-Teaching All Students Grant - Cascade High School Chosen to Participate TDOE Announces 18 Schools Selected for Teaching All Students Initiative Through \$5.5M State Personnel Development Grant Grant Serves Students with Complex Cognitive Disabilities Statewide

- Today, the Tennessee Department of Education announced the 18 schools selected to participate in the first cohort of the Teaching All Students (TAS) Initiative to serve students with the most significant cognitive disabilities. Through a five-year, \$5.5 million State Personnel Development Grant (SPDG), the first cohort of this initiative will strengthen instructional practices in schools across the state to better support students with significant cognitive disabilities.

- The TAS Initiative will fund training, coaching, and tools to help high school teachers and staff build an accessible learning environment for all students, with the goals of reducing the achievement gap and increasing the graduation rate and enrollment in postsecondary education through inclusive higher education, technical colleges, community colleges and competitive integrated employment for students with complex needs.

-“Through this grant, the department is able to launch the Teaching All Students Initiative to provide an opportunity for schools across the state to focus on supports for our students with complex needs to help them reach their fullest potential,” said Commissioner Penny Schwinn. “All students deserve access to a high-quality education and this grant provides highly-requested technical assistance to support our teachers as they provide instruction to students with disabilities.”

From across the state, high school teams, composed of a school administrator, general education teacher, special education teacher, and district special education director submitted applications for the opportunity to participate in TAS trainings, coaching, and technical assistance.

The following schools were selected to participate in the TAS Initiative:

Additionally, selected schools will receive mini-grants for implementation of the TAS Initiative. Through a competitive procurement process, additional partners will be selected to help schools implement this work.

Administered through the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) within the U.S. Department of Education, the State Personnel Development Grants (SPDG) program assists state education agencies and their partners to improve results for children with disabilities through systems of professional development and dissemination of knowledge about best practices to educators and families.

This grant builds on the department's previous SPDG and supports teachers in providing students with disabilities with meaningful access to and participation in standards-aligned instruction.

BEDFORD COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

Minutes from February 23, 2021 Regular Monthly Meeting

The Bedford County Board of Education met in a regularly monthly session on Tuesday, February 23, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. in the central office building board room located at 500 Madison Street in Shelbyville, TN. All board members were present (Neeley, Forsee, Anderson, Cook, Boutwell, Crews, Brown, Cashion, and Reed.) This meeting was delayed a week from its intended date of February 16, due to extreme winter weather conditions.

Chairwoman Neeley called the meeting to order and welcomed those in attendance. She expressed condolences on behalf of the Board to the family of Jimmy Woodson, who had passed earlier in the day. Mr. Woodson was remembered as having served as a long-time educator, a county executive, and county commissioner. There followed a moment of silence and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Those in the audience and those viewing the meeting online were thanked for their attendance.

CONSENT AGENDA

The consent agenda was approved by acclamation, upon the motion and second of Mr. Brown and Mr. Forsee.

ACTION ITEMS

Appointment of Superintendent

Chairwoman Neeley – “As we move into the superintendent selection, I would like to take this opportunity to thank our board secretary Suzanne Alexander, Zack Spears with Technology, Kenzie Miller, our Communications Coordinator, and those who may have helped them during the interview process. They were the folks behind the scenes who enabled our days to go smoothly.

Also, thank you to my fellow board members for investing the time required for the search and I’m sure spending countless hours going through their individual processes to come to a decision. This decision is not taken lightly by any member of this board. While I realize, as we all do, there will be many emotions once the decision is made, we all must remember that no matter who is chosen, we as a board, system, and community must unite and work together.

Last, but certainly not least, thank you to Dr. Garrett, Mrs. Scoggins, Dr. Ralston, and Mr. Harwell for their interest in our system. I know the day long interview process was grueling, along with all the work to put your thoughts together and develop a presentation to highlight your career? We certainly appreciate all your efforts to be prepared and share your background and abilities with us.

Moving forward tonight, the Board must first approve the selection process to be used. I am submitting to you the process that has been outlined in our notebooks from TSBA on page 4, number 5 (see document in February 23, 2021 board meeting file) which states, "at the end of the process, each board member will list but not rank his or her top two choices on a written and signed ballot. Only those interviewed will be included on the ballot. A board member may not vote for the same person twice on any ballot." I have spoken with Dr. Grissom and was told this is the method used and deemed as a best practice. I then spoke with Chuck Cagle who also expressed this is the most widely used and accepted method of selection. The only variation would be a roll call vote and each board member would voice their two choices. I have also researched methods of voting used and watched other boards/systems and what they did and found this is how they have proceeded. Also, in previous superintendent selections in our own system this method was used.

Suzanne will provide a ballot to each of us with the names. Once you have marked your top two and signed the ballot she will collect them, read them out loud and tally them. Additionally, per board policy 5.801, Item D., "the board shall attempt to select a director by unanimous vote, but a simple majority vote of the membership of the board shall be required for the appointment of a superintendent." The candidate who receives the majority of votes will be considered the board's superintendent choice and the board would then need a motion to offer the candidate the position and move into negotiations. Should there be a tie with no one candidate receiving more votes than the others, there will be a ballot vote between those two candidates. At this time, I would entertain a motion on the procedure to use for selection."

Mr. Boutwell moved to accept the procedure recommended by TSBA that had just been read aloud and outlined by the Chair. His motion was seconded by Mr. Brown.

Michael Cook – "So, is this is - just a quick question, is this to get to - So, we're 'gonna do two if I heard you right, that went fast. So, we're 'gonna nominate two votes on this ballot, correct?"

Diane Neeley – "Your top two choices."

Michael Cook – "Top two choices, in no certain order."

Diane Neeley – "No certain order."

Michael Cook – "And then once all of the ballots are collected, they'll be tallied and the top two vote getters will move into another vote?"

Diane Neeley – "No, if we have someone that attains five or more votes, the person who gets the most, that would be our candidate. That would be our choice."

David Brown – "But if we don't, then we vote again."

Diane Neeley – "Right."

Michael Cook – "What if we get two that have a majority?"

Diane Neeley – "It's whoever has the most. If there is a tie we would vote again."

Michael Cook – "So, we're voting eighteen times? So, we are nominating two people - So, we get through that - and then we go to - let's just see where we are at."

Diane Neeley – “It takes five to be the majority.”

Michael Cook – “But we don’t get to vote twice...”

Diane Neeley – “No. You just rank your top two and we’ll read those out and see where we are. Basically, if we have one candidate with five or more, whoever has the most. We may have two candidates that have more than five. Whoever has the most would become our choice.”

Mr. Forsee said he would like to make an amendment as follows: **“I move that we elect the Superintendent of Bedford County Schools by each board member voting for one of the four candidates by a ballot vote. If, after the second ballot there is no election, then the top two candidates only will be voted on. As per board policy, a simple majority vote will constitute an election.**

Thoughts behind this are as follows:

- This process is consistent with all other board actions i.e.: policy matters, board chair, interim superintendent, etc.
- This process is simple, clear, and concise.”

Mr. Cook asked if Mr. Forsee would re-state his motion, and he did so.

Michael Cook – “I would just say that we do our two. Once we see where we stand, and then vote that way with our top two.”

The Chair clarified that Mr. Cook was not seconding the motion to amend. Motion to amend failed for lack of a second. Mr. Crews stated he felt there is a precedent on this from TSBA and other recommendations that should be taken into consideration.

There was a consensus that the vote on the original motion would be done by roll call vote. The results were:

First District, David Brown – Yes

Second District, Brian Crews – Yes

Third District, Dan Reed – Yes

Fourth District, Diane Neeley – Yes

Fifth District, Michael Cook – Yes

Sixth District, Dr. Andrea Anderson – Yes

Seventh District, Nicole Cashion – Yes

Eighth District, John Boutwell – Yes

Ninth District, Glenn Forsee – No

Motion carried by a vote of 8-1.

Dr. Tammy Garrett was the candidate of choice according to the ballots. The Chair asked for a motion to accept this decision and name Dr. Garrett as the Board’s choice for Superintendent. **Mr. Boutwell moved to do so. His motion was seconded by Mr. Brown and carried unanimously.**

The Chair explained that the next step would be to form a committee for the contract, explaining that Attorney Chuck Cagle has a model contract which can be customized. She appointed Dr. Andrea Anderson, John Boutwell, Nicole Cashion, and David Brown to serve on the committee that will work through the contract process, and bring the contract back before the board. The board will need to have a special called meeting to finalize and set a start date.

Michael Cook – “With that being said, like the choices there, pretty predictable. This would be an open meeting setting, right because there will be more than one board member?”

Chair Neeley - “Certainly. They would do the background work to see what is necessary to fill in the blanks and then the whole board would be involved and welcome to sit-in on any meetings that are held.”

Mr. Cook asked and the Chair clarified that the board as a whole would approve the contract.

Mrs. Cashion said she would like to abstain from serving on the contract committee due to family health concerns that might not allow her the time to serve and would like another board member to serve in her place. Mr. Cook said he would like to make a motion to nominate Mr. Crews. Mrs. Neeley asked Mr. Crews if he would serve. The committee will consist of board members Anderson, Boutwell, Brown, and Crews.

Mr. Forsee asked for a point of clarification regarding if the interim superintendent would continue to serve in the position until a contract is approved. The Chair said yes, the Board had initially proposed a start date of March 1, but because of the inclement weather, that would not be possible. She added

this had been discussed in previous meetings that March 1 was a target but might not be what the Board would ultimately be able to do because of circumstances. She added that hopefully everything could be ironed out within the next two weeks.

Voluntary PreK Amendment – Revision #2

The second revision on Voluntary PreK (see document in February 23, 2021 board meeting file) represented a standard transfer of funds between line items that has already been approved by the state. **This amendment was accepted by unanimous vote upon the motion and second of Anderson and Forsee.**

ESSER Grant – Revision #6

This will be the sixth amendment to the ESSER Grant (see document in February 23, 2021 board meeting file) moving monies between line items. It has already been approved by the state. **Mr. Forsee moved for approval of the amendment. His motion was seconded by Mr. Crews and carried with a 9-0 vote.**

Additional BEP Funds Allotment

Chairman Neeley explained that Interim Superintendent Karen Scoggins had asked for a deferral on this item. **Mr. Forsee made a motion for deferral that was seconded by Mr. Brown. Motion passed with a 9-0 vote.**

January Monthly Financial Report

County Finance Director Robert Daniel reported that the January Monthly Financial (see document in February 23, 2021 board meeting file) was on track. **The January Monthly Financial Report was accepted unanimously, upon the motion and second of Mr. Boutwell and Mr. Forsee.**

REPORT ITEMS

Monthly Tax Analysis

Robert Daniel reviewed the monthly tax analysis (see document in February 23, 2021 board meeting file) noting that all categories were ahead for the year at this point.

Legislative Report

Chairman Neeley noted that there are currently approximately 250 bills submitted to the legislature on education.

Executive Committee Report

The Chair reported for the record having received a Declaration of Surplus from Liberty School.

She reminded that TSBA's annual SCOPE event had been cancelled.

A special called meeting to approve the contract for the superintendent will need to be held.

The next regular monthly meeting will be on March 16, 2021.

Superintendent's Report

Interim Superintendent Scoggins gave an update on numbers saying that the system is holding steady at 8,501, down 218 from this time last year. There are currently 1,251 students in the virtual program at this time.

COVID-19 numbers continue to decline with only two adult staff and five students affected and 17 in quarantine at this time.

Mr. Forsee asked for an update on snow days and was told that the stockpile of days have been utilized. The last day school was out (Monday, February 22), Mrs. Scoggins said was mainly due to debris and low trees that created unsafe conditions on roadways. That day will have to be made up. Mr. Forsee asked if a staff development day would be used to make that day up and Mrs. Scoggins said that would be up to the new superintendent.

OTHER BUSINESS

Acknowledge Special Programs & Achievements

Mr. Crews thanked Mrs. Scoggins for her leadership, courage, wisdom and for filling-in when asked to do so and for doing a good job.

Mr. Cook also thanked Mrs. Scoggins and said he appreciated what she had done for the school system, adding she had "been put in a lot of hard spots and shone through every bit of it."

Mr. Forsee acknowledged all the thoughtful commentary he had received from the community throughout the search process and felt it was a very good representation of input from across the county.

Mr. Brown thanked Chairwoman Neeley, saying "it has been a lot of work." Chairwoman Neeley said she was only doing what was expected of her.

Mr. Cook wished to thank all the candidates, saying they had done a great job and were clearly prepared. He also thanked everyone for the emails he had received and that he believed he had responded to each and every one. Mr. Cook said he valued each and every person that works for the system. Michael Cook – "I am thankful for the folks that we have and the dedication to our system in Bedford County. We have some really shining stars out there."

Chairwoman Neeley said she too would like to thank Mrs. Scoggins and everyone involved. She added, "While I know we didn't make everyone happy, I think we can move forward and no matter what, we must unite and work together."

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned at approximately 5:56 p.m., upon the motion of Mr. Forsee.

BEDFORD COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

Minutes from March 1, 2021 Special Called Meeting

The Bedford County Board of Education met in a special called session on Monday, March 1 at 5:00 p.m. in the central office building board room located at 500 Madison Street. Board members Diane Neeley, Glenn Forsee, Dr. Andrea Anderson, Michael Cook, John Boutwell, Brian Crews, Nicole Cashion, and Dan Reed were present at the start of the meeting. David Brown arrived a short time later.

CONSENT AGENDA

The consent agenda was approved by acclamation, upon the motion and second of Boutwell and Forsee.

ACTION ITEMS

Consideration of Interim Superintendent Karen Scoggin's Request to the Board

Chairwoman Neeley explained that on Wednesday, February 24th, the Board had received a request for a timeline from Mrs. Scoggins requesting a timeline. Also on the 24th, the Chair spoke with the board's attorney to craft a response that simply stated the Board would like to have Mrs. Scoggins stay as interim and that it was her choice to do so. She was asked to respond and did so

Chairwoman Neeley noted that the response (see document in March 1, 2021 board meeting file) contained two requests. Request #1 was a timeline for the continuance and a date for when Dr. Garrett would assume the role of superintendent. Mrs. Neeley reported that Dr. Garrett will be released from service with Murfreesboro City Schools after they graciously agreed to do so, effective March 5 and will be able to begin her duties in Bedford County on March 8.

(Mr. Brown arrived at this point in the meeting.)

The Chair asked Mrs. Scoggins, now that a timeline was known, if she would like to remain as interim for the remaining four days of the week under the agreement they had or have the Board take into consideration her second request.

Karen Scoggins – "Do you want me to continue for \$39.20 per day?"

Diane Neeley – "I haven't broken it out."

Karen Scoggins – "That is what we previously agreed to. I have asked for a supplement..."

Mrs. Neeley confirmed that Mrs. Scoggins wished for the Board to consider Request #2 for the remainder of the week and then read the second request which stated: "I am requesting a raise in the supplement to \$1,500 a week for each week I am serving as interim, in addition to my current salary."

The Chair then asked what was the will of the Board.

Mr. Cook noted the request was made prior to knowing the timeline and that Mrs. Scoggins has requested the Board honor the additional pay for the remainder of the week, adding he didn't have a problem with that and made a motion to that effect. Mrs. Cashion seconded the motion for the additional compensation. Dr. Anderson clarified that the additional pay would be for this week, ending on Friday.

Brian Crews – “As with all our administrators, they are under a year to year contract, is that correct?”

Diane Neeley – “Yes, as far as I know.”

Brian Crews – “In that contract is there a clause that requires a notice if they were to accept other employment?”

Diane Neeley – “I can't answer that without looking at the specifics of a contract.”

Mr. Crews asked Mrs. Scoggins if she knew and she said there was no such clause but went on to explain how a license can be held for thirty (30) days or until a replacement can be secured to take that person's place.

Brian Crews – “When you say license – because you are a licensed educator in the State of Tennessee so, if you were in the classroom, in fairness to whoever was your supervisor, that supervisor could hold you to a thirty-day continuation of employment thirty days...” Mr. Crews asked if Mrs. Scoggins knew what the consequences of that would be.

Karen Scoggins – “That is customary with the teacher shortage the last couple of years. In our district, we try to not let someone take other employment -because it is so hard to find people and leaves schools in a predicament - Usually everyone offers a two-week notice.”

Michael Cook – “Once Dr. Garrett is in place, you would go back to your current contract, correct?”

Karen Scoggins – “The superintendent can transfer any person at any time. If you are talking about my position specifically, Bedford County Schools cannot reduce my compensation in accordance with that, until the next school year.”

Michael Cook – “So you would have a contract in place 'til the next school year.”

Brian Crews – “The reason I asked that is because I think when we set things in motion – or I personally was a proponent of having Mrs. Scoggins serving in that interim role because I thought it was very important thought to have a continuum of operations. Our teachers, our educators, everyone we interviewed said this has been the most difficult year ever. Well that is not going to change with bringing in a new superintendent so I think there is some value – for our interim superintendent and our new superintendent working together for a period of time and doing what is in the best interest of the school system. So, I don't think this is unreasonable.”

The Chair restated the motion as “it is to honor the request for an additional \$1,500 for this week until the end of business on Friday.”

John Boutwell – “Prior to this increase, she was essentially making what Don was making.”

Diane Neeley – “Yes, she was receiving the difference between her salary and what his was as superintendent.”

Mr. Forsee called for the question. Hearing no objection, the motion carried with a voice vote of 8-1 for the motion. Mr. Boutwell cast the dissenting vote.

Contract Approval for Dr. Tammy Garrett

Chairwoman Neeley thanked the committee appointed to work on the superintendent contract for their prompt attention getting it done, noting they had finished on Friday, submitted the document to Attorney Chuck Cagle, who then returned it over the weekend, and the contract went back out this morning.

The Chair noted that Dr. Garrett had reviewed the contract and had a request on #8 – Residency, regarding the possibility to extend the time from six to seven months for personal reasons regarding the house in which she currently resides, keeping in mind the request on #8.

Mr. Forsee moved to accept the contract submitted for Dr. Tammy Garrett, Superintendent of Schools. Mr. Cook seconded the motion. The Chair offered the opportunity for someone from the committee to go through the contract highlights. Mr. Cook asked that Mr. Crews review.

Brian Crews – “One of the things we changed from our prior superintendent’s contract that has caused this board a lot of grief in the past, the additional performance bonus. We took that amount and added to base salary – keeping in budget. That was the biggest, significant change. Section 8 in this contract required the relocation within Bedford County within six months or the contract could be voided on our part. Other than that there was a lot of language that was consistent with what we’ve had.” The committee picked Jackson-Madison County’s contract as a model from four examples.

Mr. Boutwell noted there was a motion and second on the floor and asked if that was for the six or seven months on Section #8. Michael Cook – “I would amend my part to seven, if you are okay.” He then asked Dr. Garrett if it would be better to go with nine months versus seven months. Dr. Garrett explained that she had consulted with an accountant about tax ramifications on selling her home, which she will have resided in for 24 months in September. She added that her hope is to get to Bedford County much sooner, but appreciated the additional time.

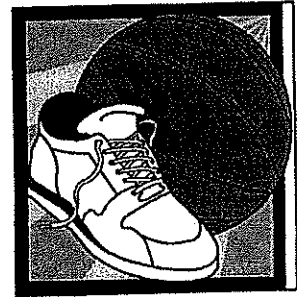
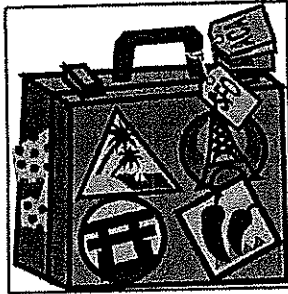
Mr. Cook then made a motion to amend the contract to say nine months, rather than six months regarding residency requirement, to which Mr. Forsee agreed. The amendment was approved by a vote of 9-0.

Mr. Crews said there were a few things spelled out in the contract there might need to be an understanding of. Brian Crews – “There is some performance goals and measures within three months and six months - a desire of the Board for you to communicate with us your vision and for us to have the opportunity to set some realistic goals the first year...” Mr. Cook confirmed with Dr. Garrett that she was fine with the contract.

ENA Voice Opt-In Agreement (2021)
(Educational Networks of America)

ENA is our provider for:

- Internet and Internet services
- Voice (telephone system)
 - At all sites except BCLA and Maintenance
- Wireless
 - At all sites except BCLA, Bus Garage, and Maintenance

ENA is offering a cost savings of @\$1200/month if this agreement is signed. It is for 3 years with the option to add another year and then another, based on Metro Nashville continuing with their contract.

Bedford County Schools is part of the ENA Consortium among many, many more districts across the state. BCS has signed an LOA to be a part of this consortium, and the Metro Nashville Contract is the document at the heart of this collaboration of school systems. The consortium allows for Metro Nashville to include BCS when filing the federal 470 which requests CAT1 and CAT1 services to be funded by e-rate. This helps BCS with e-rate filing for Internet services yearly.

The ENA agreement that the BCS Technology Dept is wishing to be signed is a voluntary option. If BCS chooses to back out of this agreement, BCS will revert back to year-to-year pricing (higher cost). BCS can even change partners and drop ENA during this time, if so desire.

Bedford County has been using ENA Voice services since around 2009 for half of the schools. In the 2019-2020 school year, the Technology Dept rolled ENA Voice out to the remaining school sites except for BCLA to build a unified telephone system across the district. The Transportation Office was also added this school year. BCS has made an investment in ENA Voice. It is a solid platform and has been for many, many years.

This agreement is showing the desire to stay with ENA Voice throughout the life of the Metro Nashville contract which BCS is a part of via the ENA Consortium.

ENA Opt-In Voice Services Agreement

This Opt-In Agreement for ENA Voice Services is entered into by Bedford County Schools ("Client") as of July 1, 2021 ("Effective Date") in conjunction with Metro Nashville Public Schools Purchase of Internet Access and Related Services Contract 2-225071-08 ("MSA") between Education Networks of America, Inc. ("Contractor" or "ENA") and The Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County by and through The Metropolitan Board of Public Education and client voluntarily extended related services accordingly.

Client agrees to exercise its voluntary option to extend the term to June 30, 2024, under section 4 of the MNPS Contract. Further, Client intends to exercise its voluntary option to extend through 2026 if MNPS so extends.

Client agrees that the following terms of service ("Terms of Service") shall govern Client and its Users use of ENA voice services (the "Services"). In these Terms of Service, "User" shall mean any individual or legal entity that uses or accesses the Services directly or indirectly from Client.

Services are provided by ENA Services, LLC or one or more ENA affiliates or underlying service providers. Any data supplied by Client such as data necessary for conversions from other carriers and/or Letter(s) of Authorization and Agency ("LOA") may be used by any of ENA, its affiliates or underlying service providers, as appropriate, for purposes of delivering the Services contracted herein.

1. Pricing. Pricing is indicated in the relevant pricing document(s).

While most of the charges associated with ENA's service are included in the available product configurations at a flat rate, certain services have a per usage charge or may be restricted/blocked as described below and in more complete detail in ENA's published price lists.

- 900/976 numbers – Client acknowledges by signing this agreement that ENA has informed Client that the Services do not permit calls to 900/976 numbers or other pay-per-call services.
- Directory Assistance – Client acknowledges that ENA has informed Client that calls to Directory Assistance (411, 1-XXX-555-1212 or similar) will incur a per usage charge of \$1.00 per call or as otherwise indicated in ENA's tariffs, as updated. Client may request that Directory Assistance calls be blocked.
- International calls – Client acknowledges that ENA has informed Client that international calls and calls to US locations outside the continental United States are not included in the Services and will incur a per call charge based on ENA's then applicable rates. International calls are blocked by default. Client may request that international calling be enabled on a per extension basis.
- Operator-Assisted calls – Client acknowledges that ENA has informed Client that Operator-Assisted calls, such as Operator-Assisted Person-to-Person calls, Operator-Assisted Collect calls, Third Party Billed Calls, and Operator-Assisted Dialing, are not supported on ENA's Voice services.

2. Invoicing. Client's first invoice from ENA may include a partial month of Service. It may take up to three (3) billing cycles until charges for all Services requested appear on the invoice. After the initial billing cycles, Client's invoice will include charges for one month of Service for all requested Services, including any usage charges. Client should receive a final invoice from its existing local, long distance, and/or data service provider(s) that ENA is replacing and Client will be responsible for paying any charges resulting from the early termination of a service contract with existing provider(s), if applicable.

3. Transition from Prior Service Provider. ENA will handle communication with Client's existing provider(s) regarding the porting of your existing numbers to ENA, based on the scope of services ENA is to deliver; however, Client is responsible for requesting that existing services be disconnected from your current provider once service has been migrated to ENA. ENA can provide sample disconnect language, upon request.

4. Disconnection. Upon disconnection of Service, ENA shall release to Client's new service provider the telephone number(s) used in connection with Client's Service if all of the following occur:

- a) Such new service provider is able to accept such number;
- b) Client's account has been properly disconnected;
- c) Client agrees to resolve any outstanding dues or fees on the account; Client requests the transfer upon disconnecting Client's account.

5. Voice Recording. ENA may provide Client with the ability to record voice calls placed via the Services. Client is solely responsible for notifying those using the Services that the calls may be recorded and complying with all applicable laws and regulations regarding notifications required for the recording of any voice conversations. Client will indemnify, defend, and hold harmless ENA for any claims, damages, liabilities or costs (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising from a claim resulting from the recording by Client of any voice conversations using the Services.

6. 9-1-1 Dialing Feature; Compliance with 47 CFR § 9.11 et. seq. Included in the Services provided to Client by ENA is a 9-1-1 Dialing Feature that has certain limitations as compared to a traditional telephonic 9-1-1 dialing. Client acknowledges that the Client has certain obligations in connection with the provision of the 9-1-1 Dialing Feature. Client acknowledges and agrees that it is Client's responsibility and obligation, prior to initiating any of the Services, to comply with the following:

- a) **Registered Location.** Client is required to provide to ENA the physical location(s) at which the Service will be utilized ("Registered Location").

Client is required to notify ENA via phone (1-888-612-2880) or email (support@ena.com) if Client needs to update one or more Registered Locations.

Client may opt-in for self-management of 9-1-1 records via a supplied web portal. Client must designate individuals who will be granted access to the web portal and who will be responsible for maintaining 9-1-1 data.

- b) **Notification to End Users.** Client is required to provide a copy of the 9-1-1 Dialing Feature specifications, provided by ENA in the form of labels to be adhered to phones, to each end user of the service and to post a copy of the 9-1-1 Dialing Feature specifications described herein. Client hereby certifies that it has adhered the labels to each phone and appropriately inform all end users of the Services of the 9-1-1 Dialing Feature specifications. If Client fails to provide the necessary records or refuses to make such certification, ENA may immediately suspend Service until such records are provided or certification is made. Client hereby forever releases ENA from any and all liability, losses or damages which may arise from ENA's suspension or disconnection of any of Client's Services due to the failure of Client to provide the necessary proof of compliance to the 9-1-1 Dialing Feature specifications detailed herein. ENA reserves the right to terminate the Services for a breach by Client of the obligations in this section, in addition to any other remedies ENA may have in law or equity.
- c) **Acknowledgement of 9-1-1 Dialing Feature.** By signing this Agreement, Client acknowledges that it understands the 9-1-1 Dialing Feature is provided as part of the Services.

General Indemnification. In the event that the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”) conducts an audit or inquiry of ENA’s compliance with 47 C.F.R. §§ 9.11, Client agrees to cooperate fully with ENA and the FCC and produce all records requested by either ENA or the FCC. Should ENA be found in violation of any provision of the 47 C.F.R §§ 9.11 or any other FCC rules regarding the provision of 9-1-1 services as a result of Client’s breach of or failure to comply with any of its obligations under this section, Client agrees to indemnify and hold ENA harmless for any and all monetary penalties assessed by the FCC on ENA.

When placing a 9-1-1 emergency call, always state the phone number and location that you are calling from because the phone number that is transmitted to the 9-1-1 operator may not be the same as the phone number you are calling from and if your 9-1-1 call is disconnected, the 9-1-1 operator may need to call you back. Additionally, the address that is transmitted to the 9-1-1 operator is the main address for your service location; therefore, you should tell the operator your specific location (for example – the classroom number and floor) within the main address so emergency personnel can more easily locate you.

Additional limitations for VoIP 911 service are as follows:

- If you lose power or there is a disruption to power at the location where the ENA voice service is used, neither the ENA voice service nor the 9-1-1 dial feature will function until power is restored. You should also be aware that after a power failure or disruption, you may need to reset or reconfigure the end user phone device prior to utilizing the service, including the 9-1-1 dialing feature. ENA and your local phone service coordinator can assist if needed.

You are responsible for updating and advising ENA of any and all changes to the address or location at which ENA connected phone handsets and phone numbers will be used. ENA uses third parties to route the 9-1-1 dialed calls to the applicable local emergency response center or to the national emergency calling centers. ENA makes no representations, warranties or guarantees as to whether, or the manner in which, 9-1-1 dialed calls that you make are answered or responded to by the local emergency response center or by the national emergency calling centers. ENA disclaims any and all liability or responsibility in the event that the third party data used to route 9-1-1 dialed calls is incorrect or yields an erroneous result. Neither ENA, its officers, directors, stockholders, parent corporation, its affiliated or subsidiary corporations, employees, representatives or agents may be held liable for any claim, damage or loss, and you hereby waive any and all such claims or causes of action, arising from or relating to ENA 9-1-1 service unless such claims or causes of action arise from ENA's gross negligence or willful misconduct. You agree to release, indemnify, defend and hold harmless ENA, its officers, directors, stockholders, parent corporation, its affiliated or subsidiary corporations, employees, representatives or agents and any other service provider who furnishes services to you from any and all claims, damages, losses, suits or actions, fines, penalties, cost and expenses (including, but not limited to, attorney fees) or any liability whatsoever, whether suffered, made, instituted or asserted by you or by any other party or person, for any personal injury to or death of any person or persons, or for any loss, damage or destruction of any

property, whether owned by you or others, or for any infringement or invasion or the right of privacy of any person or persons, caused or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly, by the operation, failure or outage of services, incorrect routing, or use of, or inability of a person to use, ENA 9-1-1 dialing feature or service or access emergency service personnel.

Pursuant to the legislation passed during the special session earlier this month, please find below your district's allocation of funds to increase salaries for teachers and other certified personnel and additional information regarding these funds. The department will post this information and additional Frequently Asked Questions on its website as well for ease of access.

District Allocation

District	Allocation
Bedford County	\$375,000

Overview

The General Assembly and Governor Lee passed legislation to provide additional funding for teachers and certified personnel, effective for the second half of the current fiscal year (Jan. 1, 2021 – Jun 30, 2021). The funding gives districts more than \$42 million to provide salary increases this school year, with districts having the flexibility to determine the right implementation for their local contexts. While the calculation aligns to the BEP formula, this funding increase requires no local match from districts in this fiscal year, ensuring stability for local budgeting practices. The information below provides more details on how the funding operates for districts.

Calculating Allocations

District allocations were determined in alignment with the BEP formula, following the same process as prior year adjustments for additional educator salary funding. The below steps were used to calculate each district's award value.

1. The current year's BEP formula was run again, adjusting for the 2% increase on the instructional salary component and related benefits (social security, Medicare, and retirement).
2. Each district's current FY21 BEP allocation was subtracted from the new allocation generated in the step above.
3. The difference was then divided by two to reflect that the increases are effective for half of the fiscal year (e.g. beginning on January 1, 2021).
4. The result is each district's allocation to support teacher salary increase in FY21.

As a reminder, no local match is required on these allocations because the state is funding the full allocation amount for FY21. This will not remain true for subsequent increases in FY22.

Disbursement

- **Timing:** The department will begin processing payments as soon as the bill is fully signed into law, with the goal of initial payments being issued in mid- to late- February. With the exception of the initial payment that will be processed as soon as possible, the payments will follow the calendar of BEP payments for the remainder of the fiscal year.
- **Amounts:** The total allocation will be divided over the five installments of BEP payments districts receive throughout spring semester. The initial payment will include January and February amounts, and subsequent payments will each reflect a remaining fifth of the allocation.
- **Tracking:** Information on both allocations and payments will be accessible in ePlan, similar to standard BEP payments.

Local Use

- **Eligible Employees:** The funding is required to support salary increases for teachers and other certified staff. Certified personnel include positions requiring a license issued by the State Board of Education and nurses (a full list of the instructional and certificated position associated with this increase is available in the BEP Blue Book, available [here](#)).
- **Distribution of Increase:** Districts have the discretion to determine how to allocate these funds to increase teacher and certified personnel salaries. Districts may use these funds to raise teacher pay through such methods as increasing the district salary schedules, providing across-the-board raises outside the salary schedule, or awarding bonuses.

Reporting

Districts will be required to report on the use of these funds in the Annual Salary Transparency Report survey for FY21 to be administered next fall.

The Tennessee Constitution

Section 12. The state of Tennessee recognizes the inherent value of education and encourages its support. The General Assembly shall provide for the maintenance, support and eligibility standards of a system of free public schools. The General Assembly may establish and support such post-secondary educational institutions, including public institutions of higher learning, as it determines.



Lawsuit Filed Seeking Equitable Funding

Tennessee Small School Systems, an unincorporated association of seventy-seven rural school districts, filed suit against the State of Tennessee and Governor Ned McWherter on July 7, 1988, in the Davidson County Chancery Court to overturn the Tennessee system of financing local school systems (851 S.W. 2d 139).



Tennessee Small Schools Won Lawsuit

The Tennessee Supreme Court decided in 1993 that the system of financing public education in Tennessee violated the provisions of the Tennessee Constitution guaranteeing equal protection of the law to all citizens.

The court held that the Tennessee General Assembly must maintain and support a system of free public schools that affords equal educational opportunities to students in small counties as well as large, and rural counties as well as urban.



Basic Education Program (BEP)

The general assembly passed the Educational Improvement Act of 1992 that contained a new formula, called the Basic Education Program (BEP), to replace the old statutory funding scheme.

State statute requires the BEP to ensure more equitable funding for all of Tennessee's public school systems. The concept is straightforward:

The state will contribute more dollars to districts that have less ability to generate revenue, and fewer dollars to districts that have a greater ability to generate revenue.



Tennessee Advisory Commission On Intergovernmental Relations (TACIR)

- One way to measure a county's level of effort in supporting public schools is to compare the money it *does* give to fund education versus the money it *could* give. The amount any county could give is not an unknown value.
- In fact, the Tennessee Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations (TACIR) in Nashville calculates this amount every year, just as it has since the inception of the BEP in 1992.



What is Fiscal Capacity?

This calculated value, known as *fiscal capacity*, is defined by TACIR as “the potential ability of local governments to fund education from their own taxable sources, relative to their cost of providing services.

The formula estimates how much revenue per pupil each county area can afford to raise for education.”

Fiscal Capacity

While the idea is simple, the actual funding formula is rather complicated. Several factors are taken into account, and the percent of state funding is different for virtually every district in the state.

For the 2016-2017 fiscal year, the state percentage ranged from a low of 26 percent for the wealthy Franklin Special School District to a high of 82.7 percent for Alamo City Schools, mostly due to its limited ability to generate local revenue

Fiscal Capacity

An important distinction is that fiscal capacity is not a measure of what a county must provide to its local schools.

Instead, just as the name suggests, it is simply an indication of how much funding a county has the potential to provide.

Maintenance of effort is required.

Local School Funding

Analyzing school funding based on the local percent of per pupil expenditures is not the only way to measure a community's commitment to public education.

Another type of assessment involves comparing a county's fiscal capacity to the actual revenue generated, an amount largely driven by tax rates set by the county commission.

Beginning in the 2017-18 school year, chronic absenteeism became part of district and school accountability. The measure is called the Chronically Out-of-School Indicator. This indicator will be based on what research calls chronic absenteeism, which is defined as a student missing 10 percent or more of the days the student is enrolled-for any reason, including excused absences and out-of-school suspensions. Excessive absences from school represent lost instructional time for a student. The department of education encourages districts and schools to carefully review attendance data throughout the school year to ensure supports are in place to maximize learning time for all students.

Counts 10% of Accountability on State Report Card

Definition Truancy: A legal term that refers only to unexcused absences. A Tennessee student is considered truant at five unexcused absences and may be subject to legal intervention.

Definition Chronic Absenteeism: Missing school for any reason (excused, unexcused, suspended/expelled). Commonly defined as missing 10 percent or more of instructional days, the threshold at which research indicates most students are at risk of negative academic and social consequences.

In order to be successful in addressing chronic absenteeism, it is important that we view attendance as more than a legal or compliance issue and try to understand what factors may be contributing to a student's absences. Furthermore, we can best serve students by viewing attendance as an opportunity to learn and chronic absences as an indication of barriers or conditions that are limiting that opportunity.

Multiple research studies link poor attendance with reduced academic outcomes. From a Tennessee perspective, we know that Tennessee students who are chronically absent in kindergarten are 15 percentage points less likely to reach proficiency in either third grade math or ELA. We also know that Tennessee students who are chronically absent in ninth grade are 30 percentage points less likely to earn an on-time diploma (62% vs. 92%).
