PLC (Professional Learning Communities):

Our PLC's are up and running for the 20-21 school year. Each certified teacher belongs to a PLC at our school. Every other week throughout the school year, we will meet to have professional conversations about grit using a book study and also analyze and discuss student data. From my perspective, PLC meetings are wonderful times to work closely with each grade level team and the specials team. The conversations about instruction and student growth are very productive and worthwhile.

Reading Intervention:

We have begun our LLI (Leveled Literacy Intervention) with 1st through 4th graders. Our 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grade numbers were very consistent with numbers from in the past. Our 1st grade numbers are higher this year, most likely due to our 19-20 kindergarten students missing the last quarter of in-person instruction last spring. We are confident that these numbers will go back down to normal (or less!) as students get into routines for intervention and receive specific instruction at their level.

Beginning of Year Assessments:

We are currently in the process of completing our beginning of year assessments. Students in kindergarten and first grade did the MAP Fluency assessment at the end of August to measure their phonological awareness, phonics, and listening skills. We used this assessment, along with classroom assessments and text leveling (determining a child's reading level through reading,

comprehension questions, and accuracy) to determine our intervention groups. MAP Fluency was also used for the Nebraska Reads Act to flag students who did not meet the minimum benchmark for the fall testing. FYI: we had one first grader qualify for Nebraska Reads and no kindergarten students. Nebraska Reads is a program that ensures students who are reading significantly below grade level are receiving intervention appropriately. We will be administering MAP growth testing for 2nd - 4th graders in September in reading and math (and science for 4th grade). I am anxious to see how students do on this assessment and to move forward with our instruction.

Character Recognition Program:

Our character award this year ties in nicely with our game theme: SES Game Changers. Students will be recognized as Game Changers monthly by focusing on specific character traits. In September, our focus is responsibility. Teachers are working with students to teach them what it means to be responsible. As the month progresses, adults at SES will watch for students who are demonstrating responsibility and students will be recognized at the end of the month. Students who are recognized will have their picture in the paper, in our trophy case, and be given a small prize. Our hope is that students will learn character development skills at an early age and understand the importance of demonstrating these skills their whole lives. Skills being taught include responsibility, kindness, self-control, respect, integrity, perseverance, and effort.

3. Parent Teacher Conferences. Currently we are planning for these to take place Monday, 28 September, from 1600 to 2000 hrs. (4:00-8:00 pm). Our 5th grade teachers will continue to have both of their conferences in the fall semester with their additional conference for parents on Thursday, 24 Sept., which is the week prior.

4. Student Wellness Day. Scheduled for Friday, 25 September. For this event we will continue our current practice of students wearing a mask unless they can social distance throughout this day

of outdoor activities. This is a full day of activities with our entire student body. Students will walk from our building along the Plum Creek trail then back to Plum Creek Park for wellness clinics with CU coaches and students. Mr. Makey coordinates this activity and does a very nice job organizing everything. This day is designed to bring awareness of the importance for adolescents to establish healthy lifestyles.

5. Plum Creek Literacy Festival. This has been pushed back until April so will wait until Spring to determine schedules.

6. MAP (NWEA) Testing. These assessments took place in August, doing them a couple weeks early this year to be sure and get the data. We test every student in the middle school with students missing less than one day of instruction during the testing period.

The 2020-2021 is off to a great start! Students and teachers are getting settled into their schedules, fall sports are in full swing, and we are really excited about the direction of the school year. The vast majority of students have done very well with the COVID protocols and mask requirement. We would encourage any and all board members to stop in at the High School to see some of the exciting things going on in our classrooms or in our extracurricular activities.

Safety Drills:

We have completed two fire drills, a tornado and a bus drill this school year. We do ten fire drills per year by law, one crisis drill per term, and one bus and tornado drill per semester.

Parent Teacher Conferences: We hosted our first parent/teacher conference for the 2020-2021 school year on Tuesday, September 8th. We emailed the following information to our parents and students prior to the conferences.

Parent-Teacher Conferences are an important facet of communication at SHS. We are planning on continuing our traditional in-person parent-teacher conferences (Masks required). This year, Covid-19 continues to impact everything that we do and we ask you to consider the following options to help us reduce possible exposure to the virus for parents as well as teachers.

- 1) If you do not have any concerns about your child's courses and you feel like you have enough information from PowerSchool about your student's progress you may consider not attending Fall Parent/Teacher conferences. Please feel free to use our normal communication tools (email, phone call, etc.) with any questions and concerns.*
- 2) If you have concerns about one or a few courses, please consider only visiting with those teachers and use our normal communication tools with other teachers.*
- 3) If you have concerns about multiple courses, please feel free to practice social distance, wear a face covering, and visit with each teacher.*

We thank you for your consideration and support whatever option that you choose. Please know that we value parent-teacher communication and we will do all that we can do to support this during this Pandemic.

Homecoming Week Highlights: NETFLIX HOMECOMING 2020 was a huge success. Dress Up Days included *The Office* (gray); *Friends* (purple); *Grey's Anatomy* (green); *Outer Banks* (pink); and *All American* (blue and yellow). The Freshman class won the "Booster Club Award" with their *Outer Banks* hallway decorations, but the Seniors accumulated the most points by decorating their *Stranger Things* hallway, dressing up on theme days, and participating in GooseChase missions and challenges. Following the parade to Seward Elementary, the cheerleaders hosted a Pep Rally at SHS where the Seniors were awarded the coveted Spirit Stick! The band, student section, and cheerleaders did a fantastic job adhering to the current safety protocols while cheering their Bluejays on to a victory!

Freshman Orientation: We had an extremely well attended Freshman Orientation Event. Feedback from parents and students indicated that the information and experiences provided as part of this orientation was very well received. The vast majority of the attendees commented how they enjoyed the open house format this year and the goosechase game that students and parents participated in as they made their way around SHS.

NWEA Testing/ACT : We will begin with fall NWEA testing the week of September 22nd for students in grades 9-10. While 11th grade will be completing a practice ACT test and Seniors taking the actual ACT at the Ag Pavilion.. Students will be tested in math, reading, science, and language usage. The results of these assessments will be used to guide our instruction, intervention practices, and provide students and parents an indication of their growth and progress. NWEA assessment results serve as an important barometer within our comprehensive assessment system.

Activities:

The Fall sports season is off to a great start. New protocols have been created to keep athletes and spectators safe at all events. SHS has hosted numerous softball contests, football games at all levels, a golf invite, and the Thorell Cross

Country Invite. Senior Night, typically at the end of each season, has been moved up in case the Fall season gets cut short. Typically, I would start my September report with statements about what state reports have been completed, what NDE timelines have been met etc. However, this year, I want to begin by expressing high praise and thanks to the students, the faculty, all of the classified staff, my fellow administrators, and students' parents for their diligence and perseverance across each of the 18 school days that have now occurred. The passion displayed for providing safe but inviting learning environments for everyone has been amazing. Most certainly, I am Blue Jay proud!

The plans laid out for the safe re-opening of our schools have also played a positive part in keeping the number of remote learning requests limited. As of today, there are 27 students approved for remote learning and those children are from 18 different families. There is a possibility of three new requests coming in within the next day or so. Still this is only 1.8 % of our K-12 population.

The current NDE Exempt School listing indicates that we have a total of 13 and families that have fully submitted applications for 17 children to be homeschooled. Through my conversations with families, I know that 4 more applications are set to be submitted. Two of the children approved were homeschooled last year and two others attended a local parochial school. All four of these children received special education services through Seward Schools. The total of 17 homeschooled children is 1.1% of our K-12 population.

Lastly, while I'm trying to keep NDE references limited in this board report, I will share that in the next month many, many state reports will be completed as well as data uploads to NDE via our PowerSchool and the state ADVISOR collection system. Tom Widler is our ADVISOR guru and I'd like to thank him ahead of time for the hours he puts toward getting these collections right. As an example, the zoom training on the criteria for the Staff upload alone is set to last three hours. The collection tasks are extremely tedious and time consuming even with, and sometimes in spite of, help myself, April Craig, my administrative assistant, each building secretary, and principals.

Speaking of data, below are the latest numbers for special programs within the District. As of today, there have been 26 students who have moved in with a special education verification and we have had 22 special education students move out of the district. Please note that the Title I section is empty on the report as the needs assessments are not yet complete.

September 2020 Board Report for Curriculum and Staff Development

Board Members,

We have taken the opportunity to “press on” with our academic goals over the last several weeks. We are thankful for each day that we have with our students, and teachers are working hard to ensure that students are receiving quality in-person instruction as well as implementing our assessment system to ensure that we have current data regarding our students. Our assessment results are indicating that, as we hypothesized, our youngest students struggled the most from the Remote/Summer learning time. We have created additional opportunities for these students to get additional practice in literacy during the instructional day. Thankfully, our students at the middle school level are scoring in the traditional range for incoming Fall scores.

Curriculum

We submitted a reVISION grant to assist us with our Career and Technical Education curriculum revision process. We should know in October whether or not we will receive any assistance in this area.

I have seen several examples of implementation of our new curriculum in Music, FCS, and Spanish. Students are very much enjoying and learning from the cultural drums that have been used in the middle school music curriculum.

Instruction

Our teachers have done a nice job preparing students to learn in any educational environment. Teachers have been doing stellar work with in-person learning, but they have also integrated tools that they used during remote learning. All students have Google Classroom or SeeSaw accounts that can be used in any educational environment. I have also heard about some of our teachers who have pre-recorded their lessons when they are going to be gone so that the sub may play the lesson for the students. This is an opportunity to keep learning going, even when the teacher is absent.

Staff Development

Our September Staff Development Day will give staff opportunities to learn about annual staff development topics such as Suicide prevention and Blood Borne Pathogens. Our staff will also have time to meet with their site-based strategic planning groups and develop goals for their groups for the 20-21 school year. As you know from previous board meeting reports, Grit and Feedback are going to be the two priorities of the school year, but we will be implementing plans in several other areas as the year goes by.

Assessment

This week our 2-4th grade students will be taking the NWEA test. The NWEA test gives us real-time data on where our students are at regarding their math and reading development. Our 5-8th grade students completed NWEA over the last couple of weeks and our 9-10 students will complete NWEA on September 22nd. This year our K-1 students took the MAP Fluency assessment for the first time. Overall, I would say that this assessment was a success and helped us to identify students who need additional support with reading.

As a reminder, we did not complete summative assessments last year, and we will not receive any accountability reports or ratings. Our Seniors will be taking the ACT test for free, at the Ag Pavilion, on September 22nd. This is a make-up test from last year. Our Juniors will again be taking the ACT in the Spring as part of the Nebraska Summative Assessments.

Grit in the Middle of a Pandemic

One of the side effects of the pandemic is that we get to see the best of people and sadly, the worst of people. I have been so proud and thankful for the Seward staff and how you have embraced the challenge of teaching in a world we could never have imagined. I see people every day committed to helping kids reach their full potential, committed to their academic, and social-emotional needs. I am inspired by you and your determination to provide students a sense of normality and stability in a world that is far from normal and stable.

There are people in our world who will try to tear us down or slow us down with opposing views and contrasting opinions, but to me, grit means that I/We can persevere toward our goal of making every student, every day, a success even when it is hard, and a pandemic is hard! That also does not mean that we won't face setbacks, and we need to remember that it is OK not to be OK. We need to take care of each other, listen, problem-solve, and be empathetic to the needs of all.

In each newsletter going forward- I will highlight information regarding Grit. The summary below sets the stage for all of you as we embark on learning more about Grit and mental health in our PLC's and staff development days.

Talent Does Not Equal Success

According to author Angela Duckworth, people generally assume that great professional success—winning awards, gaining recognition, and earning lots of money—is directly related to natural talent. Duckworth herself was guilty of this thinking when she taught middle school math. She automatically assumed that the students who showed the most aptitude for math would have the highest test scores in the class. In reality, the students who studied the most and worked the hardest were the ones who did the best. "I'd been distracted by talent," Duckworth admits.

After hundreds of interviews with successful people about how they had achieved "greatness," plus studies of West Point cadets and competitive spellers, Duckworth knew one thing to be true: talent has very little, if anything, to do with success. "I've never really viewed myself as particularly talented," says

of the work he put into his craft. Like Duckworth's middle school math students, he made a consistent, concentrated effort to improve.

According to Duckworth, effort is more important than natural talent. She explains this in two equations: talent x effort = skill and skill x effort = achievement. Effort essentially counts twice, making it more important than talent. The equation also indicates that talent is multiplied by effort—the more effort put in, the more skill is generated. A child might be a naturally good speller, for example, but they won't win big competitions if they don't put any effort into practicing. They will be outperformed by students who have average natural talent and a drive to study and succeed.

THE POWER OF A POSITIVE EDUCATOR

When I think about the teachers who made a difference in my life I realize they were all positive. Mrs. Liota smiled every day and made me feel loved. Coach Caiazza believed in me while Mr. Ehmann encouraged me to be my best. Years later as I think about the impact these teachers had on my life it's clear that being a positive educator not only makes you better it makes everyone around you better. Positive educators have the power to transform lives and inspire young minds to believe they can and will change the world. In this spirit here are seven ways we can all choose to be a positive educator.

1. Be Positively Contagious – Research shows that emotions are contagious. Sincere smiles, kind words, encouragement and positive energy infect people in a positive way. On the flip side your students are just as likely to catch your bad mood as the swine flu. So each day you come to school you have a choice. You can be a germ or a big dose of Vitamin C. When you choose to be positively contagious your positive energy has a positive impact on your students, your colleagues and ultimately your school culture. Your students will remember very little of what you said but they will remember 100% of how you made them feel. I remember Mrs. Liota and her smile and love and it made all the difference.

2. Take a Daily Thank you Walk – It's simple, it's powerful, and it's a great way to feed yourself with positivity. How does it work? You simply take a walk... outside, in a mall, at your school, on a treadmill, or anywhere else you can think of, and think about all the things, big and small, that you are grateful for. The research shows you can't be stressed and thankful at the same time so when you combine gratitude with physical exercise, you give yourself a double boost of positive energy. You flood your brain and body with positive emotions and natural antidepressants that uplift you rather than the stress hormones that drain your energy and slowly kill you. By the time you get to school you are ready for a great day.

3. Celebrate Success – One of the simplest, most powerful things you can do for yourself and your students is to celebrate your daily successes. Instead of thinking of all things that went wrong at school each day focus on the one thing that went right. Try this: Each night before you go to bed think about the one great thing about your day. If you do this you'll look forward to creating more success tomorrow. Also have your students do this as well. Each night they will go to bed feeling like a success and they will wake up with more confidence to take on the day.

4. Expect to Make a Difference – When positive educators walk into their classroom they expect to

and lessons will lead to positive outcomes for their students. They win in their mind first and then they win in the hearts and minds of their students.

5. Believe in Your Students More than They Believe in Themselves – I tried to quit lacrosse during my freshman year in high school but Coach Caiazza wouldn't let me. He told me that I was going to play in college one day. He had a vision for me that I couldn't even fathom. He believed in me more than I believed in myself. I ended up going to Cornell University and the experience of playing lacrosse there changed my life forever. The difference between success and failure is belief and so often this belief is instilled in us by someone else. Coach Caiazza was that person for me and it changed my life. You can be that person for one of your students if you believe in them and see their potential rather than their limitations.

6. Develop Positive Relationships – Author Andy Stanley once said, "Rules without relationship lead to rebellion." Far too many principals share rules with their teachers but they don't have a relationship with them. And far too many teachers don't have positive relationships with their students. So what happens? Teachers and students disengage from the mission of the school. I've had many educators approach me and tell me that my books helped them realize they needed to focus less on rules and invest more in their relationships. The result was a dramatic increase in teacher and student performance, morale and engagement. To develop positive relationships you need to enhance communication, build trust, listen to them, make time for them, recognize them, show them you care through your actions and mentor them. Take the time to give them your best and they will give them your best.

7. Show you Care – It's a simple fact. The best educators stand out by showing their students and colleagues that they care about them. Standardized test scores rise when teachers make time to really know their students. Teacher performance improves when principals create engaged relationships with their teachers. Teamwork is enhanced when educators know and care about one another. Parents are more supportive when educators communicate with their student's parents. The most powerful form of positive energy is love and this love transforms students, people and schools when it is put into action. Create your own unique way to show your students and colleagues you care about them and you will not only feel more positive yourself but you will develop positive kids who create a more positive world.
