





Policy Overview: BB 9310 POLICY MANUAL

In governing the district, the School Board has pledged to consider the will and needs of the community. The district's policy manual is developed, distributed and maintained for the purpose of communicating to interested parties the policies, regulations and bylaws within which our schools will operate.

The School Board desires that the community and district employees have access to the policy manual. Districts with no online access will maintain a policy manual at each school site so that it may be examined by students, staff and other interested parties during normal business hours. (cf. 1340 - Access to District Records)

The Superintendent or designee shall provide access to copies of the district policy manual to School Board members, central office administrators, principals, recognized employee organizations, and other key district personnel.

As necessary, the district shall develop or revise policies and regulations in order to reflect new legislation and changing community views. The Superintendent or designee shall maintain procedures for distributing to all authorized manual holders copies of new or revised policies, bylaws and regulations after adoption. The Superintendent or designee shall annually arrange to have all district policy manuals monitored to ensure that they are up to date and complete.

The full amount of the TRS and PERS on-behalf from all funds must be recorded in the operating fund. The district is to calculate the functional break-out in order to allocate the related on-behalf expenditure.

The district is to use the following allocation method for breaking out the TRS by function.

- 1) To calculate the TRS on-behalf amount take the difference between the Board Recommended Rate and the Effective Rate and multiply the difference by the total district wide TRS payroll from all funds. You will now have the total dollar amount of the TRS on-behalf for all funds.

BP 4112.10 EMPLOYMENT OF RETIRED TEACHERS

It is the policy of the Board that teacher vacancies be filled in a timely manner by qualified personnel. The District administration is authorized to employ retired teachers in accordance with <u>AS 14.20.136</u> in cases of teacher shortages, and to notify the Administrator of the Teachers' Retirement System that it is hiring retired teachers pursuant to that statutory provision.

The hiring of retired teachers is authorized in those disciplines or specialties in which a shortage of teachers exists despite active recruitment efforts. A shortage is deemed to exist for those open positions that the administration has been unable to fill with qualified candidates, despite recruitment, public advertising for at least 10 business days, interviews, and the offering of positions to qualified candidates, if any.

Resolution 2024-002

WHEREAS, the Chugach School District requests to enter into an agreement to allow the reemployment of retired teachers. Members retired under AS 14.25.110 (a) who are reemployed by a School District under AS 14.20.136 will: not become an active member; continue to receive retirement benefits from the plan and benefits through reemployment by the School District; will not pay contributions under AS 14.25.050; and will not accrue additional service credit during the period of reemployment.

WHEREAS, members who retire under AS 14.25.100 (a) and are reemployed by a School District under AS 14.20.136 are eligible to waive employer health coverage if the employer's health insurance policies allow for participant waiver/opt-out. Also, the active health coverage must be offered equally to all rehired retirees.

Who can participate:

Members of AS 14.25.009-14.25.220 (TRS DB) and/or members of 14.25.310-14.25-590 (TRS DCRP) are allowed to participate. The contract for reemployment may not exceed 12 months.

Requirements – Rehired Retiree:

- *No prearrangement of reemployment prior to retirement
- *Member must meet Bona Fide Separation rules

Requirements – Employer:

- *Publicly advertise the position for 10 business days and actively recruit to fill the position by hiring a person other than a member who is retired under the Defined Benefit Plan.
- *Provide the Administrator of the Plan (DRB) with a copy of the adopted resolution and a report identifying every rehired member who is retired
- *Describe the circumstances of the shortage that necessitated the rehire; and actions taken by the School District to comply with the School District Policy adopted under the requirements of this section
