





Purpose of Memorandum

The purpose of this memorandum is to formally document how the district's Social Studies curriculum meets and exceeds the statutory requirements outlined in **Nebraska Statute 79-724 (Americanism)** and **LB 399 (Multiculturalism)**. The curriculum is intentionally designed to promote civic responsibility, patriotic understanding, constitutional literacy, and recognition of the diverse contributions that have shaped the United States.

Compliance with LB 399: Multiculturalism

LB 399 requires that all approved social studies courses emphasize the contributions of all ethnic groups to the development and growth of the United States, including contributions to government, culture, science, the arts, and military service.

District Implementation

The district addresses this requirement through continuous, embedded instruction across grades 6–12 rather than isolated lessons or events. Multicultural perspectives are incorporated into existing standards-based instruction while reinforcing shared American democratic values.

- **Middle School (Grades 6–8):**
 - Grade 6 focuses on world cultures and the relationship between geography and cultural development.
 - Grade 7 examines global societies and their historical contributions to civilization.
 - Grade 8 emphasizes the diverse cultural foundations of the United States, including Indigenous peoples, European settlers, Africans, and immigrant groups.
- **High School (Grades 9–12):**
 - Grade 9 Civics focuses on citizenship rights and responsibilities in the United States and comparative global systems.
 - Grade 10 World History examines global cultures and their influence on modern society.
 - Grade 11 American History analyzes the impact of world events on the United States and other nations.

- Grade 12 American Government emphasizes the structure and function of government and civic participation.

This approach ensures that multicultural education is consistently reinforced throughout students' secondary education.

Compliance with Nebraska Statute 79-724: Americanism

Part 1: Patriotic Observances

The district provides appropriate patriotic instruction associated with nationally recognized holidays, including but not limited to:

- George Washington's Birthday
- Abraham Lincoln's Birthday
- Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day
- Constitution Day
- Veterans Day
- Memorial Day
- Thanksgiving Day / Native American Heritage Day

These observances are addressed through classroom discussions, instructional activities, and school programs as appropriate to the academic calendar.

Part 2: Civic Knowledge and Participation Requirements

Nebraska Statute 79-724 further requires students in grades 8–12 to complete one or more civic learning experiences. The district fulfills this requirement through multiple avenues:

- 1. Civic Knowledge Assessments**
Students in high school civics courses complete practice citizenship examinations aligned with the U.S. naturalization test. These assessments reinforce constitutional knowledge and promote understanding of the responsibilities of citizenship.
- 2. Participation in Public Government**
High school juniors participate annually in **County Government Day**, during which students:
 - Are sworn in by the county attorney
 - Learn the roles of county government offices
 - Observe public meetings
 - Complete reflective civic learning activities
- 3. Civic Research and Presentation Projects**
Eighth-grade students complete a Founding Fathers research and presentation project

following the Revolutionary War unit. Students research a key historical figure, produce a written summary, and present findings related to the individual's contributions, commemorations, and significance to American democracy.

These experiences ensure that all students engage in meaningful civic learning prior to graduation.

Conclusion

The district's Social Studies curriculum demonstrates clear and consistent compliance with Nebraska's Americanism and Multiculturalism statutes. Through structured instruction, civic engagement opportunities, and patriotic observances, students develop an informed understanding of American democracy, constitutional principles, and the diverse contributions that strengthen our nation.

This memo serves as formal documentation of the district's compliance and commitment to high-quality civic education.

K–5 Americanism Curriculum Alignment Overview

Purpose: This overview summarizes how Franklin Public Schools' K–5 curriculum aligns with the Nebraska Social Studies Standards and the work of the Americanism Committee by ensuring instruction in civics, history, geography, economics, and financial literacy.

Kindergarten

Students are introduced to foundational civic concepts through literature, discussion, and classroom routines. Instruction emphasizes rules, citizenship, community, and national holidays.

- Examples: learning about voting, community and neighborhoods, and observances such as Veterans Day, Presidents' Day, and Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

Grade 1

Students expand their understanding of community and civic responsibility while exploring geography and history.

- Examples: studying George Washington and Abraham Lincoln, exploring maps and globes, learning about jobs and communities, and recognizing the significance of national holidays.

Grade 2

Instruction is directly aligned to Nebraska Social Studies Standards with teaching of civics, economics, and geography.

- Examples: rights and responsibilities of citizens, democratic decision-making and rules, financial literacy (needs vs. wants, currency), environmental stewardship, and community-focused current events.

Grade 3

Students deepen their understanding of government, civic participation, economics, and historical change.

- Examples: how local government works, why people immigrate, how individual actions impact communities, economic decision-making, and participation in events such as the Veterans Day program.

Grade 4

Students engage in a comprehensive study of Nebraska history, geography, government, and economics.

- Examples: Native American tribes of Nebraska, westward expansion, statehood, Nebraska government, primary source analysis, timelines, and historical studies through *The Nebraska Adventure* and integrated reading texts.

Grade 5

Students study U.S. history and government to build a broader perspective.

- Examples: early civilizations, European exploration and settlement, regions and climate of the United States, Native American history, and foundational civic and economic concepts.

Extended Learning Opportunities

Music Instruction: Reinforces Americanism through patriotic and historical songs such as *The Star-Spangled Banner*, *America the Beautiful*. The preparation for the Veterans Day Program for K-5 along with studying the symbolism of the American flag.

Morning Meetings: Provide consistent instruction and reflection on civic values and national observances, including Labor Day, Veterans Day, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Black History Month, Thanksgiving, and Presidents' Day.

Flyer Bank Branch – Financial Literacy Support: Supports Nebraska Social Studies Standards related to economics and financial literacy by providing K–5 students with real-world financial literacy through an In-School Savings Bank partnership with Cornerstone Bank. Reinforces key economic concepts such as saving, goal setting, and responsible money management. The Flyer Bank also develops leadership and workplace skills through the Student Teller role, including completing job applications, interviewing, responsibility, accuracy, and customer service.

Bonus Days Overview (High School & Middle School)

Franklin Schools will implement Bonus Days as a positive, schoolwide incentive to promote strong academics, behavior, and attendance.

Bonus Days are unannounced incentive days that occur periodically throughout the school year to motivate students and recognize those who meet expectations.

Eligibility Criteria (effective February 1, 2026):

- No missing assignments and no overall grade of F
- No office referrals
- No unexcused absences

High School (Grades 9–12):

Students in good standing may earn an early dismissal at 12:06 p.m., with the option to leave campus or return for optional supervised activities.

Middle School (Grades 6–7):

Students in good standing will participate in structured, on-campus enrichment and recreational activities during the afternoon.

Students who do not meet Bonus Day criteria will remain in structured academic support sessions focused on assignment completion, grade improvement, attendance, and behavior skill-building. Bonus Days are designed to support growth while rewarding positive student behaviors.

Families are notified in advance, and all supervision and safety expectations remain in place.

Dual Credit Opportunities for Students

Franklin High School continues to expand postsecondary opportunities for students through dual credit coursework. These opportunities allow students to earn college credit while completing high school graduation requirements and to begin building credentials aligned with future career pathways.

Students may earn dual credit in **College English** through a partnership with **Nebraska Wesleyan University**. This course provides rigorous, college-level instruction in reading, writing, and critical thinking, preparing students for the academic expectations of postsecondary education while potentially reducing future college costs.

Franklin High School also offers **Intro to Mechatronics I, II, III, and IV (Course Code 101900)** as a dual credit pathway. This sequence prepares students for careers in advanced manufacturing and for continued postsecondary education. Instruction focuses on a core structural study of:

- Hydraulics and pneumatics
- Electrical systems
- Material testing
- Sensors
- Electric and pneumatic robotic operations
- An introduction to programmable logic controllers (PLCs)

The recommended grade level for the Mechatronics pathway is **Grades 11–12**.

In addition, Franklin High School is launching the **Grow Your Own** dual credit program for students interested in pursuing careers in education. Courses will be offered through **Wayne State College**, allowing students to begin coursework toward a teaching degree while still in high school and helping develop a future pipeline of educators.

This year, the **math department** also implemented a dual-credit course with **Central Community College (CCC)** that will be offered again next year. This course enables students to earn college-level mathematics credit, supporting them as they pursue a wide range of postsecondary pathways.

In total, Franklin High School offers dual-credit opportunities in at least four areas, enabling students to begin earning college credit aligned with their future careers in education, advanced manufacturing, mathematics, and core academic studies. These offerings reflect the district's commitment to college and career readiness and to providing students with meaningful postsecondary pathways.

Session Overview

The 2026 Legislative Conference in Lincoln provided updates from multiple senators on the current 60-day legislative session, which includes 581 bills.

Budget Snapshot

- The state is facing a \$471 million budget deficit, which includes the required 3% reserve.
- Senators indicated the true operational deficit is closer to \$326 million.
- Nebraska has approximately \$600 million in the Rainy Day Fund, but the Governor has stated this funding will not be used to balance the budget.

Governor's Budget Proposal – Education Impacts

- Includes a \$7 million reduction to the Department of Labor for scholarships for non-public K-12 schools.
- Indicates a potential future reduction in Special Education reimbursement.

Key Concern:

K-12 educators question the prioritization of non-public school subsidies while funding for public school students—particularly those with the greatest needs—faces reductions.

Key Education-Related Legislation

Student Activities

- LB742 (McKinney): Permits 7th and 8th grade participation in high school sports.

Position: Student activities should continue to be governed by the Activities Association.

Literacy

- LB1050 (Murman): Reading Improvement Act with 3rd-grade retention.
- LB862 (Prokop): Extends funding for the Reading Improvement Act.

Position: Evidence-based literacy supports yield better outcomes than mandatory retention policies.

Student Discipline

- LB1053 (Education Committee): Removes prohibition on suspending students in pre-K through grade 2.

Position: Provides schools a tool for family engagement, not a requirement to suspend young students.

Employee Leave

- LB440 (Spivey): Education Leave and Support Act (AM1699 requires first 30 days covered by districts).
- LB1207 (Juarez): Requires mental health leave days for school employees.

Position: Employee leave and benefits are best addressed through collective bargaining, not legislative mandate.
