1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular Board of Education meeting was called to order by Chair Kirkpatrick at 7:00 p.m. in the Board of Education Chambers.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

3.1. Approval of the January 13, 2025 BOE Minutes

Rationale: The Board to review and approve the minutes from the January 13, 2025 Board meeting.

Motion to approve minutes of January 13th Board of Education Meeting. This motion, made by Ed DePeau and seconded by Derek Zelek, Carried. **Yea: 8, Nay: 0, Absent: 1 (Carl Stebbins)**

4. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

4.1. Superintendent Update

Superintendent Galloway met with parents of SES students last Wednesday evening. Parents asked questions and shared concerns about the SES HVAC Project. An FAQ has been added to the website. Superintendent Galloway reiterated that the proposal to move 5th grade students to MBA during the construction project is still an "if." Plans are being developed for multiple scenarios. Moving 5th graders to MBA is both a practical and feasible solution; however, this plan is not solidified at this time. Superintendent Galloway is happy to schedule another parent meeting and offer a parent survey as the dialogue continues.

Superintendent Galloway highlighted some key elements of a plan that would move students to MBA. The move would take place in Fall 2025. Students would follow the current MBA schedule. Fifth grade students would still have specials,

snack, and recess. There's potential for a section of the library to be set up specifically for 5th grade students and for these students to receive assistance in selecting just-right books. The MBA lunch price would be offered to students, along with a few additional food items from what is served at SES. The district is awaiting a response on whether 5th graders would have their own bus. Aftercare would be available. Students would either ride a van or be escorted to walk to aftercare. The use of portables has been explored. This would increase the project total by about \$1,000,000. Kibbe Fuller has also been explored as a relocation solution. The building is currently occupied, and the basement is being used for storage. Superintendent Galloway thanked the families who were able to attend the meeting last week.

4.2. SHS Student Representatives

Rationale: Students from Somers High School will update the Board on recent events.

Discussion: Senior Emma Ciccarella and Sophomore Carolyn Castonguay presented an SHS Student Update. Sydney Cassidy reached the 1,000-point milestone in girls' basketball on 12/30/24. The Spartan Showcase will take place on 2/4/25. The SHS Band and Chorus Concert will be held on 2/12/25. The Capstone event was held on 1/8/25. It was a successful event with a great turnout. Midterms recently took place from 1/21/25-1/24/25. Course selection will begin in February. Community member Lisa Horan inquired whether the Capstone is required for all students. The Capstone is a graduation requirement. Juniors may complete the project if their schedules allow. Seniors who have not completed it during their junior year are required to complete a Capstone project. There are several upcoming field trips, including a trip to Hartford Hospital Center for Education, Simulation, and Innovation and The Pequot Museum. An "Inspiring Women in Engineering and Medicine" workshop is planned at UConn Health for students to attend. Attorney John Russotto will speak to the Principles of Law Class.

A new lunch schedule was rolled out at SHS on 1/27/25. Three lunch waves were condensed to two. Previously, lunch waves were under capacity by approximately 70 students during the A-B-C format during an extended block. The decision to remove the B lunch results in more time to clean up the cafeteria between waves and also eliminates an academic block being interrupted by lunch. Day 1 of the new schedule was very smooth.

SAT Academy will take place on Saturdays in February and March leading up to the SAT. It will be opened to juniors. If all spots are not filled, they will be opened to sophomores.

The STEM Club is continuing to meet with Dr. Martin from the University of Saint Joseph for STEM research. There is an ACE (Architecture, Construction & Engineering) Mentorship Program presentation on 2/19/25. Superintendent

Galloway asked Miss Ciccirella to elaborate on the program, as she is an active member. Miss Ciccirella explained that the program takes place every Wednesday from 4-6 p.m. The program is free of cost outside of transportation to Hartford. She attends the program to explore a career in architecture. Students are able to work on a mock project to learn what it's like to design various projects under the guidance of a professional in the field. Attendance for the program is up to 14 students. Last year, 4 students attended.

Board Member Mike Briggs asked Miss Ciccirella and Miss Castonguay how the Board can support students. The SHS representatives stated that they enjoy answering questions from the Board and would love to know what topics the Board would like to hear about from them.

4.3. Superintendent Presentation of Proposed 2025-2026 Budget

Rationale: Dr. Galloway will present the proposed 2025-2026 Somers Public Schools budget to the Board.

Discussion: Superintendent Galloway shared the 2025-2026 Budget Presentation. Student enrollment on campus is 1,339, with an additional 40 students off campus. Superintendent Galloway shared several highlights from the past year, including:

- SES Invention Convention
- Robotics and STEM Clubs
- 2024-2025 MBA Middle School of the Year
- MBA Alex's Lemonade Stand raised almost \$5,000 for cancer research
- RISE Program for MBA students in the life skills program with a focus on creating an inclusive learning environment for all students and helping to keep students in the district
- SHS Trades Fair
- SAT Preparatory Classes
- SHS Collaboration with Dr. Mallory Kane through the Mini Medical School Program
- Changes to districtwide communication to streamline the format and distribution of report cards

The budget objectives are to maintain and improve current programs, be fiscally responsible, and support students' growth and development. Superintendent Galloway reviewed the fiscal considerations of the budget, including a new K-8 math curriculum that would affect over 900 students at the cost of \$211,000. Considerations also include staffing efficiency savings, new contracts, and increases to utility delivery fees and insurance premiums.

Superintendent Galloway shared the 9 categories that comprise the budget and showed where increases align with each category. The proposed budget is a 5.72% increase, with salary and benefits totaling 80.1% of the total budget. Last year's budget was a 5.21% increase.

The budget timeline was reviewed. Tonight's presentation will be posted on the website on 1/28/25. Board members were provided a detailed budget and a summary of changes that reduced the budget from the original 6.8% increase. The Board will have an opportunity to review the detailed budget before voting on it.

Discussion: Stephanie Levin shared the Quarter 2 budget transfer request. This request was previously brought to the Planning and Finance subcommittee. The transfers total \$112,937. The specific transfers were reviewed.

9. COMMITTEE REPORTS

9.1. Curriculum (next meeting 2/10/25 6 p.m., 3/10/25 6 p.m., 5/12/25 5:30 p.m., 6/9/25 6 p.m.)

The committee met last week to discuss SHS course adjustments. Several courses will adjust their AP/ECE status. The Grade 10 U.S. History class will be divided into two semester-long classes. One will cover Civics, while the other will cover

U.S. History. They will be taken consecutively for 0.5 credit each. This may help students who struggle with one portion of the class and eliminate the need for these students to retake the entire year-long class as it is currently offered.

The committee will meet on dates and times listed above.

9.2. Policy (next meeting TBD)

The Board is awaiting the quarterly update from CABE before scheduling the next meeting. Board members were provided a policy update summary covering all policies that have been reviewed since Superintendent Galloway joined SPS. Moving forward, an update will be provided every January with a short explanation of the policy and when it was approved. The policy manual is posted on the district website.

9.3. Planning/Finance (next meeting TBD)

The Planning and Finance Committee has met several times over the last couple of weeks.

9.4. Salary & Negotiations (next meeting TBD)

There are no updates.

9.5. Building (next meeting 2/4/25 & 2/18/25 2 p.m. - every other Tuesday at 2 p.m.)

This committee will meet on 2/4/25. Bid documents for the SES HVAC project go live on 1/28/25 at 8 a.m. Contractor walk-throughs will take place on 2/5/25. All bids must be received by 2/25/25. The project is scheduled to start on 4/14/25 with the removal of ceiling tiles.

SEF met on 1/24/25 and discussed creative fundraising ideas and ways to partner locally. There are seats available on the SEF Board for those who may wish to be voting members.

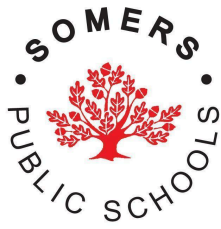

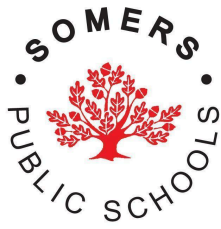
