1.0 CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Board of Education was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairman Palmer in the Mabelle B. Avery Middle School BOE meeting room.

2.0 PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3.0 APPROVAL OF MINUTES

3.1 March 22, 2010 Regular Meeting – It was MOVED (B.Devlin) SECONDED (J.Taylor) to approve the March 22, 2010 Board of Education regular meeting minutes as presented.
PASSED 6-0

Chairman Palmer proposed delivering the Technology Plan to the Board of Finance in person so that the Board of Education can respond to questions.

4.0 AUDIENCE TO CITIZENS/STAFF/STUDENTS

4.1 Curriculum Presentations: Gifted/Talented & Virtual High School

4.1.1 Gifted and Talented

Director of Curriculum, K.Pezza, presented an overview of Quest, the Somers Gifted and Talented program that serves students identified as academically gifted.

Mrs. Pezza explained that all third grade students are screened using a non-verbal reasoning test, the DRP and a teacher survey of gifted behaviors exhibited in the regular classroom. Scores are combined using a point matrix and the top 20% of each third grade class is given the opportunity to participate in the Quest program. Of the 20% of the students selected, the top 10% participate twice per cycle and the students in the 11-20% range participate once per cycle.

All students in grades 2-5, regardless of their gifted eligibility, can participate in the CT Invention Convention each year.

Mr. Griffin, who oversees the Quest Program, works closely with all the elementary grade levels and offers enrichment suggestions for students who are not involved in the Quest program.

- 4.1.2** Director of Curriculum, K.Pezza, presented an overview of Virtual High School which is an on-line school that offers high school, middle school, AP, International Baccalaureate and credit recovery courses. Classes are offered during the fall and spring semesters, as well as during the summer. VHS allows students to take specialized courses that are not available at Somers High School or that are not available due to scheduling constraints.

Mrs. Pezza explained that schools sign up as members of VHS and can pay per student enrolled up to a total of 10 students per semester, or schools can donate 0.2 FTE in exchange for 20 “free” seats per semester. The 0.2 teacher teaches one VHS course. Somers participates in the second option. Peter Stone teaches one VHS course and is the on-site coordinator. Mr. Stone handles the enrollment process, scheduling and grade reporting associated with VHS.

Sixty Connecticut schools participate in VHS. Courses offered include Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, Fine Arts, Business World Language, English, Life Skills and Health, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Tech Ed. and Middle School courses. In the last two years, 21 Somers High School students have enrolled in 25 VHS classes (21 different courses). Of those classes, 17 were college prep level, 6 were honors level and 2 were AP level.

Students are expected to login each day and participate in their class through on-line discussions, research and class work. Assignments are usually due once a week.

Dr. Suffredini suggested that Mr. Taylor invite the concerned individuals to attend a Wellness Committee meeting to discuss their concerns and offer suggestions.

- 5.3** Dr Suffredini reported that he has been contacted by First Selectman, Lisa Pellegrini, regarding who will be responsible to pay to have the Mabelle B. Avery lacrosse fields lined for use by the recreation lacrosse program. Dr. Suffredini will meet with the First Selectman to see what can be worked out; however, it was the consensus of the Board of Education that this expense cannot be absorbed by the Board of Education.

A.Kirkpatrick also attended the meeting and reported that it was mentioned that the secondary school reform bill maybe pushed out to 2015.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Palmer at 6:30 p.m. in the Mabelle Avery Middle School Board of Education meeting room.

10.1 SHS Master Schedule/Class Size Update

Somers High School Principal, Gary Cotzin, presented an update on the 2010-2011 high school master schedule and projected class sizes. Mr. Cotzin reported that the scheduling is 95% complete and was constructed based on student requests. The schedule will change over the next few months and through the first ten days of the first quarter as conflicts are resolved. Counselors will be working with students to help them select electives that will fit into their schedule and meet their post-secondary needs. A Scheduling/Class Size report will be presented to the Board in June.

A discussion was held regarding the low enrollment in some of the AP classes. The Board and administration want to continue to maintain all the current AP offerings. Students are encouraged to take AP courses whenever it's possible and appropriate.

10.2 Transportation Update

Dr. Suffredini reported that we are under contract with First Student Bus Company with a zero increase for bus service next year.

Dr. Suffredini reported that currently there are 15 busses; however, they are evaluating the total delivery service. Routes are being reviewed to see what bus runs might look like if the district downsized to 14 or 13 busses.

10.3 Vision Boulevard

Dr. Suffredini reported that the Board of Selectmen approved to make Vision Boulevard a town road. A meeting is scheduled for April 27th to look at the pattern and flow of traffic.

10.4 Dr. Suffredini informed the Board of a new state program that is being offered to districts who apply. The program is entitled the Board Examination System. One of the options of the program will give high school students the opportunity to graduate in two years. If selected, districts will receive state funding for staff training for specific courses.

Administration will be exploring and discussing the program during the next few weeks.

Dr. Suffredini will present more information to the Board at the May 10th BOE meeting and ask the Board to vote on a Memorandum of Understanding with the state.

11.2.1 A meeting will be scheduled for May 10th to review the Math Curriculum.

11.2.2 Dr. Suffredini and K.Pezza informed the Board that a school improvement professional development initiative involving all administrators and some teachers will be held on May 10th and May 25th and continue in the fall. Dr. Steven Wlodarczyk from the CT Center for School Change is the presenter. This professional development is entitled *Instructional Rounds* and its focus is on program evaluation processes to assess programs through classroom observations.
