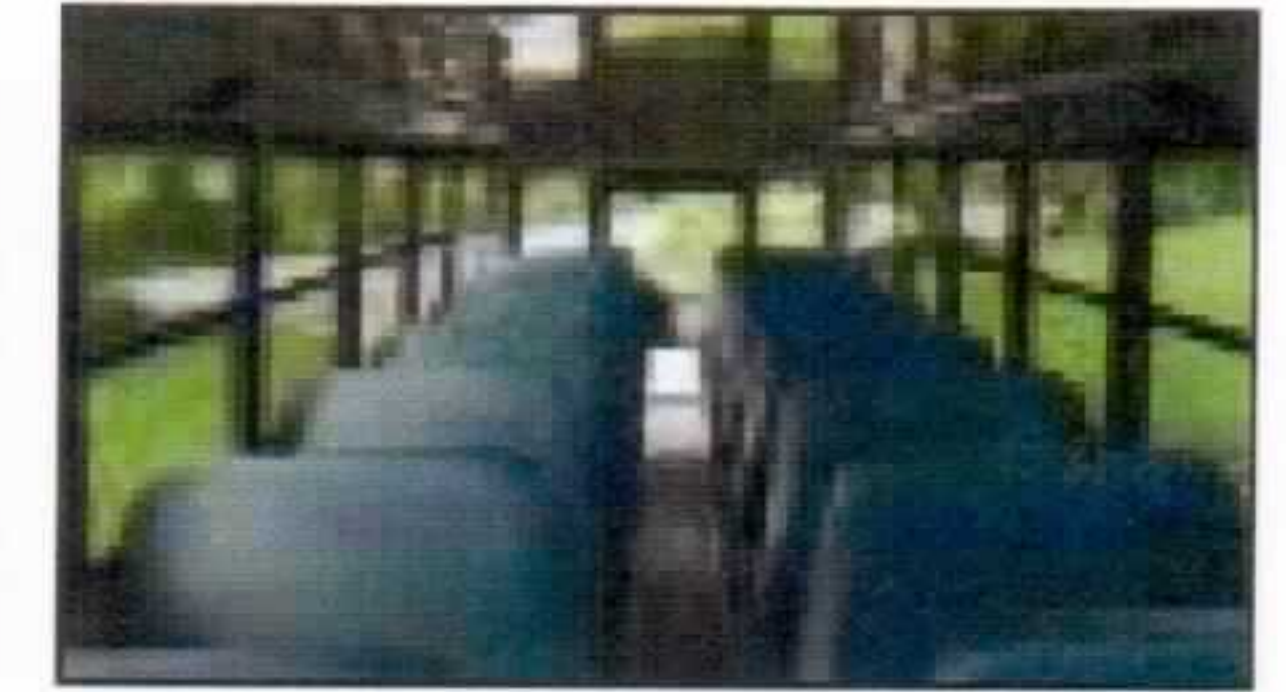

- A. Parent-teacher conference attendance was approximately 95% on the elementary level.
- B. PPT-There was a meeting on September 24 during P/T conferences. It was decided to promote the Close-up Fun Run with elementary students, provide a free movie night, and continue to find ways to increase attendance at meetings.

I. Nebraska Risk and Protective Factor Student Survey (NRPFS)

- a. Students in grades 8th, 10th, and 12th grade, took this survey on Tuesday, September 30th.
- b. The survey gathers data on risky behaviors the adolescent may partake in.
- c. The information that this survey will provide, will help guide programs within Butler and Saunders County that will address At-Risk behaviors.

II. Professional Development

- a. Our next professional Development day will be October 15th.
- b. The secondary staff will be having a technology share-out. This will give all the teachers to share with each other, how they are utilizing the technology in their classroom.
- c. This has proven to be a beneficial experience for the staff in the past.

III. Enrollment 7-12

- a. Attached is a 15 year enrollment summary for grades 7-12.
- b. The last several years have been pretty stagnant, hovering right around the 160-170 mark.

IV. Secondary Leadership Teams

- a. I have started utilizing secondary leadership teams this school year.
- b. The purpose of these teams is to have valuable discussions regarding how we are educating our students, and in what ways can we improve on what we are doing.
- c. I have set up a rotation for the secondary staff, that will allow each teacher to be on the leadership team throughout the school year.
- d. The teachers have been very receptive to this, and appreciate the opportunity.

V. 1:1 Laptop Program – grades 7-12
