C. Leone distributed and reviewed the budget transfers for January 2013. A motion was made by D. Seldon and seconded by R. Ike to have the Bloomfield Board of Education approve the budget transfers for January, 2013, as presented. The motion was passed unanimously.

B. Approval of Proposed 2013-2014 Academic Calendar

A motion was made by D. Seldon and seconded by R. Ike to have the Bloomfield Board of Education approve the proposed 2013-2014 academic calendar, as presented.

The proposed academic calendar for 2013-2014 was distributed and reviewed by C. Leone. Election Day versus Veterans Day as a no school/professional development day was discussed. As the chair of the Bloomfield Town Committee, R. Ike was opposed to the schools being in session on Election Day.

A motion was made by S. True and seconded by R. Ike to have the Bloomfield Board of Education postpone, until the March 2013 Board of Education Meeting, the approval of the proposed 2013-2014 academic calendar. The motion was passed unanimously.

X. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

The Board members expressed their appreciation of the snow removal/cleanup after the Blizzard of 2013. The budget proposal effort was acknowledged. The college acceptances and recruiting effort demonstrates the increased academic rigor in the district. The digitalization of district records is underway. Activities around town include L Chapman's Testimonial Dinner on March 16th, Black History Month at Prosser Library on February 20 at 7PM, and the Board of Education Budget meeting on February 21st.

A. Board Action on Superintendent's 2013-2014 Proposed Budget

The following topics were commented on:

- Declining enrollment versus a steady budget was discussed. Although the enrollment is declining, funds are being spent increasing student achievement through professional development and extended learning programs.
- It was noted that the Republic Town Committee will be offering a books scholarship for a graduating senior.
- Administration appears top heavy and how is this supported as grants money diminishes was clarified by reviewing the details of the proposed budget.
- There was appreciation of the continued support for professional development, continued extended learning opportunities and student achievement.
- The Learning Academy is no longer under the Bloomfield High School accounting codes. It is a standalone accounting entry because of interest by other districts to have students attend creating income from the out-of-district students.
- Specific line entries were clarified and justified.
- Health insurance and pension increases were discussed.

A motion was made by D. Seldon and seconded by R. Ike to have the Bloomfield Board of Education adopt and approve the operating budget for 2013-2014 in the amount of \$38,555,104, as presented. The motion was passed unanimously.

Dr. Thompson thanked C. Leone and all those contributing to the effort of developing the budget.

A closing comment from the board was dollars does not define achievement.
