Under state law, the dollar amount of school taxes imposed on the residence homestead of a person 65 years of age or older or of the surviving spouse of such a person, if the surviving spouse was 55 years of age or older when the person died, may not be increased above the amount paid in the first year after the person turned 65, regardless of changes in tax rate or property value.

Notice of Voter-Approval Rate: The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is \$1.32299. This election will be automatically held if the district adopts a rate in excess of the voter-approval rate of \$1.32299.

COVID-19 Policy & Procedures- UPDATED 08/18/2021

- Masks are not required
 - If you or your child(ren) choose to wear a mask, please provide the masks for them.
- If a student tests positive for COVID they can return to school once they are 24-hour fever free **AND** a physician has cleared them to return to school.
- We are not required to do contact tracing. However, the school will notify parents of classmates if a student or staff member test positive and has been present at school.
- Students will be sent home from school if they have COVID symptoms **AND** a fever of 100.3 or higher.
- A doctor's note will be sufficient for an extended absence.
- If a student tests POSITIVE:
 - 10-day quarantine from symptom onset
 - May return after 10 days if:
 - Fever free for 24 hours **AND**
 - Other symptoms have improved
 - Please provide a physician's note giving the student clearance to return to school
- If a student was in CLOSE CONTACT:
 - Parents of students who are determined to be close contacts of an individual with COVID-19 **may opt** to keep their students at home during the recommended stay-at-home period:
 - 10-day quarantine **OR**
 - 7-day quarantine accompanied by a negative test on day 6 or day 7 of quarantine
 - Monitor for symptoms
- If a student is absent for a positive test result or quarantine due to close contact exposure within the household or if a physician has ordered quarantine the parent must contact Rio Vista ISD to setup remote conferencing to receive instruction and attendance credit.

*CDC defines close contact as someone who was within 6 feet for a total of 15 minutes or more within 2 days prior to illness onset, regardless of whether the contact was wearing a mask.

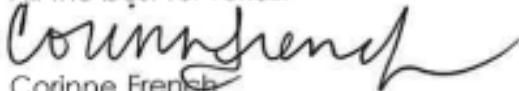
