ASVAB - Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery

CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM

The ASVAB is a no cost, no pass or fail evaluation measuring current vocational strengths and showing potential for future success.

The ASVAB Career Exploration Program [CEP] identifies verbal, science, technology & math strengths and creates a Find Your Interests [FYI] inventory based on John Holland's RIASEC theory of career choice.

The results help students understand their verbal, math, science and technical skills and can identify potential career options using their CEP scores and the FYI results.

CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM

CCC students can take the no cost OCCU-Find assessment to enhance their career search and exploration.

The OCCU-Find is a catalog of careers containing relevant occupational data in an easy to navigate format. Students can quickly identify potentially satisfying career options using their Career Exploration Scores and FYI results.

ASVAB - Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery

CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM

Each occupation includes information about the importance of verbal, math, science and technical skills represented on a five-star scale. The ratings show the extent to which the daily tasks of a job require verbal, math, and/or science & technical skills.

There is no direct correlation between Career Exploration Scores and the skill importance ratings. Students view these ratings as a snapshot of the degree to which these skills are used on-the-job.

BENEFITS TO OUR STUDENTS AND COMMUNITIES

The ASVAB for military service and the CEP at CCC is the **ONLY testing location outside of the MEPS in Omaha. Very unique to testing and first in Nebraska!**

Testing at Grand Island provides numerous benefits:

- ASVAB testing closer to the western 2/3s of Nebraska**
- Time and tax dollar savings by not sending prospects to Omaha**
- Immediate test results to share with recruiters – or not!**
- Ability to test as often as the prospect desires**
