	Students consistently valued friendships, supportive teachers, positive staff relationships, mental health supports, school traditions, and opportunities to belong within the school community.
2	We engage in meaningful and relevant learning experiences that encourage curiosity, a growth mindset, and foster student success.
	Students expressed appreciation for engaging instruction, hands-on projects, electives, real-world learning, college opportunities, flexible learning environments, and opportunities to explore personal interests.
3	We are provided opportunities throughout the day to move, recharge, collaborate, and participate in activities that support overall well-being.
	Across all grade levels, students repeatedly requested more recess, physical education, outdoor opportunities, free time, flexible seating, breaks, longer lunches, and reduced time sitting.
4	Our school spaces are clean, well-maintained, and designed to promote safety, security, and privacy.
	Students frequently emphasized cleaner facilities, improved bathrooms, upgraded gyms and locker rooms, better equipment, improved technology, temperature control, and overall school upkeep and safety.
