- The Council may enter into closed session to discuss any matter on this agenda when it is determined that a closed session is clearly necessary for the protection of the public interest or the prevention of needless injury to the reputation of an individual (if such individual has not requested a public meeting) or as otherwise allowed by law. Any closed session shall be limited to the subject matter for which the closed session was called. If the motion to close passes, then immediately prior to the closed session the Mayor shall restate on the record the limitation of the subject matter of the closed session.

ORDINANCE NO. 21802

1 AN ORDINANCE amending Title 9 of the Lincoln Municipal Code relating to Public
2 Peace and Welfare to create a new chapter 9.70 entitled "Crypto Currency" to provide guidelines
3 for cryptocurrency ATMs and Bitcoin ATMs and penalties for violating the same.

4 BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Lincoln, Nebraska:

5 Section 1. That Title 9 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended by adding a new
6 section numbered 9.70.010 to read as follows:

7 **9.70.010 Definitions.**

8 The following words as used in this chapter shall have the following meanings:

9 Cryptocurrency shall mean a virtual currency that utilizes cryptography to secure transactions that are
10 digitally recorded on a cryptographically secured, distributed ledger or blockchain.

11 Crypto ATM or Bitcoin ATM shall mean a stand-alone electronic kiosk that allows users to buy and sell
12 cryptocurrency in exchange for cash or with a debit card.

13 Blockchain shall mean a decentralized ledger that stores information across a network of computers or
14 nodes in blocks that are verified and validated to ensure legitimate and accurate transactions.

15 Section 2. That Title 9 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended by adding a new
16 section numbered 9.70.020 to read as follows:

17 **9.70.020 Cryptocurrency Automated Teller Warning Notice.**

18 1. Any person or business operating, or providing access to, a functioning crypto ATM or Bitcoin ATM
19 on its premises shall post a written warning in the form of a sign provided by law enforcement and
20 within readable sight of the crypto ATM or Bitcoin ATM providing notice to customers and users of
21 the potential fraud or scam risks associated with utilizing the crypto ATM or Bitcoin ATM.

1 2. Any person or business upon whom a duty is placed by the provisions of this chapter who shall fail or
2 neglect or refuse to perform such duty shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction
3 thereof shall be punished by a fine of \$500.00, recoverable with costs.


4 3. Each day that a violation continues shall constitute a separate and distinct offense and shall be
5 punished as such.

6 Section 3. That Sections 1 and 2 of this Ordinance shall be codified in the Lincoln
7 Municipal Code as Chapter 9.70 entitled Crypto Currency.

8 Section 4. That Chapter 9.70 shall go into force and effect **30 DAYS FROM MAYOR'S SIGNATURE**
on ~~January 16, 2026.~~


9 Section 5. This ordinance shall be published, within fifteen days after the passage
10 hereof, in one issue of a daily or weekly newspaper of general circulation in the City, or posted on
11 the official bulletin board of the City, located on the wall across from the City Clerk's office at
12 555 S. 10th Street, in lieu and in place of the foregoing newspaper publication with notice of
13 passage and such posting to be given by publication one time in the official newspaper by the City
14 Clerk. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication
15 or after its posting and notice of such posting given by publication as herein and in the City Charter
16 provided.
