

Legislative Updates

The Nebraska Legislative Session has ended. Here is an update on the NRCSA bills we have been closely monitoring. The administration and Marci will be listening to a live meeting on April 20, 2026, at 9:00 am, presented by NCSA and Perry Law Firm on the upcoming changes to policies, handbooks, forms, and practices.

LB 1050, the "Nebraska Reading Improvement Act", was introduced as a way to ensure students are reading at grade level. The bill would have required retention of students at the end of their 3rd-grade year if they were not reading at grade level. A few amendments were introduced to improve the bill, with one by Sen. Jana Hughes drawing considerable discussion. The Education community was against the bill. On Wednesday, April 8, the bill **FAILED** on a Cloture vote.

LB803, the section directly relating to schools, would impact the timeline for the "pink postcard" hearings and budget increases. The hearing would be held between July 1st and July 15th instead of September. At least $\frac{2}{3}$ majority of the members of the board would be needed to vote to increase the property tax request. **PASSED** on April 10th.

LB 937 was a "Christmas Tree" bill. Several bills are attached to one. This bill would have given the parent the last say on a possible change in placement or services in an IEP. **FAILED** on April 7th.

LB 1219 was a bill to set a hard cap on 2% increases in property tax requests for governmental subdivisions, including schools. **FAILED**

NEE Change

The administrative team has selected the tool NEE Network for Educator Effectiveness to use for evaluations next fall. The admin team will be participating in a two-day training held in Minden the last week of July. On April 29th, we will be introducing the tool to the teachers during the in-service. We are looking forward to trying something new. We will have some formalities for the board to accept the new tool, and we will submit the change to the state for approval.

Maintenance Report from Steve

On Monday, April 6th, Rasmussen replaced/upgraded two mini split systems in rooms 100 and 102 in the high school wing. The two units were the last 2 to be replaced in that wing. We replaced the other six last spring with insurance money from the hail damage 3 years ago.

With the mini-splits and the locker room upgrade both complete, our HVAC projects are complete for the 2026 plan.

Hopefully, at the May board meeting, I will be able to provide updates on the start dates for the parking lot, patio, and window projects.
