History of SES Playground



- Playground was built in 2003 and replaced a wooden playground.
- All original components are still there, with the addition of the basketball court and spider web being added in the past 10 years.
- Wood chips replaced every other year
- Lifespan of Playground is 20 years

Pros and Cons of Existing Equipment

Pros:

Equipment is large and many children can play on the equipment at one time.

There are multiple choices for students to run, climb, jump, swing, and play sports (basketball, soccer, 4 square, etc.)

Cons:

Equipment is beginning to wear. Multiple pieces have needed replaced due to damage the past few years.

Playground is not accessible to special needs students.

Playground Information

We need a playground that:

- Can accommodate up to 250 students at a time. Our playground was made for about half of that total
- Allows students to climb, run, swing, and slide safely
- Is accessible to all students, no matter their needs
- Has a more cost effective and safe surface area
- Can be a central location for our community to use safely
- Continues to utilize the spider web and new basketball court

Our Process

What we've already done:

- We have a great partnership with our PTO, who has agreed to help us raise money for the playground. The PTO will have approximately \$25,000 for the playground after this year. Hope to raise ?
- I have spoken with three playground company reps who have looked at our current playground and discussed approximate costs.
 - Total cost: between \$250,000 and \$300,000
 - This includes surfacing (concrete and the rubber surfacing), a new large playground, and all of the accessible features, swings, and stand alone features

Our Process

Possible next steps:

- Create a timeline for the project, pending School Board approval
- Continue fundraising efforts with PTO
- Create a playground “team” that includes parents, staff, and students to help design a playground
- Go through competitive bid process with companies
- Investigate and apply for applicable grants to help with funding, including asking local group for donations
- Learn about new ways to save \$ with the project, like using community members and our maintenance team to help tear down and build the new playground, with guidance from companies

Our End Goal

Seward Elementary wants a playground that promotes wellness for our students and community.

We are hoping for a large playground structure to accommodate up to 250 students, including the structure itself, and the smaller components that will also be nearby.

We are also hoping for a solid concrete slab, covered with rubber surfacing to be used under the playground structures, with a solution to our drainage issue in place.

Another goal would be to someday have a concrete walking loop around the outer edges of the playground.

Proposed Timeline

Best Case Scenario:

- Continue fundraising and submit grant applications
 - Playground built late spring/summer 2021

Or

- Continue fundraising and submit grant applications
 - Playground build late spring/summer 2022
