1. 1st Reading of New and Revised Policies

**NARRATIVE**

**BACKGROUND**

The update of policy ACB "Every Student Belongs" (formerly All Students Belong) and administrative regulation ACB-AR is the result of changes made by the Oregon Legislature and the Oregon State Board of Education over the past several months. House Bill 2697 (2021) takes effect on January 1, 2022 and OSBA is asking boards to delete the current version of this policy and AR prior to that date and approve the new version (the AR does not require board approval).

The law does not require a second reading of the policy, which allows the board to vote immediately or to defer to the December meeting for a 2nd reading and vote.

**BACKGROUND**

The Oregon School Boards Association is organized as one general state association with up to 23 regionally elected representatives established across 14 geographic regions to support member participation and representation.
