New Addition

The fire marshal did not sign off on Thursday but we only have about 4 things left on his to-do list; 1 in the old high school, 1 in the gym, and 2 in the new addition. The architects and contractors did a walk through to create the punch list to complete – hopefully by Fri Oct 14. The weather has not cooperated in terms of being able to paint the block and lay the brick pavers. Both groups plan to be here on Monday to work on those projects unless it rains again. The concession coolers arrived and were installed today. The chairs, tables, and related furniture arrived today and stored in the shop until the new addition is cleaned. The lighting in the new addition was programmed today. There is still a fair amount of touch up painting and cleaning to do and the trophy cases and some doors and windows need glass and trim pieces instead of plywood. The electrician is still doing some wiring. Our students can use the weight room beginning Mon Oct 17 even if everything else is not quite done.

ALICAP Walkthrough and Safety/Security Audit

Our workmen's comp insurance company agent, Ron Wall, conducted their annual walk through in the elementary and high school buildings this morning. He will get to Bellwood in the coming weeks. We will have to find someone new to do our safety and security inspection because our former person passed away in recent weeks.

Title I and Title IIA Funding

NDE received notice from United States Department of Education (USDE) on Monday, October 3, that 2016-17 grant awards for Title I and Title II have been reduced. The reduction also affects Title I-D and Title I Accountability.

Below is an excerpt from the correspondence received from the USDE.

The Continuing Appropriations and Military Construction, Veterans Affairs, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2017, and Zika Response and Preparedness Act (FY 2017 continuing resolution), however, includes a 0.496 percent across-the-board reduction in the amount of funds provided through the FY 2016 appropriations act that applies during the period covered by the FY 2017 continuing resolution (October 1, 2016 through December 9, 2016). This reduction therefore affects the portion of Title I-A and Title II-A funds that became available on October 1, 2016.

Today the U.S. Department of Education (ED) issued October FY 2016 Title I-A and Title II-A (SEA and SAHE) grant awards. To determine the award amounts, ED revised the FY 2016 Title I-A and Title II-A allocations to reflect the 0.496 percent reduction. The revised Title I-A allocations also incorporate corrections by some States to their State per-pupil expenditure data since July 1, 2016.

Because of these changes, NDE will be recalculating 2016-17 LEA allocations for Title I-A, Title I-D, Title I Accountability, and Title II-A. As soon as revised allocations are available they will be posted on the NDE Federal Programs webpage. The required recalculation of allocations will delay the opening of the NCLB Consolidated Application and the Title I Accountability Application. We apologize for any inconvenience.

Scheduling


Due to an error on the part of Madison, we will be playing a JH FB game prior to our game here with Conestoga. That game will take place at 4:00.
