Questions were asked regarding the use of the same financial numbers in the long range facility plan. Here is the answer I received:

It appears you are referencing one school, Hickman County High School. Phase 1 estimates are listed in years 2 and 3 at \$3,762,000 each year and years 6 and 7 at \$9,408,000 each year to complete of the work required to address the 60.64 FCI of that facility. The estimate to address all of the work required at Hickman County High School was \$26,340,000. We broke out all of the critical items (roofing, electrical ,HVAC, plumbing, and fire safety) that received a score of fair or poor for all schools except East Hickman High and two intermediate schools and created a Phase 1 of work to be addressed in the first four years. For East Hickman High and the two intermediate schools, since they were the newer schools, we included only the identified critical items with poor scores in Phase 1.

The estimated cost of the phase 1 work for Hickman County High School was \$7,524,000. The estimated cost of the remainder of worked needed at Hickman County High \$18,816,000. We simply divided the cost of Phase 1 items for this school into two years (2 & 3) and the remainder of work, likewise, into two years (6 & 7) to more evenly balance the cost burden over the ten year plan. If you add the estimates listed for this project in the four years you will find it equals the total renovation estimate of \$26,340,000. Remember that these estimates include the cost of design services (architect, engineer, etc.) and a 5% contingency. I used the MNPS fee schedule, which calculates the design fee as a % of the construction cost with the % being lower the higher the cost of construction, to calculate fees.

As to the square footage costs used, I consulted with the MNPS Planning and Construction Department to understand the costs they have experienced in the past year or two. Square footage costs of \$173 for elementary and intermediate schools, \$189 for middle schools, and \$285 for high schools were used. MNPS actually used a significantly higher number for high schools but I was aware that the two high schools for which they were receiving proposals were more complex and included items, such as a parking structure, that would not be needed in Hickman County. We felt the contractors bidding on Hickman County work would be much the same as those bidding MNPS work, so the cost should be comparable.
