VII.I. Annual Review of Policy JIA - Violence Free/Anti-Bullying Policy

Discussion: Board Member Reeves inquired regarding quantity of times this Policy was visited in 13-14 school year. Supt Schoeppey noted approximately 2-3 times, and upon Board Member Smith inquiry, he added no suspensions resulted. Supt. Schoeppey noted he is in favor of isolation/separation action upon violation verses suspension. Board discussed whether the policy is strict enough and actions of enforcement in regards to potential revisions to the policy. In addition, Board Member Stromberger mentioned educating/reiterating to all staff in August current and appropriate discipline policy. Further consideration will be on-going as it pertains to school handbooks.

Discussion: In regards to a bus, quotes were reviewed; various unit sizes, seat & storage options, prices, and upgrade options were discussed. Concerns discussed included ensuring operation will be in accordance with Nebraska Transportation Rule 92. Supt. Schoeppey noted trade in of the current activity bus has not been discussed with vendor to date. Supt. Schoeppey recommended and Board agreed that a site visit prior to bus purchase to view what is on site in Sedalia, CO would be beneficial. In addition, Schoeppey noted a new bus build to order option would take approximately 90-120 days from date of order. Seating need was estimated at approximately 42 per unit. Strand and Board also suggested having vendor bring bus here for review and Supt. Schoeppey said he would follow up and inquire as to such an option. Lastly the Van bids were discussed and action was taken.

Principal's Report

1. MAP Testing has been scheduled for students in September.
(MAP) Measures of Academic Progress scale norms provide growth and status norms for: Reading, Language Usage, Math, General Science, and Science Concepts and Processes. Status Norms provide a starting point for educators to review data, and help them gain an understanding of each child's current academic level, where they need focused instruction.
2. Summer Math Learning Camp for students grades 4-6, was held July 28-August 4. Many exciting learning opportunities were provided by Nancy Sorensen and Paul Ekberg. Thirty-two students were sent invitations to attend. Eleven students participated for two weeks of learning. The teachers used the E model for learning which is Engage, Explore, Explain, Evaluate, and Extend. After evaluating test scores, areas of needs of improvement, were stressed during the Summer Math Learning Camp. Those areas were: Compare and interpret data, correct units of measure, fractions, decimals, and percents. Students were provided with Inquiry-and Standard based activities.
3. First Day of School Procedures handouts were given to teachers to use with students. Cafeteria Orientation and Bus Orientation will be provided to students the first day of school.
4. SMART Boards are up and will be ready to use prior to school starting. The SMART Notebook 2014, including 3D, math and Response software program was included in this purchase. ESU15 staff has been working to install the boards and set up the software.
5. All teachers will be attending PLC workshops at ESU 15. The dates are August 25-Dec. 9. Teachers will be working towards our goals of identifying essential learnings, creating common assessments for these essential learnings and collaborating on how to teach these essential learnings! So far these meetings have been extremely successful!
6. National Geographic Science has been purchased for grades k-5. This science program immerses students in the nature of science and inquiry, and builds scientific and content literacy. At every grade, students and teachers will have online access to the books and digital program resources. Students will join leading National Geographic Scientists and Explorers in the field via special video. These interactions provide students with real-life models of how scientists conduct studies and gain scientific knowledge.

7. Reading Wonders will be used as our core reading program for the second year. Teachers are feeling confident and excited for this year. I have heard a lot of positive things about the program. Teachers have stated that the reading program was rigorous and brought many changes as to how reading was taught. It was stated to me by the teachers that the program covered Nebraska standards well.
8. EnVsions math will be the core math program this year. After two years of using the program, Math NeSA scores are improving.
9. I attended Administrative Days in Kearney. The guest speakers were inspiring. I was especially inspired by, keynote speaker, Manny Scott, "How to Reach Youth Today" and keynote speaker, Dave Weber, "Sticks and Stones Exposed: The Truth Behind Words and Relationships." I attended workshops: The Kitchen Sink on Student Safety and School Security, Using MAP Assessment Identifying and Overcoming Relative Weakness, and The New Attendance Law workshop.
10. Teachers will begin their professional development this year by reviewing the book, How to Grade for Learning. It was a required read for all of the elementary teachers. Many of the teachers met over the summer to discuss the material covered in the book. Another book, Sticks and Stones Exposed: The Power of Words, by Dave Weber, will be the focus for a book study for teachers and classified staff this year. The focus will be on strong, positive, and mutually beneficial relationships.
