9 **RESPONSE TO TESTING RESULTS¹**

11 If the results show that lead levels exceed fifteen parts per billion (15 bbp) but are below twenty parts per
12 billion (20bbp), that school shall conduct lead level tests on an annual basis. This shall continue until tests
13 show that the lead levels are under fifteen parts per billion (15 bbp).

14
15 If test results show that lead levels equal or secede twenty parts per billion (20 bbp), the school shall
16 immediately remove the drinking water source from service. The drinking water source shall not be
17 available for use until retesting confirms the water lead level does not secede twenty parts per billion (20
18 bbp). If corrective action is taken, retesting shall occur within ninety (90) days.

20 The Director of Schools/ designee shall notify the appropriate authorities within twenty-four (24) hours of
21 a test result showing that lead levels equal or exceed twenty parts per billion (20bbp). Parent(s)
22 guardian(s) shall be notified within five (5) business days of such test results.

The insurance program shall provide coverages in a minimum of the following broad categories:

1. Property: Buildings and contents against fire, extended coverage, vandalism and malicious mischief, boiler and machinery explosion; and vehicles;
2. Liability: Board members, director of schools and employees resulting from discharging their duties;
3. Worker's compensation; and
4. Fidelity: Blanket bond and fiscal agent's bond as required by statute.

The director of schools shall continually review the insurance program to ensure that adequate protection is being provided at a reasonable price.

GROUP HEALTH

The board may provide group health insurance for all full-time employees.¹ The director of schools, after consultation with personnel, shall recommend carriers of insurance for programs in which the board makes partial or full payments. The board shall approve all insurance carriers.

ANNUITIES²

Board-approved companies for tax-sheltered annuities shall include all companies presently having contracts with employees.

1. The addition of a company to the list of board-approved companies shall be considered on written request of agents of the company; and
2. Written request for a change in annuity deductions shall be reported to the payroll office on or before the first day of the month in which such change is to be effective.

RETIREES¹

The Morgan County School System offers a post-retirement benefit of \$2,000 to personnel to help pay the cost of health insurance at retirement until the year the retiree turns 65 years of age or 5 years whichever comes first. This section shall only apply to retirees and employees who were employed by an LEA within Tennessee prior to July 1, 2015.

~~Payment of individual hospitalization insurance coverage shall be available for any retiring—
employee at the same cost as for other employees until the employee reaches age sixty-five (65)—
provided that. Retired employees will be permitted to pay the difference in an individual plan and a
family plan on a monthly basis and continue coverage if they so desire.~~

1. The employee is eligible for retirement under the eligibility standards as set by Tennessee Retirement System; and
 2. The employee was enrolled in the Board-sponsored insurance plan for one (1) full year prior to retirement.
