WAYZATA PUBLIC SCHOOLS – IOCP PARTNERSHIP PROJECT

Maximizing Key Strategic Partnerships in the Creation of a One-Stop Community Learning and Serving Center

OBJECTIVE:

To engage with Interfaith Outreach & Community Partners (IOCP) and Hennepin County to create a one-stop, multi-service and learning center that is intentionally designed to meet the needs of low-income and low-employable families who reside in the Wayzata Public School District (WPS).

STRATEGIES:

1. **EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION:** This satellite site will create 20 additional preschool spaces. Early childhood education is key to academic success, particularly for children of low income families. The Family Learning Center (FLC) prepares youth for kindergarten through its preschool program, but consistently wait-lists the program.
2. **PARENT ENGAGEMENT AND EDUCATION:** This site will create new opportunities for highly targeted parent education and support for low income, hard to reach and hard to identify WPS families.
3. **ABE/ ESL/GED:** Adult Basic Education programs (ABE) will expand and, with help from IOCP, will reach deeper into the District's community to provide instruction to the adult basic learner. Additionally, ABE and IOCP will expand their partnership around learning toward employment.
4. **ADULT and SENIOR ENRICHMENT:** This site will create daytime learning space, which is currently unavailable in the district, for education, enrichment and community building. WPS will more fully engage this key population, maintaining an on-going presence in their lives.
5. **K-12 ACADEMIC SUPPORT:** Building on the success of the CONECT Program which is currently tied to three neighborhoods, this partnership will provide a CONECT-like homework-support program.
6. **HIGH SCHOOL SERVICE LEARNING:** Expanded service learning opportunities such as mentoring, volunteering, etc., will be available due to the new IOCP building and co-located partnership.

MEASURABLE IMPACT:

- More low income pre-schoolers identified and better prepared to enter kindergarten
- More low income families identified and provided with parent education
- More low income ABE/ESL/GED households identified and served
- More ABE learners will gain employment resulting in enhanced family stability for Wayzata Public School families
- More seniors engaged and experiencing positive relations with Wayzata Public Schools
- More low income/academically at-risk K-12 students receiving academic support

- * Elimination of the 95 cent processing fee charged to families who chose to pay electronically
