sitting in a classroom, partially conscious. EMS was called and assessed the female, who was regaining consciousness. The female was in possession of 2 glass pipes. She was issued a citation for the paraphernalia.
- 5) **SWC (079111 – Burglary of Vehicle)** On 02/10/2026, an officer was flagged down near the Diesel Lab at Southwest Campus. A female (student) reported that a parked vehicle had the passenger side window broken. The owner of the vehicle claimed they had approximately 7 pairs of tennis shoes in the vehicle. They did not know when the vehicle was burglarized. Campus police will review the video footage.
- 6) **PAC (079143 – Criminal Mischief)** On 02/13/2026, an officer responded to the Ozuna Building at Palo Alto College. The officer met with a male employee, who reported graffiti in the men's restroom near room 130. The employee suspected that high school students were responsible for the vandalism. Campus police will review the video for footage of suspects. The Facilities Division was notified regarding the graffiti.
- 7) **SAC (079144 – Possession of Dangerous Drugs)** On 02/14/2026, an officer was patrolling to the parking garage at San Antonio College in Garage #2. The officer observed an intoxicated male (non-student) yelling at people in the garage. The male was taken into custody and booked into 401 S Frio for Public Intoxication. While at the jail, the male was found to have additional drugs hidden and was charged with taking Prohibited Substances into a Correctional Facility.
- 8) **SAC (079159 – Assault Threaten Bodily Injury)** On 02/16/2026, a male student came to the Campus Police Office at San Antonio College. The male wanted to report a male who had threatened him. The male stated he confronted another male who had entered one of the female restrooms in the Loftin Center. The male student didn't know the male but gave a description. The male student stated he did not want to file charges for the threat. The male was given a report number and informed to contact police dispatch if he saw the male again.
- 9) **SAC (079167 – Assault Bodily Injury)** On 02/17/2026, an officer was dispatched to the Oppenheimer Building at The San Antonio College. The officer arrived and found a male (non-student) and a female (non-student) arguing. The female had marks on her arm from the male. The

male and female were in a relationship. The male was arrested for Assault-Family Violence and was transported to the Bexar County Jail.

- 10) PAC (079170 – Assault)** On 02/17/2026, An officer received a call from an employee that a high school female student reported unwelcomed contact a male. The female student stated she didn't know the unknown male or whether he was a student. She stated he has appeared a few times when she is on break. The female states she doesn't want to file charges because she believes the person is on the Autism spectrum. Campus officers are attempting to identify this suspect. The case is still open pending identification. The incident has been reported to Title IX at PAC.
- 11) SAC (079237 – Terroristic Threat)** On 02/25/2026, an officer was dispatched to the San Antonio College Campus Police office. A female (student) stated that a male she met online and went on one date with threatened her. The male (unknown full name) had threatened to release sexually explicit pictures of the student (which she previously provided). The male became upset that the student stopped responding to his calls/texts. He threatened that he would kill her. This case has been assigned to the Investigations Division and is on the DPS threat assessment watch.
- 12) PAC (079241 – Assault)** On 02/25/2026, an officer was dispatched to the portable room #102 at Palo Alto Campus. The officer met with a male (student) who stated another male threatened him in the Ozuna Building. The male didn't know whether the suspect was a student. He gave a good description, and the Campus officers are attempting to identify the suspect. This case is open pending identification.
- 13) SAC (079244 – Disorderly Conduct)** On 02/26/2026, a female came to the Campus Police Office to report a verbal argument in Parking Garage #3. Officers responded to Parking Garage #3 and located the two females arguing. One of the females took the other female's keys and phone and attempted to throw them off the garage. The officer stopped the female from tossing the items. The aggressor was cited for disorderly conduct, and the females went their separate ways.

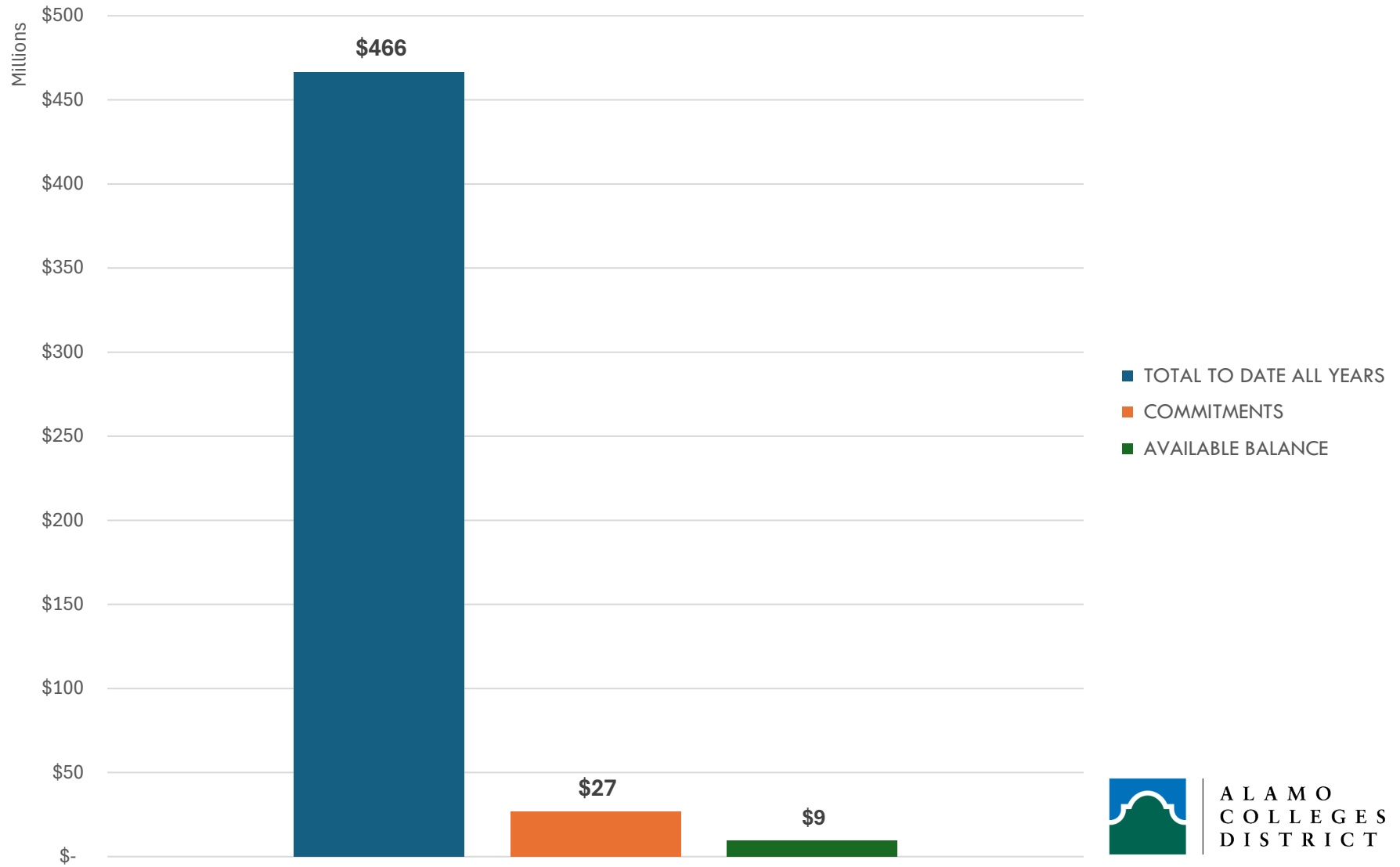

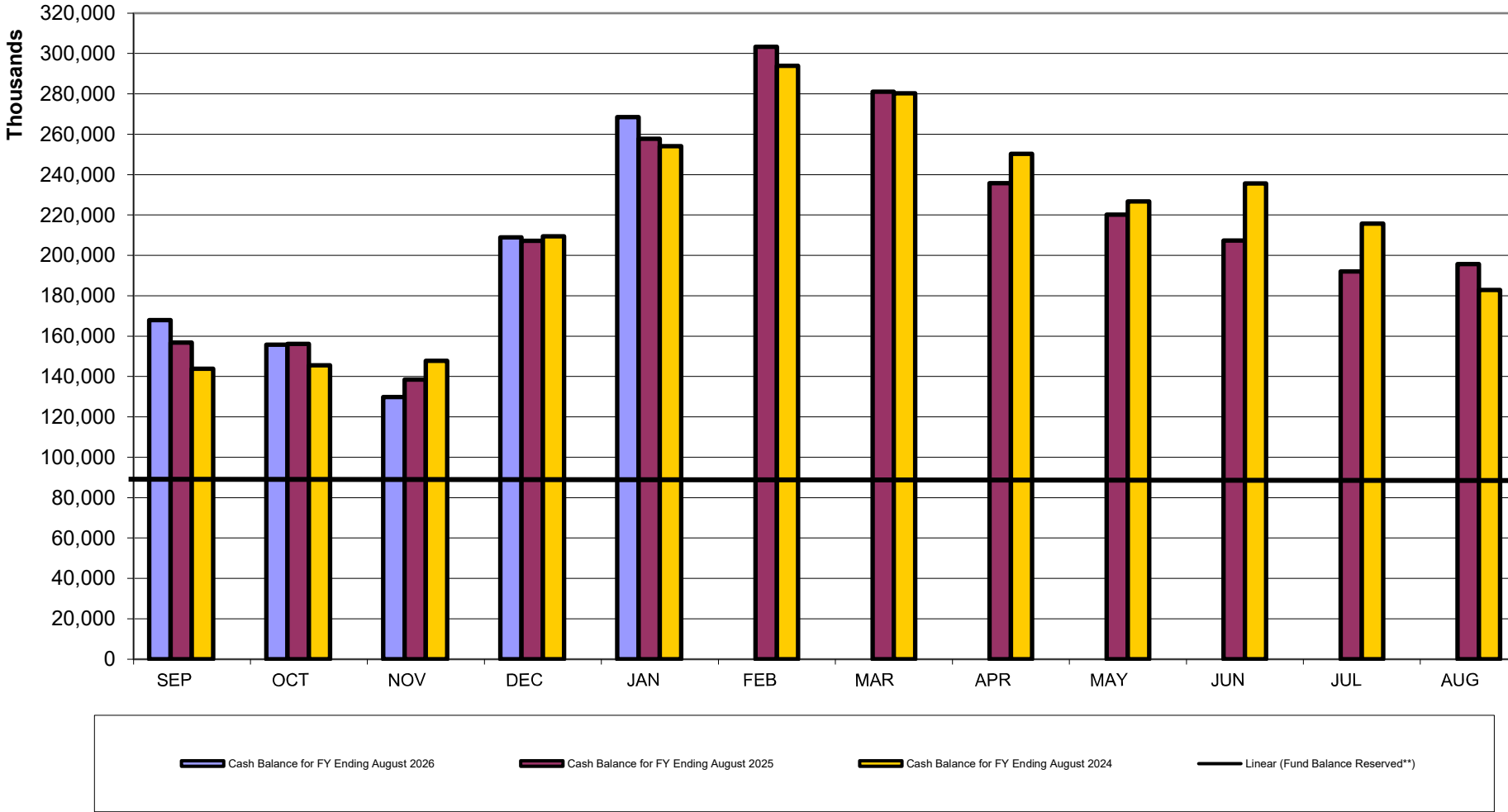

 Through January 2026



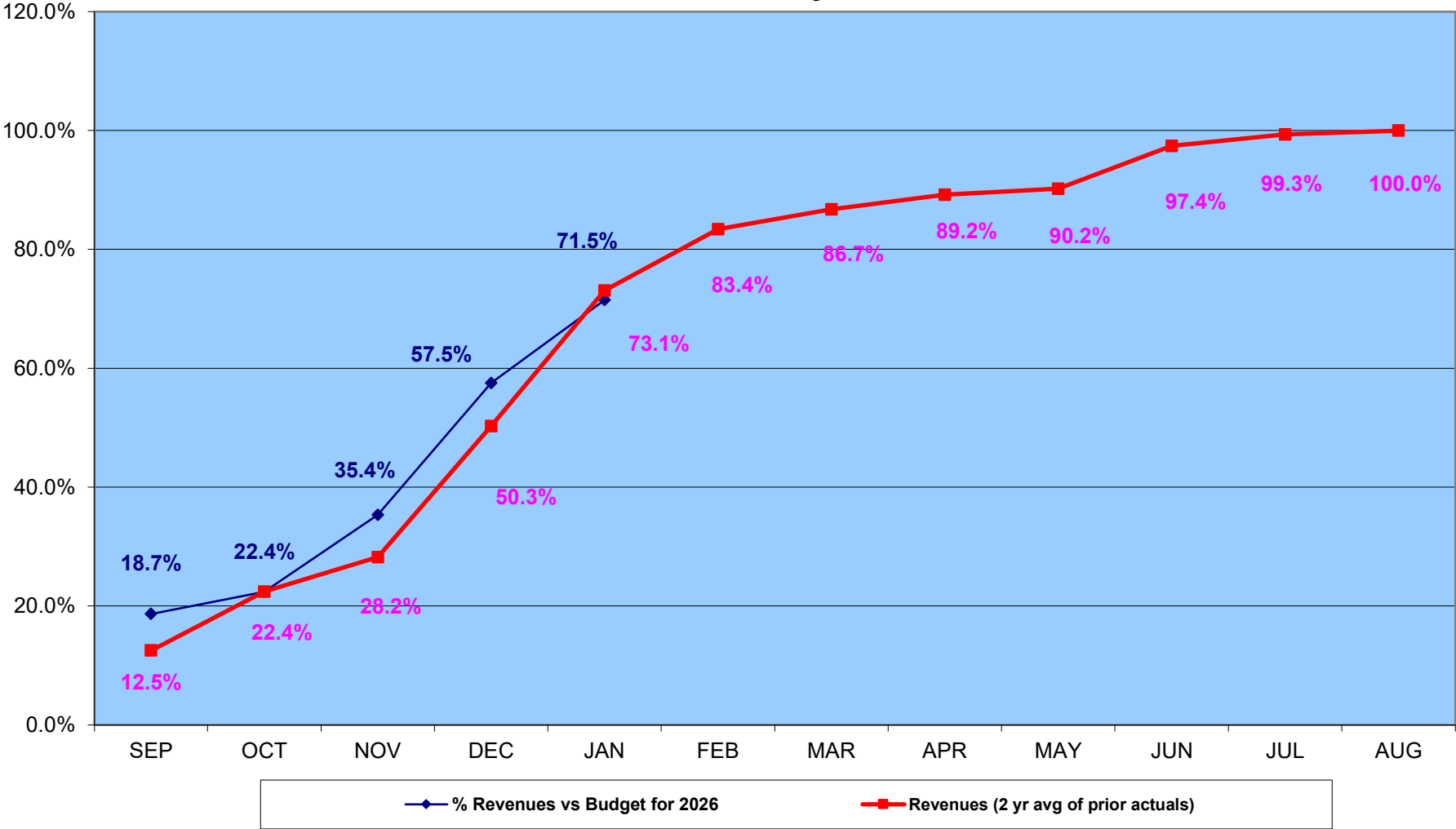

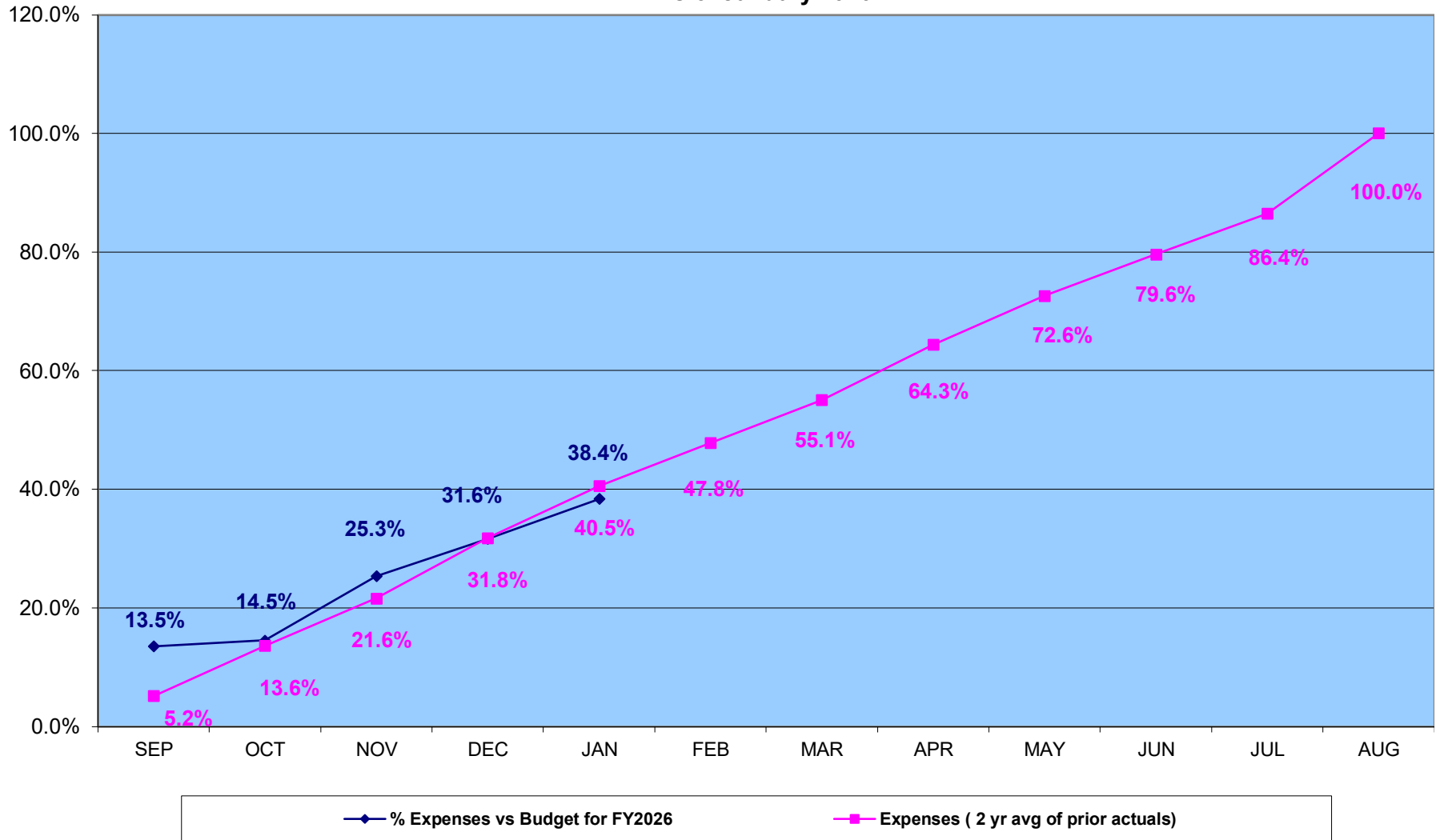

Not all COOP programs charge fees, and some COOP's offer cash rebates paid directly to Alamo Colleges. The Purchasing and Contract Administration Department utilizes the COOP programs to gain greater access to goods and services, cost savings through leveraged buying, and reduced administration costs by issuing fewer competitive bids and proposals. The combined buying power of public institutions throughout the State of Texas nationally translates into savings and provides an efficient, cost effective and legal means for providing goods and services to departments throughout the Alamo Colleges in an expedited fashion.

BACKGROUND

Vendor contracts awarded through approved federal, state, or cooperative purchasing agreements are a statutorily approved alternative to competitively procured vendor contracts. Only the following contract purchases require prior Board approval:

- a. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that will result in additional gross square footage (permanent or otherwise) that will require cleaning and maintaining and have at least two utilities present.
- b. Purchases valued at \$200,000 or more in any 12-month period that in the judgment of the Chancellor or Purchasing & Contract Administration would commit the College District or one of the colleges to an entirely new technology that would be pervasive for subsequent years.

For any cooperative purchasing contract valued at \$25,000 or more, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall document any contract-related fee, including any management fee. At least annually, Purchasing & Contract Administration shall present a written report regarding any contract-related fees, including any management fees, to the Board of Trustees at a properly posted open meeting.



Quarterly Market Summary:

During the District's second quarter for fiscal year 2026, the FOMC continued to transition monetary policy from easing to a more cautious stance. In December, policymakers reduced the federal funds rate to 3.50%–3.75%, then held that range steady in January while signaling a data-dependent approach going forward. Inflation remained above the 2% target, economic growth continued at a moderate pace, and the labor market showed signs of gradual cooling without significant deterioration. At the same time, escalating geopolitical tensions, including instability in Venezuela and conflict in the Middle East, contributed to volatility in commodity prices, periodic risk-off sentiment in equity markets, and a modest steepening of the Treasury yield curve as investors reassessed inflation risks and the likely path of Fed policy.

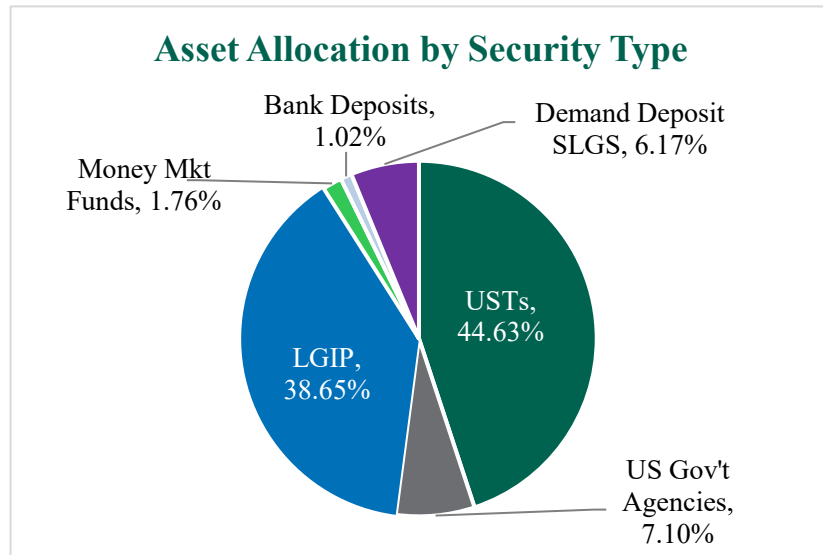
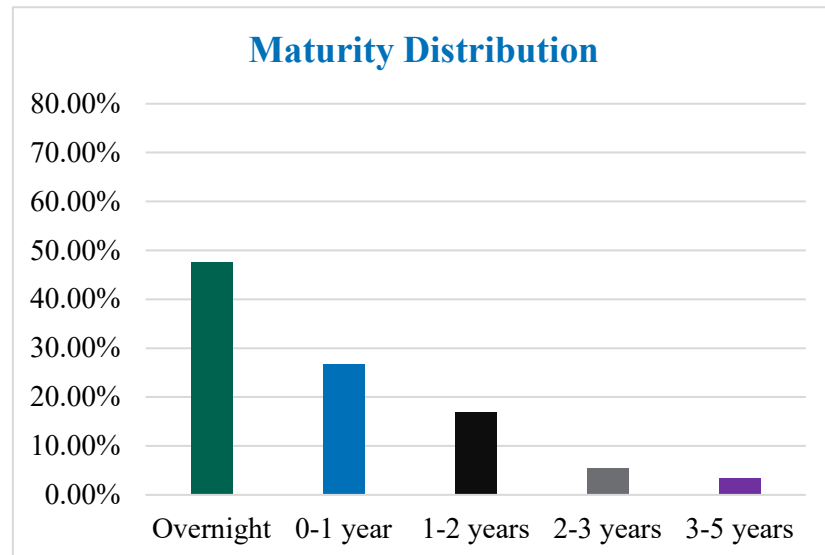

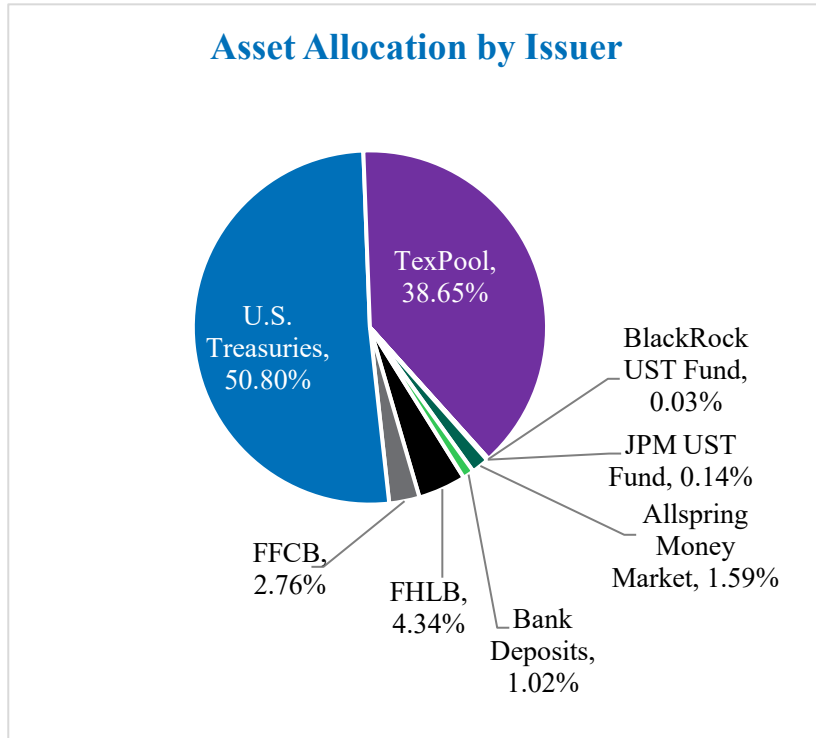
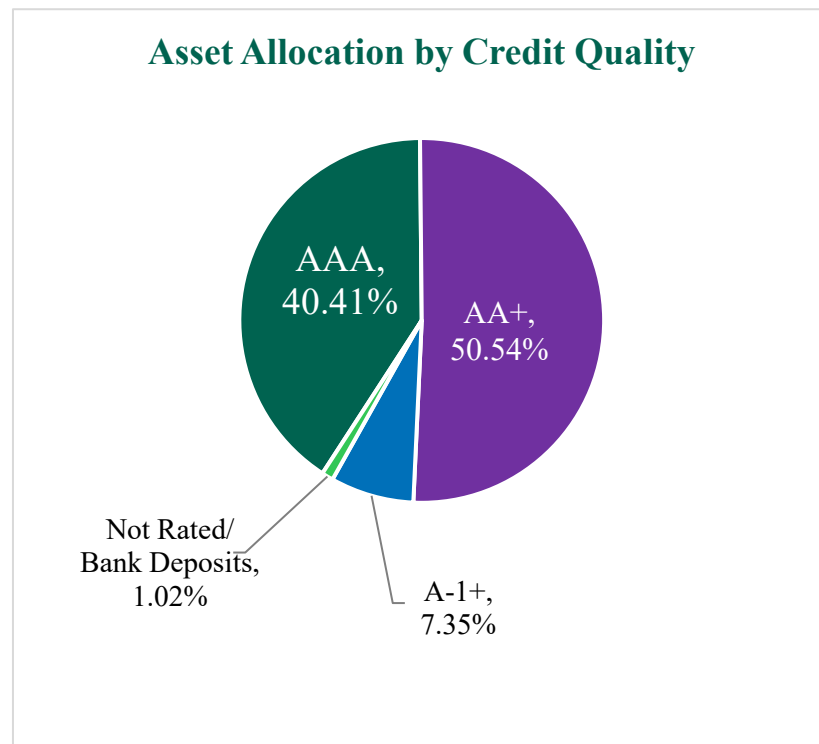

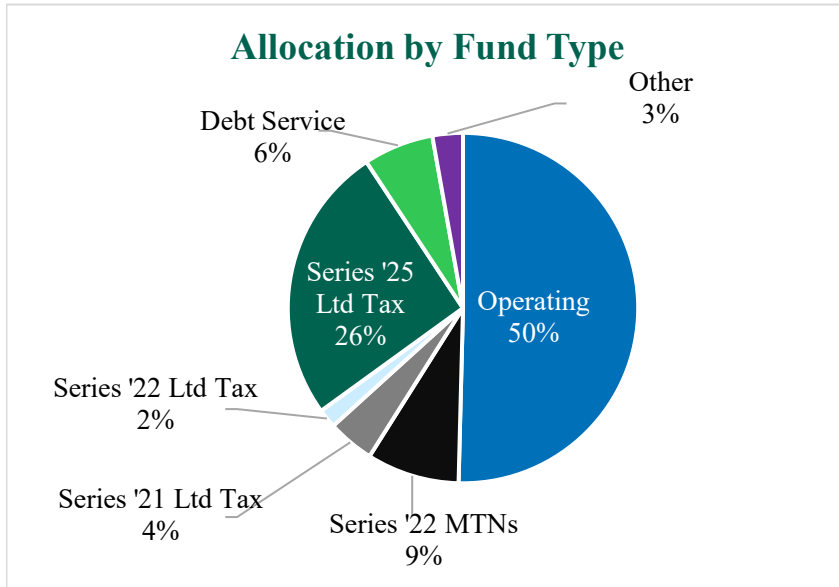
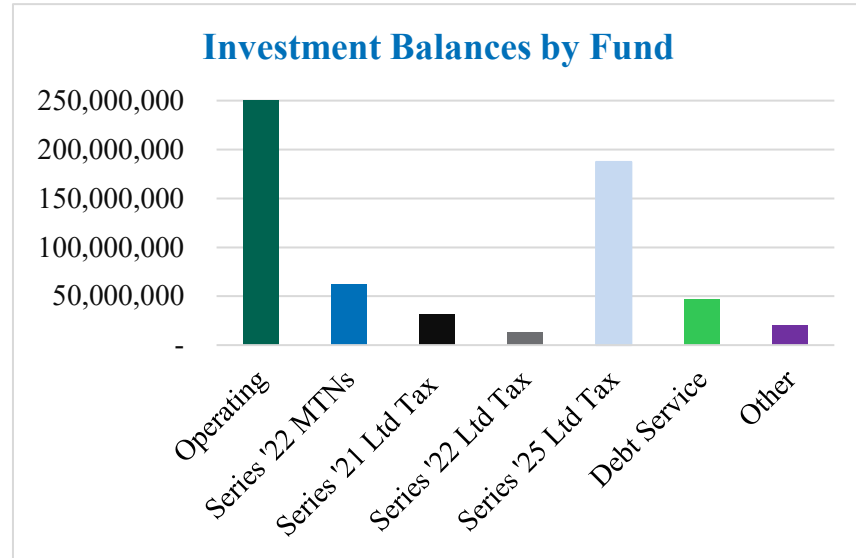
