IV. Operations

A. Facilities Update:

- Reroof at Daniel Boone High is complete. In the process of removing left over material and debris. Soffit material at the auxiliary gym is back ordered 4 or 5 weeks.
- The awning replacement at Lamar Elementary has not been accepted yet. Determining the next steps. This could include securing another vendor to complete or repair the job.
- Status of lighting replacement by Excel Energy Group; Completion of the project is anticipated for the 27th. The project has been a very smooth and trouble free project.
- Practice football field at David Crockett High is in process. Some of the dirt from turf installation will be utilized to fill in for practice area.
- The Lewis Group will be working up new cost estimate for David Crockett High culinary arts department.
- ESG is in process of manning the HVAC system pump install at Daniel Boone High. Pumps should be delivered this week and control wires will begin being pulled throughout the buildings.
- Installation of turf will begin March 21st - weather permitting. High School football fields will be out of service beginning March 21st.
- Daniel Boone High kitchen specifications are nearly complete and will be let for bid.
- David Crockett High backordered kitchen equipment will be installed the week of March 25th.
- Purchase order has been issued for sound boards at Lamar. Shipping date is not known.
- Shampoo chairs at Daniel Boone High Cosmetology Dept. are installed.
- System wide installation of 40 bottle fill stations will be done as time is available for the plumbers.

Mr. Boyd said he would be presenting upgrades for the house lighting in the little theater at David Crockett High.

Ms. Buchanan asked for it to be looked into on replacing the stage curtains at Daniel Boone High and David Crockett High.

Mr. Boyd noted David Crockett High administration included replacement of the state curtains in their requested budget items for FY23.

Mr. Boyd presented a proposal for employees to receive a one-time bonus from the COVID sick leave that was unused. Full time employees would receive \$300.00; part-time \$150.00. Mr. Boyd said the intention of COVID sick leave pay was to benefit the employees and the line of thinking of using the balance for employees.

C. FY23 General Budget Draft Documents

Mr. Boyd began with explaining the process up to this point for the provided FY23 budget documents, beginning with receiving input from each school with their foreseen needs/requests. Mr. Boyd said reoccurring cost was also reviewed.

Mr. Boyd presented the amount requests, per school, based on requested additional personnel, instructional programs, materials, and equipment.

Chairman Day asked where to spend the most to get the system to the next level? He suggested evaluating each area and determine the best allocation of funds.

Ms. Dellinger urged for lower teacher/pupil ratios.

The Board proceeded with reviewing district department requests, both non-reoccurring and reoccurring expenses. Mr. Boyd noted a big expense would be math textbook adoption in sy22-23.

Mr. Riddle asked to review the direction of CTE programs. Also the target for each school and what it will take to reach the goal.

A work session for the FY23 budget will be scheduled.




- Reroof at DBHS is complete. In the process of removing left over material and debris. Soffit material at the auxiliary gym is back ordered 4 or 5 weeks.





Coordinated School Health Activity Bus

Overview

Coordinated School Health (CSH) would like to convert a retired school bus into a rolling asset for our district. In an effort to improve both student health and student learning, the bus will be converted into an activity bus with the slogan, “Healthy Kids Learn Better”. The bus will be filled with activities and games that are designed to be played outdoors but will also be suitable for indoor use for inclement weather and winter months.

The Plan

The bus will have the seats removed and barriers will be placed on each side of the aisle to secure games when in transit. The games added to the bus will include but not limited to:

- Corn Hole
- Pickle Ball
- Ladder Ball
- Frisbee Golf
- Ring Toss
- Spike Ball
- Gaga Ball
- Frisbee Set
- Jump Rope Set

A notebook detailing each game and instructions of each game will be located in the bus.

The bus is intended for use during Physical Education classes. The instructor will call Meagan Meade at the CSH Office to reserve the bus. She will be handling the scheduling of the bus and working with our transportation department to get it delivered to a school. Mrs. Meade will provide you with all the details about the games and activities, bus parking, access to the bus, and timelines of use. Our office will work with each school’s administration team to determine the best bus parking location for easy access to the games and not in the way of current school specific ingress and egress patterns.

The bus will be reserved for one week to allow all students the opportunity to utilize the activities. The bus will be brought to the school. The school will be provided with a key to access the bus to get the games and will be responsible for the safe use and storing of the games and then securing the bus at the end of each day.

Making a change to the Washington County Schools 403(b) retirement plan requires careful thought and consideration. As members of the board, you are entrusted to balance the best interests of both the school district and its employees.

A preliminary review of the plan shows that employees of Washington County Schools are participating at a far lower rate (15%) than the national average for school district employees (27%)¹. These numbers indicate that there is a lot that can be done to help our employees along the path towards a secure retirement.
