If there are more than 6 individuals who wish to address the board, the 30 minutes will be divided equally between the number of speakers. These time limits may be changed by a majority vote of the board members in attendance to extend the time for a specific item or speaker.
- **Personnel or Student Topic:** If you are planning to speak about a personnel or a student matter involving an individual, please understand that the district has a complaint policy and/or procedures to resolve such complaints and concerns. The Board requests that you follow the policy and procedures before addressing these matters with the Board. Board members will generally not respond to any questions you ask or comments about individual staff members or students.
- **General Rules:** This is a public meeting for the conduct of business. Comments from the audience while others are speaking will not be tolerated. Lewd, obscene, profane, slanderous, threatening and hostile conduct or statements and fighting words (words whose mere utterance entails a call to violence) will not be tolerated.
- **No Action by the Board:** The board will not act on any matter unless it is on the published agenda.



INTERIM PRINCIPAL'S CONTRACT OF EMPLOYMENT RAVENNA PUBLIC SCHOOLS

THIS CONTRACT is made by and between the **Board of Education of Ravenna Public Schools**, legally known as **Buffalo County School District 10-0069**, and referred to as "the Board" and "the District" respectively, and **Noah Maulsby**, referred to herein as "the Principal", and cumulatively referred to as the "Parties." In accordance with its action taken and recorded in the minutes of a duly advertised board meeting, the Board agrees to employ the Principal, and the Principal agrees to accept such employment, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

Section 1. Term of Contract. The Principal is currently a regular teacher of the District under a regular teaching contract covering the 2023-2024 school year. The Principal has agreed to serve in the role of principal due to a mid-year resignation. The Principal shall be employed in this interim position from November 20, 2023 through July 31, 2024. The Principal shall perform duties on all working days. "Working days" typically will not include Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, but it shall include all days on which the Principal actually and necessarily completes his contractual duties, even if those are weekend days or holidays.

Section 2. Renewal of Contract. IT IS A MATERIAL PROVISION OF THIS CONTRACT THAT IT IS FOR A LIMITED PERIOD OF TIME AND SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO THE RENEWAL OR NONRENEWAL PROVISIONS OF NEB. REV. STAT. §§ 79-824 TO 79-839 OR §§ 79-846 TO 79-849. IN EXCHANGE FOR **\$1** AND OTHER VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, THE INTERIM PRINCIPAL AGREES TO ACCEPT EMPLOYMENT ON THIS BASIS AND HEREBY RESIGNS AS A PRINCIPAL AS OF THE EXPIRATION DATE SET OUT ABOVE. BY RESIGNING AND ACCEPTING THIS ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATION, THE INTERIM PRINCIPAL UNDERSTANDS THAT HE IS WAIVING STATUTORY RIGHTS SUCH AS TO NOTICE AND A HEARING AND OTHER RIGHTS REGARDING RENEWAL OF EMPLOYMENT AS A PRINCIPAL OR AMENDMENT OF CONTRACT. AS CONTAINED HEREIN, HE AGREES THAT HE WILL RETURN TO REGULAR TEACHING DUTIES AND ACCEPTS ANY AMENDMENT OF CONTRACT NECESSARY TO RESTORE HIM TO THE FULL RIGHTS AND BENEFITS OF A REGULAR TEACHER AFTER THE EXPIRATION OF THIS CONTRACT. HE DOES SO VOLUNTARILY AND WITH FULL KNOWLEDGE OF THE RIGHTS HE IS WAIVING.

Section 3. Salary. The Principal's salary for the Contract year shall be \$7,500 per month payable on the District's normal payroll schedule. **In addition to the principal's salary of \$7,500 per month, the Principal shall continue to receive compensation for extra duty assignments at the rate**

previously agreed to by the Parties including: Head Girls Basketball (\$6,132/annually), Assistant Football (\$3,577/annually), ½ of Summer Weight Room Supervision Responsibility (\$1,277/annually), Senior Class Sponsor (\$486.67/pro-rate for remainder of this contract term). These extra duty payments will be added and paid out over the remainder of the Interim Principal Contract. The Board shall not reduce the Principal's salary during the term of the Contract, but may increase it and/or the benefits during the term of this Contract, as an amendment to the Contract, without the amendment constituting a new contract, requiring a hearing, or extending the term of this Contract.

Section 4. Deductions. This Contract shall conform to the statutes and regulations governing deductions from compensation and shall be subject to the School Employees Retirement Act, due to the ongoing employment relationship between the Parties. The Principal authorizes the District to deduct or withhold from each and every period of pay any amounts necessary to offset any damages caused by the Principal or the value of property or money entrusted to the Principal or owed by the Principal to the District during the course of or as a result of the Principal's employment, if such property or money have not properly been returned to the District. The school district shall withhold other deductions as the Principal and Board may agree.

Section 5. Professional Status. The Principal affirms that he is not under contract with any other board of education covering any part or all of the term provided in this Contract. Throughout the Contract Term, Principal will hold a valid and appropriate certificate to act as a principal in the State of Nebraska which he will register and maintain on file in the school district's central administrative office. This Contract shall not be valid and the Board will not compensate the Principal for any service performed prior to the date that he registers his certificate. The Principal represents that: (1) all information provided in connection with his application for employment with the District was true and accurate at the time of application, and if there is or has been a material change in such information, he will advise the Board immediately; (2) he has never been convicted of or plead no contest to, a felony as defined in Title 92, Chapter 21, Sections 003.11 and 003.13 of the Nebraska Administrative Code ("Rule 21"), or any offense involving moral turpitude, abuse, neglect, or sexual misconduct, as defined in Title 92, Chapter 21, Sections 003.12 and 003.13 of the Nebraska Administrative Code; and (3) he has not had any professional licenses or certificates suspended or revoked.

Section 6. Principal's Duties. The Principal's duties shall be as prescribed by statute and by Board policies, rules, regulations, and directives. The Principal agrees to devote his time, skill, labor and attention to his duties throughout the Contract Term. The Principal shall be subject to the direction

and control of the Superintendent at all times and shall perform such administrative duties as the Superintendent or Board assigns. By agreement with the Superintendent, the Principal may undertake consultative work, speaking engagements, writing, lecturing, or other professional duties and obligations as long as they do not interfere with carrying out his duties and obligations to the District.

Section 7. Nonrenewal, Termination, Cancellation or Mid-Term Amendment. Except as otherwise agreed to in the waiver and restoration sections herein, nonrenewal, termination, cancellation, or amendment of this Contract shall be in accordance with state statutes. During any applicable probationary period, the Board may nonrenew or amend this Contract for any reason so long as it is not unconstitutional. At all other times, the Board may terminate, cancel, or amend this Contract for any of the following reasons: (a) the cancellation, termination, revocation, or suspension of the Principal's certificate (Nebraska Administrative and Supervisory Certificate, or the Nebraska Professional Administrative and Supervisory Certificate) by the State Board of Education; (b) any of the reasons set forth in this Contract; (c) the breach of any of the material provisions of this Contract; (d) incompetence; (e) neglect of duty; (f) unprofessional conduct; (g) insubordination; (h) conduct involving moral turpitude; (i) physical or mental incapacity; (j) immorality; (k) conviction of a felony; (l) any conduct that substantially interferes with the Principal's continued performance of his or her duties; (m) any arrest, criminal charge, or criminal conviction of Principal or the failure to report the same; (n) any filing against the Principal under Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 43-247 or any other provision of the Nebraska Juvenile Code for child abuse and/or neglect or the failure to report the same; (o) knowingly falsifying school district records or documents; (p) misrepresentation of fact to the district and its personnel in the conduct of the district's official business; (q) the use or possession of illegal drugs or controlled substances except as prescribed by a physician; or (r) being under the influence of illegal drugs, controlled substances, or alcohol while on school grounds, at school events, or in a vehicle owned, leased or contracted by the district except as prescribed by a physician.

Section 8. Disability. If the Principal is unable to perform his duties by reason of illness, accident or other disability beyond his control, and the disability continues for a period exceeding the Principal's paid leave allowance or if the disability is permanent, irreparable, or of such a nature as to make performance of her duties impossible, the Board may initiate action to cancel this Contract, whereupon the respective rights, duties and obligations of the parties hereunder shall terminate, with the exception of any benefits to be paid to the Principal under any insurance coverage furnished by the district.

Section 9. Transportation. The Board shall provide the Principal with transportation or reimburse him for mileage required in the performance of his official duties at the rate approved by the Board.

Section 10. Fringe Benefits. The Board shall provide the Principal with the following fringe benefits:

- a. Health and Dental Insurance.** The Principal shall be eligible to receive health or dental insurance from the School District, in the event his current insurance situation changes and he is then in need of insurance benefits.
- b. Leaves.** The Principal is entitled to use paid leaves he has currently accrued under his existing teaching contract with the District. Upon resuming teaching duties, leave balances he did not use during the time he serves as interim principal will be available for his use as a teacher.
- c. Disability Insurance.** The Principal shall purchase or continue carrying any existing long-term disability insurance from the District's carrier. The Parties will cooperate in providing updated salary and other information to the District's carrier to reflect the interim principal period.
- d. Professional Development.** With the approval of the Superintendent, the Principal may attend appropriate professional meetings and trainings at the local, regional, and state levels; the Board will pay for valid expenses of attendance.
- e. Professional Dues.** The District will pay the annual dues for the Principal's membership in the following organizations: Nebraska Council of School Administrators (NCSA) and any others approved by the Board.
- f. Expense Reimbursement.** The Board shall pay or reimburse the Principal for expenses that are actually, necessarily, and reasonably incurred in attending approved educational seminars, conventions, and workshops; conferences; training programs; official school functions, hearings, or meetings as permitted by law and policy.

Section 11. No Penalty for Release or Resignation. There shall not be a penalty for the release or resignation of the Principal from this Contract;

provided no resignation shall become effective until the expiration of the Contract unless it is accepted by the Board, and the Board shall fix the date at which the resignation shall take effect.

Section 12. Compensation Upon Termination. Upon lawful termination of this Contract for any reason, the compensation to be paid hereunder shall be an amount which bears the same ratio to the monthly salary specified as the number of months or fraction thereof to the date of such termination bears to the monthly salary period in which termination occurs. The Principal shall refund any portion of the salary he was paid but had not earned prior to the date of termination of this Contract.

Section 13. Evaluation. The Superintendent shall evaluate the Principal as required by state statute and Board policy. The Principal agrees that the full instructional/observational evaluation period, as required by section 79-828, shall mean any observation of the Principal's duties for at least 40 minutes, whether consecutive or as aggregated throughout the period applicable to the evaluation. The Principal agrees that time spent working in conjunction with the Superintendent on school-related matters may be counted toward observation for a full instructional period.

Section 14. Legal Actions. The Board will support the Principal if there is a legal dispute caused by him carrying out his duties properly. If a legal action, including a professional practice complaint, is threatened or filed against the Principal as a result of his performance of his duties or his position as Principal of the District, the Board will provide him with a legal defense to the extent permitted by law so long as he acted in good faith and in a manner which he reasonably believes to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the District and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe that his conduct was unlawful.

Section 15. Physical or Mental Examination. The Principal agrees that, at the request of the Board or Superintendent, he will have a comprehensive physical and/or mental examination performed by one or more licensed physicians or psychologists of the Board's choosing during the term of this Contract. In deference to the confidentiality requirements in state and federal law, the physician's report to the Board and/or Superintendent must address whether the Principal is able to perform the "essential functions" of his position.

Section 16. Resumption of Teaching Duties. Unless the Parties agree otherwise, at the conclusion of the Term of this Contract, the Principal will return to a teaching position for which he is qualified. His salary and benefits will resume as a teacher as though he successfully completed the

contract days and duties of his teaching contract for the 2023-2024 school/contract year. This will include credit for teaching experience and restoration of due process rights and benefits for which he would have been eligible if he had not agreed to perform interim principal duties.

Section 17. Governing Laws. The parties shall be governed by all applicable state and federal laws, rules, and regulations in performance of their respective duties and obligations under this contract.

Section 18. Amendments to be in Writing. This Contract may be modified or amended only by a writing duly authorized and executed by the Principal and the Board.

Section 19. Severability. If any portion of this Contract is declared invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such declaration shall not affect the validity or enforcement of the remaining provisions of this Contract.

TEACHER'S CONTRACT

For Class II, III, & VI Schools and Class I Schools with a Superintendent

THIS CONTRACT made by and between the School District of Ravenna, District No. 69, in the County of Buffalo, in the State of Nebraska, hereinafter referred to as the District, and Cannon Blauvelt, a legally qualified teacher, hereinafter referred to as Teacher.

WITNESSETH: That the Board of Education of the District hereby agrees to employ the Teacher above named in the schools of the District for a school year, which shall begin on or about 12/20/23 and end on or about 8/31/24, and shall consist of 96 days of service and that the Teacher hereby agrees to accept such employment at a salary of \$ 34,769.67 and under the following conditions.

FIRST: The salary of the Teacher shall be payable in eight equal installments. The first installment shall be payable on the 20th day of December, 2023, and the remaining installments shall be payable on the 20th day of each month thereafter.

SECOND: The teacher hereby agrees to be governed by the policies of the Board of Education of the District and that the teaching duties to be performed by him/her under this contract shall be subject to assignment of the Superintendent of the District with the approval of the Board of Education of the District; and further agrees to devote full time, during days of school to his/her position in all respects, to diligently and faithfully perform the assigned duties as Teacher to the best of his/her professional ability.

THIRD: In addition to the teaching duties set forth herein, the Teacher may be assigned such "extra duty" assignments as defined from time to time by the parties of this agreement which shall be upon such terms and conditions and at such additional stated rate of compensation as the Teacher and the District may from time to time agree upon.

FOURTH: This contract may be cancelled or amended by a majority of the members of the school board during the school year for any of the following reasons: (a) upon cancellation, termination, revocation or suspension of the teacher's certificate by the State Board of Education; (b) breach of any of the material provisions of this contract; (c) for any reason set forth in this contract; (d) incompetency; (e) neglect of duty; (f) unprofessional conduct; (g) insubordination; (h) immorality, or (i) physical or mental incapacity. Cancellation or amendment under this contract shall be governed by the provisions of 79-12,110, R.R.S. (1982 Supp.)

FIFTH: That upon termination of this contract for just cause, or upon the release of the Teacher from this contract, the compensation paid or to be paid hereunder shall be an amount which bears the same ratio to the yearly salary herein specified as the number of days of service to the date of such termination bears to 96 days of service. Any, unearned fractional portion of an installment paid but not earned prior to termination of the contract shall be refunded by the Teacher.

SIXTH: There shall be no penalty for release or resignation by the Teacher from this contract; provided no resignation shall become effective until the close of the school year unless accepted by the Board of Education of the District and the Board shall fix the time at which the resignation is to take effect.

SEVENTH: This contract shall conform to the regulations governing deductions from the above stated compensation with reference to Withholding Tax, Social Security and Teacher's Retirement. Other deductions may be withheld as agreed to by the parties to this contract.

EIGHTH: The Teacher hereby affirms that he/she is not under contract with another School Board or Board of Education within this State covering a part or all of the same time of performance as is contemplated by this agreement. The Teacher further affirms that at the beginning of the term of this contract he/she holds or will hold a valid Nebraska Teaching Certificate. It is understood and agreed that this contract is not valid until the Teacher's Certificate, as herein listed, is registered in the office of the Superintendent of Schools in this County and that the Teacher shall not be compensated for any services performed prior to the date of registration of this certificate.

NINTH: Terms and conditions set forth in this agreement shall be subject to such wages and conditions of employment as may, from time to time, be mutually agreed upon by and between the Board and teachers or a duly recognized collective bargaining agent for said teachers, and said agreement, when reduced to writing, and executed by the parties, shall be deemed to be included herein by reference and shall become a part hereof.

TENTH: Hereafter, this contract may be continued by a separate, annual written "Renewal Agreement" which shall incorporate all the provisions hereof by reference, except as stated on such Renewal Agreement. Renewal Agreements or renewal contracts must be executed by the Teacher and delivered to the Superintendent of Schools or the Secretary of the Board of Education of the District within fifteen (15) calendar days of receipt thereof from the district. Said Renewal Agreement or renewal contract shall not be offered to the Teacher prior to March 15th. Contract renewal, amendment, termination or cancellation shall also be subject to the requirements of Sections 79-12,111 through 79-12,114 R.R.S. (1982 Supp) and any other applicable state statutes.

ELEVENTH: The failure to return a signed copy of the contract or renewal agreement to the Superintendent of Schools or Secretary of the Board of Education of the district on or before 12/11/23 shall constitute a rejection by the teacher of the offer of employment.

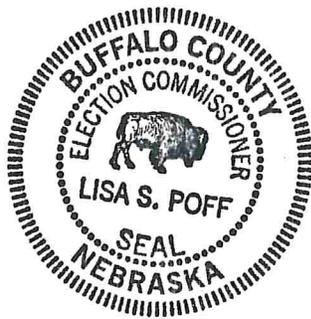

Enclosed you will find the certification form that needs to be completed for your subdivision. This form needs to be back at the Election Commissioner's office by January 5th, 2024. This certification tells our office how many positions within your subdivision are up for election in 2024 and other information our office needs for the election cycle. Enclosed you will find a map with our precincts on them. You will need to use the precincts on these maps to describe your boundaries on the certification along with the legal descriptions and a map of your subdivisions per State Statute 32-1203.

At the bottom of the certification form, you will find the filing deadlines for your board members. An incumbent is any current office holder who was elected or appointed to an elective office and a non-incumbent is someone who is not currently holding an elective office. January 5th, 2024 is the earliest date our office can accept a filing from any candidate. The filing forms will be available around the 1st of December 2023.

Enclosed you will also find the Nebraska State Statute, 32-608, about filing fees. This may help clear up some confusion on who has to pay, how much and where to pay the filing fee.

32-608. Filing fees; payment; amount; not required; when; refund; when allowed.

(1) Except as provided in subsection (4) or (5) of this section, a filing fee shall be paid by or on behalf of each candidate prior to filing for office. For candidates who file in the office of the Secretary of State as provided in subdivision (1) of section 32-607, the filing fee shall be paid to the Secretary of State who shall remit the fee to the State Treasurer for credit to the Election Administration Fund. For candidates for any city or village office, the filing fee shall be paid to the city or village treasurer of the city or village in which the candidate resides. For candidates who file in the office of the election commissioner or county clerk, the filing fee shall be paid to the election commissioner or county clerk in the county in which the office is sought. The election commissioner or county clerk shall remit the fee to the county treasurer. The fee shall be placed in the general fund of the county, city, or village. No candidate filing forms shall be filed until the proper payment or the proper receipt showing the payment of such filing fee is presented to the filing officer. On the day of the filing deadline, the city or village treasurer's office shall remain open to receive filing fees until the hour of the filing deadline.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (4) or (5) of this section, the filing fees shall be as follows:

(a) For the office of United States Senator, state officers, including members of the Legislature, Representatives in Congress, county officers, and city or village officers, except the mayor or council members of cities having a home rule charter, a sum equal to one percent of the annual salary as of November 30 of the year preceding the election for the office for which he or she files as a candidate;

(b) For directors of public power and irrigation districts in districts receiving annual gross revenue of forty million dollars or more, twenty-five dollars, and in districts receiving annual gross revenue of less than forty million dollars, ten dollars;

(c) For directors of reclamation districts, ten dollars; and

(d) For Regents of the University of Nebraska, members of the State Board of Education, and directors of metropolitan utilities districts, twenty-five dollars.

(3) All declared write-in candidates shall pay the filing fees that are required for the office at the time that they present the write-in affidavit to the filing officer.

(4) No filing fee shall be required for any candidate filing for an office in which a per diem is paid rather than a salary or for which there is a salary of less than five hundred dollars per year. No filing fee shall be required for any candidate for membership on a school board, on the board of an educational service unit, on the board of governors of a community college area, on the board of directors of a natural resources district, or on the board of trustees of a sanitary and improvement district.

Crisis Response Policy

- I. **The following objectives apply to dealing with a crisis situation:**
- A. Ensuring the safety and emotional security of students.
 - B. Formulating a plan of action immediately that provides uniformity in the treatment of each crisis.
 - C. Identifying those students and staff who will likely be most strongly affected by grief.
 - D. Preserving, to the extent possible, the daily school routine and pre-scheduled activities so as not to draw others into deeper levels of grief than they would normally experience.
 - E. Monitoring students' progress through the stages of the grief process.
 - F. Making the school's resources available to parents and guardians who become concerned about their child's reaction to a crisis.
- II. **Policy**
- A. Collaboration
 - 1. The superintendent or his/her designee shall meet at least annually with local authorities (e.g., fire, police, rescue, emergency management, mayor's office, etc.) to prepare for and communicate about possible crisis events which could occur at school or school activities. appropriate local agencies to identify and address safety and security issues.
 - 2. The school system shall have guidelines and policies for event and incident management.
 - 3. The school system shall maintain compliance with fire and life safety.

4. The school system shall have a structure to identify a primary school leader to serve as a liaison between emergency personnel and the school system in the event of an incident.
5. The school system's safety and security plan should include the development and implementation of multi-hazard practices in compliance with local, state, and federal regulations
6. The school system shall develop and implement multi-hazard training in compliance with local, state, and federal regulations.

B. School Hours

1. During a crisis situation, the administration will maintain established school hours and proceed with all co-curricular activities as scheduled whenever possible.
2. If, during a crisis situation, the parent(s) or guardian of a student decide that the student needs to be absent, this absence will be excused.

C. Access to School Facilities

1. The school's facilities may not be used for funeral or memorial services during the school day, unless otherwise authorized to do so by the superintendent.
2. This policy does not discourage the presentation of traditional American Legion memorial services which promote patriotism.

D. Memorials

1. Memorials often create a visual reminder of a particular crisis that may reintroduce feelings of grief for students. Therefore, memorials may not be displayed anywhere on the school premises without board approval.

This policy is not intended to discourage the acceptance of memorial funds or specific items.

Extracurricular Drug Testing Program

The Ravenna Public School district supports and values student participation in extracurricular activities, but such participation in school district extracurricular activities is a privilege and not a right. Students in all extracurricular activities in grades 7-12 shall be subject to mandatory and random testing for the presence of tobacco/nicotine, alcohol, illegal drugs, and misused prescription drugs.

1. Purpose of Random Drug Testing

- a.** The school district has recognized that observed and suspected drug, alcohol, and nicotine/tobacco use and abuse has increased among the student population, including students participating in extracurricular activities.
- b.** The school district seeks to provide safe, substance-free schools.
- c.** The school district seeks to deter the use of illegal and prohibited drugs, alcohol, and nicotine/tobacco among students.
- d.** The school district recognizes that students who use illegal and prohibited substances pose a threat to the health and safety of themselves, other students, teachers, administrators, and other persons.
- e.** The school district finds that drug, alcohol, and nicotine/tobacco use among the student body will be effectively addressed by making sure that the large number of students participating in extracurricular activities do not use drugs, alcohol and nicotine/tobacco.

2. Notice. Each student who participates or seeks to participate in extracurricular activities shall be given a copy of this policy. This policy may also be included in the student and activities handbooks.

3. Drug Testing Coordinator. The Drug Testing Coordinator shall be the Secondary Principal, Activities Director, or his or her designee unless otherwise indicated.

4. Extracurricular Activities. This policy applies to any activity that meets the guidelines of an extracurricular activity at the school district which includes but is not necessarily limited to the following:

5. **Students Who Are Required to Submit to Drug Testing**

- a. **Grades.** All students in grades 7-12 who participate in any extracurricular activity are part of the pool subject to random drug testing.
- b. **Consent.** A student and his or her parent(s)/guardian(s) must sign a consent form before the student shall be eligible to try out for, practice with, or participate in the extracurricular activity. The consent form is attached to this policy.
- c. **Selection Pool Eligibility.** Students shall remain in the selection pool for an entire calendar year (365 days) from the date the consent form is received by the school district except students who quit during the season.

Random testing will be completed a minimum of 3 times per year or as determined by the DTC. Each selection pool will consist of:

Three students from 7th and 8th grades
Six students from 9th through 12th grades

- d. **Withdrawal.** Students who have a consent form on file remain eligible for drug tests from the date the consent form is received by the school district and throughout the remainder of the school year or until the student files a Withdrawal of Student from Activity form signed by the student and his or her parent(s)/guardian(s). Upon withdrawal, the student shall not be eligible to participate in any activity that is subject to drug testing for the remainder of the school year. A student who files a Withdrawal of Student from Activity form after selected for a random drug test but before submitting to the test or after testing positive shall be ineligible to participate in any extracurricular activities

for one calendar year from the date the Withdrawal of Student from Activity form is received by the Drug Testing Coordinator.

6. Drugs. Students participating in extracurricular activities are prohibited from using, possessing, distributing, manufacturing, or having drugs, alcohol, and nicotine/tobacco present in their system. For the purpose of this policy, “drugs” means:

- a.** Any substance considered illegal by the Uniform Controlled Substances Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. § 28-401 *et seq.*
- b.** Any substance which is controlled by the Food and Drug Administration unless prescribed to the student by any licensed medical practitioner authorized to prescribe controlled substances or other prescription drugs;
- c.** Alcohol for any student under the age of 21. Alcohol shall have the meaning as provided in NEB. REV. STAT. § 48-1902(1).
- d.** Any tobacco or other substance which introduces nicotine and other tobacco-related substances into the body, including alternative nicotine products ingested in any way, such as by use of an e-cig, vape pen, or Juul.

7. Testing Procedures

a. Student Selection. All students who participate in extracurricular activities and submit a consent form will be included in a master list and will be subject to random drug screening. The master list shall be submitted to the company employed by the district to conduct the testing.

b. Reasonable Suspicion Testing. In addition to random drug testing, a student is subject to drug testing at any time when the Drug Testing Coordinator determines there is individualized reasonable suspicion based upon articulable facts to believe that the student has used a drug. The Drug Testing Coordinator will notify the student and take the necessary steps to schedule a test as soon as practicable. Reasonable suspicion testing may be used during school sponsored summer activities and camps.

c. Parental Request. Students who do not participate in extracurricular activities may be added to the random drug screening master list upon parental request. Parent(s)/guardian's may also request that their student be subject to non-random drug screening. The school will arrange for the test as soon as practicable. The parent(s)/guardian(s) making a request under this subparagraph must submit a signed consent form and indicate which type of test is being requested. Any cost

associated with tests administered as a result of parental request must be paid by the parent(s)/guardian(s) in advance of the test.

- d. Type of Test.** The school district reserves the right to utilize breath, saliva, hair, urinalysis, or any other reliably recognized testing procedures. Urine and oral fluid samples which screen positive will be confirmed by GC/MS. Positive saliva or breath alcohol tests will be confirmed by EBT (Evidential Breath Tester). Other testing will be confirmed via industry-recognized processes and equipment.
- e. Collection Site.** The Drug Testing Coordinator will designate the collection site at which student will provide specimens. The collection site may be off the premises of the school district.
- f. Collection Procedures.** The school board will select a Drug Program Administrator (DPA). The DPA shall randomly select the students subject to drug testing from the master list. The DPA will maintain and follow generally accepted industry standards for collecting, maintaining, shipping, and accessing all specimens. The DPA will seek to obtain the sample in a manner designed to insure accurate testing protocols while minimizing intrusion into a student's privacy. The DPA and the school district will provide a copy of the collection procedures upon request.
- g. Drugs.** Students may be randomly tested for any drugs, including but not limited to nicotine, alcohol, amphetamines, marijuana or cannabinoids, cocaine, methadone, methaqualone, propoxyphene, hallucinogens, opiates, phencyclidine, synthetic opiates and PCP, steroids, barbiturates, benzodiazepines, and any prescription drug that was obtained without proper authorization.
- h. Results.** The DPA shall notify the student and the Drug Testing Coordinator of any positive test after the initial screening. The school representative shall notify the student's parents. The DPA will use a secure method to transmit all positive test results to the DPA's Medical Review Officer (MRO). The MRO will be certified by an MRO accreditation body. The MRO will be responsible for reviewing test results and determining whether the use of a substance identified by the sample analysis is from illicit use or a legitimate medical use. Prior to making a final decision, the MRO or his or her assistant shall contact the student and his or parent(s)/guardian(s) to discuss the result either face-to-face or over the telephone. If the MRO determines the test results are negative, no further action shall be taken against the student. The MRO will report results of verified positives to the DPA. The DPA

shall then notify the Drug Testing Coordinator of the positive test result. The Drug Testing Coordinator shall notify the student and his or her parent(s)/guardian(s) and any staff members responsible for implementing the consequences of this policy.

- i. **Request for a Retest.** A split specimen will be collected for all testing methods, with the exception of alcohol testing. A positive alcohol test will be confirmed with an EBT device. In the event of a positive test a split specimen will be tested at a second nationally certified laboratory from a list provided by the MRO. The school district will cover the cost associated with testing the split specimen. The student will remain eligible pending the results of the split specimen test. If the test is confirmed positive the student will begin any consequences associated with testing positive on the day the school district receives notice of the confirmed positive test.

8. Negative Tests. Students and their parents will receive verbal or written notice when the student's test result is negative.

9. Consequences for Testing Positive. Whenever the test results indicate the presence of drugs, Drug Testing Coordinator shall schedule and hold a confidential meeting with the student, parent/guardian, and sponsor/coach. Other members of the school's administration may also attend the meeting. At the meeting, the Drug Testing Coordinator shall explain the drug testing procedures and the policy of the district. The consequences shall be as follows (**All offenses are cumulative in grades 7-8. Offenses that occur in grades 7-8 shall not count as offenses in grades 9-12. All offenses are cumulative in grades 9-12**):

a. First Offense

- i. The student will be allowed to attend practice.
- ii. The student will be ineligible to publicly perform in any extracurricular activity for 10 calendar days and a minimum of 1 competition. The day of the positive test result shall be the first day for counting purposes. If the activity ends prior to the 10 calendar days the consequence will carry over to the next activity.
- iii. The student shall attend drug, alcohol, and/or nicotine/tobacco counseling or educational program at the student's expense or as arranged or approved by the District Testing Coordinator.

- iv. The student will have a follow up test to be conducted in conjunction with the next random test. This test will be conducted at the parent's expense. If the student were to test positive it will be considered a second offense. If the student tests negative they will return to the random pool.

b. Second Offense

- i. The student shall be allowed to attend practice.
- ii. The student will be ineligible to publicly perform in any extracurricular activity for 20 calendar days and a minimum of 2 competitions. The day of the positive test result shall be the first day for counting purposes. If the end of the activity precedes the end of the 20 days, the consequence will carry over to the next activity.
- iii. The student shall obtain a drug and alcohol assessment at student's expense from a certified substance abuse counselor or licensed mental health provider who holds a valid license that includes in its scope of practice the ability to administer substance abuse evaluations and/or treatment. The student shall provide written proof of obtaining the assessment to the District Testing Coordinator. The student is strongly encouraged to comply with the assessment recommendations.
- iv. The student will have a follow up test to be conducted in conjunction with the next random test. This test will be conducted at the parent's expense. If the student were to test positive it will be considered a third offense. If the student tests negative they will return to the random pool.

c. Third Offense

- i. The student will be ineligible to practice or publicly perform in any extracurricular activity for one calendar year from the date of the third positive test or end upon graduation. The day of the positive test result shall be the first day for counting purposes.
- ii. The student must submit to a district administered test and test negative before returning to activities.

d. Fourth Offense

i. The student will be ineligible to participate in any extracurricular activity for the remainder of the student's time at the school district.

10. Refusal to Test. A student who refuses to submit to a drug test authorized under this policy, or fails or refuses to comply with any other provision of this policy, shall not be eligible to participate in any activities covered under this policy including all meetings, practices, performances and competitions for one calendar year.

11. Tampering. Tampering is the use of any agent or technique which is designed to avoid detection of a drug and/or compromise the integrity of a drug test and is prohibited. This includes providing false urine samples (for example, urine substitution), contaminating the urine sample with chemicals or chemical products, the use of diuretics to dilute urine samples, and the use of masking. If the Drug Testing Coordinator determines that a student tampered with a drug test, the student shall not be eligible to participate in any activities covered under this policy including all meetings, practices, performances and competitions for one calendar year.

12. Maintenance of Records. All results of drug testing shall be confidential. Procedures for maintaining confidentiality will be developed by the school district and the testing organization. The Drug Testing Coordinator shall maintain records of positive tests in a secure location. This information will not be available to anyone other than appropriate school personnel and parents. This information will be destroyed upon the student's graduation or one year after the student's class graduates. Under no circumstances will this information become a part of the student's permanent file, nor will it be sent to another school when the student moves to another district or transfers to another school. The school district will not share drug testing results with any law enforcement agencies.

13. Appeal. The school district will rely solely upon the opinion of the MRO to determine whether the positive test result was the result of the consumption of a drug. There shall be no appeal of the test result to any school administrator or the board of education.

14. Severability. If any portion of this policy is deemed to be contrary to the law of the state of Nebraska or the United States by judicial decision or an act of Congress, then only such portion or provision directly deemed to be unconstitutional shall be stricken, and the remainder of the policy shall remain in full force.

We understand these results will be forwarded to school district officials and will also be made available to us. We agree to sign any necessary releases if requested to do so.

We understand that consent pursuant to this Consent to Perform Random Drug Testing will be effective for all extracurricular activities in which this student might participate during the current school year.

We hereby release the Ravenna Public Schools Board of Education and its employees from any legal responsibility or liability for the release of such information and records, pursuant to the policy.

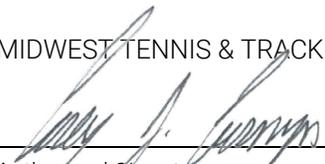

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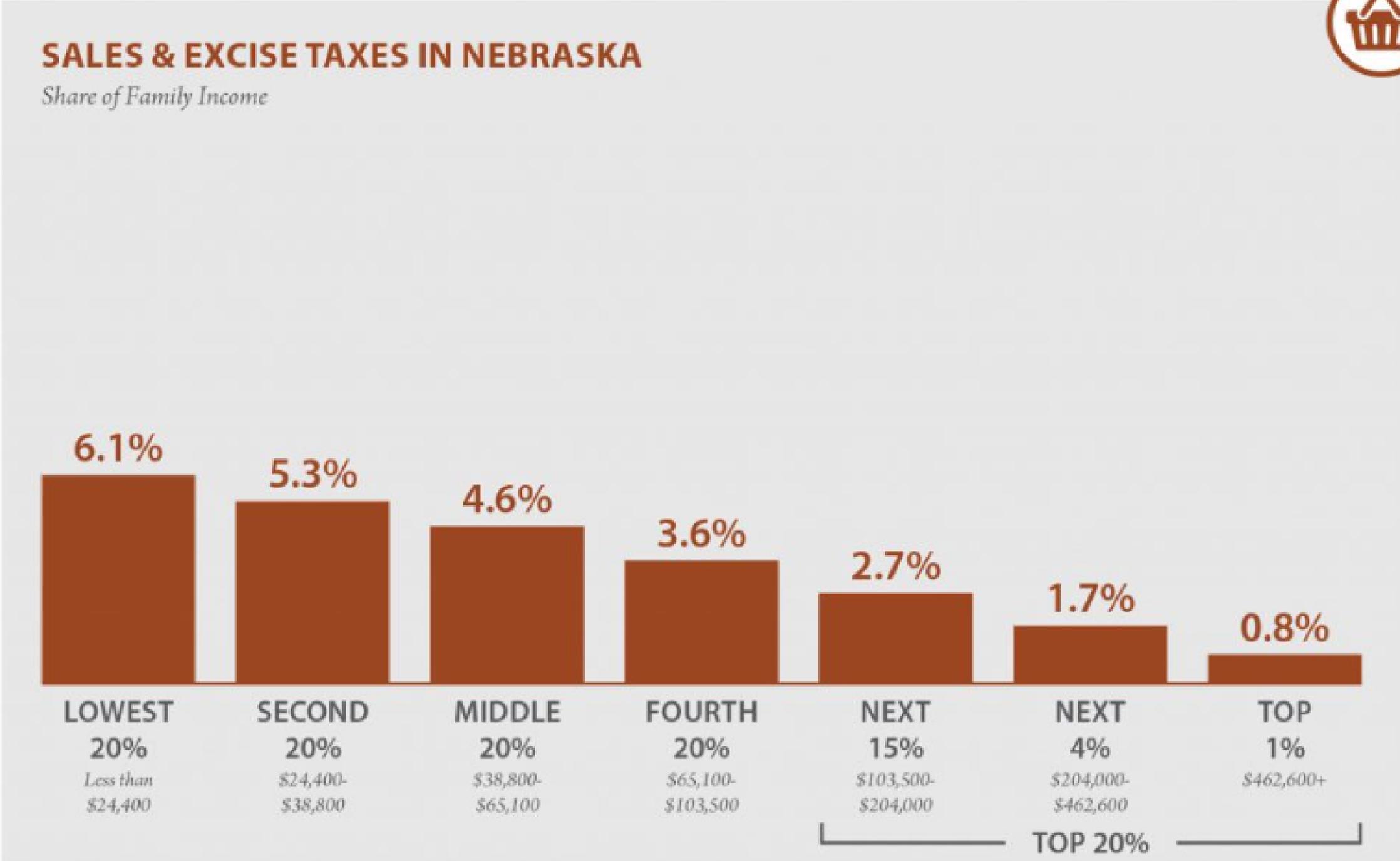

Final Language

TEXT FOR A CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT:

“To add a new section 14 to Article VIII of the Nebraska State Constitution: VIII-14 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Constitution, beginning January 1, 2026, no governmental entity in the State of Nebraska may impose taxes other than retail consumption taxes or excise taxes.”

OBJECT STATEMENT:

“A Constitutional Amendment to restrict governmental entities in Nebraska to imposing only retail consumption taxes and excise taxes. This amendment will eliminate Nebraska personal and real property taxes; personal and corporate income taxes; sales taxes and inheritance taxes.

EPIC (Elimination of Property, Income and Corporate) Tax
Initiative Proposal

Definitions

A **consumption tax** is a tax on the purchase of a good or service. Consumption taxes can take the form of sales taxes, tariffs, excise, and other taxes on consumed goods and services.

Excise taxes are taxes imposed on certain goods, services, and activities. Taxpayers include importers, manufacturers, retailers, and consumers, and vary depending on the specific tax. Excise taxes may be imposed at the time of: (a) Entry into the United States, or (b) sale or use after importation.

Initiative Petition Process

- There are two types of initiatives: (1) Initiated statute (state law); and (2) initiated amendment to the Nebraska Constitution.
- To place an initiated statute on the ballot, sponsors must collect signatures from 7% of registered voters. For an initiated amendment to the Constitution, sponsors must collect signatures from 10% of registered voters.
- EPIC will require the gathering/validation of 122,635 signatures (10% of registered voters).
- Both initiative measures require that signatures be from at least 5% of voters from 38 of Nebraska's 93 counties. This is known as the "two-fifths rule."
- Once the signature threshold is reached, sponsors submit the petitions to the Secretary of State no less than four months prior to a general election (by July 2024).
- The petitions are separated by county, and the Secretary of State ensures the minimum number of signatures have been collected prior to sending the petitions to county election officials for verification.
- County election officials must verify circulators complied with state law and compare petition signatures against voter registration records. If any signatures belong to non-registered voters or other circumstances have caused signatures to be invalidated, the official notes the issue on the petition next to the signature.
- Local election officials have 40 days to return the verified petitions to the Secretary of State, who reviews the petitions and tallies valid signatures. If the Secretary of State finds a sufficient number of valid signatures, the measure is certified for the ballot.
- Once an initiated measure clears this hurdle, the Secretary of State is responsible for submitting the measure to the voters at the first general election held not less than four months after the filing of a verified initiative petition.
- An initiated measure becomes law or part of the Constitution when a majority of votes, but not less than 35 percent of the total vote, are cast in favor of the measure.
- No measure, in either form or substance, can be submitted to the voters by way of initiative more frequently than once in three years.
