This constitutes an agreement between the Nebraska Safety Center (NSC) at the University of Nebraska at Kearney and Franklin High School.

The NSC will provide our Driver Education course to Franklin High School during the 2020 calendar year for the sum of \$330 per student. The driver's education course consists of parent and student orientation, classroom instruction, slow-speed driving exercises on the NSC driving Range, and on-street driving with a certified instructor.

The NSC requires a minimum number of 8 students in order to hold the class, which may consist of students from the surrounding areas. The class will be held at the Franklin High School. The registration deadline is two weeks prior to the start of class.

A brochure and registration form for the school to copy and distribute, will be sent separately after receipt of the signed agreement by the NSC. The NSC will process student registrations. A student and parent orientation will be scheduled at the beginning of the first class session.

Franklin 1 Classroom: June 29-July 2; from 8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Range Exercises in Kearney: Friday, July 3; from 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Scheduling for on-street driving and testing will be arranged by the instructor for outside of classroom times and will be conducted in the local school area. No on-street interstate lesson will be taught in Kearney on July 24th.

The NSC will provide the on-street vehicle(s) and fuel, classroom materials, and use of the Cope Driving Range; as well as set-up and instruction of Range exercises.

Franklin High School is responsible for transporting and supervising students to and from the classroom facility and the Cope Driving Range in Kearney.

Franklin High School is also responsible for communicating class dates, times, and locations to the students and providing a classroom, computer including Internet access and DVD player with a projector as well as required usernames/passwords.

3048 Communicable Disease

The school district strives to provide a safe environment for both students and staff while safeguarding the rights of all students and employees, including those with communicable diseases.

Communicable Diseases. Communicable diseases are defined by the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services in Title 173 Nebraska Administrative Code Chapter 1 and include HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis (A, B, and E), Measles, Mumps, and Tuberculosis.

School Attendance and Participation in School Sponsored Activities. A student who has been diagnosed with a communicable disease shall be provided with educational services in accordance with state law and board policy. Generally, individuals with a communicable disease will be restricted only to the extent necessary to prevent the transmission of the disease, to protect their health and rights of privacy, and to protect the health and safety of others. The decision regarding a student's education program and placement shall be made on an individual basis in light of current medical and educational information and recommendations. These will be determined by the superintendent, the student's Section 504 or Individualized Education Program (IEP) team, or the district's Crisis Team. In addition, participation in Nebraska School Athletic Association (NSAA) events will be subject to its rules and procedures, if any.

Infection and Exposure Control Procedures/Universal Precautions. The district will monitor the information available through the Federal Centers for Disease Control, the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services, and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration. This policy and any procedures, universal precautions, or exposure control plan will be modified, if appropriate, based upon the best new medical information provided by the above sources.

The superintendent will take appropriate measures if there is an epidemic or outbreak of a communicable disease which may include, but it's not limited to, the emergency exclusion or alternative placement of students or the closure of a school building or the entire school district.

Confidentiality. The existence of an individual's communicable disease shall be treated as confidential and will be limited to school staff on a "need-to-know" basis. If it is necessary to inform a person of another's condition (due to exposure, for instance), the person will be notified of the confidentiality of that disclosure. In addition, any communication about a student's

communicable disease shall be consistent with that student's IEP or Section 504 Plan, if any.

Staff Training. Staff will receive training regarding communicable diseases and the requirements of this policy and any adopted procedures as part of the training received under the Workplace Injury Prevention and Safety Committee policy.

Reporting. School staff who learn that an individual has a communicable disease will report it to the proper authority as required by Title 173 Nebraska Administrative Code Chapter 1

6031 Emergency Exclusion

Grounds for Emergency Exclusion. Any student may be excluded from school in the following circumstances subject to the procedural provisions governing short term suspension found elsewhere in these policies or state law:

(a) If the student has a dangerous communicable disease transmissible through normal school contacts and poses an imminent threat to the health or safety of the school community; or

(b) If the student's conduct presents a clear threat to the physical safety of himself, herself, or others, or is so extremely disruptive as to make temporary removal necessary to preserve the rights of other students to pursue an education.

Any emergency exclusion shall be based upon a clear factual situation warranting it and shall last no longer than is necessary to avoid the dangers that prompted the exclusion.

Extension of Exclusion. Pursuant to the Student Discipline Act, the principal has the authority to exclude a student from school for up to five school days on an emergency basis. If the superintendent or superintendent's designee determines that it is appropriate to consider the extension of an exclusion beyond five days, such consideration shall be made according to the procedures set forth below.

Notification of Student's Parent(s) or Guardian(s). The superintendent or the superintendent's designee shall notify the student's parent(s) or guardian(s) that the principal has proposed the extension of the exclusion. If the initial notice is oral, the superintendent shall confirm it in writing.

Opportunity to Request a Hearing. The student's parent(s) or guardian(s) may submit an oral request for a hearing on the proposed extension of the exclusion within two school days of receiving the initial notice. If the initial request for a hearing is oral, they shall confirm the request in writing.

Failure to Request a Hearing. If the parent(s) or guardian(s) do not request a hearing within two school days of receiving oral or written notice, the proposed extension of the exclusion shall automatically go into effect.

Appointment and Qualifications of a Hearing Examiner. If the parent(s) or guardian(s) request a hearing, the superintendent shall appoint a hearing examiner upon receiving a request for a hearing. The hearing examiner may be any person who did not bring charges against the student, is not to be a witness at the hearing, and has no involvement in the charge.

Hearing Examiner's Notice to Parent(s) or Guardian(s). The hearing examiner shall promptly give written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. The hearing will be held within five school days after the school district receives the initial oral or written request; provided, the hearing may be held more than five school days after receipt of the request upon a showing of good cause. No hearing will be held on less than two (2) school days' notice unless otherwise agreed to by the student's parent(s) or guardian(s) and school officials.

Continued Exclusion. If a hearing is requested, the principal may determine in his or her sole discretion that the student shall remain excluded from school until the hearing officer makes a recommendation to the superintendent.

Examination of Student's Records and Affidavits. Prior to the hearing, the student and his/her parent(s) or guardian(s) shall have the right to examine and have school officials explain the student's records and any affidavits that will be used by school officials at the hearing.

Attendance at Hearing. The hearing may be attended by the hearing examiner, the principal (or designee), the student, and the student's parents or guardian(s). The student may be represented at this hearing by a representative of the family's choice.

Student's Witness(es). The student and his/her parent(s) or guardian(s) may ask any person with knowledge of the events leading up to the sanction or with general knowledge of the student's character to testify on behalf of the student. If school personnel or other students are requested to testify by the student's parent(s) or guardian(s), the hearing officer shall endeavor to help obtain the presence of such witnesses at the hearing.

Right to Know Issues and Nature of Testimony. The student and his/her parent(s) or guardian(s) have the right to request in advance of the hearing the issues which the administration will propose in support of the extension, and the general nature of the testimony of any administrative or expert witnesses.

Presence of Student and Witnesses at the Hearing. The student and witnesses may be excluded at the discretion of the hearing examiner in accordance with state statutes. The student may speak in his/her own defense and may be questioned on such testimony, but may choose not to testify.

Sworn or Affirmed Testimony. The principal or his or her designee shall present evidence supporting the recommended extension of the exclusion. Witnesses will give testimony under oath of affirmation, and may be questioned.

Hearing Examiner's Report and Recommendations. The hearing examiner shall prepare a report of his or her findings and recommendations, and forward the report to the superintendent.

Superintendent's Decision. The superintendent will review the hearing examiner's report and determine whether to extend the exclusion. He or she shall have the decision delivered or sent by registered or certified mail to the student, student's parent(s), or guardian(s). If the superintendent decides to extend the exclusion, the extension will take effect immediately.



Keep Calm and Carry On

If you've caught the news, hopped on Twitter, or checked your email this week you know that more cases of COVID-19, commonly referred to as the coronavirus, are being reported worldwide. As a result, schools are being urged again to review their preparedness for outbreaks of communicable disease. Fortunately, most schools already have policies in place that allow them to effectively respond to a pandemic. Additionally, schools can look to their state educational agency for support in responding to this issue. For example, we've been communicating with the Nebraska Department of Education, which is working closely with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services to make resources and support readily available. The Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services is already providing the public its most up-to-date information at this [site](#).

With this foundation in place, the best thing you can do is keep calm, and use this opportunity to review your policies, consider your implementing procedures, and reassure your school community that you are monitoring the situation and prepared to respond as appropriate.

Check Your Policies and Procedures

Most schools will already have policies in place that authorize school officials to exclude students, close school, or take other appropriate actions to respond to an outbreak of communicable disease. For our policy service subscribers, policies 3013 *Emergency Closings*, 3048 *Communicable Diseases*, and 6031 *Emergency Exclusion* provide this authority to the superintendent. Policy 3048 *Communicable Disease*, best summarizes the superintendent's authority and responsibility should the coronavirus require responsive action:

The superintendent will take appropriate measures if there is an epidemic or outbreak of a communicable disease which may include, but is not limited to, the emergency exclusion or alternative placement of students or the closure of a school building or the entire school district.

As you review your policies, you should also consider what procedures you would follow to carry them out. We would also recommend that you identify who will be responsible for monitoring the developing information related to the spread of coronavirus and what resources will be relied upon, such as the Department of Health and Human Services.

It is also important to take proactive steps to maintain health and peace of mind. Remind your students and staff of the importance of good hygiene, and encourage those who are sick to remain home. To that end, refresh yourself on your sick-leave and FMLA policies. Finally, remind your employees that a considerable amount of disinformation is shared during any public health emergency, and that they should seek out reliable sources of information that do not benefit from misrepresenting the facts (such as state and local health departments, the CDC, or the WHO.)

Communicate Effectively

In situations like these, we always recommend that schools communicate with the public about their proactive approach. To help you do so, we've developed the following statement you can provide parents after reviewing your policies and, if necessary, updating them.

Dear Parents and Students,

The district is monitoring the developing information related to the spread of COVID-19 (commonly referred to as the coronavirus). To date, the district is unaware of any native cases of COVID-19 being reported in our state.

However, the district has reviewed its relevant policies and procedures and is confident that it is prepared to respond to any outbreak of communicable disease that may occur. Should this situation interfere with the district's

ordinary operations or schedule, you will be provided notice in the customary fashion.

We encourage you to remain informed about the spread of the coronavirus, and would recommend that you visit the website for the Department of Health and Human Services, found here, for further information as it develops. We would also encourage you to use this opportunity to remind your students of the importance of getting rest and washing hands, especially during cold and flu season.

February 12, 2020

Members Present: Adam Boettcher (Chair), Donna Wery (Food Services Director), Jamie Silas (Elem. Teacher), Taelyn Pritchard (Student), Ryan Hoffman (PE Teacher), Erica Bonham (FACS Teacher), Jan Weiss (Parent), and Leah Stall (Elem. PE Teacher)

Members Absent: Seth Elley (Science Teacher), Claire Harrison (Student), Logan Wentworth (Student), Raquel Felzien (Board Member), and Michelle Kahrs (Parent)

1. The purpose of tonight's meeting was to discuss the results of the Lunch Survey which was made available to Students and Staff, as well as, Patrons from January 6th to January 31st. Below is a list of recommendations for improvement in our schools Lunch Program that came from this discussion:
 - a. Portion Size and Guidelines continues to be a hot topic between patrons and staff. The committee recommends putting out to the public a student friendly flyer, post on facebook, or something that explains what the guidelines for meals are and why we need to follow those guidelines. Donna Wery stated that she would be willing to share this information and we would work with our technology coordinator to put something together to be shared.
 - b. We would like to see a creative sign posted every time we are serving beef and/or pork that has been donated from our patrons. This would be posted in the serving line so that all staff and students know that the beef or pork that they are eating was donated and being used.
 - c. Donna Wery (Food Services Director) stated that she would like to get a list of food items from staff and students that they truly like, and wants to put together a rotating menu with those items from month to month starting next year.
 - d. It was suggested that each week there is at least one meal that is "homemade" using the beef or pork that was donated, and do less weeks that tend to be "chicken week, beef week, or pre-packaged week," which sometimes seem to happen.
 - e. It was suggested that there be at least one if not two times a week that some kind of dessert is made available with meals. As of this semester so far there has not been a dessert with a meal.
 - f. One issue that continually seems to arise is that the last group of students that are served tend to have slim or sometimes no pickings. This is something that needs to be addressed, along with the fact that often times when we are getting to those last students food is sometimes cold.
 - g. Lunch Counts each day still seem to be an issue and something that will continue to be addressed with staff. The kitchen was also reminded that on the "homemade" meal days they need to account for way more than the count as that tends to be a day that students want to eat, and don't always say so.

- h. For the optional chef salad, it has been nice having the different dressing options, it is still our request though that more things be made available to put on their salad, like tomatoes, peas, peppers, etc.
- i. We would like to see a warm vegetable option be made more available during meals.
- j. Especially for younger students it was suggested that maybe Monday, Wednesday, Friday, there be a second option of PB & J, and/or Ham Sandwich, and possibly having a PB and J option made more available more often to K-3 especially.
- k. On the salad bar continue to try and provide more fresh fruit, and consider cutting up the fresh fruit for ease of the students. Slice up the apples and pears, so that students can take a bunch of slices instead of the whole fruit that tends to not get eaten.
- l. On the salad bar, consider having Cheesesticks and go-gurt type options as well.



Q2 On average, how often do you eat school lunch?




