- **I. Service Providers** We are excited to report that we have an excellent line-up of special education service providers for next school year.

II. CIP Update

- The Early Childhood Learning Center is currently out for proposals (due April 21). We will need a special meeting of the Board (Zoom) to approve the selected contractor.
- For Tatitlek and Chenega, the next design team trip to sites is planned for April 10. RFPs are anticipated to go out in early June.

III. Alaska's Reads Act

While there is much anticipation and a magnitude of planning that needs to take place, the AK Reads Act Regulations have yet to be approved by the AK State Board of Education, and released to the school districts. What we do know is that CSD will need to adopt new reading curriculum, adopt mClass (Dibles 8th Edition) as an early literacy screening tool, increase our intervention supports, provide extensive PD to staff, Elementary certified staff and administrators will have to obtain credits in the area of literacy, and CSD will have to increase offerings for additional schooling, etc. While the list is long, we will not know until final regulations are released what will be required first and when they will be due. Once we can establish this timeline, we can start planning for the additional time and financial requirements.

Introduction

The Chugach School Board adamantly supports the post-secondary endeavors of the district's graduates. The Board's scholarship was developed to reward students for their achievements and help cover the cost of post-secondary schooling/training. Eligible recipients are high school graduates from the Chugach School District (within two years of application).

Process

To be considered, students must complete the following for the Board's review during their May board meeting.

- 1. Completed Application (2 pages)
- 2. A short essay (500 to 1,000 words) explaining why you should be considered for this scholarship and what you intend to do with your furthered education. Please include personal experiences that have helped you decide on furthering your education.
- 3. Proof of enrollment into college or vocational school
- 4. Previous year transcripts or current class schedule
- 5. Two letters of recommendation

Funding

The Board wishes to give a minimum of five (5) \$1,000 scholarships each school year. Funds will come from the Board's budget, donations, fundraisers by stakeholders, and any extra funds the district can divert to the scholarship fund. In times of financial hardship, the Board may decide to waive the scholarship until funding is more readily available.

The district is to use the same methodology for recording total PERS on-behalf. The TRS and PERS on-behalf allocations are to be recorded in the schedule below and also included in the employee benefits in each function. The total on-behalf employee benefits by function should reconcile to the total on-behalf revenues recorded from page 4.
