May 13, 2023

May is always an exciting time of year with graduation and the end of the school year. There are also a lot of reports that are due and have to be finalized before the end of the school year in special services.

The Special Education Targeted Improvement Plan (TIP) was due on May 1st. Our TIP focuses on reading and what we are doing as a district to improve reading scores for our students who receive special education services. We aligned our TIP plan with our District Strategic Plan and will be focus on how to strengthen our interventions and enrichments through MTSS. All students should have access to quality Tier 1 instruction and then by using flexible grouping we will be able to differentiate for students based on their individual needs.

The 2022-2023 PEaK (Promoting Engagement and Knowledge) grant was also due May 1st. We use money from this grant to support our work on our Targeted Improvement Plan. Specifically, we use the funds for staff to attend conferences and to help pay for Branching Minds, our data warehouse.

Dr. Dominy and I meet with representatives from our Non-Public schools for our consultation meeting on April 20th. Documentations of this meeting needed to be turned into NDE by May 1st.

The following reports are coming due in the next few weeks.

The Annual ELL Program review report is due May 13th and has been submitted.

IDEA Maintenance of Effort (MOE) is due on May 15th. School district receipt of IDEA dollars is contingent upon maintaining fiscal effort for Special Education. Districts must expend a greater or equal amount of local or local/state funds from a previous year's highest level to meet the MOE requirement..Heidi has already submitted this and we have and it has already been confirmed that we have met Maintenance of Effort.

The special education Extended School Year (ESY) service budget is in the process of being drafted.

The Seward County Sixpence Grant is due May 25th. Dr. Michele Rayburn at ESU #6 and I are working on completing this grant.

By the end of May, our preschool staff will complete the GOLD assessment on each preschool center-based student (peers and students who have an IEP) and the birth to three children on IFSPs. This assessment is required two times per year by NDE and the expectation is for individual student growth.

Thank you again for all you do to support our students and staff.

May 2023 Board Report for Curriculum and Staff Development

Board Members,

The end of the school year is near and it was a year full of learning, memories, and growth academically, physically, mentally, and emotionally. I am proud of our staff and their ability to know each student and strive to provide those students with the support that is needed.

Curriculum

A good portion of our ELA materials have arrived. As of this writing, we have completed our Wonders training at the elementary level and we will have our Middle School and High school training over the next two weeks. I do think our teachers found value in doing the training before school was out so that they could look at the materials and understand what to expect when the school year starts. We will be doing a digital follow-up lesson on their August flexible PD day and then do a full training on the September 18th PD Day.

Instruction

We are starting our pre-planning right now for the next school year regarding multi-tiered system of support. This is the last major item from our Strategic Plan. Essentially, we need to make sure that we have strong systems and supports in place for the students who do not understand the grade level, core materials and the students who have mastered the grade level, core materials. Currently, we do have structures in place to support these students, but as with all things, revisions need to be made based on our curriculum, new research, and the needs of our students.

Staff Development

Every month a staff development newsletter has been sent out to staff to continue the professional development that we are doing on our PD days. This year my focus has been on reading research, staff engagement, and the American Civics holidays. The continued focus on our professional development topics has led to further discussion regarding the topic as well as a common understanding of terms and the research. I do use a SMORE newsletter for the staff development newsletter and get a few analytics regarding how many times the newsletter is opened, etc. The newsletter is well-read and I will continue to send this out in the future.

Assessment

We are just completing the last assessments for the school year. I am thankful to the teachers and administrators who put so much work into ensuring a successful testing experience. While these tests are one small measure of our success, they are an important tool to give us information about our programs, curriculum, and the individual needs of each child.

The three-tiered support structure of a Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS) provides efficient and effective support for all students. This support begins at the core level, also known as Tier 1. At Tier 1, all students receive differentiated instruction that is scaffolded with research-based learning supports, tailored to meet the needs of all students.

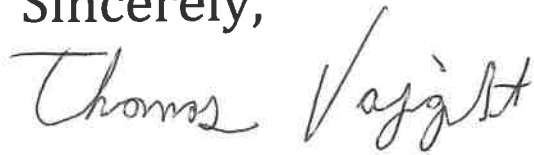

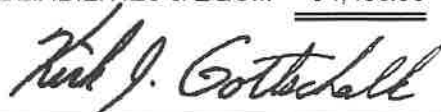

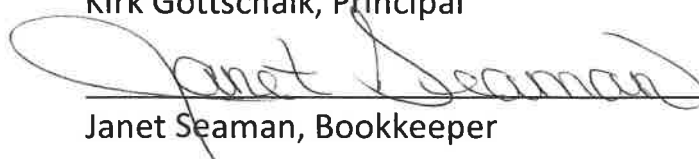
