July is a busy month for our community! There are so many different events going on. No matter what your interest, there is a way to get your family involved. Research tells us that children who are actively learning in the summer retain more of their learning, and head back to school in the fall better prepared than children who are not as active. Whether it is a visit to the library, a play, a museum, or a nature trail, children are learning and that is important to their overall success. So get out there and enjoy our amazing community!

One event that is coming up that involves many of our Duluth students is the Duluth Community Schools Collaborative Hillside Youth Theatre as they present "All You Need is Bugs" It takes place on Thursday July 27th.
